We had intended to close the series of editorials dealing with the conduct and corruption rampant in the Morehead State Teachers College with the editorial in the last issue. We felt that we had come the ground to such an extent that the citizens of this section were aware of the hazard to the institution. However developments during the past week have made it imperative that we accept the challenge. We have been threatened and we have been facused. We have re-

ed subtle suggestions that we would suffer from the react rials and we have been accused of seeking to wreck and

injure the Morehead State Teachers College out of a spirit of revenge. A defense against such a charge is sunnecessary. We have felt in common with the vast majority of the citizens, not only of Rowan county, but of Eastern Kentucky, that a cancer was being nurtured on the breast, say the very heart of Morehead, a cancer that was striking at the very visials of the institution and slowing but inevitably suppling its attength, undermining its health, reducing its resistance. When each a situation arises, in the medical world there is but one method of procedure, that is the removal of the foreign growth. That we believe to be the need of Morehead. We do not believe in the falacious doctrine of covering up. We have been ostrich-like humans too long, burying our heads in the sands of silence. The festering wound should be opened, cleaned out, a healing olimment applied.

On Wednesday of last week four of the best, most up-right and honest women of Morehead drove to Louisville to visit Chandleg head-quarters. One was the widow of the greatest man Morehead has ever ladd or ever will have. Two were the wives of two of Morehead's prominent citizens. One was the daughter of a former citizen, now dead. All are among the spost highly respected in the community, leaders in al and political life, as well as in civic activities.

Shortly after these women left town, the president of the Morehead State Teachers College and his publicity agent viated the office of a prominent citizen and requested, "Call Dan Talbot and tell him that four women are coming down from Morehead to see him and tell him not to believe anything they say or to pay any attention to them. They can't tell the truth."

By inference he called them liars, when he made the statement, Later he was called to the home of one of the women mutioned and admitted that he had made the statement, although he claimed that he had not referred to but one of the women.

Think of it, men and women of Morehead, of Rowan county, of Kentucky: The president of the Morehead State Teachers College so bemeaning himself, so sinking himself, as to attempt to besmirch the good name, the character, the integrity, the honesty of these four Morehead women. Who Ain't in Morehead, for the man who could or would even in the throes of an agony of apprehension, attack the character of decent women, simply AIN'T.

This man who has the temerity to christen these good women as liars, should be simmarily dealt with. He should be made to know without fear of misunderstanding that the men of Morehead will not lolerate such discussions or such statements.


