Modern Farming is

Destroying Wildlife

New Farm Machinery Eliminates Breeding Place Of State's Game

Many changes have taken place in the last decade in the general agricultural practices of the farm-

lands of Kentucky. With the in-

crease in the use of modern farm

machinery, intensive methods of cul-

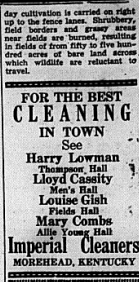
tivation have been adopted and thousands of acres of land have been cleared for new farm-

lands. These agricultural changes, when considered collectively from a state wide angle, have had a decided influence on the environment of many species of animal life. Intensive cultivation as now practiced and an abundance of wildlife do not go together.

The farmers years ago followed the practice of allowing certain fields to lay fallow for one year. This system of farming resulted in the formation of well distributed areas covered with a variety of plants which greatly benefited the natural production of birds and animals. By laying idle one year, these fields afforded nesting and hatching sites, plenty of refuge and most important of all, weeds, grasses and native legumes volunteered that furnished the necessary food.

The farmer today uses a method of crop rotation that does not call for any land laying idle. Crops follow crops immediately, and the environment necessary for birds and animals is gradually destroyed and the available refuge reduced.

The modern farm machinery of today was not known ten years ago and for that reason, little attempt was made to cultivate every
