ELECTION NOTICE

In obedience to the order of the Rowan County Court, made on Monday, August 5th, 1940, notice is hereby given that an election will be held and poll taken in Little Brusby Precinct, No. 2, at the usual and regular voting place, in said precinct on Saturday, October 5th, 1940, between the hours of six o'clock A. M. and five o'clock P. M. on said date, at which all legal voters residing in said precinct shall be given an opportunity to vote by secret ballot on the question, whether or not, spirituous, vinous or malt liquors shall be sold, bartered or loaned in said precinct, and which shall apply to druggists, etc. The order calling said election, and directing the manner in which same shall be held is in words said officers' appointment to the office of Rowan County Clerk.

REGULAR TERM

In the matter of holding an election on Little Brusby Precinct, No. 2, of Rowan County, Kentucky, being voting precinct No. 2 of Rowan County, Kentucky, and Big Brusby Precinct, No. 20 of Rowan County, Kentucky, upon the proposition, whether or not, spirituous, vinous or malt liquors shall be sold, bartered or loaned in said precincts, and which shall apply to druggists, etc. The cause coming on for hearing upon the petition and application of Sherman Brown and others, who appear as petitioners of Rowan County, Kentucky, and legal voters in Little Brusby Precinct, No. 2, and Big Brusby Precinct, No. 20 of Rowan County, Kentucky, and legal voters in said precincts, and being more in number than twenty-five, requesting all votes cast in said precincts, at the last general election, asking and praying the court to issue an order directing and appointing an election in said voting precincts upon the proposition whether or not spirituous, vinous or malt liquors shall be sold, bartered or loaned therein, and which shall apply to druggists, etc. said court having received no objections to said petition from any of the persons signing said petition and the same being in compliance with the provisions of the Statutes of Kentucky. It is ordered and directed that an election shall be held in Little Brusby Precinct, No. 2, and Big Brusby Precinct, No. 20 of Rowan County, Kentucky, on Saturday, October 5th, 1940 for the purpose of taking the vote of the legal voters of said precincts on the question, whether or not, spirituous, vinous or malt liquors shall be sold, bartered or loaned in said precincts, and which shall apply to druggists, etc. The order calling said election, and directing the manner in which same shall be held is in words said officers' appointment to the office of Rowan County Clerk.

It is further ordered that a poll be opened at the regular and usual voting place in said precincts on Saturday October 5th, 1940 for the purpose of taking the vote of the legal voters on the proposition whether or not, spirituous, vinous or malt liquors shall be sold, bartered or loaned in said precincts, and which shall apply to druggists, etc. The order calling said election, and directing the manner in which same shall be held is in words said officers' appointment to the office of Rowan County Clerk.

C. V. Alfrey, County Clerk of Rowan County, Kentucky, is hereby appointed and directed to furnish to the Sheriff of Rowan County, Kentucky, within five days from the date of said order, a certified copy of this order, as it appears on the Order Book of the Rowan County Court, within five days from the date of said order. B. F. McBrayer, Sheriff of Rowan County, Kentucky, is hereby appointed and directed to hold said election, and he will cause a poll to be opened in each of the voting precincts on Saturday, October 5, 1940, at the law in such cases directed, and he will first advertise said election by notices published in some weekly paper, published in Rowan County, Kentucky, for at least two weeks before the day said election, and he will furnish to the court, by written printed handbills posted in at least five conspicuous places in each precinct for at least two weeks next before the date of said election, and he shall report to the court in writing, his action showing that the notices have been duly published and posted. The proposition to be voted upon shall be stated on the ballot, without emblem, and two spaces left upon the right side of same, one for votes favoring the proposition to be designated by the word "YES", and one for votes opposing it, to be designated by the word "NO". The elector shall designate his vote by a cross mark (X) placed opposite the word "YES". The proposition to be voted upon and the question to be submitted, shall be as follows:
