MOREHEAD, Ky.---True or false: Most college students are binge drinkers.

False.

If you believe this statement to be true, you are among the majority of people in America, according to Judy Krug, student wellness coordinator at Morehead State University.

"In actuality, 65 percent of MSU's student population drank in a moderate manner or less in the last year," she said. "But only 35 percent could be classified as binge drinkers."

The recognized definition of a binge drinker is one who consumes five or more drinks per sitting at least once in a two week period. On the University campus, 52 percent of the binge drinkers are of legal drinking age.

MSU students' perception of their peers did not agree with the results. The study showed that 93 percent of those surveyed believed that the average student drank on a weekly basis.

Krug's findings showed some 24 percent of the MSU students did not use alcohol at all in the last year. Of those who do drink, 72 percent started drinking before they were 18 years old.

She compiled the data from the CORE Alcohol and Other Drug Survey and the Wellness Survey completed at MSU between February and April in 1993, '94 and '95.

During the three-year period, more than 1,600 students were surveyed from a random class sample. All responses were voluntary and anonymous. The survey included students' attitudes and opinions and students' own use of alcohol and other drugs.

The data was consistent for all three years indicating that students had taken the survey seriously and answered the questions accurately and honestly, Krug said.

The survey was completed through an institution-wide Drug Prevention Grant from the Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education (FIPSE), a branch of the Office of Postsecondary Education (OPE). This grant made it possible for the establishing of MSU's Office of Student Wellness and the peer educator program which has been implemented.

During the last three years, the Student Wellness Office has become a campus resource on a number of wellness topics which include: stress; sexually transmitted diseases; alcohol and other drugs; fitness, nutrition and eating disorders, and tolerance (dealing with differences), and dating communication and rape.

The findings of the survey will be consolidated into the programs Krug is preparing for next year. "We plan to focus more on binge drinking and perception," she said. "We will work more toward changing behaviors."

MOREHEAD, Ky.—Morehead State University is seeking nominations for its 1996 Founders Day Award for University Service.

"We encourage our faculty/staff, students, alumni and other friends to nominate deserving candidates who have given superior service to Morehead State University through the years," said MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin.

The award is to be presented during the annual observance on Friday, April 12, as the University celebrates its 74th year as a public institution of higher education. MOREHEAD, Ky.—The deadline is nearing for area singers who plan to audition for The Voices of Eastern Kentucky, a regional chorus sponsored by Morehead State University, that will tour England, Scotland and Wales June 20-July 3.

Auditions have been set for Sunday, Jan. 14, 1 to 6 p.m. and Monday, Jan. 15, 9 a.m.-noon and 1 to 6 p.m. in 338 Baird Music Hall.

During the audition, applicants will be tested for vocal range, asked to perform a piece of sight reading, deliver a short and simple solo of a folk or hymn tune, and after working with a piano player, sing their vocal part on a simple choral piece.

The 36-member chorus will be selected from MSU's service region, according to Dr. Kenneth Sipley, MSU assistant professor of music who will direct the ensemble.

After the choir is chosen, members will have only six months to learn a lot of music, Dr. Sipley said. "This will mean devoting additional time outside the regular practice periods," he said.

Rehearsals will be held one weekend each month from February through May with a one-week intense training session on the campus before the departure date.

MSU, in cooperation with the Cooperative Center for Study in Britain (CCSB), is arranging the overseas venture. At least six major concerts will be held with performances scheduled for a number of historical sites such as the Canterbury Cathedral.

MOREHEAD, Ky.—Three Morehead State University researchers have completed a survey of school personnel from Northeast Kentucky to determine how they believe teenagers would respond to ethics statements.

The local research was part of a national study by Phi Delta Kappa international education honor society. Completing the project was Dr. Daniel Fasko, professor of education; Dr. Deborah Grubb, assistant professor of education, and Dr. Jeanne Osborne, director of institutional planning and research.

As part of the survey, teenagers were asked to respond to 43 "value statements" reflecting ethics and behavior which included statements about honesty, faith, cheating, alcohol, drugs and sexual activity. Superintendents, principals and teachers were asked to comment on how they thought the teens would respond.

The adults believed the teens would say "yes" to "My generation is more apt to lie or cheat than my parent's generation"; and "Being honest is a good idea, theoretically, but everyone cheats sometimes, just to get along."

For "Democracy depends fundamentally upon people being honest," the educators thought teens would disagree and were undecided as to how teens would respond to "My ethics and behavior are consistent with how I was raised;" "My parents would be satisfied with my ethics and beliefs," and "My parents spend a lot of time helping me learn 'right' and 'wrong' in the world."

A follow-up study is planned to survey how well teens can predict how the adults responded. Results of the current study were discussed at the international PDK biennial council meeting in Detroit, Mich., and at the local chapter meeting.

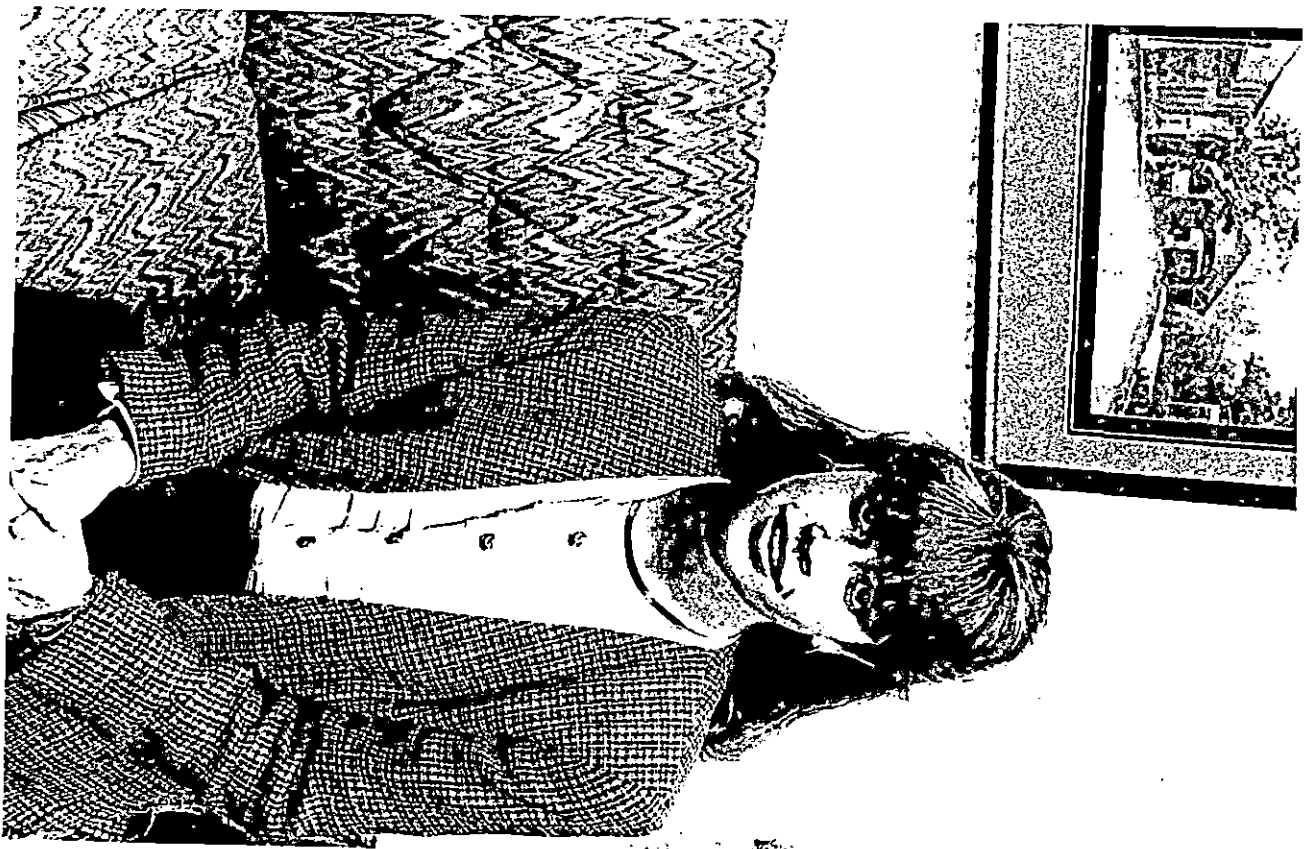

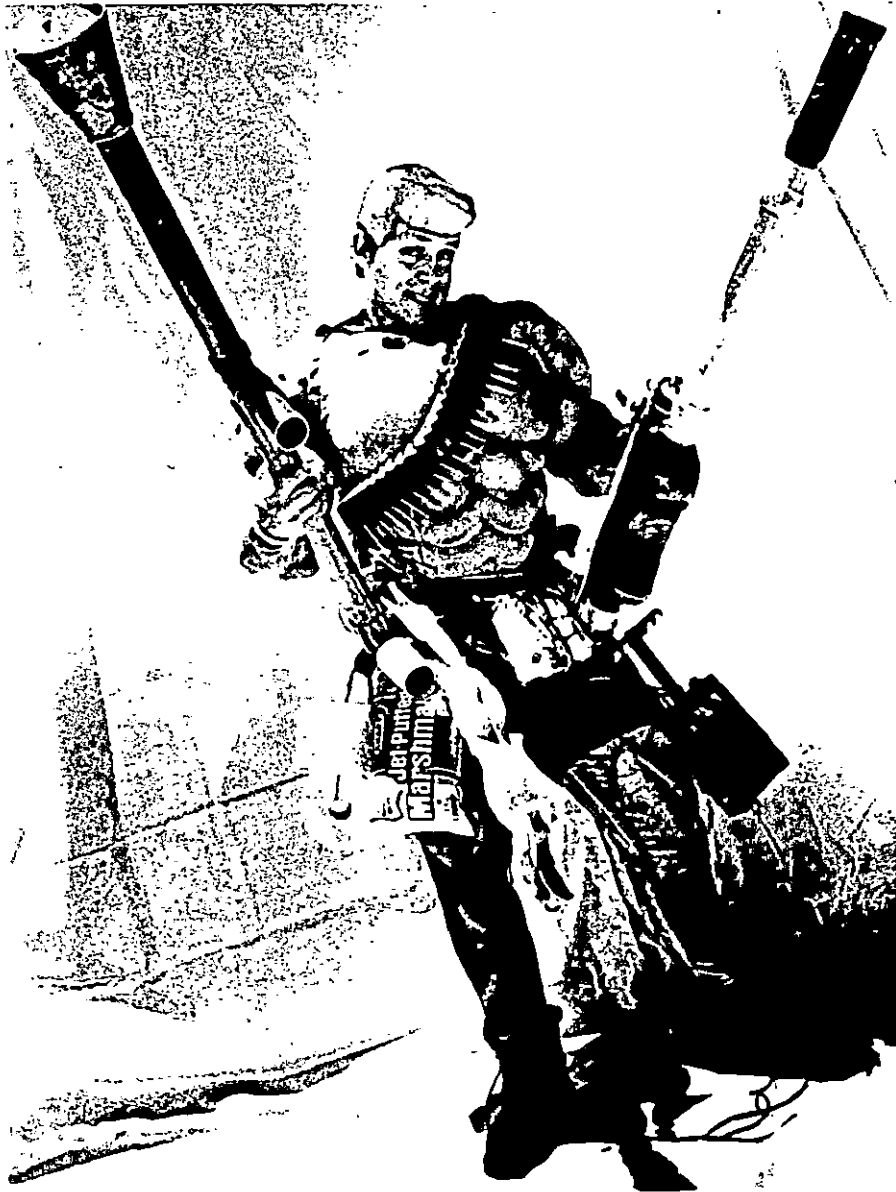

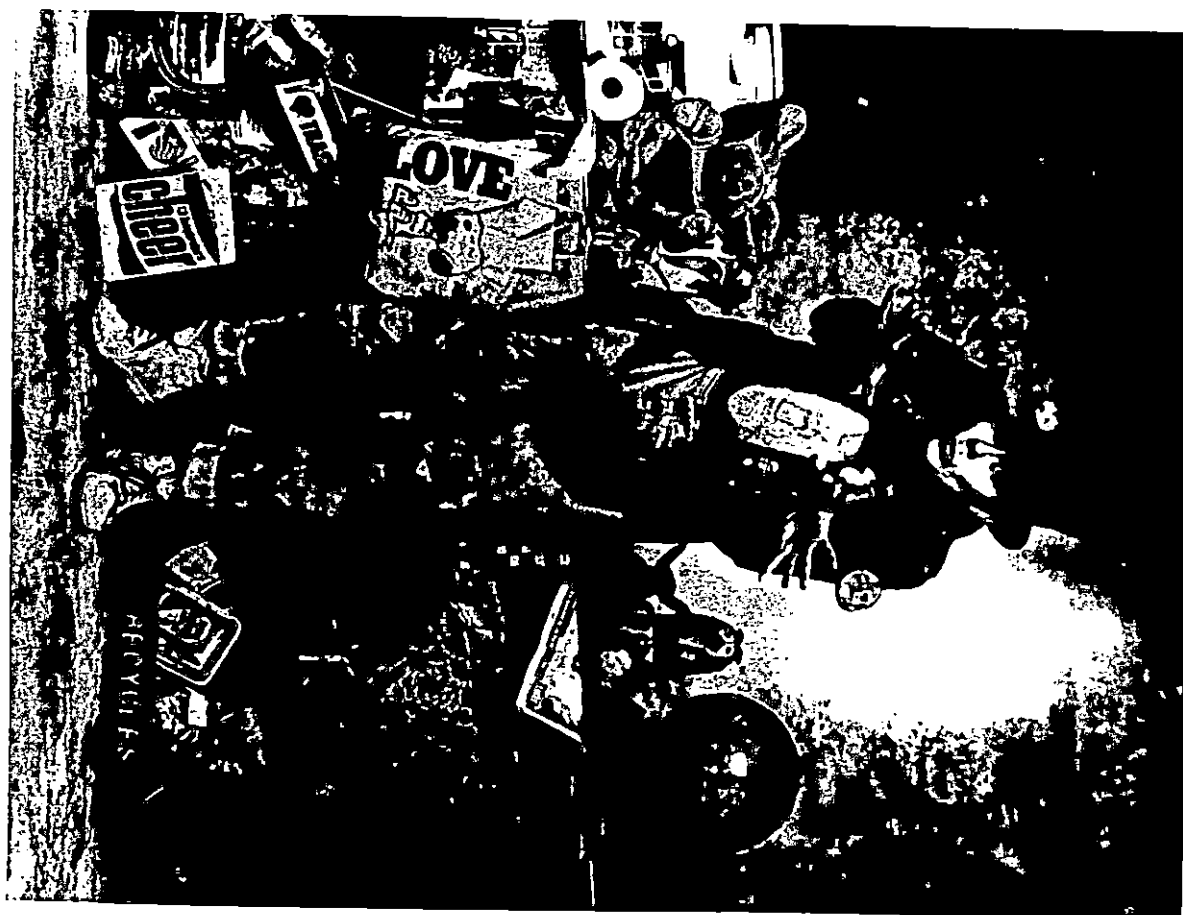

Kerr contracted the HIV virus from her high school sweetheart in 1987 while a sophomore in college. Fear of rejection by her friends and expulsion from school forced her to remain quiet about her health for a period of time.

To prevent others from following in her footsteps, Kerr began speaking out on AIDS in a campaign that took her across the U.S. Two years after her diagnosis, she graduated from Mary Washington College and began her studies at the District of Columbia School of Law where she completed one year. The DC law school has since awarded her an honorary degree for outstanding service in the Washington metropolitan area.

In addition to presentations on numerous high school and university campuses, Kerr had appeared on CNN, CNBC, MTV, "Donahue," and "The Jenny Jones Show." She also has been featured in "Shape" and "Glamour" magazines as well as "The New York Times" and "Washington Post."

Employed by Hospice of Central Virginia, Kerr is married to a fellow HIV survivor. She recently became a contributing author to the Random House book, "Letters To Our Children," scheduled for publication in May.
