

MOREHEAD, Ky.--How to use Jesse Stuart's educational materials to meet KERA goals and objectives will be the focus for the 15th annual Jesse Stuart Symposium slated Friday, June 25, at Morehead State University's Adron Doran University Center.

Hosted by MSU with the assistance of the Jesse Stuart Foundation, the event is part of the University's weeklong Appalachian Celebration which begins June 20.

Beginning with registration at 10 a.m. on the third floor of the University Center, the Symposium includes a resource review period at 10:30 where participants may view Jesse Stuart films in the Eagle Dining Room or browse through books in the lobby area outside the Crager Room.

At the noon luncheon, Dr. James M. Gifford, executive director of the Stuart Foundation, will discuss Naomi Dean Stuart's life and her influence on her late husband's work which has gained international acclaim.

Two KERA valued outcomes will be the topic for afternoon discussions with a panel composed of Tish Wilson, Kentucky Writing Program director; Hoyt LeFever, Clinton County Elementary School principal; Anne Lyon, Oil Springs Elementary School teacher, and Dr. Gifford.

The outcome to be addressed in the 2 p.m. session will be "Students construct meaning from a variety of print materials for a variety of purposes through reading."

After a break, participants and panelists will take up "Students interact effectively and work cooperatively with diverse ethnic and cultural groups of our nation and world" in a session scheduled to begin at 3:45 p.m.

While the Symposium is free and open to the public, teachers participating for inservice credit will be assessed a \$25 fee. There is also an \$8 charge for the buffet luncheon and reservations must be made by June 18. MOREHEAD, Ky.--Brig. Gen. Robert L. DeZarn, adjutant general of Kentucky, will be the keynote speaker for the 53rd session of Kentucky Boys State which will be held at Morehead State University Sunday through Friday, June 6-11.

Approximately 300 high school seniors from across the state will participate in the program which is sponsored each year by the Kentucky American Legion. During the week, the youth will take part in mock government sessions designed to provide practical lessons in city and state government.

DeZarn will address the first general session which is set for Sunday, June 6, at 7 p.m. in Fulbright Auditorium in Baird Music Hall. A former engineer and armor commander, Gen. DeZarn is the state's highest ranking military officer.

A retired supervisor with Armco Steel Company in Ashland, he is an alumnus of Eastern Kentucky University where he received his commission through the ROTC program.

Welcoming the group at the opening ceremonies Sunday at 4 p.m., also in Fulbright Auditorium, will be Keith Kappes, MSU's vice president for university advancement.

Throughout the week, the Boys State delegates will learn about the state's political system by developing their own two-party system and electing state and city officials; serving as legislators, and introducing, debating and enacting laws as in the Kentucky General Assembly.

Elected Boys State officers, including governor and lieutenant governor, will be announced on Wednesday, June 9, and on Thursday they will travel to Frankfort to meet with their real life counterparts.

Also scheduled to address the program participants during the week are Gov. Brereton C. Jones; Bob Babbage, secretary of state, and Gen. Billy Wellman, state justice secretary and commissioner of the Kentucky State Police.

A graduation awards ceremony will conclude the week's activities on Friday. MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin will be the featured speaker for the luncheon, scheduled to begin at 11 a.m. in Button Drill Room.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---An explosion and fire in a section of a utility tunnel disrupted electrical and telephone service to the eastern end of the Morehead State University campus Thursday afternoon.

No injuries were reported in the noontime incident near MSU's Academic-Athletic Center. The Morehead Fire department extinguished the blaze which apparently affected a 40-foot section of the concrete-encased tunnel.

The cause of the explosion and extent of damage to the tunnel could not be immediately determined. The tunnel section was constructed about 12 years ago.

"We anticipate that use of the indoor facilities in the athletic complex will be restricted for several days until repairs can be completed," said Porter Dailey, MSU's vice president for administration and fiscal services.

This year's celebration again includes several free children events, co-sponsored by the U.S. Forest Service and MSU's Derrickson Agricultural Complex, to be held at Rodburn Park on Wednesday, June 23, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Launching the day's activities will be the petting zoo from 10 a.m. to noon. "The zoo will allow area children to get up close where they can really see and touch the animals," said Evelyn Morgan, U.S. Forest Service interpretive specialist. "We've planned all kinds of exciting experiences for them," Morgan added.

Children who will be on hand for the full day's program will need to bring a sack lunch.

At 1 p.m., Scott Shupe from the National History Educational Company Wildlife Shows in Farmington will present a program on North American birds of prey.

"Our show will include the red tailed hawk, adult male golden eagle and the great horned owl," Shupe said.

Emphasis will be on the useful, though sometimes destructive, roles these predators play in nature, while pointing out that many species are now listed as threatened or endangered and are protected by state and federal laws.



MOREHEAD, Ky.---A discussion of the decrease in military operations in the U.S., world powers and the global economy highlighted the opening of the 53rd session of Kentucky Boys State today on the Morehead State University campus.

As the keynote speaker, Brig. Gen. Robert L. DeZarn, adjutant general of Kentucky, told the more than 250 delegates that the country is facing a real challenge. "There are 43 places in the world where we have military forces," he said. "In any one of these places, there is the danger of outbreaks or a full blown war."

Gen. DeZarn, the state's highest ranking military officer, said that it was his belief that the "U.S. should only go to war because something is posing a threat to our way of life."

Fielding questions from the audience, Gen. DeZarn said this country should be involved in taking food and medical supplies to those areas where there is a need. "We should not go in and try to stop a civil war," he said. "I don't like to play where I know I'm going to loose when I start the game."

The U.S. is the last of the "super powers" left in the world, Gen. DeZarn noted. "But emerging nations are getting into the market with goods and services," he said, adding that China may one day attain the super power status because of its people and resources.

Boys State, a yearly program sponsored by the Kentucky American Legion, allows high school seniors to take part in mock government sessions designed to provide practical lessons in city and state government. The delegates will develop their own two-party system, elect city and state officials, and introduce, debate and enact laws as in the Kentucky General Assembly.

Throughout the week, the program participants will be addressed by numerous political figures. They include: Bob Babbage, secretary of state, on Tuesday; Gov. Brereton Jones, on Wednesday, and Gen. Billy G. Wellman, justice secretary, on Thursday. Elected Boys State officers, including governor and lieutenant governor, will be announced on Wednesday, June 9, and on Thursday, they will travel to Frankfort to meet their real life counterparts.

A graduation awards ceremony will conclude the week's activities on Friday, June 11.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Gov. Brereton Jones received a hearty welcome when he addressed the 1993 session of Kentucky Boys State today on the Morehead State University campus.

Jokingly, he said he wished he could get the same support from the legislature.

The governor, when he spoke to the group last year, told them he would return each year for as long as he continued to receive an invitation. He issued that promise again, calling the education of today's youth a top priority and declaring he would do everything in his power to make the state a better place to live.

Gov. Jones encouraged the Boys State delegates to set goals and look for ways to attain them. "There is no limit to what anyone can accomplish; you can be anything you want to be, do anything you want to do" he told the more than 250 high school seniors. "It's easy to come up with excuses for reasons why you can't accomplish anything," he added. He recalled the advice handed down from his father, "Believe you can and you can."

Stating that there needed to be more good, honest people in politics to make a better life for everyone, Gov. Jones encouraged the young men to consider a life of public service. "You'll be criticized, and at times you will question why you went into the field," he said, "But, its better to try and fail than to be one of those cold and timid souls who knows neither victory nor defeat."

Fielding a variety of questions from the audience, Gov. Jones voiced his opinion on capital punishment, reasons why 16-year-olds should not be allowed to vote, racism and ethics, along with Kentucky's Education Reform Act and health care.

"Health care should be accessible to everyone," the governor said, announcing that when the 450,000 people who don't have insurance get sick, the cost of their medical expenses is passed on to those individuals who have coverage. "Some say we can't afford to make this change; I say we can't afford not to."

Kentucky Boys State, sponsored by the American Legion, is a week long program that provides a practical learning experience in state and local government. The session will conclude with graduation ceremonies on Friday, June 11.

MOREHEAD, Ky.—Morehead State University President Ronald G. Eaglin today announced the appointment of a veteran MSU educator and administrator to the post of executive vice president for academic affairs and dean of faculty.

Dr. John C. Philley, who has served as the institution's chief academic officer on an interim basis since 1990, assumes the role on a permanent basis effective immediately, according to Dr. Eaglin.

The addition of executive to the academic vice president's title was added by Dr. Eaglin last August. At the same time the president designated the executive vice president as the University's second-in-command.

"If MSU is to meet its potential at a time when higher education is funded at its lowest levels since 1988, then it is imperative that I have the assistance of a leader with the qualities possessed by John Philley," the president said.

"I feel privileged to have worked with him this past year and am delighted that he has accepted this appointment," Dr. Eaglin said.

"Dr. Philley's experience at all levels of academe, his historical sense of this institution, his integrity and his knowledge of our region led me to select him for this post," Dr. Eaglin added. "He was my top choice from the pool of six finalists identified by the search committee.

"At this time, I also want to express my appreciation to this committee and its chair Helen Northcutt for their hard work," Dr. Eaglin said.

Dr. Philley, who came to MSU in 1960, also holds faculty rank as professor of geoscience and is a certified professional geologist. A former chair of the Department of Physical Sciences, he served as dean of MSU's College of Arts and Sciences from 1986 until he was named interim vice president.

MOREHEAD, Ky—Budget constraints have forced Morehead State University's Office of Physical Plant to release approximately 75 temporary summer employees for the remainder of the current fiscal year, which ends June 30.

"We have used up all of the funds in our temporary salary account and have no funds to continue their employment at this time," said Joe Planck, MSU Physical Plant director.

"More than likely these people will be returning to work again on a temporary basis after the start of the new fiscal year which begins July 1," he added.

Included in the release, according to Planck, are about 35 part-time employees who work only 100 hours per month year round.

"Traditionally, MSU hires a number of temporary summer workers to assist in our spring cleanup and in preparing the residence halls for summer camps/conferences and for the fall, and under normal circumstances there would not be a break in their part-time employment," Planck said.

"We've been hit hard by budget cuts last year as well as this year and we just ran out of funds for this fiscal year," Planck added.

A native of Indianola, Miss., he earned the Ph.D. degree from the University of Tennessee.







Kimberly Simpson of Louisville, a participant in MSU's Minority Teacher Education Program (MTEP) has been awarded a \$3,000 scholarship for the 1993-94 school year.

A graduate of Doss High School, Simpson is a May 1994 degree candidate at MSU. She is pursuing certification in elementary education for middle school (5-8), with emphasis in science and social studies.

The middle school-aged youth appealed most to her, she said. "I am more comfortable working with children at this level," said Simpson, who is the daughter of Clifton Codey of Louisville and the late Zella C. Simpson. With so much going on in their lives at this age, they really need extra attention," she added.

In high school, Simpson became involved with a minority teacher recruitment program through the University of Louisville and in her junior year, she took part in MSU's Summer MTEP session where she heard numerous speakers discuss the importance of education and the critical needs for minority teachers. It was then that she began seriously considering a career in teaching.

After graduating from high school, she entered MSU under the MTEP project, which offers minority students interested in teaching both financial and counseling/tutoring support.

Workshops emphasizing the shortage of minority educators to serve as role models for youth continued and first-hand opportunities to work with young people in the low income areas of her community reinforced Simpson's vocation choice.

Simpson, who has two younger sisters, will be the first in her family to graduate from college.

"MTEP has been a great help to me," she said. "It is more than financial support, it offers a network of support services to help all of us in the program succeed," she added. "A lot of credit should go to Ernestine Winfield for her efforts to coordinate MTEP," Simpson added.

A dean's list student, Simpson is active in Alpha Kappa Alpha sorority, MSU's Little Brother-Little Sister Program, Kappa Delta Pi education honorary and the Black Gospel Ensemble.

In addition to the K-STEM award, Simpson also received a scholarship for the summer through funding awarded MSU by the Kentucky Department of Education. MSU received a grant of \$23,000 of which \$11,000 has been earmarked for scholarships for currently enrolled minority students. Six students were awarded summer term scholarship of \$943 each and another six received \$500 each.

Funded through the Kentucky Council of Higher Education, MTEP was launched on MSU's campus in 1988. In addition to providing support services to students in the college component, MTEP brings minority high school students to the campus throughout the year to hear about the teaching profession from minority educators/administrator and also brings them to the campus for a week.
