MOREHEAD, Ky.—Registration for Morehead State University's first summer term is scheduled from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Monday, June 13.

Students who did not advance register will develop class schedules in their major departments, before going to the Crager Room, Adron Doran University Center, to pay fees.

Students who have not declared a major will go to 233 Allie Young Hall to schedule classes. Undergraduate students who have not previously been admitted or who were not enrolled last spring will need to stop first at the Admissions Office, 301 Howell-McDowell. For graduate students, that stop will be 701 Ginger Hall.

Registration will be conducted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and entry time into the payment area in ADUC is based on an alphabetical system by last name. All fees should be paid at this time.

Schedule adjustments for students who pre-registered for Summer I will be processed in the student's major department during this period as well.

Also students taking classes at the extended campus centers in Prestonsburg and West Liberty or through the Appalachian Graduate Consortium at Pikeville College may register at those sites from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. the same day as main campus students.

Summer session tuition is \$70 per credit hour for undergraduates and \$103 for graduate students who are Kentucky residents. The tuition rate for out-of-state students is \$195 per undergraduate credit hour and \$287 per graduate credit hour.

Out-of-state students enrolled at off-campus sites pay in-state tuition.

MOREHEAD, Ky.—The state's highest ranking military officer will address the 54th session of Kentucky Boys State which will be held at Morehead State University Sunday through Friday, June 5-10.

Brig. Gen. Robert L. DeZarn, adjutant general of Kentucky, will be the keynote speaker at the first general session which is set for Sunday, June 5, at 7 p.m. in Fulbright Auditorium in Baird Music Hall.

Nearly 250 high school seniors from across the state will participate in the program sponsored each year by the Kentucky American Legion. During the week, the youth will take part in mock government sessions designed to provide practical lessons in city and state government.

Representatives from MSU will welcome the Boys State delegates in opening ceremonies set for Sunday at 4 p.m., also in Fulbright Auditorium.

Throughout the week, the Boys State participants will learn about the state's political system by developing their own two-party system and electing state and city officials; serving as legislators, and introducing, debating and enacting laws as in the Kentucky General Assembly.

Elected Boys State officers, including governor and lieutenant governor, will be announced on Wednesday, June 8, and on Thursday they will travel to Frankfort to meet their real life counterparts. This year's delegates will be able to glimpse the General Assembly in action as the legislature is expected to be in a special session at that time.

A graduation awards ceremony will conclude the week's activities on Friday, June 10. The noon luncheon will be held in the Crager Room, Adron Doran University Center.

**MOREHEAD, Ky.**—Morehead State University and Rowan State Vocational Technical School have formed a cooperative plan which allows vocational students to earn credit hours and on-the-job experience in heating and air conditioning by working at MSU's Office of Physical Plant.

Three Rowan State vocational students, Gregory Purvis of Mt. Sterling, Keith Williams of Ezel, and James "Darrin" Hackney of Sandy Hook are currently working with MSU maintenance and mechanical crews under the cooperative program.

Joe Planck, MSU director of Physical Plant, and J.D. Hackney, Rowan State instructor in the heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) program, worked together to create the co-op program that serves both the students and the schools.

Hackney said work experience is a requirement for graduation before the students take the Vocational Aptitude Test to be certified as Air Conditioning-Refrigeration Mechanics. Work experience begins in the second year of the two-year program for the post-secondary students.

The co-op students earn the same wages as other beginning employees while working for credit in their field of expertise, Planck said. Students can earn up to 300 hours of credit, depending on how many weeks they work.

Co-op students began working April 25 and will continue through June 30, the end of the fiscal year for both schools. Both Planck and Hackney said they hope to continue the program in the new fiscal year.

"Some of the students that have graduated from my program are working at physical plants now," Hackney said. "We're proud of that. This can be one of the most successful things we've done. My students have worked at construction companies, mechanical companies and St. Claire hospital, but two educational institutions working together to teach theory and experience is the best for everybody involved," Hackney added.

MOREHEAD, Ky.—"You must register and vote because the voice of the people in this country is the voice of freedom," said Gen. Robert L. DeZarn, adjutant general of Kentucky, when he addressed the opening session of Kentucky Boys State.

"It is your right and privilege to vote; to ignore it, you give up that right," the state's highest ranking military officer said.

Boys State, sponsored by the Kentucky American Legion, is a week long program that provides practical learning experience in state and local government. It is being held this week (June 5-10) on the Morehead State University campus.

The American way of life is the way it is today because of the accomplishments of our military forces, Gen. DeZarn said. He then encouraged the young delegates to be prepared because freedom is not enjoyed by populations throughout the world. "We are facing one of the most challenging times ahead because of the world situation," he said.

Fielding questions from the audience, DeZarn said it was his belief that the U.S. would get involved militarily if North Korea invaded South Korea, the draft would not be reinstated because there were numerous Americans wanting to join the armed forces, and the current downsizing in the military was budget driven.

"Things may or may not happen," he said of the world situation. "But we must be prepared to remain viable and to do that, we need a strong military force."

Also addressing the nearly 250 high school seniors, state Sen. Walter Blevins told the Boys State delegates that the U.S. was the most powerful country, but for it to remain so would take all of our efforts. "Unless you participate in the right to vote, you are in danger of losing that right," he said. "You can make a difference. Even one small step, however small, will help. The easiest way to stand up for the flag is to vote."

Earlier in the day, Armando "Al" Alfaro of Frankfort, retired U.S. Army and World War II veteran, told the group that on this 50th anniversary of D-Day we should remember the bravery of those who landed on Omaha Beach but also the other Americans who died during the war. Alfaro related the fate of the U.S. Dorchester on Feb. 3, 1943 when the troop ship was torpedoed in the icy waters of the North Atlantic. He praised the bravery and valor of the four chaplains who attempted to calm the troops in their final hours as 672 of the 902 aboard lost their lives.

Throughout the week, the program participants will be addressed by numerous political figures. Elected Boys State officers will be announced on Wednesday, June 8, and on Thursday, they will travel to Frankfort to meet their real life counterparts.

The Boys State program will conclude with a graduation ceremony on Friday, June 10.

Her work is featured in major folk art collections of individuals and museums across the country. She has a one-person show on exhibit in MSU's Kentucky Folk Art Center at the present time.

On tap for Monday, June 20, is the "Women of the Nineties--My How You've Grown!" luncheon and symposium, a celebration of Appalachian women. The day begins with registration at 9:30 a.m. in the Crager Room, Adron Doran University Center.

Welcoming attendees will be Mrs. Bonnie Eaglin, wife of MSU's president. Keynote speaker for the noon luncheon, which will be held in the Commonwealth Room, ADUC, will be Janet L. Stumbo, Kentucky Supreme Court Justice.

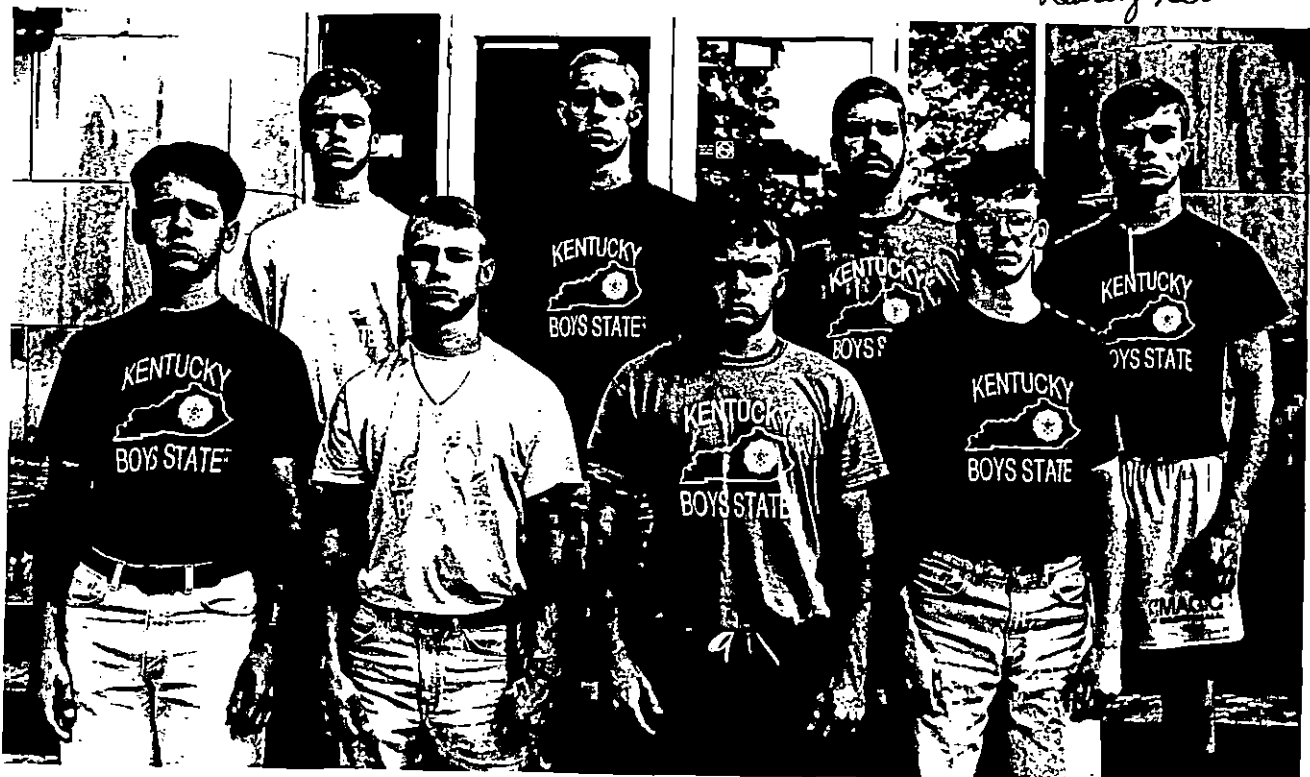

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University's Board of Regents approved a \$64.3 million operating budget for fiscal 1994-95 and approved locking-in housing rates for students who maintain continuous occupancy in University housing, effective this fall. This makes MSU the first state-supported institution with a fixed housing rate plan.

Any future housing rate increases will apply to first time MSU students and returning students who were not previously living in University housing.

The budget includes a 5 percent salary increase pool with 2 percent across the board, 2 percent in merit and 1 percent for promotions and other enhancements. According to Ray Pinner, MSU director of budgets and management information, 95 percent of the salary increases fall in the range of 2 to 10 percent.

In their meeting Friday (June 22), the regents extended MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin's contract through June 30, 1998, and increased his salary by 6 percent to \$125,557.

At the outset of the meeting, Board Chair William R. Seaton presented Dr. Eaglin with the presidential medallion symbolic of the office. Traditionally, each president's medallion has been unique. Designed by Dr. Roger Jones, professor of art, Dr. Eaglin's medallion incorporates Rowan County hardwood and has this inscription on the back:

"May your leadership be as inspiring and as durable as this black walnut from the hills of Rowan County, Kentucky."

In acting on the operating budget, the board approved the 1994-95 fee schedule which includes a \$40 per semester tuition increase set by the Council on Higher Education, a \$10 increase in the services portion of the student activity and services fee and increased student housing rates by approximately 3.7 percent.

Additionally, the regents approved consolidating the computer and student health fee with tuition and mandatory fees. For fall 1994, tuition and mandatory fees for an undergraduate in-state student will be \$950. Also approved was the 1994-95 personnel roster.

The board approved revisions and amendments to a number of personnel policies ranging from teaching workload responsibilities and overload for faculty to probationary periods for classified staff; promoted 13 faculty members; awarded emeritus status to eight retired faculty and granted tenure as an associate professor of radio/television to the new chair of the Department of Communications.

The regents gave the go-ahead for MSU to enter into an agreement with the FIVCO Area Development District for the renovation and occupancy of the G.B. Johnson Economic Development Center in Ashland for expansion of the MSU-Ashland Area Extended Campus Center. The University already occupies the second floor.

In a similar move, the board authorized MSU to enter into a lease/purchase agreement with the Prestonsburg/Floyd County Public Properties Corporation for the construction of an approximately 30,000 square foot classroom and student services building for the Big Sandy Extended Campus Center. The site would be near the intersection of U.S. 23 and KY 114 adjacent to the soon-to-be developed Mountain Arts Center.

Currently the Big Sandy Extended Campus Center is located in the Highland Shopping Plaza. The new building would double the center's space.

Other board actions included adopting a resolution commending outgoing student regent Bryan Carlier for his services; approved amendments to the Student Government Association Constitution; accepted the third quarter financial report; and ratified a series of personnel actions, personal service contracts and external agreements.

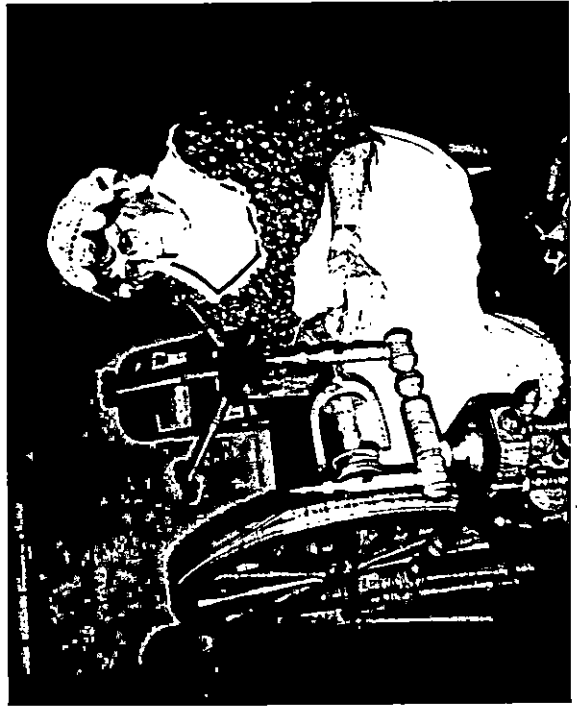

In a release following the June 22 meeting of Morehead State University's Board of Regents, it was incorrectly stated that the University's new policy locking-in housing rates for students applied to first time MSU students or returning students who were not previously living in University housing.

The fixed rate, which takes effect this fall, locks-in housing rates for any student who maintains continuous occupancy in University housing.

Any future housing rate increases will apply to first time MSU students or those returning students who were not previously living in campus housing.

With this new policy, officials believe that MSU may be the only state-supported institution in Kentucky with a fixed rate housing plan.

MOREHEAD, Ky.—Registration for Morehead State University's second summer term is scheduled from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Monday, July 11.

Also students taking classes at the extended campus centers in Ashland, Prestonsburg and West Liberty may register at those sites from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. the same day as main campus students.

Main campus students who did not advance register will develop class schedules in their major departments, before going to Button Drill Room to pay fees.

Students registering on the main campus who have not declared a major will go to 233 Allie Young Hall to schedule classes. Undergraduate students who have not previously been admitted or who were not enrolled Summer I will need to stop first at the Admissions Office, 301 Howell-McDowell. For graduate students, that stop will be 701 Ginger Hall.

Entry into the payment area in Button is based on an alphabetical system by last name. All fees should be paid at this time.

Schedule adjustments for students who pre-registered for Summer II will be processed in the student's major department during this period as well.

Summer session tuition is \$70 per credit hour for undergraduates and \$103 for graduate students who are Kentucky residents. The tuition rate for out-of-state students is \$195 per undergraduate credit hour and \$287 per graduate credit hour.

Out-of-state students enrolled at off-campus sites pay in-state tuition.
