Outlook

After an 18-5 season last year as a club sport, Morehead State University's women's softball team will become a Division II team sport this year.

MSU's assistant basketball coach Loretta Marlow will be the first head coach. Though this will be a new experience for the Lady Eagles, Marlow feels her squad should easily hold its own.

"If we can go 18-5 in our first season as a club sport, I think it's obvious we have an abundance of talent here," Marlow said. "Several good athletes tried out. It wasn't easy to pick a squad."

Top returnees for the Lady Eagles include Vicky Arlinghaus, an Elsmere sophomore who was named to the all-state tournament team last year; Sue Turner, Butler senior; Bridget Clay, Prestonsburg junior, Terry Caristo, Winchester junior; Jamie Hickle, Vanceburg junior; Diane Vordenberg, Cincinnati junior; Liz Blakeslee, Worthington, Ohio, junior; Patti Porter, Batavia, Ohio, sophomore; and Kim Cecil, New Haven senior.

Northern Kentucky and Kentucky should provide the toughest competition in the state. NKU and UK were two of only three teams to beat MSU last year. MSU went 0-2 against NKU and 4-1 against Kentucky.
