Boos, yells and cheers went up as the ball dropped into the rim and thus ended the marathon challenge to Marshall's home record in almost four seasons of play.

Scoring honors for the night went to Duncan, who bagged eight field goals and seven fouls for 23 points and a one-point margin over Morehead.

In 1926, when Doris was engaging Transylvania college in a basketball game, Jack Strickland tagged one of the greatest exhibitioners of scoring ever seen in the item called basketball. When the final gun had sounded he had gathered a total of thirty-seven points.

No other player in the state since that time has been able to equal that feat.

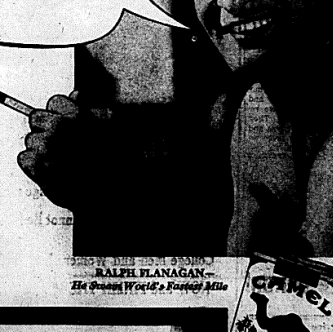

There are four optional subjects in the Student Aid examination. Engineering, political science, public administration, and statistics. Applicants must

Provision is made for the acceptance of applications from junior students who expect to complete their junior college year not later than July 1, 1942. They may also receive provisional appointment, but they may not enter on duty until
