



MOREHEAD, Ky.---In an effort to help future students and their parents learn more about the campus, Morehead State University will hold a final Student Orientation, Advising and Registration (SOAR) program this month.

The University will host the daylong session on Friday, July 14, to assist incoming freshmen, transfer students and their parents.

"The SOAR program provides a lot of information in an informal setting," said Sandy Barker, associate director of admissions. "It allows students and their parents to tie together everything they need before coming here in August," she said. "I encourage everyone to call and register early so that we can provide the best assistance."

The SOAR program will begin with registration at 9 a.m. in the Adron Doran University Center. Following registration, students and their parents will be invited to visit displays of the University's departments.

An official welcome from University personnel is planned for 11 a.m. in Button Auditorium. Among those scheduled to greet participants are: MSU President Ronald G. MOREHEAD, Ky.---Dr. Steve Parkansky, assistant professor of geography at Morehead State University, presented a 30-minute demonstration of "The Atlas of Appalachia" at the annual Kentucky Geographic Information Systems Conference in Bowling Green, June 5-8.

A variety of professionals, state officials and researchers concerned with general information about the region attend the conference each year, including individuals involved with forestry, agriculture, health, the census and the transportation cabinet.

"The Atlas of Appalachia" provides a systematic inventory and depiction of Appalachia through maps, texts, and photos. The atlas contains a variety of information about Appalachia, including its location, natural environment, history, demography, social patterns, education, health, resources, economic development, culture, political landscape and prospectus for the future.

"The atlas will provide basic statistics for Appalachia as well as rare and unusual information," Dr. Parkansky said. "Such information will be useful for schools and business applications, as well as other interested individuals," he said.

Produced by the MSU's Institute for Regional Analysis and Public Policy, "The Atlas of Appalachia" is scheduled for release on CD-ROM in 2002.

Dr. Parkansky is serving as cartographic editor for "The Atlas of Appalachia." An MSU faculty member since August 1997, he received his doctoral degree from The State University of New York at Buffalo in 1999.

"The Government Inspector," written by Nikolai Gogol and adapted by Peter Raby, Oct. 12-14, 8 p.m., Button Auditorium. This satirical comedy is set in a small town, where corrupt officials mistake a young clerk for a government inspector. The town's officials proceed to bribe him with hospitality, money and the mayor's daughter as a bride. Chaos erupts when they discover their error.

"Quilters," written by Molly Newman and Barbara Damashek, who also wrote the music and lyrics, Nov. 14-18, 8 p.m. and Nov. 19, 2 p.m., Kibbey Theatre. This story of a pioneer woman and her six daughters is told through music, dance and drama. It combines a series of interrelated episodes that portray the cycle of life on the American frontier.

"The Heiress," written by Ruth Goetz and Augustus Goetz, suggested by Henry James' novel, "Washington Square," Feb. 20-24, 8 p.m. and Feb. 25, 2 p.m., Kibbey Theatre. This Tony and Academy Award-winning drama takes place in mid-19th century New York. A wealthy, young girl falls in love with a fortune hunter and agrees to an elopement. When she discovers his intentions, the young girl seeks revenge.

"The Secret Garden," book and lyrics by Marsha Norman with music by Lucy Simon, March 29-31, 8 p.m., Button Auditorium. Based on the novel by Frances Hodgson Burnett, the play is a classic story of an orphaned girl who is sent to live with her only living relatives in England. The story unfolds with the discovery of a secret garden.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University students may now access services with ease through convenient, state-of-the-art systems.

Students can complete a variety of routine academic and administrative tasks on the University's Web site with immediate interactive feedback, according to Beth Patrick, assistant vice president for information technology.

"The system was designed to provide access to routine services and information on a convenient 24-7 schedule," Patrick said. "The online, interactive admission process and course scheduling option eliminates the need to visit campus offices to complete the enrollment and registration process."

MSU students were first introduced to the Web-based services as an option in the fall of 1999 when they were able to pre-register for spring 2000 classes. Utilizing one's official program-of-study check sheet, the online registration program will electronically advise the student whether the courses selected will qualify for credit under their current degree program. The system also will perform various online verifications, for pre-requisite and required courses, before accepting the student's schedule request.

Popularity of the Web-based student services has been overwhelming, with more than 72 percent of the current students activating their personal Web account since the new site was brought online in the fall of 1999, Patrick noted. "In addition to enrollment and registration, students attending MSU this fall may apply for and verify the status of their financial aid, apply for housing, order textbooks, drop or add courses, receive grade reports and degree audit checksheets, and pay their fees online from their student Web account," she said.

Implementation of the Web-based student services system was the result of an on-going reengineering project designed to improve services to students, Patrick noted.

Like ATMs, pay-at-the-pump gas stations and self-service grocery check-out lines, routine student services literally will be available "at the fingertips" of Morehead State students.

Other services in the planning stage include a new OneCard ID system. Scheduled to begin in the spring of 2001, the OneCard is a credit card-sized ID card that, with the aid of an embedded microchip and magnetic-strip technology, will store information that will facilitate financial, security and service transactions throughout campus facilities.

“The proposed OneCard will have the ability to function as a student meal card, library card and door key, and will hold balances for petty cash that can be used in campus vending machines, laundry facilities, copy and laser printer stations and the campus bookstore,” Patrick said. “In time, students will have the option of using their OneCard as an ATM card and debit card for banking services,” she said.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---The face of Kentucky Boys State took on a new look this year when the first female counselor joined the program for the weeklong experience. Tonya Donaldson of **Barbourville** didn't realize that she was breaking new ground.

A member of the Kentucky National Guard for 19 months, Donaldson was pleased to be considered for the program. "I knew I would be doing something new and different," she said.

But, when she volunteered for the assignment, she didn't realize how new or how different it would be. "When I was told it was Boys State, I pictured youngsters, maybe eight years old, with their moms," she said. After discovering the participants averaged 17-years-old, the position took on a whole new meaning for her.

Silas Noel of **Frankfort**, director of Boys State, was glad to welcome Donaldson as a junior counselor for the program. "She held up her share of the responsibilities," he said. "They (the delegates and staff) made no distinction between her and the other counselors."

Kentucky Boys State, which held its 60th annual session this year, provides high school seniors hands-on training in the state's government system. The American Legion-sponsored program, which is held annually at Morehead State University, allows young men from across the state to participate in an exercise that promotes public service and community involvement.

Donaldson was impressed with the way the legionnaires kept the young men moving throughout the organized activities of each day, from reveille, which began at 5:45 a.m., until lights out at 11:30 p.m. "The senior counselors constantly give the boys guidance," she said. "It's fun; the boys like being involved and they (the counselors) treat them like family.

"They have a schedule and they stick to it," she said. "They keep the boys on their toes. It is really good for the boys who want to go into law; this allows them to see what it's like and if they need to make a career change."

Boys State was a real-life learning experience, watching the retired military men move through the operation of the program, she noted. Some of the routine "was a reminder of her days in basic training, especially singing the songs because I knew everyone of them."

Studying to be a registered nurse, Donaldson is taking classes at Southeast Community College in Middlesboro. Because of her medical training, she was qualified to serve as one of two medics for Boys State.

Growing up, Donaldson thought she would one day be a lawyer. After taking her military occupation specialist (MOS) training, she decided to change her career goal because she liked medicine.

While training with the Guard, where her obligations includes active duty one weekend each month and two weeks during the summer, Donaldson drills at Richmond with Shawn Daugherty of **Stearns**, who also was a junior counselor this year. A 1993 Boys State delegate who was elected president of the Senate, Daugherty had first-hand knowledge of the program's goal. "It was a super experience," he said.

A veteran counselor for Boys State, Andy Cahill of **Leitchfield**, was Donaldson's senior counselor. He did not see things any different this year than in previous sessions. "Everyone did what (he or she) was supposed to do for the good of the program," he said.

With the week behind her, Donaldson will return to the routine of becoming a nurse. "I consider it an honor to be first female to work with the Boys State program in the counselor capacity," she said. "It has been wonderful to work with the Legion."







Illinois counties eligible for in-state tuition at Morehead State University




Illinois counties eligible for in-state tuition at Morehead State University


Indiana counties eligible for in-state tuition at Morehead State University









Tennessee counties eligible for in-state tuition at Morehead State University




Virginia counties eligible for in-state tuition at Morehead State University



MOREHEAD, Ky. ---David Bartlett, Morehead State University professor of art, visited China to lecture and exhibit his art.

Bartlett, who has taught at MSU since 1980, spoke about his career and his love of photography, especially photogravure, which is the type of art he exhibited at the Academy of Traditional Chinese Painting and Capital Normal University. Photogravure is a combination of photography and intaglio printmaking.

"The trip was very exciting, educational and inspiring," said Bartlett, who had sent a proposal for the trip to Chinese university officials nearly two years ago. Dr. Lemuel Berry Jr., dean of MSU's Caudill College of the Humanities, provided assistance in making the trip possible.

Preparing for the overseas lectures required more attention than Bartlett would have done if he were speaking on campus. After organizing his lecture in English, he completed a synopsis that was translated into Chinese for distribution before his talks.

As he lectured at the Beijing Film Academy and Capital Normal University, an interpreter translated his English words into Chinese. Approximately 150 people attended each of his talks.

The overseas venture was a learning experience for Mike Rayburn, **Morehead** senior, who traveled with the professor. "While he is a business (administration) major, he has been concentrating his efforts in photography recently," Bartlett said. "I thought it would be educational for him."

While visiting China, Bartlett traveled to several cities, including Hong Kong and Shanghai, documenting the excursion in photographs. His favorite sites on the monthlong trip were the Li River and the town of Yang Shuo.

"The Chinese people were extremely hospitable, hard working and friendly," Bartlett added.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Two Morehead State University graduate students have begun to “virtually move mountains” in East Kentucky with the help of \$1,000 from the Gorilla Group, a Web site for student entrepreneurs.

Through the group, students can participate in a monthly business plan contest that nets the winner \$1,000 in start-up money to further their business plan or entrepreneurial education. Dwayne Stevens of **Pikeville** and Brad Hall of **Weeksbury** submitted a plan for MountainMed.com.

The pair designed a business to provide East Kentucky residents with access to medical information through the Internet. “We’re in a rural area and health care is far away in some cases,” said Hall, who expects to complete his Master of Business Administration degree in December. “We want to shorten the distance between doctors and their patients,” he added.

Thus far, they have compiled a database of doctors, dentists and optometrists in Pike, Floyd, Martin, Magoffin and Johnson counties.

Stevens, who finished his MBA degree in May, came up with the MountainMed.com idea almost two years ago. After sharing the idea with Hall, the twosome submitted a business plan to Dr. Betty Regan, chair of MSU’s Department of Information Systems, as a class project.

She told them about Gorilla Group, an initiative of the Kentucky Science and Technology Corporation that is funded from the Kentucky Department of Education, James Graham Brown Foundation and private companies.

Webmaster for Pikeville College, Stevens wanted to blend his career with his undergraduate degree in biology and chemistry. “I also thought there was a need for this type of Internet resource in the area,” he said.

“I really enjoy what I do (at Pikeville College) and I’m glad to be able to apply it to this start up,” he added.

Though in the beginning stages of MountainMed.com, the duo has plans to expand their business to include computer installation, training, Web design and consulting, as well as online prescription orders and medical advice through eDO (electronic doctor's office).

"We want to see how the community responds to the database first before we take on the liability of eDO," said Hall, who is a comptroller for the Mountain Water District in Pike County. "Eventually, we hope to find doctors who are willing to spend time online in an advisory capacity."



MOREHEAD, Ky.---As Morehead State University students return to the campus this fall, they may purchase textbooks and supplies online and complete a variety of routine academic and administrative tasks on the University's Web site.

The University Bookstore has opened a virtual store that will allow electronic shopping 24-hours a day. "Our online store offers everything from textbooks and course materials to gifts, apparel and general merchandise," said Jackie Griffey, bookstore general manager.

"We're confident students and others will find our Web site just as friendly and easy to shop as our regular store," she said. After ordering their books online at <http://bookstore.morehead-st.edu>, students may pick up their purchases at the store, physically located in the Adron Doran University Center.

The popularity of the Web-based student services has been overwhelming, with more than 72 percent of the current students activating their personal Web accounts since the new site was brought online last fall, according to Beth Patrick, assistant vice president for information technology.

"The system was designed to provide access to routine services and information on a convenient 24-7 schedule. The online, interactive admission process and course scheduling option eliminates the need to visit campus offices to complete the enrollment and registration process," she said.

"In addition to book sales, enrollment and registration, students attending MSU this fall may apply for and verify the status of their financial aid, apply for housing, drop or add courses, receive grade reports and degree audit checksheets, and pay their fees online from their student Web account," Patrick said.

So that students may perform all of these online tasks from the comfort of their residence hall rooms, the Office of Information Technology has begun a new program to lease computers on a per semester basis. The machines available for lease come loaded with a Web browser and Microsoft Office 95.

Further, information technology will offer a telephone help desk and several network installation assistance workshops for students interested in having Internet access in their residence hall rooms. 

MOREHEAD, Ky.---It has been a long time since Dean Hill of **West Liberty** bought his first Nikon 35mm camera in Hong Kong.

As a Peace Corps volunteer in Thailand in 1978, Hill purchased a camera to document the people and the landscape where he worked. Now, more than 20 years later, Morehead State University is displaying one of his first exhibits in Special Collections, on the fifth floor of Camden-Carroll Library.

After two years in the Peace Corps, he sold his camera to help pay for a trip through Asia. It wasn't until about five years ago, that Hill decided to pick up a camera again.

A logger and a sometimes carpenter by trade, Hill now hopes to make photography his full-time profession. "I'm making my first push to make an income from my work," he said.

The MSU exhibit, which includes photographs of the Paint Creek and Paintsville Lake areas of Morgan and Johnson counties, will be on display through Monday, Aug. 21. It may be viewed during the library's regular hours. The photographs are available for purchase.

Mainly self-taught in his craft, Hill has taken workshops to polish his skill. "They (the workshops) help you take what you've got and develop your own style," he said. The courses, plus traveling in Asia and the southwest and northwest United States, "helped me from behind the camera."

Hill's favorite shots are those taken early in the morning on Paintsville Lake, near his home. "At the crack of dawn, I go out with my coffee and my camera and wait for the light to get right," he said.

The photographs he chose for the library exhibit include "Morning Mist," "It's Spring!" and "Peak of Colors." "I tried to get some seasonal pictures and mystical-type shots with the fog," he explained. "It seems to fit in with the typical eastern Kentucky landscape."

Hill also has an exhibit at Hungerford's Gallery of Stone and Metal Arts in Lexington. Later this year, he plans to display and sell his photographs at the Morgan County Sorghum Festival in September and Paintsville's Apple Festival in October.
