- 1. Mateness—ne sent throwing it away.
  2. Tobacco—Throw pipe ashes and cigar or eigerette satus of the road and stamp out any first. Do not throw to sent the saturation of the
- o. r-uting out a camp fire—sur the coast while sometime that water, turn ginall sticks and drench both sides; wet, the coals while souking Piem with water; if water is not obtainable, sar in earth and tread it down until packed tight over and around the fire. Be sure the
- I spark is dead.

  Smoking out animals—Never attempt to smoke animals out of holes, or hollow logs or trees.

  Thrush or clearing fire—Never build brush or clearing fires in windy weather or when there is the slightest danger of their escaping.

The above is good, sound advice that we should all follow. It will mean longer life for our forests and more game to hunt. There is nothing that tends more to destroy with life than fire in our farest. Fortugately the forest Rangers and the local CCC camp have demonstrated that they are able to extinguish forest fires in a minimum of time, but the best remedy is prevention.
