Agronomy  
Expert Meets  
With Farmers

Mr. Ralph Kenney was with County Agent Kermit Mills and some of the Rowan county farmers Friday, February 20, to discuss the problems in agronomy. Some of the things decided upon to be accomplished this year are:

1. Seed more cover crops. This will save the soil, provide more pasture and small grain.
2. Due to increased prices on farm seed, poor transportation, and the need for more seed, acre seed of the following crops the farmers agreed to try to save. Barley—four farmers are wanted to give barley for seed.
3. Barley rye—Ten to 15 farmers should save for seed.
4. Oats—especially Pulwin Oats—Fifteen to 20 should save seed.
5. Vetch—as many farmers as possible save vetch seed.
6. Italian rye grass—save as much seed as possible.
7. Karesa lespedeza seed—we need to save at least enough seed for Rowan county.
8. Red top—save some of the best top for seed.

If the farmers of Rowan county will give in the habit of saving their own seed, it will solve several problems. Some of the farmers could afford to sow more seed per acre, thereby getting better pasture and hay crops. He would be able to sell all cultivated land in a winter cover crop to protect his land from washing and leaching. This winter cover crop may be a small grain which would permit us to decrease our acreage of corn. Above all, if the farmers will save part of their crop of seed, it will mean a big saving for Rowan county. It will cause the average farmer to sow more seed per acre. The winter cover crop will save the farmer from having to buy seed for the next year.

Income Tax Levied  
On As Little As  
\$14 Per Week

This is a message to students. Single persons or married persons not living with husband or wife, whose average earnings were as much as \$14.43 a week for the year 1941, and married persons living together who had aggregate earnings averaging as much as \$28.86 a week for the year, are required to file Federal income tax returns.

This year, more than ever before, the necessity for prompt filing in preparing and filing income tax returns is emphasized to everyone. It is estimated that 22,000,000 income tax returns

will be filed before midnight of March 15, 1942, and that of this number 7,000,000 persons will file income tax returns for the first time.

Under the laws of the state in which he has legal residence the earnings of the minor belong to the minor, such earnings, regardless of amount, are not required to be included in the return of the parent. In the absence of proof to the contrary, a parent will be assumed to have the legal right to the earnings of the minor and must include them in his return.

A minor, just as a person of legal age, who is single or is married and not living with husband or wife for any part of the taxable year, is required to render a return of income if he owns \$750 or over for the taxable year. If the aggregate gross

income of such minor from any source, including dividends, interest, rent, annuities, and royalties, exceeds \$100, the minor must file a return. For taxpayers not eligible to be a trustee or guardian, and who own property, the return must be made by the minor or, if for him by his guardian, or other person charged with the care of his person or property.

To assist taxpayers in the preparation of their income tax returns the Treasury Department has issued a folder entitled "How to File Your Simple Income Tax Return, The Simple Way". It contains a booklet of the simplified Form 100A and illustrates the steps required to prepare the return.

Form 100A may be used by persons who are required to file returns but who have gross income of not more than \$10,000 from salaries, wages, compensation for personal services,

dividends, interest, rent, annuities, and royalties only. For taxpayers not eligible to be a trustee or guardian, and who own property, the return must be made by the minor or, if for him by his guardian, or other person charged with the care of his person or property.

To assist taxpayers in the preparation of their income tax returns the Treasury Department has issued a folder entitled "How to File Your Simple Income Tax Return, The Simple Way". It contains a booklet of the simplified Form 100A and illustrates the steps required to prepare the return.
