SUBJECT: "The Place of Religion in a Nation's Life. Ex. 26:1-9, 29-40; 40:34-38. GOLDEN TEXT: "Blessed is the Nation whose God is the Lord." Psalm 33:12.

HEALTH CHART

A new and interesting kind of health chart or clean up chart is being used at the Razon school. It is a large chart on which all the names of the pupils are written. Each morning before any work is done the children are inspected as to the cleanliness of hands, nails, ears, etc., and if they pass inspection they stand at the chart ready to give those who pass the inspection a blue check mark. Those who do not pass a brown mark at the end of the year, those who have blue checks receive the chart receive a blue ribbon. Most of the squares are now blue. Mrs. Carolyn Crosthwaite says this is a fine way to make the children remember and that Dr. Evans approves of it wholeheartedly.

Two things are significant in this: God knew that it would be good for the people to gather together in a special meeting to concentrate their worship upon him. Then he knew also that the best expression of worship was through sacrifice.


