MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University will celebrate Black History Month in February with a variety of events including an art exhibit, lectures and a number of student-oriented activities.

The art works of Kevin Jerome Everson of Cleveland, Ohio, will be on display in the gallery, Claypool-Young Art Building, Feb. 13 through March 22. A reception to honor the artist will be held on opening night Tuesday, Feb. 13, beginning at 7 p.m.

The exhibit, which the artist has titled "Adult Material," may be viewed weekdays, 8 a.m.-4 p.m. There is no admission charge.

Since he was a sophomore in college, Everson has been producing art works. This show will include a video installation as well as nearly 20 pieces made from found objects.

Most of his works are influenced by his memory of things he remembers from his past, Everson said. He is a graduate of the University of Akron where he received a B.A. degree and Ohio University at Athens where he earned an M.F.A. degree. His interests include art history, bookmaking, printmaking, filmmaking, sculpture and painting.

Kicking off the month long celebration will be a talk by Darryl Matthews, executive intern with Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., in Washington, D.C. He will speak on Monday, Feb. 5, at 8 p.m. in Breckinridge Auditorium.

On Wednesday, Feb. 7, a Fashion Show, sponsored by Delta Sigma Theta and Alpha Kappa Alpha, is on tap. The line-up begins at 7 p.m. in Button Auditorium.

A Speech Contest, sponsored by Delta Sigma Theta, begins at 8 p.m. in the Commonwealth Room, Adron Doran University Center, on Thursday, Feb. 8.

On Valentine's Day, Delta Sigma Theta will sponsor its own "Dating Game." The fun begins at 8 p.m. in the Crager Room, ADUC, on Wednesday, Feb. 14.

As the number of commuter students increases, it is of utmost importance to make information available to outlying regions in a quick and timely fashion.

A decision to alter the main campus schedule is normally made at approximately 6 a.m. that day, unless conditions are severe enough to make the determination the night before.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University's Department of Music will present a guest recital by a flute soloist on Tuesday, Feb. 20, at 8 p.m. in Duncan Recital Hall.

The recital, which is free and open to the public, will feature Sandra Seefeld, associate professor of music at Miami University of Oxford (Ohio). She has held concerts throughout the U. S. and Europe and has toured Taiwan, Canada, the Czech Republic and Austria as flutist of the Miami Wind Quintet.

The program will include "Sonate in D major" by Jehann Nepomuk Hummel, "Sonata" by Lowell Liebermann, "Spring Serenade" by Peter Schickele and "Regrets and Resolution" by Gary Schocker.

Seefeld has served as the principal flutist of the Echternach International Music Festival Orchestra of Luxembourg, the Fort Wayne Philharmonic Orchestra, The Richmond, Indiana Symphony Orchestra and the Whitewater Opera Company. She also has played in the American Institute of Musical Studies Summer Vocal Institute Orchestra in Graz, Austria.

She has five recordings to her credit, two of avant-grade works on the Opus One label and three with the Miami Wind Quintet.

Accompanying Seefeld will be Ron J. Matson, solo pianist and assistant conductor of the Cincinnati Ballet Company. He has conducted ballet orchestras in many cities including Vancouver, Knoxville and New Orleans as well as seven different ballets at the Kennedy Center Opera House Orchestra.

Matson has been on the faculty of Miami University for many years, serving as staff accompanist, director of Choraliers and instructor of accompanying and theory. He has been accompanying Seefeld since 1978.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---College seniors across the country will be attending graduation exercises and heading into the job market in a matter of a few months.

To be ready for the big day, it is extremely important that students be prepared, according to Kathy Carey, interim director of Career Planning and Placement at Morehead State University.

"With so many students competing for jobs, employers will be evaluating applicants in all aspects that pertain to their particular field," Carey said. "The student with the strongest resume who is best prepared for the workforce, interviews well and has relevant experience will most likely be the one who gets the job."

To aid in the job search, MSU is again offering a class entitled "The World of Work." Beginning March 5 and continuing for nine weeks, the course will cover researching a company, mock interviews, resume writing and self-evaluation topics such as personality, skills and interests.

While some students utilize the class as a place to polish their resume, still others believe participating in a mock interview is beneficial, Carey said. "After being videotaped in a job interview setting, each student is critiqued on overall interview performance."

Among their list of things to do, Carey urges seniors to complete a placement file no later than the beginning of their senior year.

Establishing a placement file entails completing a series of forms and including a resume, transcript and at least three letters of recommendation. The recommended documents can be added to the file as they become available. Upon request, these materials are sent to prospective employers who are searching for someone with your specific qualifications. Students may participate in on-campus interviews by employers once their placement file is started.

The office also has services available for students who are not ready to graduate. "A resume is something students should start thinking about early in their college training," Carey said.

Keeping journals of employment dates, activities and accomplishments will make writing an account of one's employment experiences and extracurricular activities a simpler task. When looking at the big picture, students may assume leadership positions and choose activities which will make them more marketable, Carey noted.

"When completing a specific course in your major or working a summer job, you will be in contact with individuals who will make good references," she said.

Students can come to the office and use the Discover program which provides information about occupations, colleges, graduate schools, financial aid and job seeking. It also includes an interest inventory to help students learn about themselves and occupations that match their interests.

To help students write a resume, the office offers a guide in its "Writing a Winning Resume." The complete booklet is available for \$1. The "Perfect Resume" program is another resource students have used to help develop their resume. Once a rough draft is completed, office personnel will assist students in "fine tuning" the finished product.

Other services offered by career planning and placement include a weekly Job Vacancy Bulletin of listings by field. The University also receives nearly 100 job bulletins from other universities across the country.

As a resource to education majors, MSU along with Eastern Kentucky University, Kentucky State University and University of Kentucky, participates in the Kentucky Teachers Network (KTN) which hosts an annual career fair for teachers. This year's activity will be held April 1 from 2 to 6 p.m. at ECU and noon until 4 p.m. at KSU. There is no charge for attending and job seekers may have interviews on site or distribute resumes.

MSU students also can conduct job searches via the Internet. The Office of Career Planning and Placement is developing a list of Internet addresses to help students access information more effectively. Computers are available in 107 Combs Building from 8 a.m. until 10 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. on Fridays. Workshops on computer use are available on a regular basis.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Some Morehead State University students are getting an early start on a future career by taking the skills they have learned in the classroom and putting them to practical use.

Through a special program called Service Learning, the students are enjoying actual life experiences while fulfilling a community need.

"This can only make for a win-win situation," said Samantha Murphy, co-director of the Service Learning Education Department. "We coordinate the student's expertise with the community's needs and the end result is that everyone benefits," she said.

Murphy, a Fairborn, Ohio, junior elementary education major, worked with one project where she had the opportunity to interact with small children. The outcome was an increase in self-confidence as she applied what she had learned in her classes to a real-life situation.

Joining Murphy in implementing the Service Learning program, are three other students: Jenny Collins, a Whitesburg junior, and Elmer White, Brandenburg sophomore, who are co-directors of the Fine Arts Department, and Kendra Rase, Portsmouth, Ohio, junior, who along with Murphy serve as co-directors of the Education Department. Laura Flora, Hillsboro graduate student majoring in English, also is working with the group.

As the semester gets underway, the co-directors are busy matching students with professors and projects in the community. Once an agreement is reached, the University students will be out in the community fulfilling the desired need.

"Our goal is to match the expertise of the students with the needs in the community," Murphy said. "That way all parties achieve something worthwhile," she said.

"Another bonus of service learning is that when the project is completed, each student who completes 10 hours of service will receive a certificate indicating their contribution to a community cause," Murphy said. "This documentation will be available for future employers to see that in addition to course work, the student completed a hands-on experience as well."

MSU's Service Learning program was funded by a grant from the Council on Higher Education Keys to Kera Consortium. It is being administered through Academic Support Services Program.

"Participation in this project has been very positive from the University and the community," said Dr. Dan Connell, Academic Support Services director. "While still in the early stages, more than 100 students will be involved in the program during the second year.

"One option that interests faculty members is being able to incorporate activities into their course curriculum which focus on KERA service-learning areas," Dr. Connell said.

MSU faculty members working with the program since its inception are Karen Hammons, assistant professor of education; Dr. Andrew Glendening, assistant professor of music, and Ernestine Winfield, Minority Teacher Education Program coordinator. Other faculty who recently received the training and have joined the group, are: Dr. Lloyd R. Jaisingh, professor of mathematics; Dr. Terry L. Irons, assistant professor of English; Dr. Sheryl Brown, assistant professor of management; Gary Mesa-Gaido, assistant professor of art; Dr. Ken Siple, assistant professor of music; Jay Flippin, professor of music; Dr. Paul McGhee, professor of education; Dreama Price, assistant professor of education; Dr. Phyllis Oakes, associate professor of education, and Donna Johnson, instructor of education.

"By allowing them to participate in service-learning, students have a better understanding of what they are doing," Hammons said. "This is one of the best ways of connecting students through their coursework to the world of work."

In some of the music classes, a component has been added to the lesson which will aid the MSU students so they will be better prepared when they offer assistance to younger musicians, such as those in middle or high school, Dr. Glendening said. "It truly is a learn and serve situation," he said. "The University students are more confident when they offer instruction to the younger players."

To provide information to other students, participants in the program will be passing out brochures in the first floor lobby of the Adron Doran University on Wednesday, Feb. 28, from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m.

"In celebrating our past and this singular milestone in particular, we are very pleased and honored that Gov. Breathitt has accepted our invitation to speak," said MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin.

"Gov. Breathitt, a former member of our Board of Regents, has been a good friend of MSU for many years," Dr. Eaglin added. The former governor served as regent from 1986 to 1989 and was vice chair of the board during his tenure.

Currently counsel with Wyatt, Tarrant & Combs, Attorneys at Law, Breathitt retired as senior vice president with the Norfolk Southern Corporation in 1992. He has been involved in the Governor's Scholars Program, the Kentucky Historical Society, Leadership Kentucky and the Prichard Committee for Academic Excellence.

Breathitt was governor 1963-67 and also served three terms in the state General Assembly. He presently chairs the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky.
