MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University's Board of Regents approved a \$61.5 million operating budget for fiscal 1993-94 and awarded MSU President Dr. Ronald G. Eaglin a new four-year contract, starting July 1. The regents also endorsed new student housing and dining requirements which go into effect in fall 1994.

In announcing the new contract, board chairman William Seaton said that the board believed Dr. Eaglin "was doing a good job and had initiated policies which will move the University forward." He added that Dr. Eaglin was directing the University toward more public service in economic development.

The budget includes a 3 percent across the board pay increase for faculty and staff, funding for 18.6 new faculty and staff positions, increases to existing student scholarships to offset rising tuition/housing costs, a 27 percent increase in funding for library books and funds for expansion of the extended campus centers in Ashland and West Liberty.

The regents also increased Dr. Eaglin's 1993-94 salary by 3 percent to provide additional life insurance for him and health and dental benefits for Mrs. Eaglin. His current salary is \$115,000.

During the discussion related to the budget and other personnel issues, the president reiterated his expectation that the salary increase pool for 1994-95 include a minimum of 25 percent of those funds to be distributed based on a merit system. Regent John Rosenberg asked for information on how other institutions nationwide deal with the issue of merit pay.

In acting on the operating budget, the regents also approved the 1993-94 fee schedule which includes an \$80 per semester tuition increase set by the Council on Higher Education, a \$5 increase in the student activity and services fee as requested by the Student Government Association, and a 7 percent increasing in student housing. A portion of the housing increase will be earmarked for additional student computer labs with expanded hours of operation.

Also approved was the 1993-94 personnel roster which reflects the University's organizational changes to be implemented July 1.

Effective with the fall 1994 semester, new and returning full-time students with fewer than 60 credit hours will be required to live in University housing and purchase a minimum \$300 dining club plan.

The requirement will be waived for students who will be 21 years old during the semester; single parents; married students; students commuting from home of parents or guardian; students with documented medical reasons and veterans.

MSU officials expect the new housing policy to reverse a two-year decline in housing occupancy and to begin to address what is now an approximately \$300,000 subsidy of housing from the general fund. Dr. Eaglin said that those dollars could be better spent on academic programs. The regents were told that national studies also show that students living in residence halls do better, stay in school, graduate sooner and are more involved with university life than those living off campus.

Other board actions during the April 30 meeting included approval of awarding an honorary degree to Faith Esham, an internationally-acclaimed operatic soprano and native of Lewis County, and approval of amendments to various personnel policies, ranging from tuition waivers for employees to sexual harassment.

The board also adopted resolutions commending outgoing student regent Chando Mapoma and Dr. Alban Wheeler, who had served as faculty regent for past six years, for their service. The oath of office was administered to the newly-elected faculty regent, Dr. Bruce Mattingly, who began his three-year term at this meeting.

Dr. Sharon M. Murphy, dean, College of Communication, Journalism and Performing Arts, Marquette University, May 10-11.

Dr. James C. Foster, assistant to the president for academic affairs, St. Mary's College of Minnesota, May 13-14.

Each candidate will spend two days on the campus meeting with the various constituencies. "We want to encourage the faculty, staff and students to take advantage of the opportunity to meet with these candidates," Northcutt said.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Three Morehead State University faculty members have been selected by their colleagues to receive the University's most prestigious faculty awards for extraordinary achievements.

Dr. John E. Kleber, professor of history whose historical research has enriched the archives of the commonwealth, was the recipient of the 1992-93 Distinguished Researcher Award, sponsored by the MSU Research and Creative Productions Committee and awarded annually since 1979.

Dr. Michelle Boisseau, associate professor of English whose poetry has gained critical acclaim nationwide, has become the second person to received the Distinguished Creative Production Award, initiated last year by the RCP Committee.

Mary Jo Netherton, associate professor of French whose gift for teaching has given countless students a heightened awareness of a different culture, has earned the 1992-93 Distinguished Teacher Award, established in 1964 by the MSU Alumni Association.

The awards were announced at the University's ninth annual Academic Awards Convocation held Sunday, May 2, in Button Auditorium. The event capped a weeklong tribute to scholastic achievement.

A member of the MSU faculty since 1968, Dr. Kleber focuses his research efforts on Kentucky history. His work as editor-in-chief of the "Kentucky Encyclopedia" has attracted the attention of scholars nationwide and in the Bahamas, who consider the encyclopedia a model for such research.

The volume, published by the University Press of Kentucky in conjunction with the state's bicentennial in 1992, has sold nearly 35,000 copies and a CD-ROM version is expected to be out later this year.

A recipient of the Governor's Outstanding Kentuckian Award, Dr. Kleber is a member of the Kentucky Historical Association, the state Historical Records Board and the Filson Club. Earlier, he served as editor of the public papers of Gov. Lawrence W. Wetherby. He currently is working on a comprehensive history of Clark County.

Dr. Kleber, who received MSU's Distinguished Teacher Award in 1982, directed the University's Academic Honors Program for 15 years. A native of Louisville, he graduated summa cum laude from Bellarmine College, and earned master's as well as doctoral degrees from the University of Kentucky with additional graduate study at the University of California-Irvine.

Dr. Boisseau is an award-winning poet who considers her activity as a published writer essential to the teaching of creative writing to her students. She serves as faculty sponsor for Inscape, the student literary magazine, and coordinates a readings series which brings other poets and fiction-writers to the campus and region.

A member of the faculty since 1987, Dr. Boisseau has received numerous grants and fellowships, including a National Endowment for the Arts Poetry Fellowship in 1989, the Al Smith Poetry Fellowship from the Kentucky Arts Council, and a Kentucky Foundation for Women Poetry Grant.

Her publishing credentials include two books: "No Private Life," published by Vanderbilt University Press, and "East of the Sun and West of the Moon," published by St. Louis Poetry Center. Dr. Boisseau also has two manuscripts in progress and is co-authoring a textbook on writing poetry for HarperCollins. Her work also has appeared in countless journals--regional and national--and in anthologies. She has read her works at numerous arts centers and colleges in Kentucky, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Missouri, Ohio, New York and Texas.

A two-time recipient of Poetry Society of America awards, Dr. Boisseau is the first Kentucky poet to receive the St. Louis Poetry Society's Stanley Hanks Poetry Chapbook Prize and is a five-time nominee for the Pushcart Prize.

She holds B.A. and M.A. degrees from Ohio University and received the Ph.D. degree from the University of Houston.

Mary Jo Netherton began her teaching career with MSU at Breckinridge School in 1964 and joined the foreign languages faculty in 1967. She also has taught in France for three summers with the Kentucky Institute of International Studies and received a fellowship from the American Association of Teachers of French for its 1993 Summer Institute in France program.

Netherton also is director of MSU's Eastern Kentucky Regional Foreign Language Festival and is a volunteer French teacher for Rowan County's Elementary Division Gifted Education program. She has served as co-director of the Rowan County Elementary School Academic Day.

In addition to her role as a classroom teacher, Netherton is advisor to MSU's chapter of Chi Omega sorority and is a two-time recipient of the University's Greek Adviser of the Year award for her work with the sorority. She also received the sorority's National Award for Excellence.



MOREHEAD, Ky.---Bryan Carlier, a senior from Batavia, Ohio, has been elected president of Morehead State University's Student Government Association (SGA). His one year term begins July 1.



MOREHEAD, Ky.—A middle school principal, a music teacher/band director and an MSU graduate student in communications have been recognized for their professional achievements by the Morehead State University Chapter of Phi Delta Kappa.

Helen Charles Pennington, Morgan County Middle School principal, received the 1993 Outstanding Public School Administrator Award.

Nadine Philips Hale, music teacher and band director at Morgan County High and Middle schools, received the 1993 Outstanding Public School Teacher Award.

James C. Barger of West Union, Ohio, who is a May candidate for an M.A. degree in communications with radio-television emphasis, received the 1993 Outstanding Graduate Student Award.

In her current role since 1989, Pennington began her career as a second grade teacher in the Morgan County system in 1969. A former school food service director for the county, she also was a food service consultant for the state Department of Education, working with 22 school districts.

She earned the B.S. degree in home economics from Berea College and her master's degree as well as certifications in elementary principalship, secondary principalship and instructional supervision from MSU.

In nominating her, one of Pennington's colleagues said that she "consistently displays qualities of initiative, conscientiousness and professionalism. She has been an educational leader who is committed to academic excellence."

Hale, this year's Outstanding Teacher, earned her Bachelor of Music Education degree from MSU and is completing requirements for a master's degree in secondary education with an emphasis in music at the University. A co-worker described her as "an enthusiastic, knowledgeable and committed teacher" and added that under Hale's leadership and guidance, students had won local and national recognition.

Barger earned his baccalaureate degree in radio/television at MSU and is a May 1993 master's degree candidate in communications at the University. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Clifton L. Barger. A graduate assistant and executive news director of MSU's NewsCenter 12, he was nominated by a communications faculty member who called him a "very positive role model as a graduate assistant" and said he "accepts each assignment with enthusiasm, dedication and determination" and has earned the respect of the students.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Dr. Wanda Durrett Bigham, a Morehead State University administrator, has been named president of Huntingdon College and will assume her new duties June 1.

Located in Montgomery, Ala., Huntingdon is a four-year, co-educational liberal arts college which is affiliated with the United Methodist Church. It enrolls approximately 800 students.

According to Jack Boykin, chairman of the school's board of trustees, Dr. Bigham may be the first woman president of a four-year residential college in the state of Alabama. She will be the 13th president in the school's 139 year history.

A former president of Marycrest College, now Teikyo Marycrest University, in Davenport, Iowa, Dr. Bigham left MSU in 1985 for Emerson College. There she was executive assistant to the president and later vice president for development and college relations. She held the Marycrest presidency from 1986 to 1992.

Dr. Bigham earned a bachelor's degree in music education at Murray State, master's degrees in music and higher education from MSU, and her doctorate in higher education from the University of Kentucky. She has studied at Harvard University's Institute for Educational Management and is an American Council on Education Fellow in Academic Administration.

Her involvement in professional organizations at many levels include service with the American Council on Education as a member of the Committee on Self-Regulation, State Coordinator of the organization's National Identification Program, and member of the Professional Development Committee of the ACE Fellows Program. Active in the National Council of Educational Opportunity Associations, she has served as treasurer and board member. In addition, she was president from 1983-85 of the Southeastern Association of Educational Opportunity Personnel, an organization which includes members from Alabama.

She has been active in community projects and served from 1987-92 as co-chair of Quad Cities Vision for the Future, a strategic planning and action committee for that metropolitan community whose estimated population is 350,000. In addition, she has served on numerous boards, including the following: Davenport Chamber of Commerce, St. Luke's Hospital, Greater Quad Cities Public Television Corporation, Junior Achievement, and the Iowa Student Loan Liquidity Corporation.

Dr. Bigham is listed in "Who's Who in America," "Who's Who in the Midwest," "Community Leaders of America," and "Who's Who of American Women." Recent awards include the President's Award of the Davenport Chamber of Commerce, the Women's Leadership Award of the Quad Cities, and the Hope for Humanity Award of the Yom Hashoah Committee of the Jewish Federation of the Quad Cities. She holds an honorary doctorate from Loras College and was inducted into the MSU Alumni Hall of Fame in 1988.

She and her husband, William Bigham who is an MSU professor emeritus of music, are the parents of three grown children.

The 10-hour course will run from 6 to 9 p.m. each evening in 302 Button Building. Classroom instruction in hunter ethics, wildlife identification, outdoor survival, first aid, firearms, bow hunting, and ammunition will be offered. The last session will include actual range firing and an examination.

Upon successful completion of the course, participants will receive a graduate card which is valid in any state where certification is necessary. Attendance at all sessions is required.

This course meets the March 1, 1991, state requirement that all hunters born on or after Jan. 1, 1975, shall, while hunting carry a valid hunter education course graduate card in addition to the appropriate state hunting license. A bow hunter, without a firearm, may carry a "National Bowhunter Education Program" card in lieu of the hunter education card.

Youth, under 10 years of age, and persons exempt from purchasing a hunting license are not required to possess the card while hunting. Persons under 10 must be accompanied by an adult of at least 18 years of age while hunting.



Limited transportation for the summer program will be offered by the Rowan County Schools with a bus schedule to be published later. Lunches will be provided at the same cost as during the regular school year.



WEST LIBERTY, Ky.—Education programs in prisons are not a waste of taxpayers' money, but an investment in the future was the message delivered Friday night (May 14) by one of those investments.

The speaker, William K. Brown, was one of five inmates of the Eastern Kentucky Correctional Complex who earned degrees from Morehead State University under a program offered at EKCC through the University's Licking Valley Extended Campus Center.

MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin, along with other MSU administrators and faculty garbed in traditional academic regalia, joined with state corrections officials to conduct a special commencement program at EKCC for the graduating inmates and their families.

Brown of Catlettsburg, Michael Lonnie Burke of Newport, Dewayne E. Goodlett of Taylorsville, Charles Wayne Houp of Nicholasville, and David E. Russell of Mt. Carmel, Ohio, received the Associate of Arts degree from MSU. Brown, Houp and Russell graduated with distinction.

"Unfortunately, there is very little that we can do about what happened yesterday, other than learn from those mistakes and not repeat them," Brown told his listeners. "Dwelling on these mistakes is not what this degree is about. It is about tomorrow."

Convinced that he wouldn't be in prison today, if he had pursued a college education rather than taking "the easy way out," Brown said that his vocational choice of welding had led to hard labor, discontent, frustration and alcoholism.

Noting that he had made a number of excuses for not going on to college, Brown said that he now knows that they were false barriers. "Education is about overcoming these fears and recognizing our abilities. It's about finding the answer to whatever problems exist. It's about looking to the future with pride and never looking back," he added.

"Recidivism is the problem we have to combat now," Brown said, adding that overcrowding in the nation's prison is aggravated by recidivism. "The only proven thing to combat recidivism is education," he said.

According to Brown, between 60 and 80 percent of people released from prison without education return in a short period of time, but that drops dramatically to 35 percent for those with a little education.

"Each time someone leaves prison without an education and returns, it costs the taxpayers a lot more more money than it would have to educate them to begin with," he said.

"There are forces in our government that would take education programs out of the prison system in the name of saving a dollar," he said, urging the members of the audience to write their congressmen and tell them to continue this program.

Under current federal legislation, there is a possibility that Pell Grants may not be available to prison inmates.

MSU President Eaglin, who conferred the degrees, earlier told the graduates that the University was proud of its program and what it is doing to help them and other inmates prepare themselves for a productive life when they return to society.

"Many of you are aware that certain political leaders and others are critical of college degree programs at correctional institutions," he said.

"But we know at MSU that education has proven to be the best method of rehabilitation and we want everyone at this institution to know that Morehead State is committed to helping you get out and stay out through education," Dr. Eaglin said.

EKCC Warden Michael J. O'Dea welcome the inmates' families and other guests to the ceremony which was followed by a reception.

MSU has been offering college classes at EKCC since fall 1990 and this is the second class to graduate from the program. The first four students received their degrees at this time last year in a similar commencement program.



The growth of Morehead State University's Big Sandy Extended Campus Center is a clear indication of the region's desire for additional higher education opportunities and MSU officials believe that growth pattern will continue.

"Regional sites, such as the Big Sandy Center, are where our future enrollment increases will be seen," said MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin. He added that he envisions a time when the University's off-campus enrollment might equal that of the main campus.

Last fall the Big Sandy Center had nearly 600 students taking a variety of undergraduate and graduate courses, a 19 percent increase over the previous year. The Big Sandy ECC serves students from Floyd, Pike, Martin, Magoffin, Johnson, Lawrence, Perry and Knott counties.

With classes in sociology, history, psychology, paralegal studies, speech, government, art, biology and other disciplines, the Center also offers two plus two programs in elementary education and business along with a B.S.N. degree program for registered nurses which saw its first graduates this spring. Several graduate programs in education also are available at the Big Sandy ECC.

Last year, the Center began offering classes during summer terms and a full schedule is planned this year. Summer term registration at the Center is scheduled for Monday, June 7, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

This fall, the Big Sandy ECC will be one of two off-campus sites for a special graduate class in management which will be offered through distance learning by interactive computer (Optel System) and voice communication integrated with videotapes. Teaching the course will be Dr. Rodger D. Carlson, professor of marketing, who will rotate teaching the class from the main campus to the Big Sandy and the Ashland Area centers.

While MSU has offered graduate work in Prestonsburg since the 1960s, the addition of upper division undergraduate work complementing existing coursework at community colleges and other schools came in 1986. Working closely with Prestonsburg Community College, MSU sought to identify the needs of those people with two years of college who could not leave the area to take additional work toward a four-year degree.

The interest in these programs shown by residents of the region resulted in the Council on Higher Education formally designating the regional site as an extended campus center in 1989.

"Our goal is to see that programs are offered at the Center which will enable students in the Big Sandy area to have more employment opportunities in the region," said Dr. Marc D. Glasser, dean of MSU's Graduate and Extended Campus Programs.

"Currently we are exploring the possibility of offering the baccalaureate degree in social work sometime in the future, but that will be dependent on funding being available and the demand for such a program," he added.

The Big Sandy ECC plans to add its second resident faculty member this fall to assist with the elementary education program, joining Dr. David Peterson, assistant professor of elementary education, at the Center.

"This will make it possible for us to enhance the elementary education program we already are offering," said Dr. Margaret Lewis, who assumed the post of director of the Center last summer. "This also is indicative of MSU's commitment to the Big Sandy area.

"We hope to continue expanding our offerings and will be examining how technology can be used to enhance the marketability of our students," she added.

For many years, the MSU classes were housed at Prestonsburg Community College, but as space needs of both PCC and the MSU Center increased, it became apparent that the University needed its own facility. In fall 1991, the Big Sandy ECC moved into its new quarters in the Highlands Plaza Shopping Center.

The new facility offers approximately 14,000 square feet of space for 10 classrooms, offices, a student lounge and a computer lab equipped with 19 PCs and several laser printers. One classroom includes an instructional media lab for teacher education students, while another is equipped for the nursing students. A bookstore operates in the Center at the start and the close of each term, for the buying and selling of textbooks and miscellaneous supplies.

The center also offers computerized registration and access to the on-line card catalog at Camden-Carroll Library on the main campus. A steerable satellite dish gives the Center access to teleconferences and to KET's Star Channel, while a "KET Cabinet" with computer, TV monitor, VCR and interactive keypads makes it possible for participation in any KET-aired teleconference.

The Big Sandy Center also has the computer capability of helping students from other schools determine not only what courses will transfer to MSU but also what additional work is needed to complete a degree.

Working with the students, in addition to Dr. Lewis and the faculty members is Debra Slone Salyer, academic/student services coordinator, who splits her time between the Big Sandy and the Ashland Area centers.

MOREHEAD, Ky .--- "If you can't sing good, sing loud."

That phrase used by the father of opera star Faith Esham to tease her was the message she brought to Morehead State University's spring graduating class of 1993.

About 670 of the nearly 800 candidates for undergraduate and graduate degrees were present for commencement program which drew more than 6,500 friends and family members to the Academic-Athletic Center.

Esham, a native of Lewis County who is now an internationally-acclaimed operatic soprano, was the recipient of an honorary Doctor of Musical Arts degree, conferred by MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin on behalf of the Board of Regents.

"Each of us here--each one of you-- has a song in your heart and this song will lead you to service," Esham told the audience. "So I say to you today, sing loud, sing with joy, sing with wisdom and with a prayer in your heart. It will make a difference," added Esham, who closed her acceptance remarks by singing "The Prayer of St. Francis."

She also paid tribute to her mother, Mrs. Ruth Esham of Vanceburg, and her "mom-ette" and former vocal teacher, Vasile Venettozzi, for their support over the years. Esham studied for four years with Venettozzi, who retired from MSU's faculty in December. Esham's father, the late Dr. Ellwood Esham, served as an MSU regent from 1954 to 1958.

Dr. Eaglin called the honorary degree the highest recognition of personal accomplishment that can be bestowed by an institution of higher education. MSU's primary objective in awarding honorary doctoral degrees is to recognize individuals associated with Eastern Kentucky who achieved national and/or international prominence.

"Such persons are a source of pride to us and to our fellow citizens as they help combat the negative stereotypes of the good people who live in these hills and hollows," the president said.

Student speaker Dorothy E. Schmidt of Georgetown reminded her fellow graduates that their education was not over. "A college education is a great starting point," she said. "Continued education and self-improvement are essential in making our lives meaningful and challenging," said Schmidt, who received her B.S. degree in veterinary technology with honors.

"Our education can take us to great heights, but how high and how far we go is up to us. Remember, eagles can glide along on currents of air, but to get where they want to go they have to flap their wings," she said.

Also presented by Dr. Eaglin during commencement was MSU's Distinguished Service Award which recognizes those at MSU who exemplify the highest ideals of service and citizenship. This year's recipient was John Michael Seelig, professor and director of the University's Social Work Program.

Following the conferring of degrees, MSU's newest alumni were inducted into the Alumni Association by William H. Redwine, director of alumni relations. The new graduates join 37,000 MSU alumni nationwide and abroad.

After commencement, President and Mrs. Eaglin greeted the new graduates and their families at an Alumni Association-sponsored reception outside the AAC.



MOREHEAD, Ky.—"Not only was it the largest but also the most beautiful building in Morehead."

"It had the latest in facilities--a science lab, woodworking department, nice library and an indoor gymnasium."

This is how former state Court of Appeals Judge Elijah Hogge of Frankfort describes Breckinridge School, where he was a member of the first graduation class in 1932.

Hogge is planning to return to his former high school for its first school-wide reunion July 2-4. He is curious as to how many others, from the nearly 1,900 alumni and friends who also have been invited, will return to Breckinridge for the weekend's activities.

Planning to be a lawyer, Hogge anxiously enrolled in Breck when the new building was completed in 1930 so he could take Latin. "My dad was a lawyer and it was expected that I become a lawyer as well," he said. "And Latin is something I still use frequently in the legal profession."

Because the teachers were so well prepared, Hogge believes the students at Breck, which also was Morehead State University's laboratory school for teacher training from 1924 to 1982, received a quality education. In addition to his Latin teacher, Juanita Minnish, he remembers George Young, Mildred Silver and Lucille Catlett among those first educators at Breck.

While the school in its early days did not have a formal athletic program, Hogge was a member of the first basketball team. "We did not have real uniforms but we donned khaki shorts and white tank tops to play," he said. The competition included approximately half-dozen neighboring schools and he believes that the major victory was a win over Soldier, a former school in Carter County, with a score of 16-12.

Life was much different in the '30s than it is today, Hogge noted. "There was no thought or mention of drugs in the schools," he said, recalling that there were approximately 500 students enrolled in the college and fewer than 100 attending Breck. Recreational activities included going to a movie at the Cozy Theatre where the feature changed four times a week, bowling a line for 15-25 cents, and eating at the Amos and Andy restaurant where 10 cents bought a hamburger or hot dog and soft drinks were a nickel.

For Hogge, a highlight of his high school days was the lunchtime activities when he and friend Roger Caudill listened to music on the car radio. "Roger was the only one in my class with a car," he said. "Every day, we would drive around listening to a broadcast from the Netherland Plaza Hotel in Cincinnati."

Education was a high priority in the Hogge household when he was growing up. His father Lester Hogge, a 1906 graduate of Morehead Normal School, was a school supervisor in the Rowan County School system where he worked with the Moonlight School Program and Cora Wilson Stewart, county superintendent. His mother, Maude, was a teacher in the same system.

After graduating from high school at 15, Hogge enrolled in Morehead State Teachers College because his parents believed him to be too young to leave home. When he graduated at 19, Hogge was off to Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Va., for his law degree.

With a career in law that has spanned several decades and numerous positions, Hogge has remained close to Rowan County and a building on the edge of campus bears his name today. He was a county attorney and practiced law in the Eastern Kentucky town in the '40s, before and after a stint in the naval reserve.

In 1957, Hogge was named commonwealth attorney for Rowan, Bath, Menifee and Montgomery counties. He served in that position until 1971 when he became actively engaged in Gov. Wendell Ford's campaign. Ford's successful race opened the door for political aspirations when Hogge was named to the cabinet. He became the first secretary of the newly-organized Transportation Cabinet, which included the Department of Highways and Motor Vehicles. Under his supervision, the highway linking Morehead to Northern Kentucky, by way of Flemingsburg and Maysville, was improved. He later resigned that post to serve on the Public Protection and Regulation Cabinet.

Under Gov. Julian Carroll's administration, Hogge was named to the Kentucky Court of Appeals for the first time. Today, he is counsel with Hazelrigg and Cox and hears all cases that come before the State Racing Commission as well as serving as a special judge who can be assigned to hear cases anywhere in Kentucky.

While he continues to live in Frankfort, Hogge makes frequent visits to the 135-acre farm he purchased in Fleming County. He is renovating and improving the Cloverland Farm which he has owned since 1988. "When I used to travel from Morehead to Cincinnati, this farm always looked so pretty," he said. "I always thought it would be fun to own."

In the days leading up to the Breck reunion, Hogge will join many others reviewing their yearbooks and trying to remember the names of former friends and classmates.



MOREHEAD, Ky.—Effective June 1, administrative oversight of Morehead State University's intercollegiate athletics program will shift to the Division of Student Life from the Division of University Advancement, where it had been since 1990.

The move is just one piece of an organizational restructuring of the University which was announced earlier, MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin said.

"In reviewing the functions of the institution, it became apparent that athletics was really more closely aligned with student affairs than with advancement," Dr. Eaglin said.

"Much of the reorganization takes effect July 1 and later, but we moved up the timeline on this change to enable the vice president for Student Life (Mike Mincey) to participate in some of the current planning for the 1993-94 program," Dr. Eaglin added.

"The shift also will allow our vice president for University Advancement (Keith Kappes) to more fully focus on his roles in governmental and legislative affairs, development and institutional relations which are key areas to Morehead State's future," the president said.

Shortly after his arrival on campus last July, Dr. Eaglin requested the University Planning Council to initiate a study of the University's structure. Meetings were held with all segments of the campus and input was solicited from all faculty, staff and students before the final plan was presented to the Board of Regents in April.


Previously he was recognized by the Maysville-Mason County Black Caucus as the 1988 recipient of its Outstanding Merit Award for Community Service.
