We hoped at that time that the president of the Morehead State Teachers College was big enough for his job, that he would surmount the obstacles that confronted him, that he would force his way over and through and around them, until the spirit voiced would be the prevailing spirit of this community.

That was in 1956. Since that time we have waited, patiently or inspatiently, for that great day to come, when the spirit of the town and the school would be no more, but a greater spirit of united effort to huild both would arrive. We have waited in vain.

We had hoped to see the Morehead State Teachers College run as college should be run, for the people of Kentucky, without politics, for the good of the students. That was the promise that the president made in 1956. If he had carried out that promise he would not now be subject to the criticism he is receiving, not only at the hands of the Rowan County, News, not only at the hands of the citizens of Morehead and Rowan County, but at the hands of every right thinking citizen of Eastern Kentucky, oht Republican and Democrat, for his failure to rise above petty politics and for his self-seeking attempt to build a hybrid political organization to prepetuate himself in a position he is not able to fill.


