The scholarship, offered through the fraternity, is designed to help defray travel expenses for people who desire to go to Phi Delta Kappa-sponsored seminars held abroad.

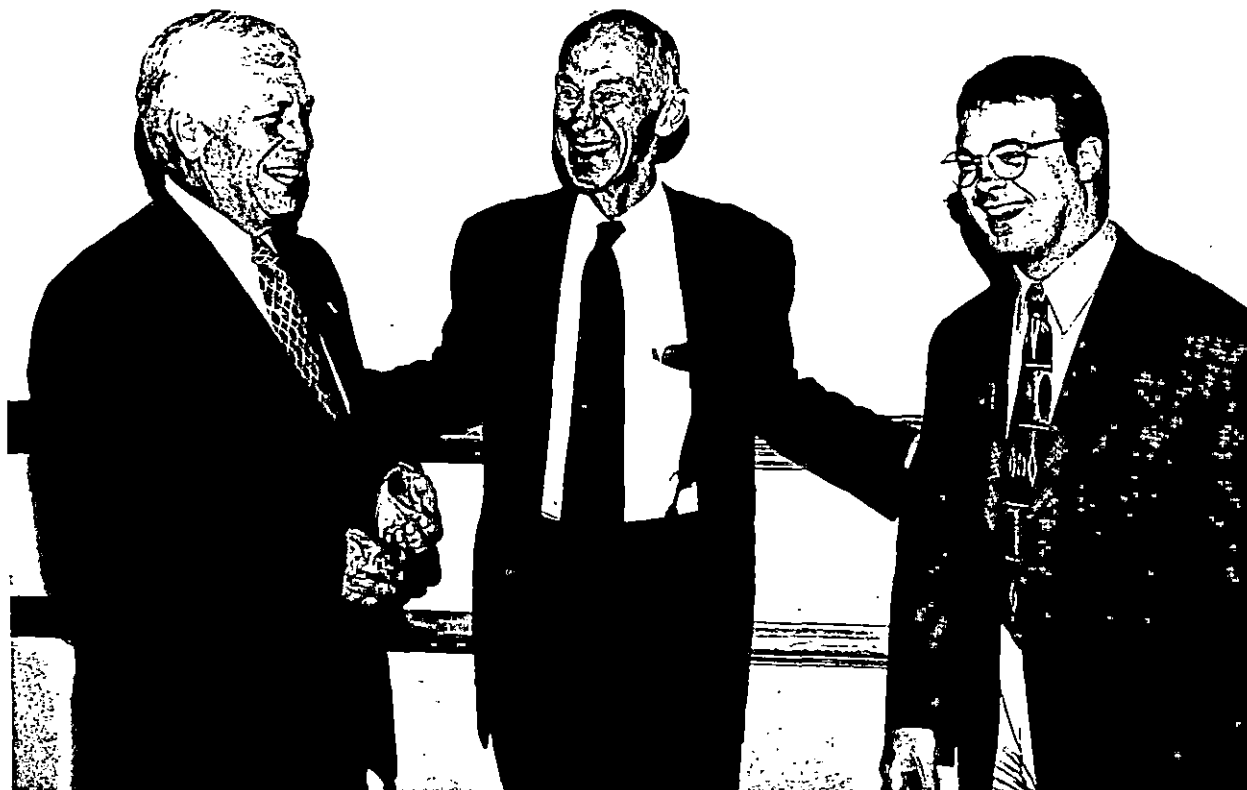
CPE PRESIDENT VISITS MOREHEAD

This is among the issues that will be discussed in a special program entitled "Love's Not Supposed to Hurt" which will be presented on the Morehead State University campus on Tuesday, Sept. 22, at 7 p.m. in the Crager Room, Adron Doran University Center. Making the presentation will be the Anti-Sexual Abuse Project (A.S.A.P.), a touring group composed of recent graduates of Brown University, Harvard University and University of Virginia.

In its presentation, A.S.A.P. will offer insights into the complexities of dating violence through the use of an innovative and realistic theatre piece. In their acting roles, one of the couples is dating while the relationship has just ended for another couple. One couple is in a physically abusive relationship while the other couple's problem is verbal abuse and manipulation.

After the skit, the "actors" will answer questions from the audience about their roles. The performers will share factual information as they address the epidemic of violence in intimate relationships.

During the evening, sexual communication, alcohol use and social interactions also will be among the issues addressed.

A.S.A.P. has been touring the country and performing on college and universities since 1996. The group was formed by undergraduate students of Brown University's sexual assault peer education program.

MOREHEAD, Ky.-- Morehead State University's Board of Regents approved a proposal to create a Program of Distinction at its meeting on Friday (Sept. 18).

The proposal to establish an Institute for Regional Analysis and Public Policy (IRAPP) will be submitted to the Council on Postsecondary Education for approval at its November meeting. If accepted, the University could have the institute operational by January and be accepting students by the 1999 fall semester.

The proposed institute was designed to meet the goals outlined in House Bill 1 which was passed in 1997 by the state legislature. The project will be funded by an \$865,000 matching grant.

IRAPP will integrate teaching, applied research and service in focusing upon issues that significantly affect the regions of Eastern Kentucky, Appalachia and rural America, according to Dr. Michael Moore, executive vice president for academic affairs, who outlined the proposal. He noted that the final project was the end result of the contributions of numerous faculty members.

Earlier in the board's Academic Affairs Committee meeting, Dr. David Rudy, chair of the Department of Sociology, Social Work and Criminology, who was instrumental in the institute's organization, discussed the composition of the institute. "IRAPP will offer degree programs in environmental science, geography, social work and sociology with a Division of Applied Research, Service and Policy that will organize the active engagements of students, faculty, staff, citizens, educators, political leaders and policymakers in issues and problems that face the region," he said.

The board also approved establishing a Master of Education degree in school administration. This new degree offering was the result of collaboration with faculty at Eastern Kentucky University, Northern Kentucky University, University of Kentucky and MSU to develop a master's program that addressed administrator standards and contained similar course content and corresponding course titles and numbers.

The current program will continue to be available for students who have already completed a master's degree prior to beginning a principal preparation program.

To meet NCAA regulations, the board adopted testing policies and standard procedures for dealing with alcohol, tobacco and other drug education by student-athletes. Under this program, random testing of athletes will be admissible in cases where there is reasonable suspicion of use.

In other business, the regents amended the Personnel Policy PG-22, Employment of Relatives, and approved the Facility Maintenance Plan.

Also at the meeting, Michelle Francis, Bardstown senior and Student Government Association president, was sworn in as the new student regent. Madge Walters Baird of Pikeville, a new appointee, and Buckner Hinkle of Lexington, who was reappointed, were sworn in for six-year terms. Commendations were given to John M. Rosenberg who completed his term on the board, and Dr. Bruce Mattingly, faculty regent, who resigned.
