

GOOD RIDDANCE OF BAD RUBBISH.

Peace About to Visit War-Worn Kentucky Once More.

LEXINGTON, Ky., Aug. 10.—There is a strong probability that the famous Rowan county troubles are at an end. For years the feud has given Kentucky a bad name throughout the country, and the prospect of a settlement will be hailed with satisfaction throughout the commonwealth. Craig Tolliver and Cook Humphrey, leaders of the rival factions, have agreed to leave Rowan county forever. Papers to that effect have already been signed. The prosecution has consented to compromise by dismissing the cases against Tolliver and Humphrey. A conviction of the parties would be hard to secure, on account of the difficulty of procuring witnesses, etc.; so that this compromise is deemed the best plan to secure peace for a distracted portion of the state. Humphrey is preparing to leave for Texas, where he will go into the cattle business. Craig Tolliver will locate either in Kansas or Missouri, and will leave for his future home this week.
