Mrs. Cora Wilston Stewart, of Morehead, found of the "moonlight" schools of Rowan County and chairman of the commission designed to eradicate illiteracy from Kentucky, spent yesterday touring Minnesota in company with Secretary of State William J. Bryan, who was speaking at the principal towns of the state in the interest of the Wilson administration. Mrs. Stewart wired The Herald last night that she had enlisted the aid of the Secretary in the campaign being waged against illiteracy. She was in Chicago last night.

"Have enlisted William Jennings Bryan in fight against adult illiteracy. We held early morning conference on subject in Minneapolis. He declared with enthusiasm that it was a most laudable movement. He was much interested in pictures and letters of 'moonlight' school pupils and expressed surprise at rapidity with which they learned. We were traveling companions through Minnesota today, he touring state in Democratic campaign and I in interest of eradicating illiteracy.
