MOREHEAD, KY.---His office is used as a warehouse, his home is located in the building where he works and he is on call 24 hours a day. But Clyde James likes it that way. As university center services manager, he oversees the daily operation of the Adron Doran University Center (ADUC) on the Morehead State University campus.

"The best part is the students," he said. "The least favorite part is using my office as a warehouse--storing broken equipment until we can get it repaired, maintaining supplies for the game room, etc."

James has been working directly with students since 1967 when he first joined the business faculty at MSU. He served as the first director of Cartmell Hall that opened in 1969. Later, he left the University to work in Iowa, and when a job opened in student activities the next year, he returned home to MSU.

"The job was for one year," he said. "I've now been back 24."

He moved into the director's apartment in ADUC 17 years ago when the director moved into a house more suitable for his family. James rented the apartment on the second floor. Now his position requires that he live on the premises.

Eleven years ago when he became director of the student center, James' staff for the office and game room was students and the same is still true today. They help him from 8 a.m. until closing time, during the evenings and on the weekends. In the constant chaos that surrounds his office, James has to know he can depend on the student workers to handle the pressure while at the same time getting things done.

“ADUC could not run without the students,” he said. “I depend on my student workers. They are most of my staff. I know that if I need to I can leave them in charge.”

James describes his job as often being a goodwill ambassador for the University. He is always greeting people and trying to make them comfortable when they visit his “home.” That includes the groups outside the University that use the center for business meetings, workshops and conferences.

“I meet most people who come in here for meetings,” he said. “We try to have things set up to suit the needs of the groups. If they are unhappy, then I haven't done my job. If they ask for something that isn't in the room they requested, then they are unhappy.

“This job requires the person in charge to be very attuned to what is going on around the building and the campus. You have to listen to people and meet their needs.”

MOREHEAD, Ky.---A state-of-the-art cable system is among the newest services awaiting students when they return for the fall semester at Morehead State University.

Registration for the upcoming term will be held on campus Aug. 12-14, with the first day designated as a business day. All MSU classes, including evening and off-campus, begin on Monday, Aug. 17.

The new television cable system will include the latest in digital video technology and expand the number of channels available in the residence halls for student viewing, according to Beth Patrick, assistant vice president for Information Technology (IT). "Recent installation of fiber optic cable to all major campus buildings, as well as the availability of new, less expensive video technology, has reduced the total project cost making it possible to fund the new cable system," she said.

MSU students will now have a basic cable service of 24 channels, an expansion from the 17 channels which had been offered. It is available free of charge to all students paying fees to live in a residence hall. The channel selections were based on a survey completed by MSU's Residence Hall Association and Student Government Association (SGA) earlier this year. Among the offerings are three music channels, Black Entertainment Television (BET), Country Music Television (CMT) and MTV.

For the first time, students also will have the option to purchase additional channels and/or premium (movie) channels. The extended tier plan, featuring another 24 channels, is available for \$36 per room, per semester. Another option will allow students to subscribe to premium channels.

Adding a cable option to one's room requires only one stop, Patrick noted. Students may visit the Student Telecommunications Office, at 133 Butler Hall, and pay the fee. The new channels will readily be available for viewing.

But cable television is not the only place where there are technological advancements, according to Patrick. For those in residency at Fields Hall, students will now have direct network access through a dedicated ethernet connection beginning with the fall term. Students in other residence halls will continue to connect their personal computers to the campus network through the University's digital phone system. Also, nearly 200 new computers have been installed in laboratories and classrooms across campus.

With safety in mind, IT has upgraded the 39 existing emergency/courtesy phones on campus and added 10 new telephones to improve security. The new phones are equipped with lights and an emergency strobe flash when the phone is activated with a 911 call. The locations of the new emergency phones was a cooperative effort between the Office of Public Safety, SGA and IT.

To help get entering freshmen and new students off on the right track, the Office of Student Development will host an orientation program, Aug. 10-13. While most programs are designed to increase success in college, there also is a chance for making new friends and getting to know one's peers. Among the speakers will be Dr. Will Keim of Corvallis, Ore., author of "The Education of Character: Lessons for Beginners," and Mike Green who developed drug and alcohol programs in New Jersey.

Mixed in among the important messages will be comedian Chris Johnson on Aug. 12, the band Deaddogs on Aug. 13, and two nights of free admission to the movies on Aug. 14-15. Everyone is invited to the street dance/ice cream fest slated for Aug. 16, from 8 to 11 p.m. on University Boulevard and the lawn of the President's Home.

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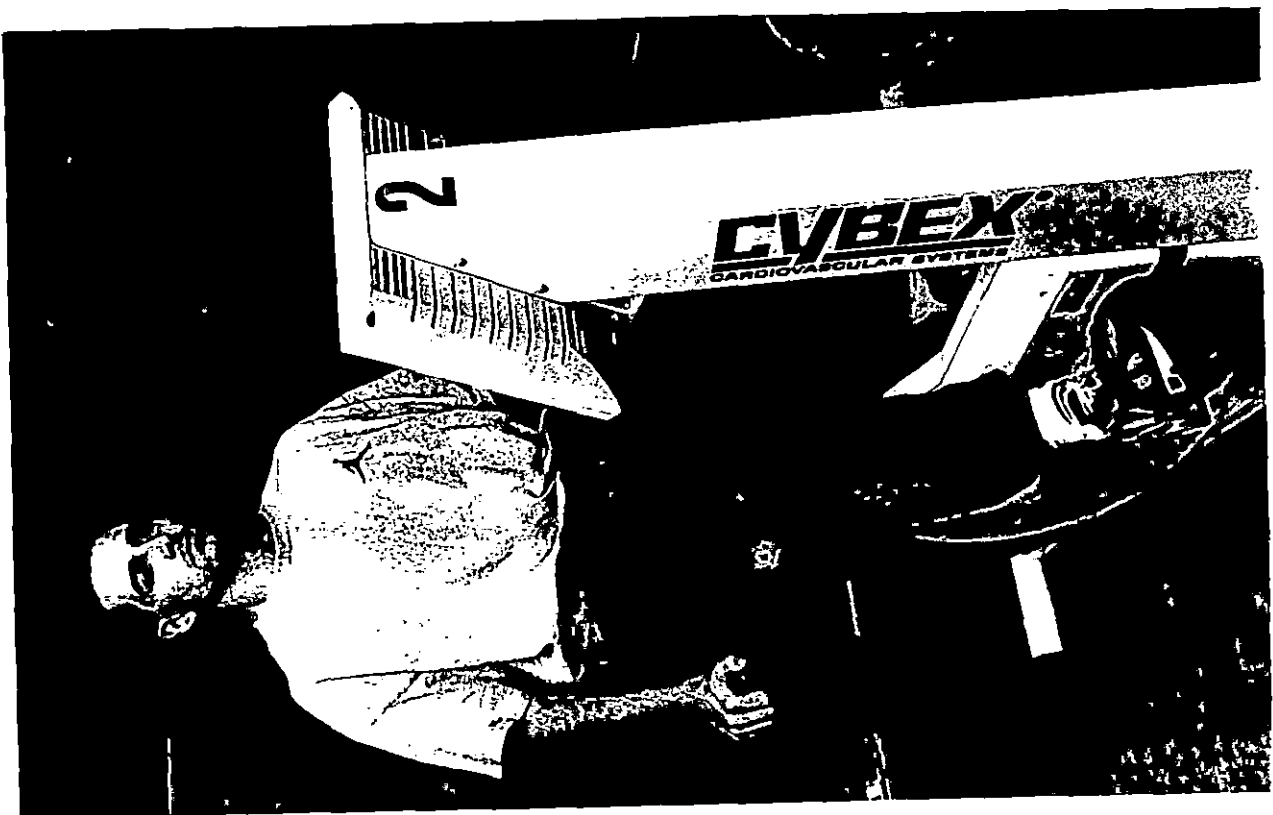
PEDDLING TOWARD AN EDUCATION

MOREHEAD, Ky.---While the weather is cooperating with warm, sunny days, motorcycle enthusiasts are enjoying leisurely rides around the countryside.

If learning to ride a motorcycle has been one of your goals, register now for one of the many classes offered by Morehead State University's Office of Community Development and Continuing Education in conjunction with the Kentucky Motorcycle Program.

There's Riding and Street Skills (RSS), a course for non-riders, new riders or those who want to brush up on their skills. The course offers instruction that covers on-cycle maneuvers in a controlled, off-street environment, learning the proper mounting technique and emergency braking. Participants must be at least 16 years of age to register and those under 18 must have parental consent.

The beginning course will be offered on a weekend: from 6-10 p.m. on Fridays and 8 a.m.-4 p.m., on Saturdays and Sundays for a minimum of 20 hours. It will be taught on Aug. 6-8, Aug. 21-23, Sept. 18-20 and Oct. 2-4, and next year on March 19-21, April 9-11, April 23-25, May 7-9, May 29-30, June 11-13, and June 19-20.

For riders who want to fine tune their street skills, the Experienced RiderCourse (ERC) may be for you. Learning the mental strategies to avoid risk will be discussed in the classroom instruction portion. The course is designed for individuals who have a current motorcycle license, have access to a street cycle and have riding experience.

The advanced class is a one-day offering which runs from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. for a minimum of eight hours. Scheduled dates are Aug. 29, Sept. 5, Sept. 19, Sept. 26, Oct. 24, March 6, March 27, April 3, April 17, May 15, May 22, and June 5.

The registration fee is \$75 for the basic course and \$40 for the advanced class. Because of limited class size, early registration is encouraged. All classes begin at MSU's Waterfield Hall Conference Center. Instructors are approved by the Kentucky Motorcycle Program.

With experience as an educator, residence hall director, educational program coordinator and campus minister, Dr. Keim will discuss ways to get the most from the college experience.

"He will address a number of items, including time management and self-esteem along with social issues, in a very positive and humorous manner," Weathers said.
