# OHIO LOWEST IN 20 YEARS

## INDIAN ROCK CAN AGAIN BE SEEN

The stage of water in the Ohio river is now lower than it has

been for several years. This morning it registered 3 feet and falling. Mr. Potter of the local wharf boat keeps a record of the river here and he is authority for the above statement.

Up at Wheeling the stage registered but 10 inches and falling and at Steubenville -- inches and falling.

Capt. Poage, the Ashland wharfmaster, is a very careful observer of the river and he states that the Ohio is now lower than it has been since October, 1888--almost twenty years ago. Indian Rock is again visible on the Kentucky side.
