

Increased Costs Necessitate Price Raiser in Cafeteria

Administration Aids Student Cooperation

A change in cafeteria food prices necessitated by rising prices of common foodstuffs, announced by the administration, will be effective within a few days.

The problem of increased food prices is not peculiar to MSTC, although it has been plaguing it in every other college, university or common foodstuffs throughout the country. During the past year prices on the majority of common foodstuffs have risen constantly. For example, a study of food costs in the present month as compared with costs during February of last year, shows a 47 percent increase in the price of longhorn cheese during the year; eggs, a 50 percent increase; pork, roasts at 30 cents; tuna fish, 147 per cent; beef, 100 per cent; veal steaks, 60 per cent; corn, 22 per cent; and butter, 20 per cent sweet milk, 16 per cent.
