# Eagles Will Meet One Of Nations Biggest Teams Here Saturday

**Lawrence Tech, Of Detroit, Mich., Has Team Average Of 200 Pounds**

The Morehead College Eagles will be outweighed at least 15 pounds to the man here Saturday afternoon when they meet Lawrence Tech of Detroit, Mich., a check of the weights of the two squads shows.

The coach doesn't mean that the Eagles have a midsize club in fact Ellis Johnson's probable starting line will average 185 pounds and the backfield 170, giving the club an exceptionally big team has a total that averages from end to end 206 pounds. Included in this list are two giant tackles.

Len Miller scouted the Eagles last Friday and warned the Tech team not to take any chances with the inveterate Morehead weight club, a heavy favorite over the Michigan Club, but the coaching staff is taking no chances.

Morehead's battle cry changed this week from "Beat Murray" to "Let's Take Tech." This doesn't mean that Morehead isn't pointing for the Murray mission, but there is no question but that this is no question but that this is the most important date on the schedule and Morehead hopes to avenge the only two defeats they have suffered since Ellis Johnson and Len Miller came to Morehead. However, the coaches don't wish to cross any bridges before they come to them, and a loss to Lawrence Tech would hurt Morehead's prestige more than if they dropped a decision to Murray.

Judge D. H. Caudill Will Hear Injunction On Incorporation

A large portion of the time allotted for the October term of Rowan Circuit Court will be taken up in hearing civil actions. Circuit Court Judge D. H. Caudill, will hear the criminal docket in the lightest in years, but there are a number of cases bound over from lower court which means that the grand jury will probably be in session all week.

From a local viewpoint the most important question to come before Judge Caudill will be an attempt to decide whether the City of Ordinance annexing a portion of West Morehead shall stand. Following the incorporation of this area a number of citizens filed an injunction suit to halt the city from taking it.

Depositions in the incorporating controversy have already been taken by both sides. All that remains for Judge Caudill to make his ruling on the matter, from which there is no appeal.

No murder cases and few felonies will be heard at this term of court.

S. S. Act Not Understood By Many (Continued From Page One) Insurance Provision has one as the lower limit...

Any profession that is covered by the Law must comply with the requirements of getting an identification number for the employer and requiring an account number for the employee...

Farmers, school teachers, religious workers and domestic helpers in the home are not required to comply with the law, but doctors, lawyers, filling station, insurance agents, stores, factories, and any other profession except the ones that I have excluded must have an employer and require that every employee have an account number in order to avoid the penalties that are imposed by the Bureau of Internal Revenue on the matter of tax collections...

Any employer needing an identification number for the employer should call at Morehead for a Form SS-4 to be filled out and sent to Lexington Social Security office for an identification number. Any employer without a number who is working for any of the covered occupations should see the Postmaster and get Form SS-5 to be properly filled out and mailed to the Lexington Social Security office for an account number...
