Three large lowers that no doubt cost a considerable amount of money have been to built over-looking many miles of this area.

Three bridges have been constructed. Travel previously was im-sible until these bridges were put in. Now these roads can be travelled the entire year

They live on poor farms classified main by by the Unified States Department of Agriculture as "substained farms." Many try to grow timber and corn on the same land. It is not unusual for a man to spend a day working in corn fields for each bushel of corn obtained. These people are fighting hard to keep off the roller folls.

This forest area is fast becoming a mecca for tourists. is almost unmatachable. It is estimated that several hundred thousand tourists have visited this forest area.
