TAXES MOTORISTS PAY

One seventh of all taxes collected in the United States are paid by

One seventh of all taxes collected in the United States are paid by motorists. That includes Pederal, state and municipal taxes. One dollar out of every seven that is collected for the expenses of running the government comes out of car-owneys' pockets. That is the report of the Automobile manufacturers' Association. Included in this toil on transportation are state registration fees, state and Federal gasoline taxes, Federal manufacturers' excise taxes, personal property taxes by etites, counties and states, and bridge and tunnel toil. The total runs to 1500 million dollars a year.

Those are all taxes on motor vehicle owners, and do not include income and property taxes on factories, repair shobs and companies operating busses, trucks, and taxiciabs.

The three most productive source of tax revenue, the Northwest-ord Mutual Life reports are first, general property taxes, second, Federal and state income taxes and, third, he taxes on automobile owners, which run to an average of more than 548, ayear on every car in use If all other businesses were taxed at the same rate that automobile service stations pay, the tax income from retail business alone would be more than 12 billion dollars a year, or more than the total tax re-emures now collected from every source, the American Petroleum Institute reports.

It would seem that motorists ought to get perfect highways, per-ectly lighted and perfectly policed, for the money they pay in taxes.
