The project consists of two divisions, radio and workshop. The radio section is to employ twenty boys, Markham said, and the remainder will work in the workshop. The project has twenty more vacancies for persons not taking academic work, a limited number of which are in the radio division and open to regular school students.

Plans for the project include the construction of an amateur radio station, which will be supervised by Mr. William V. NYA supervisor from Louisville.

The workshop project will build two radio sets, one for the use of the radio station and one for the use of the workshop.

Mr. Markham stated that with the arrival of the students, the radio station would be placed in operation.

Mr. Markham has been with the project since its inception, and holds a reserve commission in the First Air in the Marine Service for some years.
