Democrats Gain 41 In Registrations Since August Primary

Republicans Trail Now By 660; Lists, However, Not Yet Purged This Year

Rowan County now has a total registration advantage for Democrats according to figures released Friday by County Clerk C. W. Alfrey, following the close of registration for participation in the November general election. Since registration opened after the August primary 60 Democrats and 10 Republicans registered. The Democrats had previously held an edge of 619. However, it is generally agreed that for some unexplainable reason there are more Democrats registered who are not eligible to vote here than are Republicans with the same status. Actually with a strict purge the Democratic majority might fall below 500, most politicians believe.

Loan Made By Peoples Bank; County Will Save Two Percent In Interest

The Rowan County Fiscal Court voted unanimously this week to borrow \$50,000 from the Peoples Bank for the purpose of issuing the usual 6 percent interest bearing warrants on which no money was available to pay them off. Following the making of the loan the court paid out a large number of claims. Outstanding among these was the payment of claims for election officers in the June 4 special election and the August 6 primary. Among other claims allowed was one for \$613.20 to the jailer. The magistrates discussed the recent ruling of Circuit Judge H. Ford which tied up all the highway money of the county.

Two Members Of Education Bd. To Be Elected

Terms Of Bill Layne And Alvin Caudill Expire On January 1, 1939

Two members of the Rowan County Board of Education are to be elected in November to fill the places now held by Bill Layne and Alvin Caudill, whose terms will expire January 1. Considerable misunderstanding has resulted under the many changes of law as regarding the public school system in Kentucky of which the election of Board members is one. In 1935, Sam C. Caudill and Herbert Bradley were elected to the Board. However, instead of being named for four years as most people thought, they were elected for three years, to serve from January 1, 1936 to January 1, 1939. After both resigned and Layne and Caudill were appointed to fill their places. The two members to be elected this year will serve for four years, however, their term will start January 1, 1939 and continue until January 1, 1943. Another controversial subject is whether the school election will be held at the same time as the general election this year. It will be held on the same day, although a separate ballot will be used. However, the new law stipulates that the school election cannot be held on the same day as county officers are named. The appointment of Honorable Ernest E. Shannon as a member of the Board of Regents of the Morehead State Teachers College will undoubtedly meet favorable comment from friends of the Morehead State Teachers College.

Mr. Shannon is well known to a large number of people in Morehead. He has always been very popular here as well as throughout this section of Kentucky. The high position which he holds as State Auditor is ample evidence of the ability which he has.

The advice of Mr. Shannon will be very valuable in forming policies at the Morehead State Teachers College. In making this appointment the Governor acted wisely and well.

Ashland Opens A New College

Competition is becoming keener for the Morehead State Teachers College each year. There is no mistaking this fact and there is no need to dodge the issue. It will be far better to face it squarely and build the foundation for a continued battle.

The Ashland Junior College opened its doors this week, taking from Morehead many students who would otherwise attend school here. Ashlanders argue that this new Junior College may prove a boon for Morehead for after they give the students two years training many of them will finish their college work at Morehead.

Actually Ashland's new college falls far short of offering the same kind of advanced training that one may receive at Morehead. That school does not have the plant, the facilities, the background nor the money to provide educational training that Morehead offers.

The school has one advantage... it is located in a thickly populated area and is practically to the mouth of the Big Sandy river, a section from which Morehead has always drawn a large part of its student body.

It is squarely up to Morehead to maintain its competition and new competition that may come in the future. Morehead is eastern Kentucky's college. Better training, better advertising and a better community are three big features in attracting students to Morehead.

A National Safety Laboratory

The use of the Baltimore-Washington Highway as a national laboratory of traffic safety has been proposed by the American Legion. It looks like an important, practical step in attacking the nation's traffic accident problem.

The plan, as explained by Bruce T. Bair, retiring Commander of the Maryland Legion, calls for the Baltimore-Washington Boulevard, one of the most heavily traveled highways in the country, to be modernized to incorporate the most advanced methods in road design, construction and traffic planning.

Because it leads to and from the nation's capital, this is about the one highway in the country which would attract widespread national interest. Every state might well develop similar model, safety highways, in the light of the experiments and experience developed here by the Federal government.

A Harry Moore, Governor of New Jersey and Chairman of the President's Accident Prevention Conference, has assured the Legion of the interest of the Conference. The project has also been endorsed by Governor Nice of Maryland and others. It would seem appropriate that such a Federal safety laboratory should be established at the Capital's front door.

Canada A Good Neighbor

Americans generally, of all degrees of political faith and affiliations will heartily agree with President Roosevelt's expression of our national affection toward our sister nation to the North, the Dominion of Canada.

When Mr. Roosevelt said at Kingston, Ontario, "I give you my assurance that the people of the United States will not stand idly by if domination of Canadian soil is threatened by any other empire," he practically extended the Monroe Doctrine to cover the whole American continent.

There is every reason why Canada should be included. The interests of Canada and of the United States are identical. Any intrusion upon Canada's freedom by a foreign power would be a serious menace to us.

New Little expected here of displacement of any considerable number of Democratic Senators by Republicans. House seats shifts from "New Deal" Democrats to "Old-Line" Democrats are expected in the Upper House. This is regarded as very certain in New York's representation, where, unless there should be a general shift of the voters to the Republican ticket, which is not seriously regarded as possible, one of the two Senators to be elected is pretty certain to be a conservative Democrat opposed to the Administration policies.

Governor Lehman, regarded as the certain nominee for the Senate vacancy caused by the death of Senator Copeland, comes into that category, and at present there is no Republican in sight who is considered to have a chance to defeat him.

Republicans are building more hope for a Senatorial gain in Pennsylvania when the Democratic candidate, Governor Earl, is considered to have lost a great deal of his popularity in the way of New York, who is not only Anti-New Deal but holds the powerful position of Chairman of the Committee on Banking and Currency.

Most New Dealers believe that a big increase in Republican membership, with the simulation that would give to anti-New Deal Democratic majorities in the House, would virtually halt the Roosevelt program and eliminate the possibility of a Presidential third term.

Others, especially Democrats, believe that the tendencies, take the opposite view. The pressure upon the President to attack New Deal doubters at the Democratic primaries is increasing. Those of his advisers who believe that it is good strategy for Mr. Roosevelt to see at the risk of losing some Congress seats to the Republicans his personal standing with the voters and put himself in a position to dictate the terms of any party harmony pact in 1940. That is what all of the Democratic party "purge" is about.

WAGE DIFFICULTIES The Federal Commission to establish regulations for the control of wages and hours in industry, under the new labor laws, is expected to meet on October 1, having considerable difficulty in working out schedules, which will meet the approval of labor on one hand and of employers on the other.

Another complication is the contention of powerful labor leaders that the regulations set up by the committee should be such as to prevent any reduction of wages to the legal minimum by industries which are now paying more than the minimum.

Close observers here see a rival of the deal between William Green and his American Federation of Labor and John L. Lewis of the Committee for Industrial Organization, over the rulings of the Commission, which ever little may turn out to be.

At present, the feeling is that the Federation is gaining in prestige and political influence and that C. I. O. is losing. Further action is expected when the President's committee which has been studying European labor laws makes its report, which is expected to point toward more restrictions upon the rights of unions to disregard the rights of employers.

Whatever the results of the primaries and the elections here, the Senate would still have a Democratic majority even if every Democratic Senatorial candidate were beaten by a Republican, which is of course impossible. Only one-third of the Senatorial terms expire this year, and more than a majority of the entire Senate consists of Democratic hold-overs.

end of Long Island, to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the return of his former regiment, the First U. S. Volunteer Cavalry from the Spanish-American war. The event took my memory back to "Teddy" Roosevelt and his remarkable personality and career, and the political history which he made.

When Col. Roosevelt landed at Montauk at the head of his troops he had the Republican nomination for Governor of New York "in the bag." He little dreamed that three years he would be President of the United States. I was with him throughout his campaign and during his term as Governor. He got in by the skin of his teeth. It was a Republican year in New York. If the Democrats had had political sense enough to nominate a war hero to oppose "Teddy" they would have beaten him. As it was, he was seraped through by a bare 18,000 plurality.

Teddy Roosevelt made enemies of all the machine politicians, but how the common people of his time idolized him. No president before or since had such a hold on the public imagination, except perhaps his fifth cousin, Franklin.

REFORMER The people loved "Teddy" Roosevelt well because he was a temperamental a hero of oppression and all his public life an apostle of political reform. The politicians of his own party hated him because he was a reformer.

As a young member of the legislature he fought the bosses and put through the first tenement-house reform bill. He was a consummate showman and could dramatize him self and the causes he advocated in a way which appealed to the public heart. He took orders from nobody and was the boss of whatever job he was in. U. S. Civil Service Commissioner, New York City Police Commissioner and Assistant Secretary of the Navy "Teddy" stole the show and made people like it.

When the party bosses discovered that they couldn't get orders from the young man they had made Governor of New York they tried to "kick him upstairs" by getting him nominated for vice president in 1900. He was elected with McKinley and took office March 4, 1901. Three months later President McKinley had been murdered and Theodore Roosevelt was President of the United States.

What made "Teddy's" career so interesting is the fact that although he was the wealthiest man who ever occupied the White House, his interest and sympathies were all on the side of the common people. Rich men mostly hated him, called him a "traitor to his class."

When "Teddy" first ventured into politics at 23, as a candidate for the legislature, his friends and family protested. "You'll have to rub elbows with crooks, hangers and all sorts of disreputable characters," they told him. "If that's so, then they are governing class," he replied. "I intend to belong to that class."

So sickly as a boy that his family feared he would never live to grow up, his eyesight so impaired that he had to have constant attendants from oculists, Teddy Roosevelt built himself into an athlete by sheer strength of will. Of all the men I have ever known, I think of none who had such indomitable courage and such persistence in the face of opposition.

I had many opportunities to observe Theodore Roosevelt's courage in standing up for what he believed to be the right, no matter how strong the political pressure to do something else might be. He was never a compromiser for the sake of expediency. He went around and did what he thought ought to be done, regardless of political consequences.

I once heard him say that his conception of the authority of the President was that he could do anything which the Constitution did not prohibit him from doing, where-as his predecessors had the view that the President's powers were limited to what the Constitution specifically permitted him to do. It was that quality of boldness and aggressiveness which made "Teddy" the most popular Chief Executive the nation had ever had since Washington, and which made him a menacing figure to the eyes of every reactionary interest which he opposed.

HISTORY "Teddy" influenced world history by one exploit which he undertook on his own responsibility. That was the building of the Panama Canal. For the adequate protection of both coasts of the United States the canal was essential, to move the fleet from the Atlantic to the Pacific without a 3,000 mile detour around Cape Horn. Funds For Kentucky Highway Patrol Are 'Tied Up'

Chandler Says Some Method Will Be Found To Pay State Officers

Gov. A. B. Chandler, returned Saturday from a north woods vacation, found the state highway patrol facing an acute problem in the lack of funds to operate its automobiles.

The chief executive who left Finance Commissioner J. Dan Talbot in the northern Canadian hills still recuperating from the illness that both suffered in July, promised however, "we'll find a way to keep the state police in operation."

The highway patrol automobiles had to be stored today at Highway Commissioner Robert Humphreys' residence further honoring of requisitions for gas and oil.

Clinic Planned At Mt. Sterling On Sept. 21

Crippled Children Will Be Given Examinations, Treatments Without Charge

Plans are now under way in six counties for a free clinic for crippled children to be held in the First Christian Church, Mt. Sterling, on Wednesday, September 21, by the Kentucky Crippled Children Commission, the organization which has provided corrective treatment for more than six thousand crippled youngsters whose parents cannot pay for hospital or medical care.

Counties for whose benefit the clinic is arranged are: Bath, Menifee, Montgomery, Powell, Morgan, and Rowan. A similar clinic has been held in Mt. Sterling for several years.

Dr. T. A. E. Evans, Morehead, is chairman of the committee which has been formed in Rowan County to promote the clinic. Private transportation to Mt. Sterling and back children in need of examination. Anyone who knows of a crippled child is asked to report the name to Dr. Evans.

The Commission has held 19 state clinics since last April at which more than 1200 crippled boys and girls have been examined by some surgeons. Approximately one third of this number have gone into the hospitals for treatment. Hospital centers used by the Commission are at Ashland, Lexington, and Louisville. In each of these cities, headquarters of the surgeons who care for the commission's patients there are special wards for crippled children in the various hospitals. The commission pays the hospitals a weekly fee for the treatment of cases under its supervision. Hence, three-fourths of the commission's state appropriation is spent for hospital care of crippled children. Other items of expense are the holding of clinics such as the one planned for Mt. Sterling, traveling expenses of field nurses who plan the clinics and visit crippled children in their homes, transport of patients, etc.

The Kentucky Society for Crippled Children, which conducted a campaign for funds last spring to supplement the Commission's appropriation, has raised nearly \$45,000 which is being used to hold more clinics this year and to hospitalize many children who were not for the donations of citizens throughout the state, who have always rallied to the support of this work.

Thirty Six Enroll In Vocational Training Classes

Study On Seed Corn Is Now Being Conducted By Morehead Groups

Thirty six pupils enrolled in the Vocational Agricultural classes in the Morehead School. All the pupils seem to be very interested in their work and are looking forward to the events that this department will conduct through out the year.

Most of the time in class work was taken up in selecting seed corn from the field in the fall of the year. Few people select seed corn in the fall and farmers should know that it is a good practice and very little time and expense is involved.

From the studies that were made the best time to select seed is in late September or the first of October depending on the season. Corn contains about forty percent moisture when picked early from the field and should be dried out as quickly as possible. If corn that is to be planted the next spring remains in the field and freezes a few times more damage will be done and a poor stand of corn is likely to be the result.

Selection may be done in a number of ways, a good economical way is to take a sack of some kind and go through the field and select the best ears from the desirable stalks. The stalks chosen should be straight, good size, free from smut and preferably two ears to a stalk.

Seed corn that was kept in the following conditions: 1. Dried at 25 to 30 degrees F. 2. Stored in a cool, dry place. 3. Seed containing 10 to 15 percent moisture and the temperature range was from 32 to 28 degrees F. 4. A 100 percent germination was affected. Another test was made on corn that had a moisture content of 25 to 25 percent and the temperature ranged from 32 to 28 degrees F. The grains germinated, on corn that had a moisture content of 25 to 30 percent the germination was affected at 32 percent.

The main objective is to get the seed corn dried to a very low moisture content so as to prevent freezing. When the embryo (heart) freezes the life part of the plant of next year is affected and the power to germinate is lowered considerably.

On examination it was found the corn in the field at present in sprout in the husk. This is caused by continued sprouts of warm, damp weather and if one waits to plant seed from the crib the chance are the seed will be of poor quality.

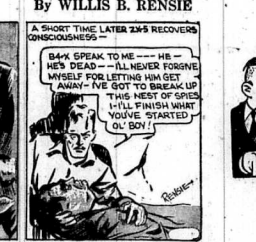

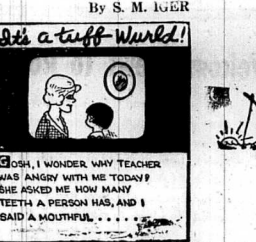
