MOREHEAD, Ky.—A critically acclaimed poet/author, professional writer and drama troupe will be among the presenters when Morehead State University hosts its third annual Writing Conference/Workshop on Thursday and Friday, July 27-28, at the Adron Doran University Center (ADUC).

The conference, entitled "Imagination in Print: Creativity, Technology, and the Teaching of Writing," is designed to help Kentucky teachers instruct students on how to become better writers.

Developed for teachers of all grade levels, the conference will include hands-on workshops as well as a technology-based session that will demonstrate the important link between writing and technology.

Registration begins at 8 a.m. on the third floor of ADUC. Ralph Fletcher, an educational consultant and published writer, will be the keynote speaker for the 11:15 a.m. session. He will discuss his writing experiences as a senior member of the Teachers College Writing Project in New York City.

A resident of New Hampshire, Fletcher earned an M.F.A. degree in writing from Columbia University. He is the author of two collections of poetry, "The Magic Nest" and "Water Plant" and has been published widely in "Cosmopolitan," "The Wall Street Journal" and "People".

Performing during the afternoon will be "Poetry Alive," a drama troupe which demonstrates interactive strategies that can be used in any classroom setting. The performance, designed to bring appreciation of poetry to audiences through participation and fast paced dramatic interpretations, is appropriate for all age groups. The program begins at 3:45 p.m. in the Crager Room, ADUC.

Highlights for Saturday include a luncheon with readings by noted poet/author Jim Wayne Miller. He will discuss the difference between stories and events, poetry and verse, and the connections between reading, writing and the region.

A faculty member at Western Kentucky University, Miller is the author of numerous essays and books of poetry, including "Copperhead Cane," "The Mountains Have Come Home," and "Brier, His Book."

A native of Western North Carolina, Miller has addressed the joys and concerns of living in Appalachia in his writings.

During the two-day program, classroom teachers will present effective strategies in workshop-style formats and allow participants to join through hands-on activities, according to Dr. Mary Anne Pollock, MSU associate professor of education and conference coordinator.

The preregistration fee for the conference is \$30 and includes the Friday luncheon. On-site registration will be \$35. The deadline for preregistration is July 17.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---A special group of potential college students will have the opportunity for a preview of things to come before they actually enroll at Morehead State University.

Nearly 100 high school students from out-of-state will visit the campus on July 20-21, spend the night in a residence hall, eat in the cafeteria and experience a typical class schedule, according to Sandy Barker, MSU admissions counselor who is coordinating the event.

When the students arrive on campus on Thursday, July 20, they will receive room assignments for a residence hall. The evening program includes outdoor games and get acquainted time at a cookout at Cave Run Lake.

Friday's schedule starts with breakfast in the Adron Doran University Center. Beginning at 9 a.m. in Duncan Recital Hall, the prospective students will learn about campus life through skits depicting situations that normally arise when students move away from home and must be responsible for their own actions. A panel composed of faculty, staff and current students will answer questions and comment on concerns that affect students when they are newcomers to a college campus.

A highlight of the program will be a performance by the 1995 Miss Kentucky Kristie Dawn Hicks. An MSU graduate, Hicks will talk with the students as well as perform.

Visits to the academic departments and attendance in actual college classes are on tap for the afternoon. A tour of the campus will conclude the day's program.

The special group are individuals who have responded to the University's TAG (Tuition Assistance Grant) campaign, a special program for out-of-state students. To qualify, students must have an Admissions Index of 500 with a 3.0 grade point average or a 20 ACT score.

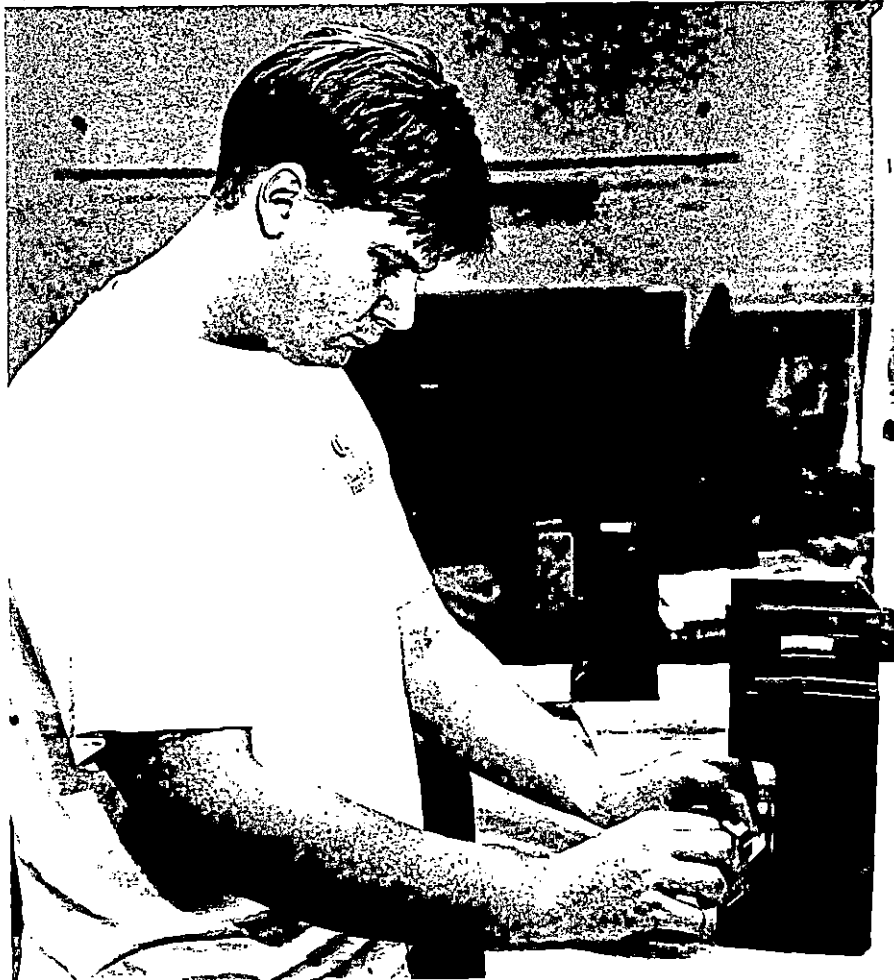

HAZARD, Ky.—In anticipation of launching a B.B.A. degree program in management this fall, Morehead State University will host an informational/registration session on Tuesday, Aug. 1, at Hazard Community College for interested students in the Perry, Breathitt and Letcher counties area.

MSU officials will be available from 6 to 7:30 p.m. in HCC's Auditorium (Room 208). If possible, students should bring a copy of their transcript in order to facilitate the registration process.

Depending upon student interest, MSU plans to offer the business courses necessary to complete its recently accredited B.B.A. degree program in management at Lees College in Jackson.

The four-year degree will be built upon the associate level programs offered by Hazard CC, Southeast Community College and Lees. Students enrolling in MSU's program will need to have completed most of their associate level work.

"Lees College and Hazard CC have surveyed the area for interest in this degree program and found that there are at least 100 students who wish to pursue their B.B.A. degree," said Dr. Marc Glasser, MSU dean of Graduate and Extended Campus Programs.

"We are working closely with Lees and HCC in this endeavor and hope to build upon the success of our collaborative effort in the elementary education degree program," Dr. Glasser said.

Recently, MSU was notified that its business degree programs have received accreditation from the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs.

MSU personnel slated to be present include Dr. Glasser, various faculty representatives from the College of Business, and a representative from the Office of Financial Aid.

Four required courses will be offered this fall. They are Money and Banking (FIN 342) on Mondays; Salesmanship (MKT 350) on Tuesdays; Cost Accounting I (ACCT 390) on Wednesdays, and Personnel Management (MNGT 311) on Thursdays. Classes will meet from 6 to 8:40 p.m. at Lees College.

MSU's 1995 fall semester classes begin meeting on Aug. 21.

The cost per credit hour for MSU's program is \$84. For full-time students taking at least 12 credit hours, the cost will be \$1,000.
