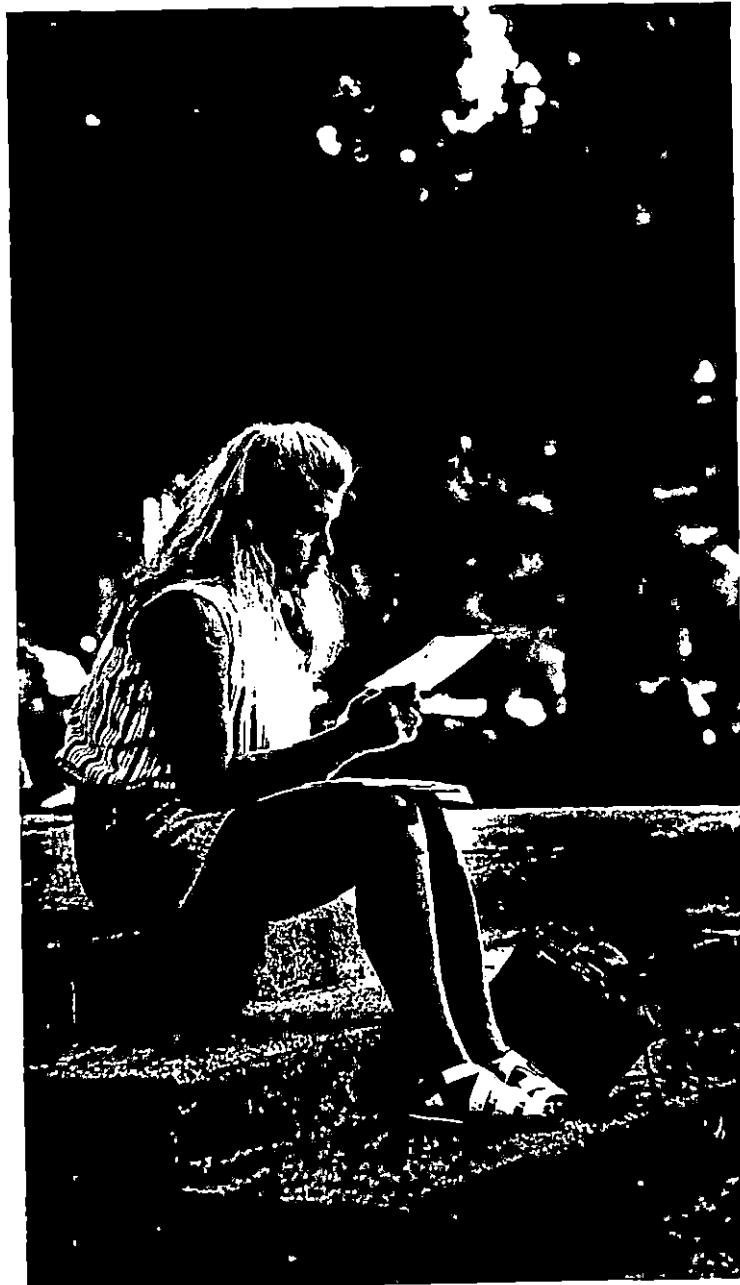

MOREHEAD, Ky.---For Morehead State University's Department of Communications, a state-mandated effort to eliminate academic program duplication systemwide, has served to strengthen the department's offerings.

"For MSU, it was the opportunity to provide our communications students with a broader, more diversified focus," said Dr. Judy Rogers, associate vice president for academic affairs and dean of undergraduate programs.

Four specific degrees in mass media-related programs as well as the non-teaching B.A. in speech/theatre were among those deleted by the Board of Regents at its June meeting.

"There has been some concern that we aren't offering media-related programs any longer, but that's just not the case," Dr. Rogers said. "We now will offer a Bachelor of Arts degree in communication with areas of emphasis in journalism, electronic media arts, advertising/public relations and communication. The electronic media arts has two options: production/management and news.

"The new degree was carefully developed by the faculty. It includes a core of required communication courses and related courses, plus those courses required for the student's area of emphasis," Dr. Rogers said.

"For example, among the courses required in the core is one dealing with the fundamentals of geography," she added. Others are basic courses in such areas as history and government.

"The restructuring of this degree program really translates into a stronger liberal arts background which is complemented by specific knowledge in the student's career field," Dr. Rogers said.

Whether the prime focus of a student's education should be in mass media courses or in a related field such as government or economics has long been debated, according to Dr. Janet Kenney, chair of MSU's Department of Communications.

"What the faculty has done is to create a program that offers answers to both arguments," Dr. Kenney said. "Students who choose one of the options under the B.A. degree in communication will be well-prepared for careers in today's world."

Students enrolling this fall will enter the new degree program while students already in the programs affected will have sufficient time to complete those programs.

In response to the Governor's Higher Education Review Commission, MSU is taking action on 35 degree programs which will result in elimination of 10 while the rest will be consolidated or merged into other programs.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Gene Caudill, a Morehead State University employee since 1970, has been elected as the staff representative to the MSU Board of Regents.

The first MSU staff member to hold this distinction, Caudill, administrative superintendent in the Office of Physical Plant, will assume his three-year term on July 15 and will be officially sworn in later this summer.

The Kentucky General Assembly enacted legislation earlier this year providing for a staff representative to each of the eight regional universities in the state system.

Sixty percent of the 599 eligible voters participated in the June 1 run-off election between Caudill and Alan Baldwin, provisional studies coordinator in Academic Support Services. Caudill won with 195 votes to Baldwin's 166.

A two-time graduate of MSU, Caudill began his career at MSU in the business office and later transferred to physical plant.

"All of us regional university employees should really appreciate the efforts of those legislators who supported this legislation and have given us a voice on our boards," he said.

"My primary goal is to see that the staff's views are well represented at board meetings," Caudill said. "I appreciate the staff giving me this opportunity and I will represent them to the best of my ability," he added.

Caudill said that he believed articulating the staff's concerns to the governing board was critical to the University's overall well-being. "I plan to work with the regents for the betterment of the University community," he said.

One continuing issue, according to the Rowan County native, will be the budget and the struggle by higher education and the state government for adequate funding of education.

Noting that he didn't believe one part of campus should suffer more than another, Caudill said he would voice his constituents' concerns regarding the impact additional cuts might have on the University's staff.

Active in the Association of Physical Plant Administrators, Professional Grounds Management and the Kentucky Turfgrass Council, Caudill also serves on the board of the Morehead State Federal Credit Union. He was a member of the steering group which organized MSU's Staff Congress and served four years as a representative.

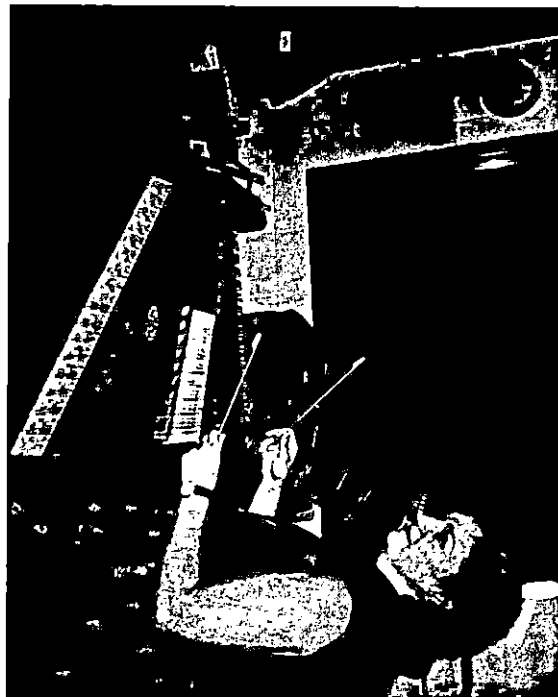

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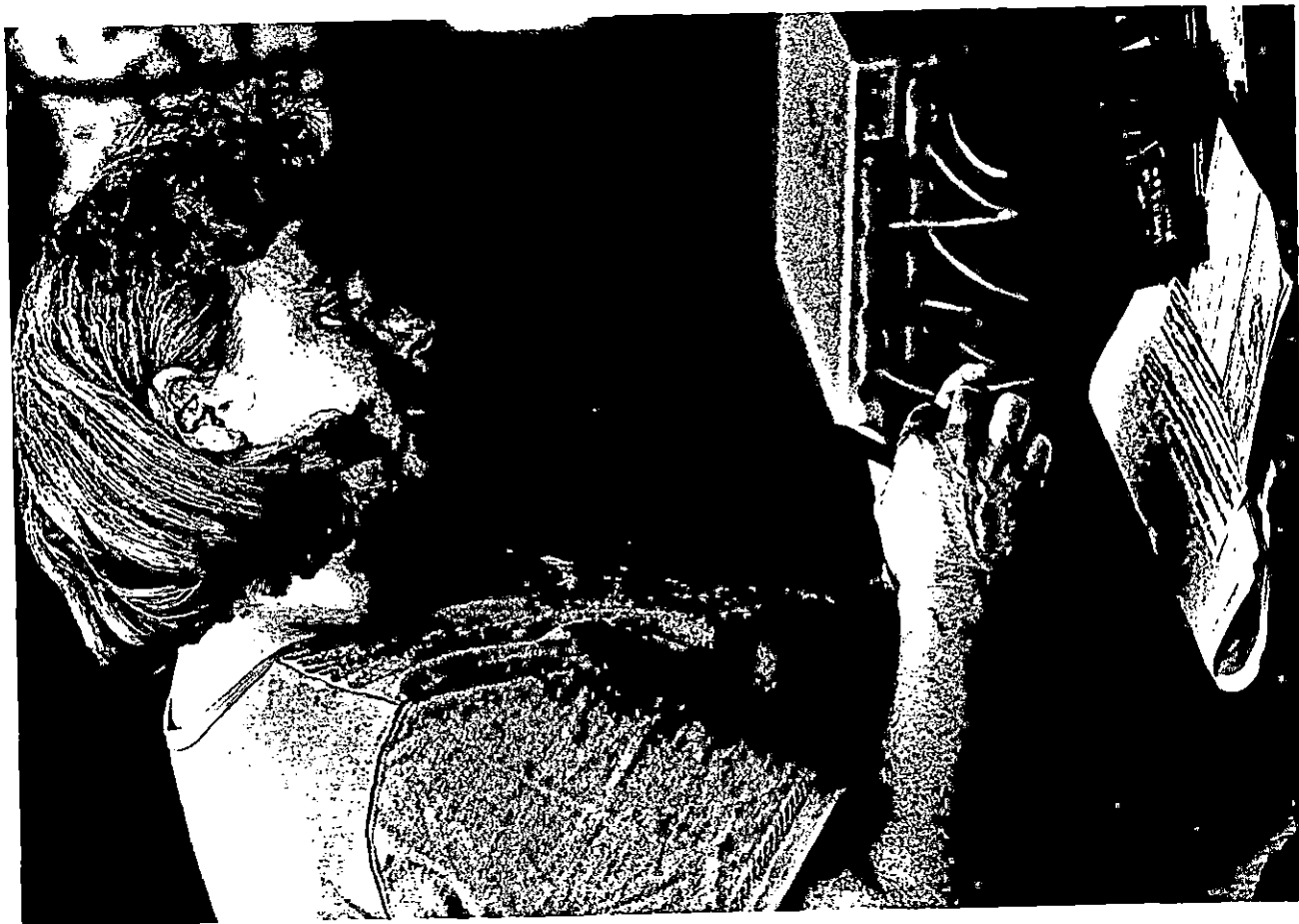

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Steve Tirone, Morehead State University associate professor of art, has been commissioned by the Carter County Board of Education to create a sculpture of the world for the new Carter County Elementary School at Olive Hill.

The globe will be installed in the Learning Courtyard of the new school in early August.

The sculpture work has been a priority since mid-May for Tirone and his student assistant, Tim Harmon of Flemingsburg. Harmon is a graduate student working on a master's degree in sculpture.

The globe is constructed of one-half inch solid bronze rods and the continents are cast one-eighth inch thick from silicon bronze and attached to the globe. The work has been modeled to scale in both longitude and latitude.

After the globe is installed, the teacher will be able to rotate it, thereby enhancing the students' educational experience.

Cutlines:

- 1---Assisted by Harmon, left, Tirone checks the exact location where the land mass of Africa should be located.
- 2---Tirone applies the splash coat made of plaster of Paris to capture all the detail in the wax prior to investing. In the next step, the wax with the splash coat will be completely entombed in a mixture of plaster, sand and vermiculite, making it ready for the bronze cast.

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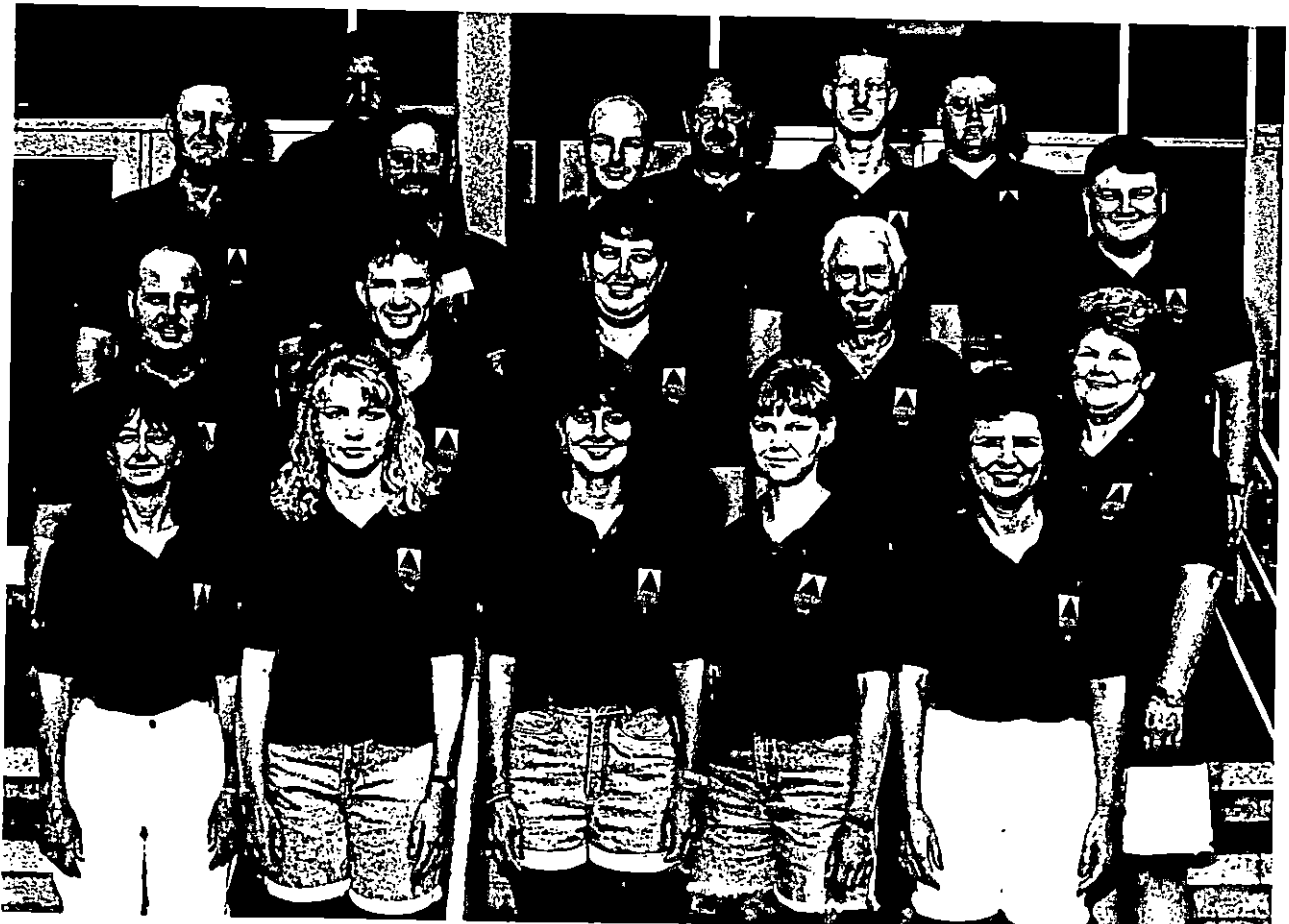

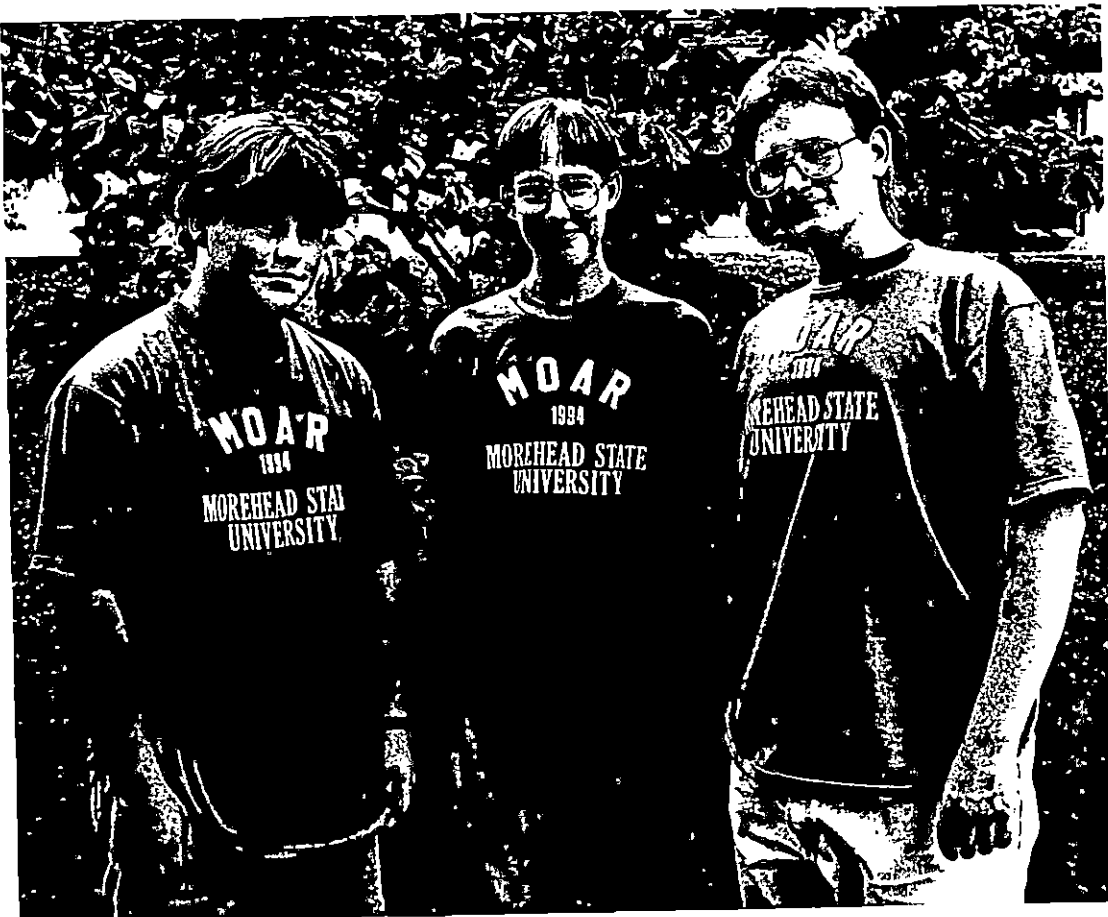

MOREHEAD, Ky.—Former Carter County resident Gary Riley was honored recently at Morehead State University as the Outstanding Alumnus in the College of Business.

Riley, who is president of Zollner Company Limited Partnership in Fort Wayne, Ind., also was the guest speaker for the college's Academic Awards banquet.

A graduate of East Carter High School, Riley earned his undergraduate degree cum laude from Morehead State University in 1978 and his master's degree in accounting from the University of Kentucky the following year.

He began his professional career in 1980 at Price Waterhouse and two years later was promoted to senior accountant, then to manager in 1984 and again in 1986 to senior manager. In 1989, he was admitted to partnership with the firm.

In March 1990, Riley left Price Waterhouse to become president of Zollner Pistons, a piston manufacturing plant which was facing bankruptcy.

During his tenure at Zollner, he has implemented a down-sizing from 1,300 to 800 employees, a move which reduced costs, improved efficiency and customer service. He implemented a budget and cost system, production scheduling system and a shop floor control system.

Riley's strategies have reduced the cost of quality from 20 percent to 13 percent of sales and improved operating income from a \$7.3 million loss in 1989 to and \$8.4 million income by 1993 with no substantial change in sales.

Riley improved Zollner's customer service by establishing multi-departmental production teams which allow the whole organization to respond to concerns of customers.

He has created what is recognized in industry as a "casual management style" at Zollner which appeals to customers and vendors. This casual style has inspired his staff and management to push away from their desks and spend time in the production areas.

Riley implemented a rotation program for the staff that scheduled off-shift visits to production areas. The program has improved communication, morale and customer service.

As part of Zollner's turnaround, Riley also has been instrumental in rebuilding the company's involvement in the community. Zollner is active with Junior Achievement, the American Red Cross, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Saint Mary's Soup Kitchen, Special Olympics, Washington House Rehabilitation Center and the Chamber of Commerce.

Riley is the son of Boyd Riley of Ashland, formerly of Grayson. His brother, Randy Riley, and sister, Teresa Riley, both reside in Grayson.

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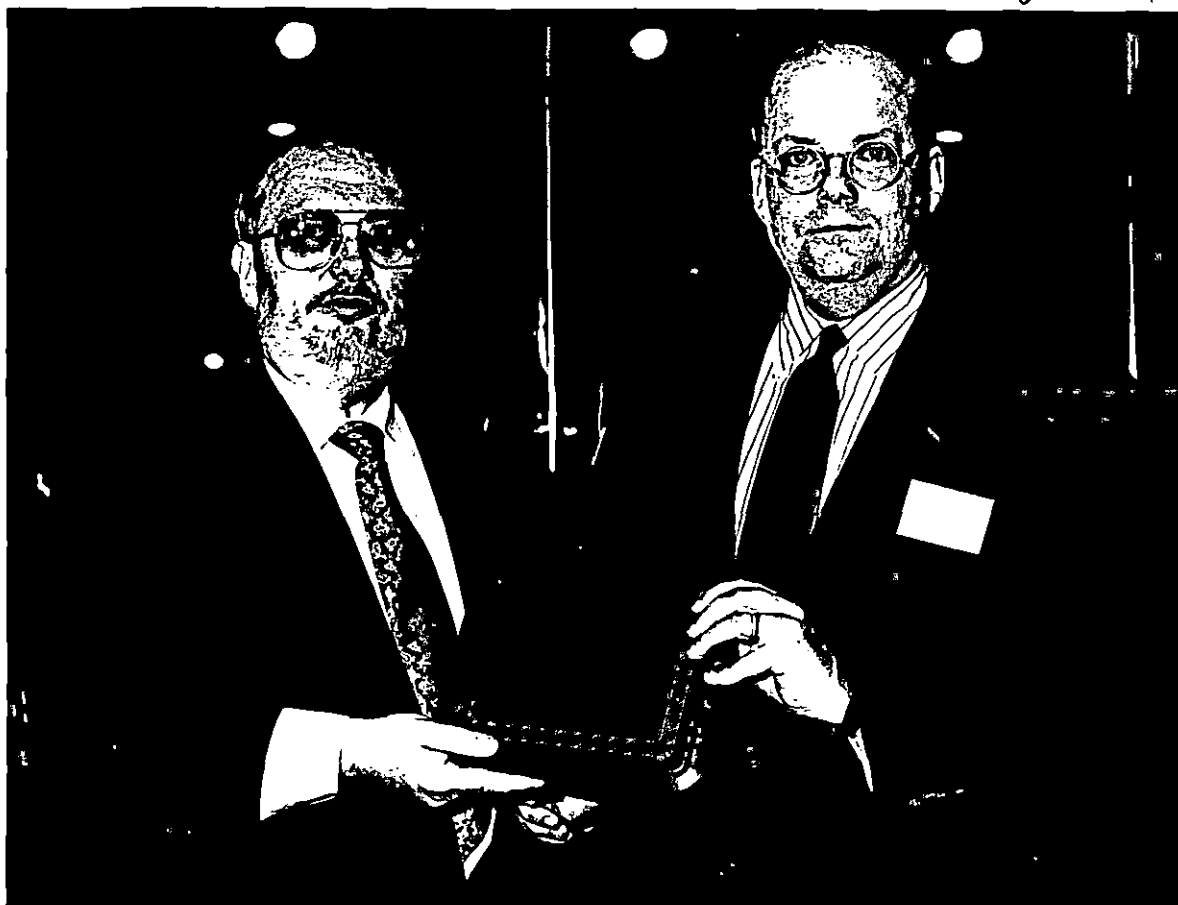

ELDERHOSTELS LEARN TO WEAVE HICKORY BARK: A Picture Story

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Nearly 40 people from all across the nation were part of an Elderhostel program at Morehead State University last week (July 19-22) that combined working with hickory bark to making bottoms for stools and other woodcrafts with the sounds of Appalachian music.

Rodi and George Jackson, program coordinators, entertained participants with music and stories of the Appalachian heritage of Eastern Kentucky, playing on a variety of traditional instruments the old gospel tunes and mountain music that have been handed down over many generations.

Immersed in the music, heritage and special flavor of the Appalachian culture, participants spent their mornings listing to music, learning about the history of those who came to Eastern Kentucky from Ireland and the British Isles.

Afternoons were spent working at the First Christian Church of Morehead making wooden stools and learning how to weave hickory bark for stool bottoms.

They took time out to travel in the area to learn more about the area's culture and were entertained again in the evenings with the sounds of Appalachian music.

Norman Caldwell of Frenchburg, a craftsperson and musician, brought in logs to show how the hickory bark is removed for weaving. He also taught his students how to weave the bark in what he called a "herringbone pattern" that is decorative and strong.

The hickory bark he collects from the woods has the quality of leather and when it has sufficient sap in it, it also has the right consistency to make it flexible.

Caldwell also freezes quantities of the bark in bundles to keep it in good shape for weaving. The bark also can be sprayed with water or soaked or even boiled to bring back the needed consistency for weaving.

The best time to get the bark, according to Caldwell, is when the sap is in the hickory tree. Strips about one inch wide are cut off a log in long lengths and the inner layer is saved for use later. 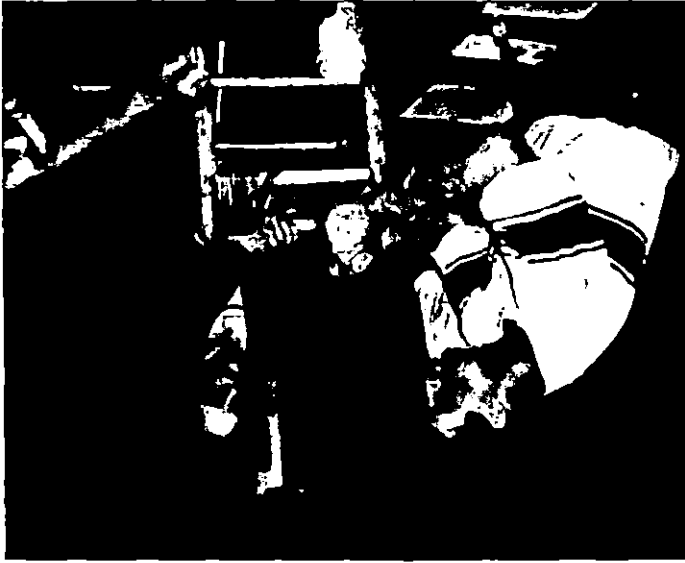

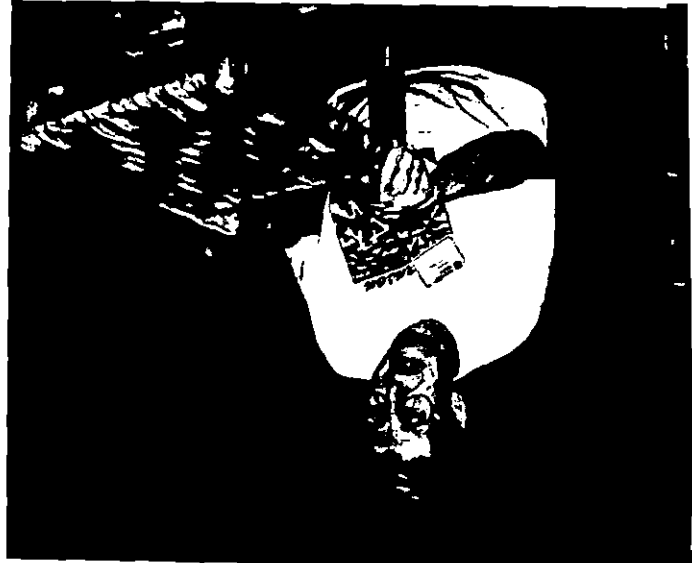

MOREHEAD, Ky.—Morehead State University's Department of Music has been notified that another of its programs has received final approval from the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM).

MSU's jazz studies area of specialization under the Bachelor of Music degree is now fully approved, according to Dr. Christopher Gallaher, department chair.

Four years ago, the department received accreditation for its graduate and undergraduate music programs from NASM through the year 2000. "At that time, the jazz studies specialization was recognized, but full approval of that one area was delayed until a sufficient number of students had graduated from it," said Dr. Gallaher.

"This now means that the full gamut of our department's degree offerings are unconditionally accredited by the NASM. "It's basically the seal of 'good housekeeping' from our peers," the department chair added.

Headquartered in Reston, Va., NASM is composed of more than 550 schools in the United States and Canada.

At the undergraduate level, the department offers the Bachelor of Music Education degree for teachers; a Bachelor of Arts degree with a music major within a liberal arts curriculum; a Bachelor of Music degree with specializations in performance, theory/composition and jazz studies.

At the graduate level, master's degrees are offered in both music education and performance.

Currently MSU's Department of Music has approximately 140 undergraduate majors and a full-time faculty of 24.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University has taken a step to help families hold down escalating college costs by freezing housing rates for students who stay in campus residence halls throughout their college careers.

Effective this fall, students will know that their housing costs will remain the same as long as they maintain continuous occupancy.

Any future housing rate increases will apply to first time students or returning students who were not previously living in University housing.

"This action should take a bite out of the ever-rising costs of higher education and also should make residence hall living more attractive to students, especially those on tight budgets," said Mike Mincey, MSU vice president for student life.

"We are the only state-supported institution in Kentucky with such a plan, although this strategy has been used by private institutions nationwide for a number of years," Mincey added.

Students moving to another residence hall will pay the rate for the new hall which was in effect when they qualified for the locked-in rate and that, depending on their hall choice, could increase or decrease their housing costs, according to the vice president.

The rate freeze policy applies only to traditional residence halls and not to family housing. Residence hall rates at MSU this fall will range from a low of \$655 to a high of \$775 with the average being between \$690 and \$710.

Also going into effect this fall at MSU is another housing policy which the Board of Regents approved last year. It requires students with fewer than 60 hours to reside in University housing and participate in a minimum dining club program. "We've provided for a number of exceptions to this requirement," Mincey said.

Exempted are students 21 years old or older, single parents, married students, students with documented medical reasons and veterans.

"Based on nationwide studies, it appears that students who live in residence halls do better and graduate sooner than those living off campus," Mincey said. "On-campus living also encourages students to be more involved in campus activities."
