The tubas, handbells, and music was appealing. LaRissa is already planning to add a large choir for next year.
- 7. Di Walke noted that 2009 will be the 125th anniversary for the building of the little white church on our site to be shared by the Christian Church, the Methodist Church, the Presbyterians, and the Church of God. She suggested that we pull together all these churches to honor the founding. She volunteers to serve on that committee. She sees that having such

an event in the offing will serve as reason to move forward with basement renovation, the faith garden, etc.

President Baldwin said we need a Task Force for such an event:

Property, Stewardship, and Worship Committee should serve.

Di and Tish Damron said they will be happy to serve. We will select a Chair later.

If those four young women and their supervisor cannot come, we will not have a June church dinner.


4. Jack Whidden complimented the organ selection Hedy Caldwell selected for communion on Sunday as well as the special music.

2. The Minutes of the July 28, 2008, Executive Committee were on the table.

- 3. Tish Damron, Treasurer, reported on the meeting of the Stewardship Committee. She has the following recommendations from the committee which she will take to the Board. (1) She will recommend that the by-laws state that special offerings will be submitted within 30 days provided the funds are available. The Treasurer will alert the Board if cash flow problems make the funds 'unavailable.'" Mark Etherton and Di Walke indicated that the Board members will challenge the phrase "if funds are available" for they designated on their subject line what the funds were for. Tish said that her problem two months ago was just a "cash flow issue" that comes when so many bills are due at the same time.
 - (2) The Stewardship Committee came up with the idea to do a stewardship campaign indicating what it costs per day to keep the church budget operating; to keep essential lines in the budget operating, such as cleaning, mowing, communion, music, etc. and ask members to fund one of these items for the year. Chair Baldwin indicated that we will need to give the Disclaimer, "Some of you are already giving above and beyond."
- 4. Personnel Issues. (a) Chair Baldwin indicated that she had sent the new contract for keyboardist to Hedy Caldwell, who has indicated she wants to be the supply musician. She does not want to sign the contract saying she will do paper work to indicate which associate musicians are to be paid for each Sunday. Di Walke indicated that we went to the policy that our current contracted musician is responsible for paying any other performers for their duties to keep the financial straight.
 (b) Our choir director is not recruiting for the choir. She is trying to work out a resolution. Di Walke indicated that we cannot afford to be paying two keyboardist salaries right now.
- 5. Chair Baldwin indicated that we have large designated gifts for "Faith Garden" including \$1500 from Leon Smothers. She asked the treasurer Tish Dameron to give her an itemized statement of gifts designated for the garden so that they can request for them to be used to pay for materials soon.
- 6. Chair Baldwin will make two recommendations to the Board.
 On emeritus status: Whereas we may periodically find ourselves in the situation of recognizing a Executive Board recommends the creation of Emeritus Status. This status may be applied, by Board vote, to any office or function of the church, including the diaconate.

On elder's sabbatical: Given the need for all healthy individuals to occasionally rest and relax spiritually and physically, or to devote additional time to family or other causes in times of need, the Executive Board recommends that the Board grant sabbatical opportunities upon request to Elders allowing them to go off rotation for 6 months to one year (or other time to be determined) when necessary or desirable.

<u>Pastor Molly's Contract:</u> She has combined the old letter of call and the job description, and added the stipulation that we pay her expenses when we send her somewhere to represent the congregation.

5. The meeting adjourned at 7: 05 p.m.

They also found a new tact for a stewardship campaign. List the cost per day to fund the church budget (roughly \$454); List the cost per essential category such as communion, cleaning, music, etc. Encourage members of the congregation to buy a day or an event in the campaign.

Property: Leon Smothers reported that the storm damage is being repaired.

Leon Smothers reported that Jackie Bailey, Stacy Baker, Yvonne Baldwin,

World Outreach/Social Action: Chair absent; no report.



- Mickey Reffitt, Deacon chair indicated that the Deacons for November are Stacey Baker, Wayne Caldwell, Sarah Chaney, Mickey Reffitt, and Liz Reffitt, and Alana Scott.
- 4. The meeting was devoted to Mark Etherton, chair of the By-Laws Committee, going through DRAFT italicized, bolded suggested changes on the current by-laws adopted in 1992. See the attached Draft for the suggested changes recorded in these Minutes which include additional suggestions from the Executive Committee.
 - p. 1 Article IA The change is to make the fiscal and the church year the same.
 - IC1. change the last phrase under annual meeting from the 1992 version "and for any other business that may arise" to "for receiving and approving the budget."
 - IC1a. change the 1992 "one week" to "'two weeks' prior to the established meeting time."
 - p. 2 IC1c change the 1992 quorum 40 to "thirty 30" for the annual meeting.
 - Change special meetings called by "30," members of the congregation to fit quorum for annual meeting.

Add to the first feature a. Notice: . . .

"The petition of at least thirty (30) members of the congregation shall be given to the president who shall call a special meeting within fourteen (14) days of the petition.

2c to be consistent "Thirty (30)" members shall constitute a quorum

Article II introduction add the phrase "as provided below" and cut 1992 phrase" (See Article V, Section C, number 1 for authority and responsibility of the Executive Committee)."

Article IIB in discussion, the Executive Committee suggested that the bolded statement

"who are actively serving" be moved to follow "as officers and those elders and deacons who are actively serving' and honorary elders and deacons." [NOTE: Is it a typo that the 1992 phrase following who are members of the congregation "and who have been elected by the congregation" as officers. . . is missing with no note of change???]

- p. 3 II C 1 no change in meaning to shift active voice to passive voice statement to keep statement focus on "Nominating Committee" with "The members of the Nominating Committee must be approved by the Board of Directors."
 - Il C2 replace specific current names ECHO with generic terms "church newsletter and bulletin" to permit changing name of communication avenues without changing by-laws.
 - II C 7 change "ECHO" to generic term "newsletter" to be consistent.
 - II D cut the 1992 redundant phrase "of the church" following "regular church attendance and financial support, "
- p. 4 ID2 [NOTE: Is it a typo that the 1992 phrase "and one (1) deacon per ten (10) members." is changed to (1) deacon per (6) members" or is it a failure to bold and italicize this change?]
 - II E, add whole statement "4. <u>Inactive Elders—Because of extenuating circumstances</u>, elders may request in writing to be placed on 'inactive status.'"
- p. 5 II G. 1 replace 1992 phrasing "the congregation shall be divided into small groups (flocks) of 10 to 20 families. Each older shall be assigned a flock and shall be responsible for serving the needs of those individuals in his/her flock and for communicating with his/her flock on matters of importance to the church and the congregation" with the simple directive

"a communication tree will flow through the elders and deacons to the congregation."

- II G. 4 correct the typo "The chairperson of the elders and deacons" to "The chairpersons..."
- p. 6 II I.1.a insert the word "active" before "membership of the Board of Directors."
 - II I 2 insert "a majority vote of "before "Executive Committee" for calling special meetings.

 Article III B. replace the 1992 phrasing "or until their successors are elected" with "unless he/she is filling the unexpired term of an officer."

The Executive Committee discussed our practice of having officers serve two

years but decided to keep the 1992 "hold office for one year" for the new suggested addition which follows makes it possible for them to continue to serve. "unless he/she is filling the unexpired term of an officer. All officers may be re-elected."

[NOTE;; "All officers may be re-elected" should not be bolded. It is from the 1992 by-laws.]

- p. 7 III C 1 insert "non-voting" into "The president shall be an ex-officio, 'non-voting' member of all
 - III C2 CUT the 1992 paragraph for Vice President which reads "In the event that the president and vice president can not perform their duties, the past presidents, beginning with the most recent and following reverse chronological order shall be asked to assume the duties of the president. This person shall serve as president until the duly elected president and/or the vice president can assume his/her duties, or until the next regular election of the Board Officers, whichever occurs first."
 See replacement in the new section "III D Vacancies of the Offices".
 - III C 4 The Executive committee discussed the change from the 1992 "\$25" dollar amount to \$100 in the phrase "a petty cash fund not to exceed \$100." After discussion the Executive Committee added the phrase "petty cash fund to be assessed and replenished regularly."
 Mickey Reffitt volunteered a fire proof lock box for safe keeping of the petty cash fund.
 - III C 4 change from 1992 treasurer as "a member" of Stewardship Committee to be "chair" of the Stewardship Committee.
 - III C 5 typo "Proscribed" should be "prescribed;" Addition of (s) to "Assistant Treasurer (s) should be bolded and italicized to indicate change from 1992 by-laws.
 - Section III D Vacancies of the Offices is NEW to replace statements in 1992 By-laws III C. 2 about order of succession to presidency in case of vacancy which were under Vice President (see above in minutes).
 - "1. <u>Presidential Vacancy</u>—In the event that the president cannot perform his/her designated duties due to unusual circumstances, the vice president shall assume the duties of the president.
 - 2. <u>Vice President's Inability to Assume Presidency</u>—In the event that the vice president Cannot fulfill the duties of the president, the president's duty will fall to the treasurer.
 - 3. <u>Vice President Treasurer Inability to Assume Presidency</u>—In the event that the vice President and the treasurer cannot or will not assume the presidency, the Presidency shall be assumed by the chair of the elders. If that is not possible, the office will be filled by the chair of the deacons until a new president has been chosen.
- p. 8 IV.A. 1 The order of the listing simply changed for readability from the 1992 ex-officio member of all organized groups, auxiliaries, and committees to "ex-officio member of all committees, organized groups and auxiliaries." TYPO: cut the comma following" Board approval" in "with Board approval shall appoint the committee chairperson.
 - IV, B. 4 The "Board of Directors" in "The only binding commitments shall be those made in writing and approved by the 'Board of Directors'" does not need bold because it is the phrasing in the 1992 by-laws.

[NOTE: what does need to be bolded is the phrasing in the last sentence of that section: "Personnel Committee" in the 1992 statement "reviewed annually by the Personnel Committee and recommendation..."

Article VI is a new addition to the church by-laws;

"Method for Amending By-Laws

- A. Amendments to the By-laws must be approved by 2/3 vote of the Board of Directors at a regular or special meeting.
- B. If approved by the Board, the proposed amendment(s) must be presented to the congregation in a regular or special meeting of the congregation where the proposed amendment(s) must receive 2/3 vote of members present.
- C. The proposed amendment(s) shall be provided to the congregation in writing not less than two weeks prior to such a meeting."

FIRST SCRIPTURE: PSALM 73: 21-25

-. 43.00

Naught be all else to me, save that Thou art...Thou and Thou only, first in my heart......I ever with Thee and Thou with me, Lord

These phrases from the hymn "Be Thou My Vision" are echoes from these verses in the 73rd Psalm. They point to lines of devotional intensity that have made this Psalm a classic of prayer and contemplation. And, as we conclude this 8 week series of sermons, these lines also point us to what has to be center in a healthy spiritual life: placing God at its center. The pure devotion and the certainty of the psalmist's praise replaces the bitterness and estrangement seen in the beginning of the hymn. The psalmist is addressing these honest words to God.

As we prepare our hearts for a seed of understanding and clarity, we would do well to move everything else from the core of our hearts, and listen for a word from God.

- 21 When my soul was embittered, when I was pricked in heart,
- 22 I was stupid and ignorant;
 I was like a brute beast toward you.
- 23 Nevertheless I am continually with you; you hold my right hand.
- 24 You guide me with your counsel, receive me with honour.
- 25 Whom have I in heaven but you? And there is nothing on earth that I desire other than you.

THE WORD OF THE LORD.

The clerk, in letting Scrooge's nephew out, had let two other people in. They were portly gentlemen, pleasant to behold, and now stood, with their hats off, in Scrooge's office. They had books and papers in their hands, and bowed to him.
