MOREHEAD, Ky.---For more than 30 years, Dr. Hanif Wahab has been collecting African American artifacts. Now he is sharing his comprehensive collection with everyone who visits the Karamu House Inc., in Cleveland, Ohio.

Dr. Wahab established the Karamu House, the first multicultural performing arts theater and visual arts institution in the United States, to provide education on people who have advanced black culture. He remains the museum's consultant and curator.

He will discuss his heritage and findings, some of which are rare and unique, during a lecture at Morehead State University on Wednesday, Feb. 12. The talk, entitled "The African Experience in America," will begin at 7 p.m. in the Crager Room, Adron Doran University Center.

In recognition of his work, Dr. Wahab was the recipient of the Achievement of the Year Award for 1989 and 1990 for museums and also was awarded the Carter G. Woodson Award for African American history.

A former faculty member at Cleveland State University and the University of the West Indies, Dr. Wahab also is founder of the Harriet Tubman Museum in Cleveland which honors the late American abolitionist.

Capping the day's activities at 6:30 p.m. in the Crager Room, Adron Doran University Center, will be the Alumni Awards Dinner, highlighted by the induction of three new members into MSU's Alumni Hall of Fame.

His interest in combining various art disciplines to create "new forms that reflect the reality of living in the information age" has resulted in him being awarded three New Forms Grants through the Rockefeller Foundation/NEA Regional Re-Grants Program.

He was recently awarded a Regional Artists Grant through the Randolph Street Gallery in Chicago which he used to create a major new installation which incorporates video and performance exploring "catastrophic scales."

A frequent guest lecturer at many educational institutions, he graduated from Florida State University with an M.F.A. degree and the Kansas City Art Institute with a B.F.A. degree.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---During the late hours on a rainy June night, Morehead State University student Roger Hicks took to running the streets of Covington, with a couple of thousand people cheering him on.

"It was a tremendous rush to see all those people in the driving rain waving American flags," the Knott County native said of his opportunity to carry the Olympic torch as it passed through Kentucky last year. "Next to my wedding and the birth of my daughter, it's the most memorable thing that has ever happened to me."

Hicks was one of 115 Kentucky "community heroes" chosen out of over 600 applicants to carry the torch in the traditional pre-Olympic relay. Currently a resident of West Liberty, he was the only one chosen who lived east of Winchester.

"It was really flattering to be nominated," Hicks said. He was selected because he has spent much of his life helping other people overcome alcohol and drug abuse, vices which took him years to beat.

A high school graduate by the time he was 16, Hicks had the potential to go to college and get a degree but he blew that opportunity, he says, because he got involved with alcohol. After a long battle, he overcame his problems and began working in a shelter with those who abuse alcohol and drugs.

A few years ago he made the decision to give college a try. "I've always wanted to hang that degree on my wall," he said. He now goes to classes full time during the day at MSU then heads to Lexington to work at a shelter from 4 p.m. until midnight. Hicks fills his life this way because he believes that "we're all given something to achieve in this life."

The "celebrity status" from carrying the Olympic Torch has given Hicks new ground on which to achieve his goals. He is networking with other actively involved people and hopes to assist in starting an association of torchbearers, in which the participants of the relay work together as a speakers bureau to help others.

As Hicks ran the streets of Covington last June, he thought of those who helped him reach that point: his wife, Candice, who has gradually become very ill, his parents, and a late friend, Don West.

According to Hicks, West was a counselor and example for him. One day during the later years of his life, West was alone in his garden when he fell and was unable to get up. "Two of his neighbors happened to walk by and asked if they could help him into the house, where he could clean up and rest," Hicks said. "Don simply answered, 'Stand me up, hand me the hoe, and I'll try to hoe to the end of the row'."

Hicks shares this example to show the approach he uses in helping others. "Get up every day and put your head through the collar," he said firmly. "No matter how tough, don't ever give up."

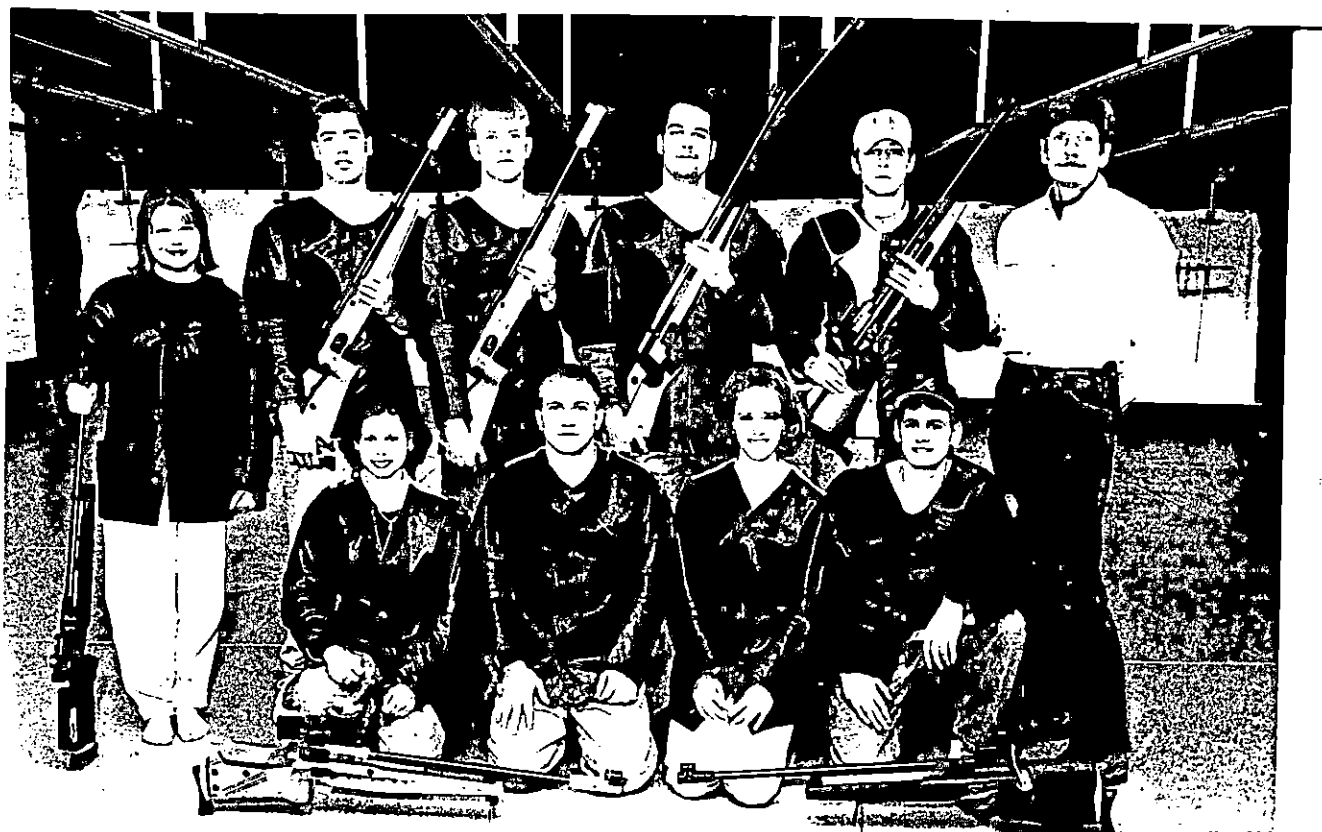

"Gene is a consummate classroom teacher and a fine professional musician, so this honor comes as no surprise to those who know and work with him," said Dr. Christopher Gallaher, chair of MSU's Department of Music. "His students and colleagues hold him in high esteem," Dr. Gallaher added.

One former student who also taught with Norden, Dr. Larry Blocher, now at Wichita State University, said that Norden "teaches out of a genuine love of music and of his students."

Another former student, Chuck Edwards, music director at Bourbon County High School, said, "From the start, I felt Mr. Norden was genuinely concerned with my education and general welfare. But as I grow older, I see this teacher/student relationship was not unique to me, that Mr. Norden has a deep sense of concern for all of his students, and this concern and attachment was for life."

Noting that she could not think of a person more appropriate as a role model for students or band directors, Nan Moore, director of bands at Louisville Male High School, said, "His door is and always has been open to students who need the help and support of a caring adult. Mr. Norden is never too busy to lend an ear or a helping hand to band directors who need help."

A member of MSU's faculty since 1968 when he came as assistant director of bands, Norden today primarily teaches music education courses and saxophone. He served as director of the University's bands from 1981 to 1985.

An evaluator and trainer for the Kentucky Teacher Internship Program, he coordinates MSU's annual middle school instrumental clinics and for several years coordinated the summer band camps.

Active in various community organizations, Norden is a former bishop of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, Owingsville Stake. Norden and his wife, the former Sandy Abrams of Lucasville, Ohio, are the parents of six children.

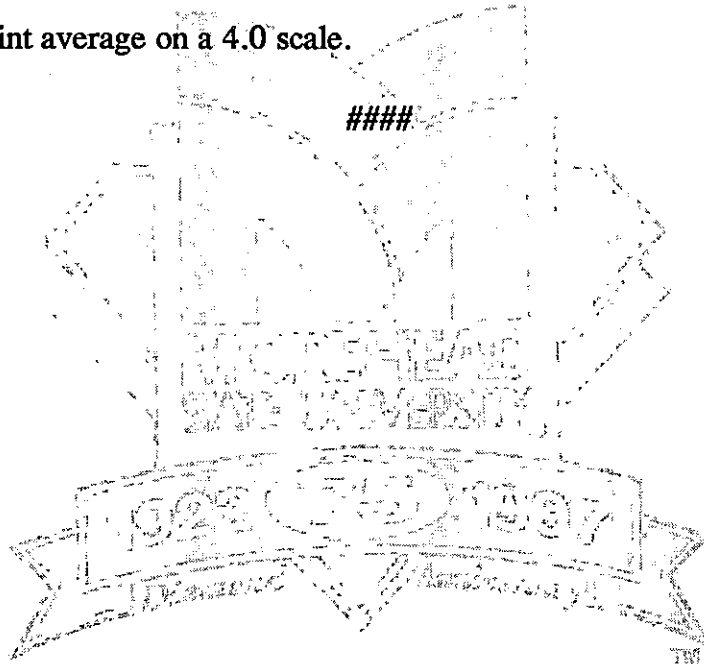
