**Steel Plants Use 80 Million Tons Coal**  
The plants of the United States Steel Company are reported to be operating at 102 percent of capacity, and the steel industry as a whole at 97 percent of capacity. The American Iron and Steel Institute, in their January bulletin, estimated that operating at maximum capacity, the steel companies will consume more than 80,316,000 net tons of coal per year, of which it was asserted that 75 percent can be supplied by mines owned or operated by the steel companies.
