MOREHEAD, Ky.---Area teachers will reverse roles and become students while attending a number of professional development workshops during Morehead State University's annual Appalachian Celebration which runs June 23-29 on the campus.

Participants may receive continuing education units (CEU's) for a number of programs which will be presented during the week. The cost is \$35 per session and pre-registration and payment are necessary for those attending the sessions for teachers professional development credit. Registrations will be accepted until a week prior to the event.

Programs slated for MSU's Waterfield Hall Conference Center are:

*An "American Folksong History" workshop, on Monday, June 24, at 9 a.m. Taught by Mark Dvorak, this session will focus on making homemade music for teachers, parents and adults with an emphasis on the historical development of American folk music and lore.

A full-time touring musician, Dvorak is on the teaching staff of the Old Town School of Folk Music in Chicago. He plays guitar and banjo and includes a number of unusual instruments in his performances.

*"The Origins and Pioneers of Bluegrass" on Tuesday, June 25, at 9 a.m. Instruction will be provided by The Special Consensus, a four-person acoustic bluegrass band.

The group, which has been performing internationally since 1975, are frequent performers on college campuses and at music festivals. They have appeared on the Nashville Network's "Fire on the Mountain" show and in the last 10 years have released six albums.

*"Story Building and Story Creation" on Wednesday, June 26, at 9 a.m. Literary storyteller Donna Dettman uses her knowledge of children's literature and folktales from her work in public libraries to make stories come alive.

A member of the National Storytelling Association and Fox Valley Storytelling Guild, Dettman earned a bachelor's degree in elementary education and a master's degree in library science.

*An "Underground Railroad Tour" and workshop. The bus boards at 9 a.m. at Waterfield Hall for a tour of Mason County's Underground Railroad Museum and African Research Center, Rankin House and Paxton Inn. Jerry Gore, director of MSU's Office of Minority Student Affairs, will be the instructor and tour guide.

A Maysville native, Gore is a member of the National Underground Railroad Museum, Inc., committee and was instrumental in the museum's opening. He has done extensive research on the underground railroad and was the 1996 recipient of the Christian Appalachian Project's Peace Award.

Also on tap for Tuesday, June 25, is "The Museum as a Teaching Resource" with instruction by Bianca Brewer, Kentucky Folk Art Center's education coordinator.

This daylong program offer options on how museums may help teachers achieve KERA's goals. The session will be held in East Room, Adron Doran University Center, from 9 a.m. until noon and the KFAC from 1 until 4 p.m.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Traditional music, workshops, demonstrations and arts and crafts will be a part of the festivities when Morehead State University hosts its 20th annual Appalachian Celebration, June 23-29.

The week long festival, which follows "The Traditions Continue" theme, will offer a variety of activities designed to enhance one's knowledge of Appalachian culture.

The celebration, sponsored by the University's Office of Community Development and Continuing Education, will begin with an opening reception and presentation of the annual Appalachian Treasure Award. MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin will make the presentation to C. Roger Lewis of Morehead on Sunday, June 23, at 6:30 p.m. in the Crager Room, Adron Doran University Center.

Lewis will join a prestigious list of Appalachian celebrities who have previously been honored. They include: James Still, 1988; Jean Ritchie, 1989; Loyal Jones, 1990; Gurney Norman, 1991; Lyndall "Granny" Toothman, 1992; Homer Ledford, 1993; Minnie Adkins, 1994, and Albert Stewart, 1995.

A Morehead realtor for more than 35 years, Lewis has made numerous appearances at noon and evening concerts during past Appalachian Celebrations as a member of C. Roger Lewis and Friends, a group of traditional musicians. With mandolin in hand, he will make three appearances during this year's celebration.

A former featured singer with the Jean Thomas American Folk Fest, Lewis has recorded for Monitor Radio and has been a regular member at musical festivals including the Fraley Festival in Carter Caves and Fiddlers Grove Festival in Union City, N.C.

Active in his community, Lewis was president of several civic and service organizations such as Lions Club and Chamber of Commerce and is currently a member of a number of groups including the Northeast Kentucky Hospital Foundation Board. He has been a member of his church's choir and has sung with a gospel quartet, The Disciples, since the early '60s.

On tap for Monday, June 24, will be the Appalachian Women's Luncheon, in the Commonwealth Room, ADUC, at 11:30 a.m. The afternoon will include the Gathering of Women in Leadership symposium in the Riggle Room, ADUC. The cost is \$15 and reservations are necessary.

Activities for the afternoon, such as storytelling and presentations, will continue throughout the week, beginning at 3 p.m. They include:

Richard Henson will use the history of broom-making in America since the colonial days to the 1950s for his "Brooms Bootsie and Me" presentation. The 45-minute program, complete with costume and music, is set for Tuesday, June 25, in Baird Music Hall. The charge is \$3.

A children's librarian will offer entertainment that is appropriate for all ages on Wednesday, June 26,. "Storytelling with Donna Dettman" will be held in the Crager Room, ADUC. The cost is \$3 per person.

"The Wonderful Whirl of Puppets," featuring stories from different parts of the world, is scheduled for Thursday, June 27, in the Crager Room, ADUC. Storyteller and puppeteer Marilyn Price will provide some history of puppets and offer a brief demonstration, including a puppet warm-up complete with aerobics. The cost is \$3.

"The Facts on Cora W. Stewart and the Moonlight School," a history lesson in the original school on the MSU campus, gets under way on Thursday, June 27. Providing the instruction will be Yvonne Baldwin, MSU assistant professor of history.

During the week, lovers of traditional music will be treated to the sounds of bluegrass, gospel and mountain melodies in noon and evening concerts.

Performers scheduled to appear include:

Monday, June 24, Mark Dvorak, a singer-guitarist and old-time banjo player and storyteller, will offer entertainment for all ages in "Old Songs and New People" in Button Auditorium at 7 p.m. Admission is \$5. Dvorak also will offer a preview of his work at 11:30 a.m. on the Laughlin Lawn earlier that day.

Tuesday, June 25, The Special Consensus, a four-person bluegrass band, will take the stage in Button Auditorium at 7 p.m. The Grammy Award nominees have been touring nationally since 1979. Admission is \$5.

Wednesday, June 26, It's a Gathering of Traditional Musicians featuring the White Horse String Band of Morehead, Mule Band of Pikeville, Marvin Carroll of Owingsville, J.P. Fraley of Rush, and Don Rigsby of Isonville. The performance, which begins at 7 p.m., will be held in Baird Music Hall. Admission is \$5.

Thursday, June 27, A Gospel Sing is on tap for 7 p.m. in Breckinridge Auditorium. Hosted by Lynwood Montell, the performers will include the Sammons Family Gospel of Prestonsburg, Gloryland Quartet of Bowling Green and C. Roger Lewis and Friends. There is no admission charge.

Friday, June 28, Bluegrass music with Stoney Creek Band and Larry Sparks will be offered in Button Auditorium at 7 p.m. Tickets are \$5 in advance or \$8 on the night of the performance.

Saturday, June 29, it's Folk Fest '96 hosted by local "Friends and Folk" performers Harvey Pennington, Glen Buckner and Steve Young. The evening's entertainment, which will include traditional and contemporary folk music, will include Clandestine from Kansas City, Mo., who specialize in Celtic music from Ireland; Dr. Ron Dobler, MSU professor of English, who tells folk tales and other humorous stories and accompanies himself on the banjo, and Jennifer Rose will offer Appalachian heritage through song and instrument. Everyone is encouraged to bring a blanket to the Laughlin Lawn at 7 p.m. for this free performance. In case of rain, the activity will move to Button Auditorium.

A number of special events are planned throughout the week. These include art exhibits in Camden-Carroll Library, demonstrations at the Kentucky Folk Art Center, booksignings at Laughlin Health Building and workshops at numerous locations on campus. Among the different items to be made will be furniture, soap, brooms, fabric crafts, meal, the art of pottery using Indian clay and chair-caning.

Of particular interest to teachers will be a number of educational workshops on making homemade music, using the museum as a teaching resource or writing/creating a story. A workshop, geared specifically toward nurses, will include a journey to Frontier Nursing Service while historians may wish to take the tour to the Underground Railroad. Children will again have an opportunity to talk to the animals at the petting zoo which is slated for Wednesday, June 26, from 10 a.m. until noon at Rodburn Park.

Capping the celebration will be the annual Arts and Crafts Market on Saturday, June 29, in Laughlin Health Building. More than 100 craftspersons are expected to exhibit and sell their handmade crafts. The fair runs from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. There is a \$2 admission charge.

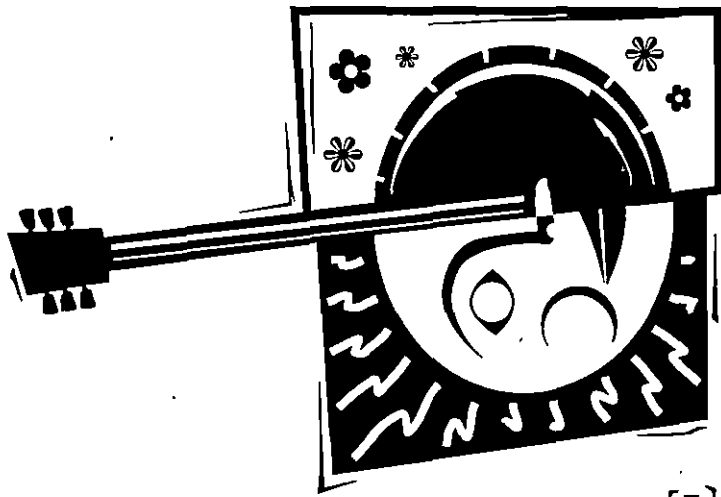

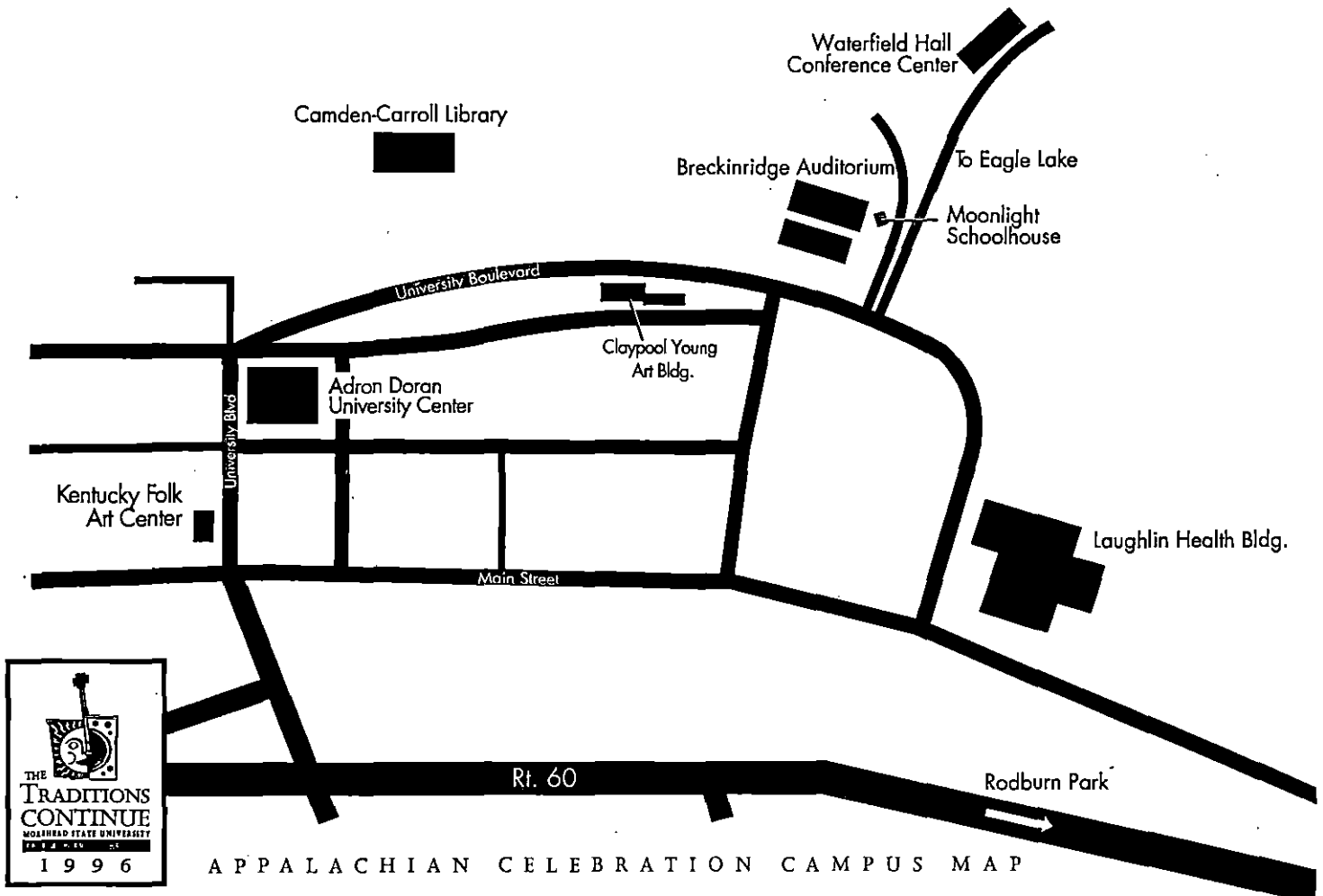

Marie Bradby of Louisville, author of "More Than Anything Else," a fictionalized account of the childhood of Booker T. Washington. Set in Charleston, W.Va., the work deals with Washington's desire to learn to read. The author and her book were honored with the International Reading Association Award this year. She will give a reading at 2:30 p.m.

James B. Goode of Anderson County, poet, essayist, photographer and Appalachian scholar, has written about the Appalachian region since the 1960s. He has authored four books of poetry and one technical book on coal mining, produced and directed two documentary films, published more than 500 poems in national and international magazines and written more than 200 columns for a variety of newspapers including the New York Times and the Lexington Herald Leader. Chris Holbrook of Pippa Passes, author of a book of short stories published this year, will read from his work "Hell and Ohio."

Florence Castle Ison of Benham, author of "Caney Girl," a novel based on personal experience. It features a coal miner's daughter who fulfills her dream of achieving an education by attending school at the Caney Creek Community Center, the forerunner of Alice Lloyd College. Ison, accompanied by Ruby Sweet signing "You've Got to Walk This Lonesome Valley," will read from her work at 2 p.m.

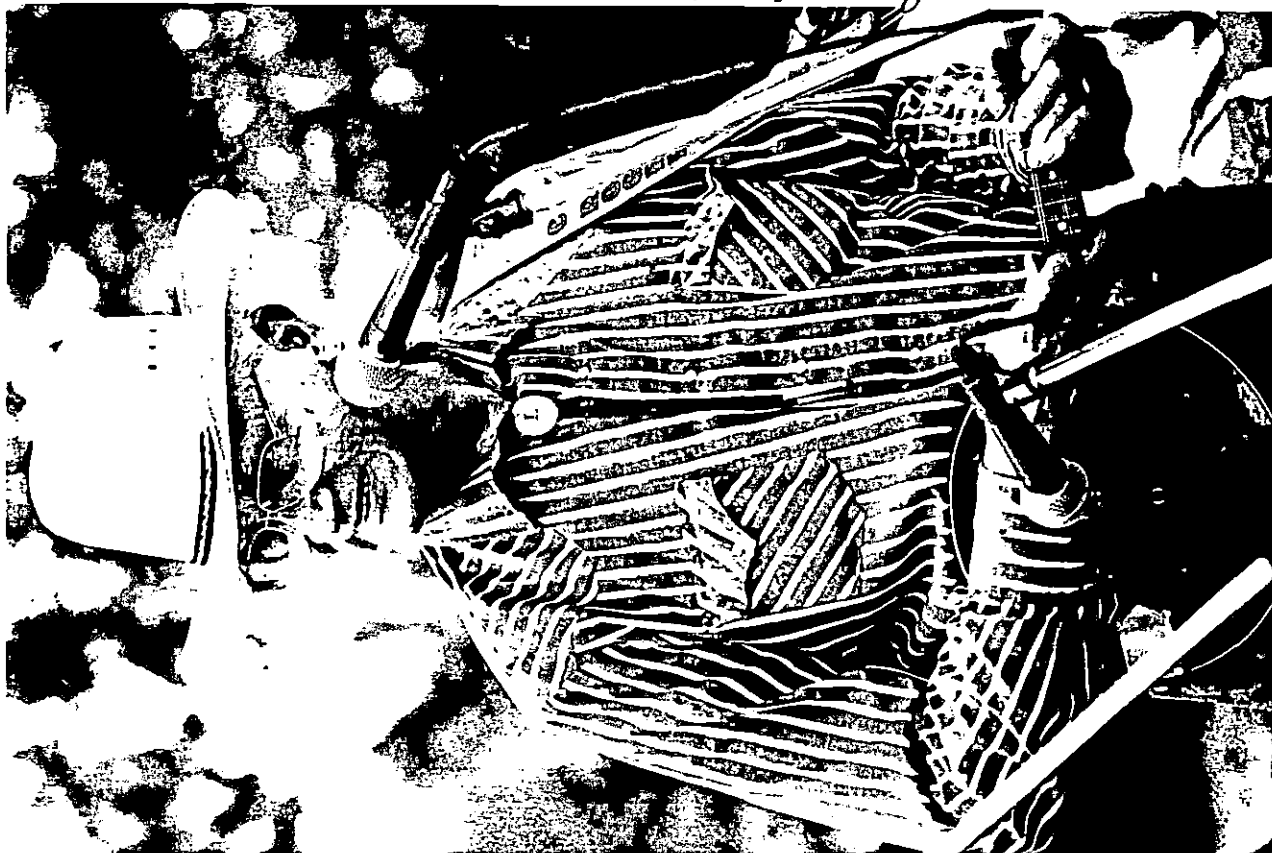

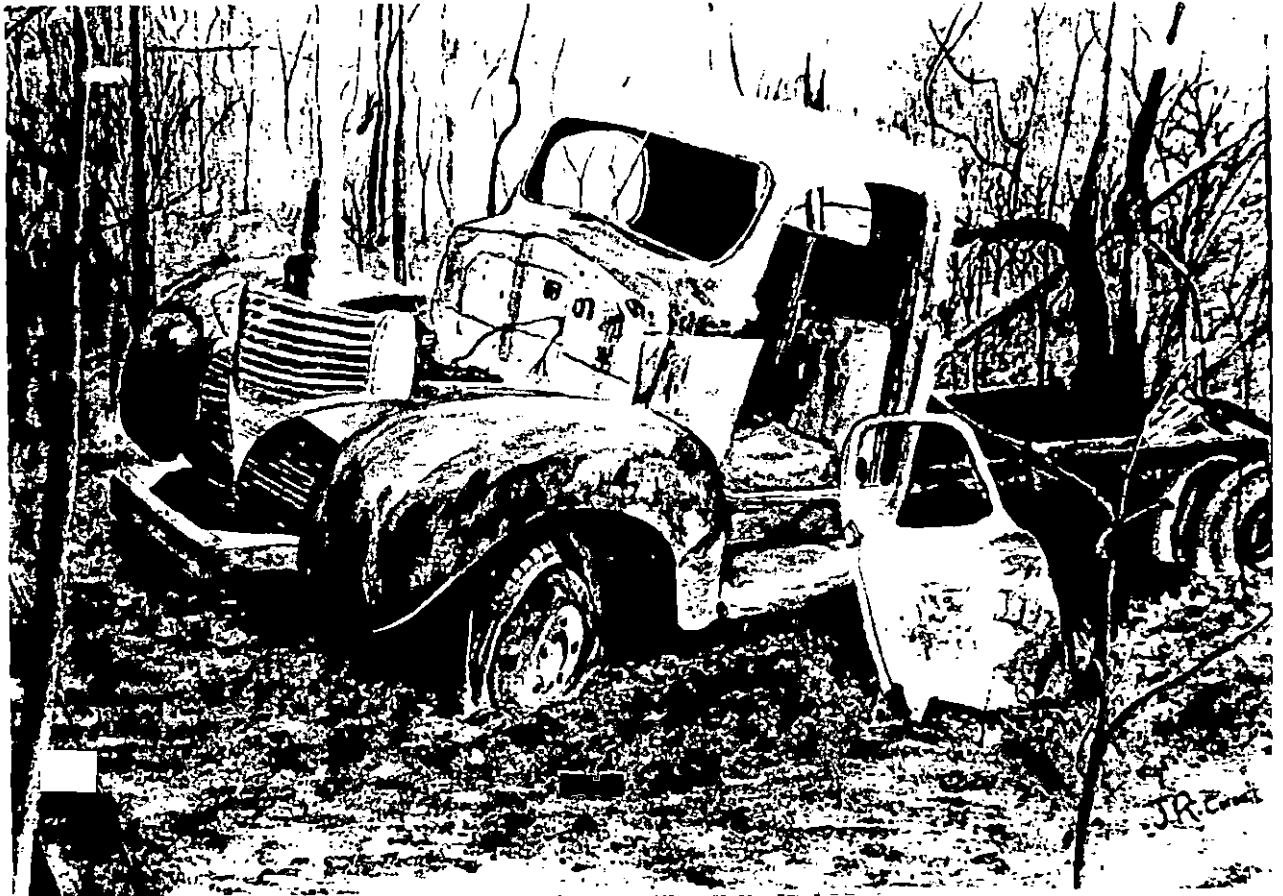

MOREHEAD, Ky.—In times of budgetary limitations, how do you interview potential candidates and keep the costs at a minimum?

When faced with this dilemma, a search committee from Morehead State University's Department of Sociology, Social Work and Criminology used technology designed for instruction--distance learning--to interview an applicant.

To discuss the use of compressed video technology, the committee turned to Ronnie Adkins, MSU coordinator of electronics. Through the use of e-mail and the Internet, the University staff communicated with Ian Truswell in the media unit of the University of New England, and Gerrald Ginter at the University of Kentucky to figure out the logistics for this project. It was determined that the link would have to go from MSU, through Frankfort, Lexington and Atlanta, to reach Australia.

With all information in hand, the committee requested Dr. Autumn Grubb-Swetnam, MSU director of distance learning, to schedule the conference. On an evening earlier this year, T.C. Young, television producer in distance education, established the video link and for the next 75 minutes an interview was conducted.

The successful applicant for the position of director of the Institute for Correctional Research and Training and assistant/associate professor of sociology was Dr. Hugh Potter, a lecturer in the Department of Sociology at the University of New England in Armidale, New South Wales, Australia. He will join the MSU family in mid-July.

Faculty members from the department making up the search committee included Dr. Robert Bylund, Dr. Connie Hardesty, Dr. Ed Reeves, Dr. David Rudy, department chair, and Dr. Alban Wheeler, committee chair. Becky Katz also attended the interview as a guest of the committee.

The committee was very pleased with the results of using this high tech approach, according to Dr. Wheeler. "We never would have been able to do this without the wholehearted support of MSU's technical staff and Truswell's assistance," Dr. Wheeler said.

Registration hours at the Ashland Area Extended Campus Center will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Students may register at the Big Sandy Extended Campus Center in Prestonsburg and the Licking Valley Extended Campus Center in West Liberty from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Students enrolling on the main campus, who did not pre-register, will need to develop their class schedules in their major department prior to paying fees in Button Drill Room. Schedule adjustments for those who registered in advance will be processed also during registration.

Students without a declared major will go to 233 Allie Young Hall to schedule classes. MOREHEAD, Ky.---Want your pet to behave? Then learn to speak its language, says animal behaviorist Patricia "Trisha" McConnell. Animals, of course, can't speak to you. So the trick is to understand their motivation and behavior.

That's where McConnell comes in. McConnell, who holds a Ph.D. in zoology with an emphasis on animal-human interaction, sees herself as an interpreter who helps humans and their pets understand each other. "I talk human and I talk dog, so I'm like a translator at the UN. I get these parties communicating effectively," McConnell said.

She deciphers animal behavior each week as host of Wisconsin Public Radio's nationally-distributed call-in series, "Calling All Pets." The hour-long, weekly call-in radio program airs Sundays at 4 p.m. on WMKY 90.3 FM, public radio from Morehead State University.

Each week, McConnell joins co-host Larry Meiller to field calls about a wide range of pet problems, from ankle-biting cats to lonely dogs and even the occasional obstinate parakeet. They offer practical suggestions to help owners solve training problems and help avoid serious human-pet misunderstandings.

A classic example: Owners who think their dog is angry with them because it destroys things in the house when they're away.

"They think their dog knows better, so it must be doing it to spite them," McConnell says. Instead, the dog may have messed up the house because it isn't properly house-trained or because it feels anxious when left alone. Understanding what motivated the behavior can help owners correct it.

Everyday problems like this one are the most commonly-given reasons owners abandon their dogs and cats at shelters--and McConnell says that's ironic because they would be easy to correct with a little behavioral training.

Traditionally, pet owners have turned to books, veterinarians or obedience classes for help. McConnell says the problem is that vets aren't typically trained in animal behavior and classes can vary greatly in quality. So the call-in show gives listeners access to proven, behavioral techniques that they might not be able to get elsewhere.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--The diversity of the Appalachian region is celebrated in a new series, "Tell It on the Mountain," which will be broadcast on WMKY 90.3 FM, public radio from Morehead State University's campus, each Sunday through September at 2:30 p.m.

The series highlights women writers who represent the breadth of mountain experience--Native American, African American, poor, privileged, middle-class, rural, urban, rooted and restless migrant.

"These women writers work in a variety of styles and genres," said Larry Netherton, WMKY general manager. "And some of their characters are among the most powerful in American literature."

The series draws a connection between the women writers and their common Appalachian ancestry. Many of the writers acknowledge their kinship with one another and mutual influence on each other's work. But as the series unfolds, as each writer talks about her life and work, the listener will hear even more common roots that connect them to the Appalachian family tree.

WMKY, an affiliate of National Public Radio (NPR) and Public Radio International (PRI), features news and information programs, classical and adult alternative music, and specialty programs. "Tell it on the Mountain" is the second of three programs to focus on writing.

"We were pleased with the listener response to 'Writing the Southwest'," Netherton said. "Those of you who enjoyed that program will certainly like this one."

The schedule of writers to be featured on "Tell It on the Mountain" is as follows:

- June 30--Sharyn McCrumb has won every award given to mystery writers. But why would an Appalachian writer turn to the mystery novel as her genre? It began with her Tennessee mountain father who told his daughter The Iliad as a folktale at bedtime. McCrumb, who began writing at age seven, never had any doubts about her career choice. She combines her knowledge of Appalachian places, people, traditions, music, language and culture with the elements of suspense to create something new and fresh.

- July 7--Classical music lovers know that deafness did not stop Beethoven from hearing incredibly beautiful music in his head, which he wrote down and performed. Readers of Jo Carson's poetry and plays know, too, that her hearing impairment has not prevented her from listening to the clear, honest voices of Appalachian people and bringing them to life. Without sentimentality or stereotyping, her work uses mountain people and settings to describe modern life and human relationships in universal terms.

•July 14--Now making her home in Arizona, Barbara Kingsolver fondly remembers growing up in the rolling hills that divide the coal fields of Eastern Kentucky from the opulent horse farms of the bluegrass area. Growing up, Kingsolver says she thought all literature was about men against something--men against men, against nature. She never knew that literature could be about two women in the kitchen. Kingsolver is part of the strong tradition in Appalachian literature in which the writer becomes the voice of the common people and a mirror for society.

•July 21--Michelle Green's mother, Willie Pearl, grew up in a hollow in a coal camp owned by Consolidation Coal Company near the Eastern Kentucky coal town of Jenkins. Green's father was to become one of the first triple-rated black pilots in the US Army Air Corps, moving his family all around the world. It was the world of memory created by Willie Pearl's stories of her childhood that inspired Green to make a successful transition from her specialty in technical writing to historical fiction.

•July 28--For over 40 years Wilma Dykeman has been one of the most respected and widely-read Appalachian authors. She has written more than a dozen books about her beloved Tennessee home with her best known novel, *The Tall Woman*, now in its 38th printing. She was truly ahead of her time and her early novels foreshadowed the feminist movement of the 1970s with the ensuing rise of female heroes in contemporary literature.

•Aug. 4--(dual program) Rita Quillen is one of the many young Appalachian writers who has been nurtured by a strong community that exists among writers who call Appalachia home. She is not only a poet, but also a teacher, a bibliographer, and an anthologist, assisting in editing a popular Appalachian literature text book, *A Southern Appalachian Reader*. She is a member of the fifth generation of her family to live in the little community of Hiltons in southwest Virginia. Lou Crabtree, an octogenarian who has lived and taught school in southwest Virginia, is also featured in this program. Her stories in *Sweet Hollow* are starkly realistic, painting a sometimes gritty and unforgettable portrait in the themes of women growing older, raising a family, living with broken hearts, and loving despite pain.

•Aug. 11--In the work of Cherokee/Appalachian poet Marilou Awiakta, readers find the timeless, wise voice of Selu, the corn mother, who speaks the language of all things eternal. With the knowledge born of a culture that regards creation as a covenant and women as sacred keepers of the covenant, Awiakta writes poetry with a power that is decidedly spiritual. Calling upon her life as a Cherokee and Appalachian woman, she uses the music of the language and the land to construct hymns of praise, remembrance and hope.

•Aug. 18--George Ella Lyon has earned a unique spot in the Appalachian literary community as she is the region's most well-known and critically acclaimed author of children's books; the author of an award-winning book of poetry, *Catalpa*; a playwright and a noted critic. Lyon writes of the eternal truths with the voice of one who is self-aware and self-confident without arrogance, and virtuous and moral without self-righteousness.

•Aug. 25--No writer in this series speaks more to the issue of personal identity than Bobbie Ann Mason. As a child she moved from the country to the city and found herself to be the outsider, different. As an adult, she experienced these same feelings when she moved to New York, where Southerners were considered to be culturally disadvantaged. "It wasn't until I got over being ashamed of the way my people talk," she says, "that I was able to write their stories."

•Sept. 1--Denise Giardina grew up in a West Virginia coal camp keenly aware of ethnic diversity. She saw economic hardship and environmental nightmare which can result from a single-industry economy. All these experiences, she says, gave her a strong interest in history and social issues and helped fuel the anger that motivated her to write her highly-acclaimed Appalachian novels. She writes about the extraordinary acts of ordinary people and is in the vanguard of younger writers in the mountains.

•Sept. 8--Now in her seventies, National Book Award winner Mary Lee Settle has lived through some turbulent years in American history. Marrying an Englishman at the beginning of World War II, she went into the women's auxiliary of the Royal Air Force. After this stint in the military, she tried working for Harper's Bazaar, but realized that she didn't want to be a "lady editor"--she wanted to write books. Her most recent novel, Choices, follows one woman's involvement in the great social movements of the 20th century.

•Sept. 15--Though a rare eye disease is slowly taking her sight, Anne Shelby is not losing her literary vision. In her books, such as Homeplace, children visit a place where the images are sharp and clear, where the world is a good place to be. Shelby uses that most important sense of all for a writer--a sense of the past and present and the connection between them.

•Sept. 22--The most well-known and widely-read of the contemporary Appalachian writers would have to be Grundy, Va., writer Lee Smith. She recalls feeling guilty as a child because her father owned the local dime store, which made her relatively better off than the kids whose fathers worked in the coal mines. Though Smith now makes her home in the university town of Chapel Hill, N.C., and her novels are widely read beyond the South, she returns again and again to the Appalachian Mountains in her novels.

•Sept. 29--Since the 1960s Nikki Giovanni has been sharing herself with the world through her poetry. Her unique perspective on the human condition, on American history, on life and poetry and being a woman produces a body of work with a distinctive voice. She is both the outsider, the skinny black kid standing on the street corner in Knoxville, and the insider, a university professor and activist speaking from a position of respect and authority.
