MOREHEAD, Ky.---Dr. J. Dudley Herron, a former professor of science education and administrator at Purdue University, has assumed the post of chair of the Department of Physical Sciences at Morehead State University.

Appointment of the Webster County native was announced by Dr. Gerald DeMoss, interim dean of MSU's College of Science and Technology.

"An innovative science educator and administrator, Dr. Herron has been recognized numerous times by his peers during a tenure of more than three decades at Purdue," Dr. DeMoss said. "We are pleased to gain his expertise here at MSU."

Dr. Herron earned his doctorate from Florida State University, the master's degree from the University of North Carolina and his bachelor's degree from the University of Kentucky.

While at Purdue, Dr. Herron served as director for several summer science institutes, including a number of National Science Foundation (NSF) ones, and was a program coordinator for an elementary teacher education project sponsored by American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS). He also held a variety of administrative posts including director of the University's School Mathematics and Science Center and head of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction.

Dr. Herron also spent a year as training adviser for the Regional Education Center for Science and Mathematics in Penang, Malaysia.

He has received numerous awards and honors for teaching and scientific endeavors, including the Outstanding Science Educator Award in 1985 from the Association for the Education of Teachers of Science and Catalyst of the Year Award in 1982 from the Chemical Manufacturers Association.

Active in various scientific and scholarly organizations, he has held offices and/or committee chairs in the AAAS, the American Chemical Society, the National Association for Research in Science Teaching and the National Science Teachers Association. An AAAS Fellow, he is a member of Phi Beta Kappa and Phi Delta Kappa.

He has written or co-authored more than 40 papers for scientific journals, seven textbooks, and been a reviewer/analyst for several research publications. Dr. Herron also is frequently invited to speak at international, national and state meetings of scientific and education associations.

He is married to the former Joyce Kincer of Whitesburg.

"Meet Morehead State Nights," held at various locations throughout MSU's service region, are designed to provide information about academic offerings, student services, and campus life in an informal atmosphere.

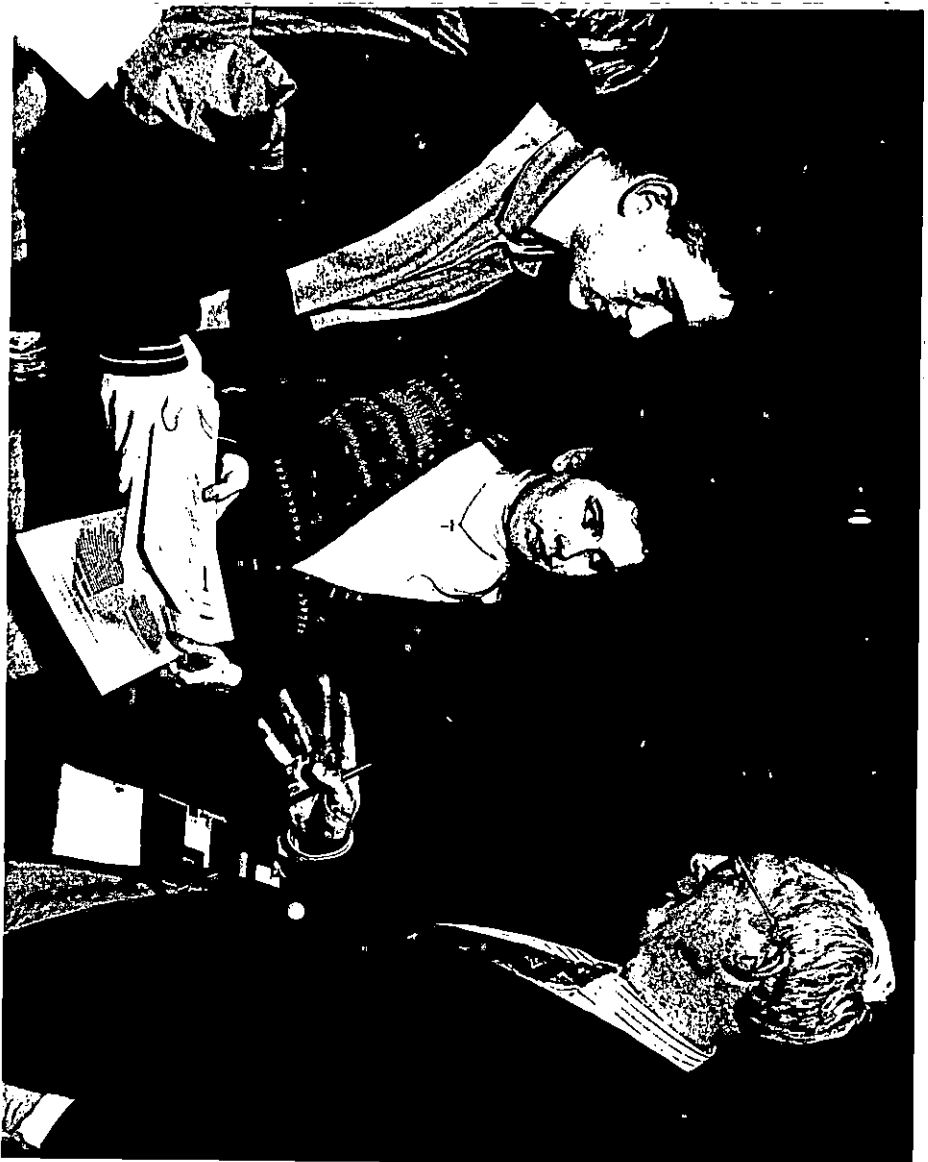
Among the topics on the evening's agenda was a discussion of ways to pay for college.

The "FreshStart" program offers techniques for losing the habit, chemical addiction and psychological dependency that comes with smoking, Krug noted.

The four-week plan includes a "FreshStart" kit to review the material covered as well as suggestions for dealing with the stress management and weight control that most smokers associate with giving up the habit.

Sponsored by MSU's Wellness Committee, Student Wellness Office and the American Cancer Society, the program will be offered at different times to accommodate the various schedules of the participants.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University has been selected by the Association of American Colleges to be part of its new curriculum planning initiative, "American Commitments."

While selection includes a \$2,000 grant, Dr. Judy Rogers, MSU's associate vice president for academic affairs, believes that the national recognition and the networking with other institutions will be worth much more.

Morehead State is one of 40 institutions chosen from among 146 applicants to participate in the program to assist schools in emphasizing diversity, democracy and liberal learning in their curriculum.

"At MSU, we are extremely concerned about providing our students with coursework that reflects diversity," Dr. Rogers said. "For us diversity not only means racial/cultural diversity but gender diversity as well," added the associate vice president who will head MSU's planning team.

The team members are Dr. Fran Helphinstine, professor of English; Dr. Russell Brengelman, professor of physics and Dr. Wendell O'Brien, assistant professor of philosophy.

Later this month, the team will attend an AAC national conference in New Orleans designed to launch the American Commitments' network.

"Collaboration in this project pairs MSU with two other institutions who are uniquely different from us: Memphis State University and Marymount College," Dr. Rogers said.

"A larger urban school, Memphis State has experience with curriculum change to incorporate gender diversity and racial/cultural diversity," she said. "Marymount is a nationally recognized women's college. They offer us the expertise in the areas we are seeking."

Shortly after the conference, the planning team along with an undergraduate student will visit the Memphis State campus. The team members also will organize workshops for other faculty members to assist their colleagues with additional curricula changes.

"The timing of this grant and our selection for the project could not have been better," Dr. Rogers said. "We have just begun circulating a new general education curriculum for the faculty which includes a framework for diversity courses."

The University is proposing to link courses such as a junior level philosophy course on social ethics with one in sociology on American Minority Relations. Also to be explored is the integration of a introductory women's studies course with courses in English, sociology and/or government.

The goal is to develop 12 hours for the general ed curriculum in two paired interdisciplinary courses which could serve as models for others.

"There is a tremendous need for MSU to incorporate a significant number of culturally diverse courses into the curriculum," Dr. Rogers said.

"We need to prepare our traditional Eastern Kentucky students for a workplace that will bring them face-to-face with cultural diversity," she added. "Many of our students have not had the opportunity to experience cultural diversity and educating them for today's world by helping them to understand cultural/social differences is part of our responsibility."

MOREHEAD, Ky.—Morehead State University's Camden-Carroll Library must select a new automated library system and the University community will have an opportunity to make recommendations.

Three potential vendors will demonstrate their products when they visit the campus early next month. The two-hour sessions will be held in 419 Reed Hall on Wednesday, March 2; Friday, March 4, and Tuesday, March 8.

"We encourage all faculty, staff, students and other interested persons to attend all three sessions," said Larry Besant, director of libraries. "During the Online Catalog (OPAC) demonstration which is the public user interface, library users will have an opportunity to try out the system, ask questions and make recommendations on their preferences for a new system."

The Camden-Carroll Library staff were notified last year a new company had purchased the Library's current automated system, LS/2000, but would not continue its support beyond July 1995. A committee has been reviewing proposals for several months with the top three recommended vendors being invited to demonstrate their systems on campus.

Once a new system is selected, the conversion process will take 12-18 months, Besant noted. "It is our goal to have the new system operational by January 1995," he said.

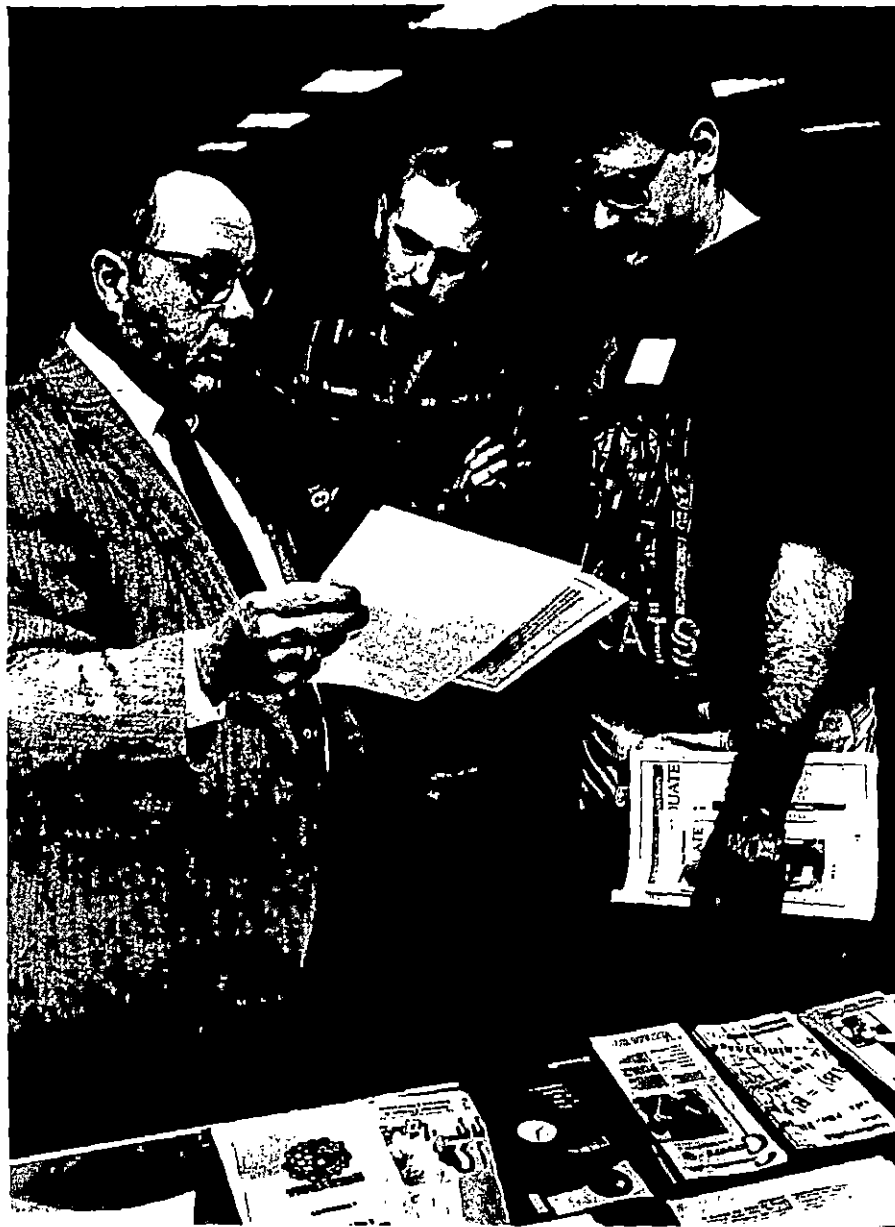

MOREHEAD, Ky.—Thanks to the cooperation of several groups, Morehead State University is preserving some of the institution's historical records.

More than 16 hours of videotapes with former MSU President Adron Doran have now been converted to a 3/4-inch master. The tapes are from in-depth interviews conducted in 1975 by Dr. John Kleber, now interim dean of the College of Humanities.

The original tapes were on 2-inch videotape which was popular in the '70s but is now almost extinct, according to Clara Keyes, head of Special Collections in the Camden-Carroll Library's Archives.

"With technology advances, MSU decided to surplus all its 2-inch video equipment several years ago," Keyes said, noting that most other stations have done the same.

It was only after a careful search by John Higginbotham, MSU's coordinator of television productions, that machines were located at two stations in Lexington--WLEX-TV and WKYT-TV--that Morehead State was able to complete the reformatting.

"The 2-inch format is so obsolete that these pieces of history would have been lost because we do not have the equipment to use them," Keyes said. "We are very appreciative of the Lexington television stations in helping us preserve these interviews and restoring them to a usable condition."

Also in the process of being preserved are copies of the Trail Blazer, MSU's student newspaper, which dates to the 1930s. "The acidic nature of the newsprint had caused the publications to become brittle," Keyes said. "With class assignments requiring the newspapers to be available for student use, it was important that the materials be preserved before further damage was done."

The newspapers have been sent to the University of Kentucky microfilm center where they will be reproduced on microfilm. "This will ensure their availability for students and researchers in years to come," Keyes said.

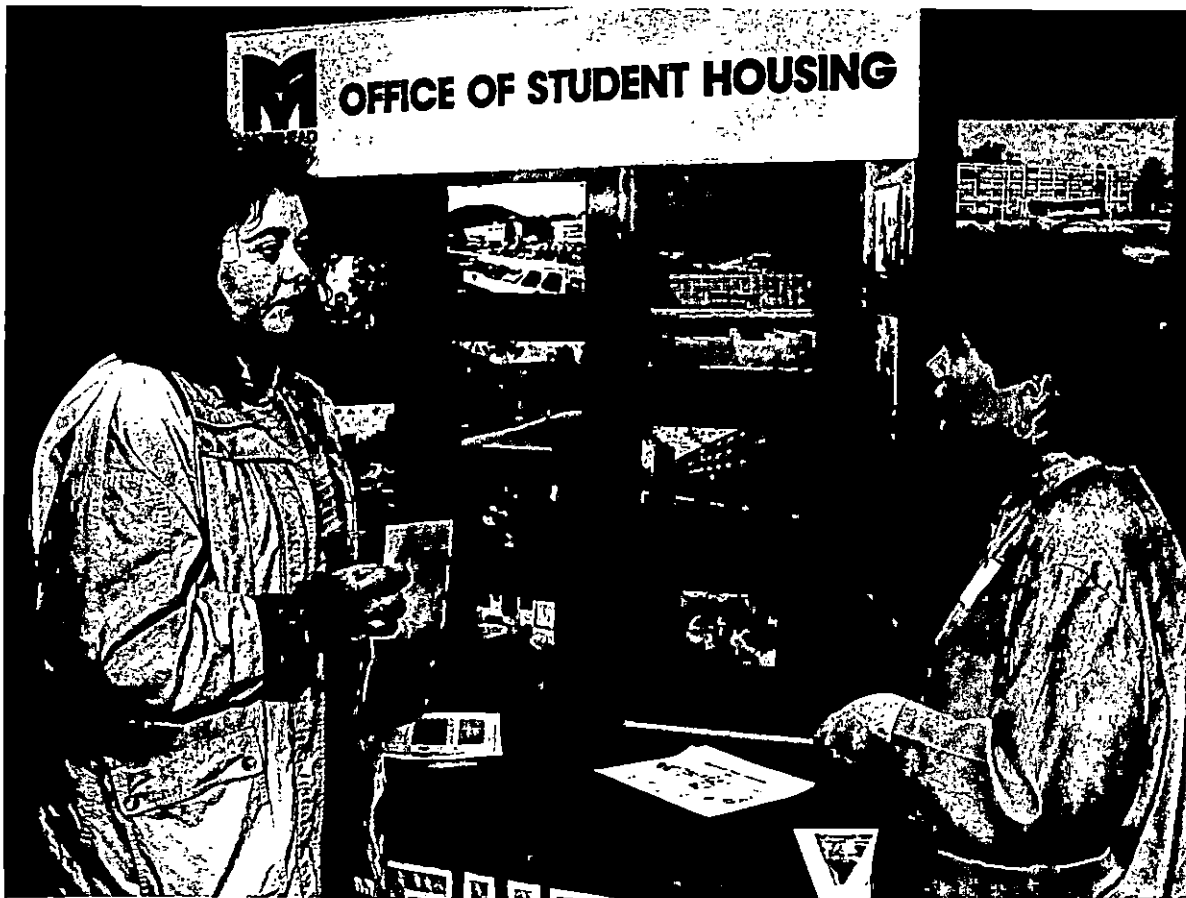

MSU, in conjunction with St. Claire Medical Center, Rowan Vocational Technical School, Morehead Clinic and several area businesses, is sponsoring the event which will be held in the Adron Doran University Center from 7:30 a.m. until 3 p.m.

Scheduled are a variety of free health screenings—diabetes, blood pressure, eye exams and height and weight. Informational booths will offer materials on numerous areas such as smoking cessation, substance abuse, nutrition, cancer and stress management.

For a small fee, one may have other tests completed. The charge for the hemocult test is \$1; cholesterol screening is \$3 or 3 cans of food (do not eat 12 hours prior to the test); body fat test is \$2 (with no food or exercise four hours prior to the test and refrain from alcohol intake for 12 hours).

Door prizes will be awarded to those attending.

SPECIAL EVENT: At noon, MSU will honor Lucille Caudill Little, Lexington philanthropist, at a Celebration of the Fine Arts. The event, to be held in Duncan Recital Hall, will include a special tribute to Mrs. Little by a surprise guest and remarks by Mrs. Little, who has given \$1 million to support MSU's fine arts programs. Later at the Board of Regents meeting, the board will introduce a resolution to designate MSU's College of Humanities as the **Caudill College of Humanities** to honor Mrs. Little and her family. Your coverage of the Celebration is encouraged.

AGENDA: In addition to the renaming of the College of Humanities, the agenda contains numerous items for discussion and/or action, including election of officers and a preliminary report on spring enrollment. The board will be asked to approve revisions or amendments to personnel policies related to promotions, tenure, faculty rights/responsibilities, affirmative action/equal employment opportunity and severe weather conditions/disaster.

Also to be approved are program deletions and tenure requests, an amendment to the Student Board of Media charter and extensions to auditing and banking contracts. Other action items include ratification of personnel items, authorization to acquire property and a lease/purchase agreement for microcomputers.

Reports are expected on the intercollegiate athletics program, the 1994-96 Executive Budget Recommendation and on major gifts since July 1. The president will update the regents on the Governor's Higher Education Review Committee, the University Ad Hoc Planning Committee and Task Force, the proposed rank confirmation and salary enhancement plan, merit pay and administrative evaluation.
