

WOMAN LEADER TO SPEAK HERE

Mrs. Cora W. Stewart To Explain Federal Housing Act

Mrs. Cora Wilson Stewart, nationally known club woman, better known in Kentucky for her activities in founding the "Moonlight Schools," will address a meeting of Lexington and Fayette county women Monday, April 29, in the interest of the federal housing act. A special committee has been selected by W. Emmet Milward, president of the Board of Commerce, to make arrangements for Mrs. Stewart's visit. The hour and place of the meeting will be announced later.

The purpose of Mrs. Stewart's visit to Lexington will be to speak of the advantage of the federal housing campaign, particularly the availability of loans for the purpose of purchasing or building new homes. These loans may be made under the federal housing act at a low rate of interest, and under a most favorable repayment plan.

Mr. Milward has requested several

Lexington and Fayette county women's organizations to appoint representatives to a central committee to arrange for the public meeting which will be addressed by Mrs. Stewart. Mrs. Charles Bohmer will act as chairman of the committee, representing the Board of Commerce. The other members of the committee are Mrs. H. S. Schooler, representing the Lexington city council of P. T. A.; Mrs. Harry McEldowney, representing the Fayette Rose and Garden Club; Mrs. Henry Chapman, representing the American Legion auxiliary; Miss Willy King, representing the Altrusa Club; Miss Margaret McLaughlin, representing the University of Kentucky Women's Club; Mrs. James N. Fuqua, representing the Woman's Club of Central Kentucky; and Mrs. John C. Lewis, representing the Lexington Garden Club.

Harry G. Smith, state director of the federal housing administration, will accompany Mrs. Smith to Lexington, and during his stay here will confer with W. C. Lawwill, chairman of the Board of Commerce better-housing committee, as to progress of the Lexington home-modernization campaign.

Many persons in Lexington will be particularly interested in Mrs. Stewart's address because this will be the first public detailed information as to ways and means of obtaining federal housing loans for the purchase or building of new homes. All Lexington and Fayette county women are invited to attend this meeting, but the meeting is not held exclusively for women. The committee also invites men who are interested in hearing Mrs. Stewart.
