

Another Farce at Morehead.

MOREHEAD, KY., July 27.—Jesse Cold-iron, the man who beat Nick Day so unmercifully on Saturday last, was arrested in the brush this morning on a warrant for breach of the peace. On motion of the prosecution the court dismissed the warrant and held the prisoner to answer for assault and battery. The defendant was tried before County Judge Stewart this afternoon. The findings of this Court was about as follows: "Well, now, I guess we will have to fine Uncle Jess about one dollar or so." In the absence of the County Attorney, Z. T. Young, three of the soldiers from Mt. Sterling were appointed counsel. A. G. Lockridge and J. B. Markham for the defendant, and S. H. Kash, assisted by A. L. Young, for the Commonwealth. The trial was a perfect farce from beginning to end. The Judge is ignorant of the most simple rulings of court, and allowed the soldier counsel to bully and browbeat him out of his few remaining wits. Mick Day was held over on the charge of using abusive and insulting language. His trial will come off on Wednesday.
