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**Earlier Grill Opening Urged**

Many students do not get up at seven-thirty in order to make the breakfast line. They intend to grab a cup of coffee at the grill before a nine o'clock class. Too often, however, it is impossible for students to obtain anything at the grill before classes. Why? Because at a quarter of nine when it is opened, there is usually a waiting line that cannot all be served until nine or after. When the grill is not opened on time, as sometimes is the case, the student with a nine o'clock class can scarcely hope to down his breakfast and still reach his class on time.

There is an obvious remedy for this situation. It will be to open the grill early enough so that all the students desiring to eat before their nine o'clock classes may be served and have time to sip their coffee and get ready for their classes. The grill is closed for the rest of the day as far as temper is concerned by a turned tongue.

Were the grill to be opened at eight-thirty, no one would suffer by the change in time. The cafeteria would not have to exert itself unduly in order to effect this change in opening time. The extra fifteen minutes leeway thus acquired by the patrons of the grill should enable them to purchase their breakfast and eat as leisurely.

This is not an extreme request to ask of the cafeteria staff and its fulfillment would certainly result in the alleviation of all justified grouches about the opening time of the grill.

**Inflation Does Affect Us**

Today inflation is more than a prospect; it has made considerable progress. Just how is this inflation apparent to a student at MSTC? And how is it affecting the student body today? Prices in the cafeteria are higher now than before the war. That pair of shoes you bought yesterday cost more than they would have a year ago. This pair of shoes will not entirely attribute to the war either. True the government has needed more to supply the war effort; but that fact in itself could not bring about inflationary prices. There is another feature of inflation that is found in circulation this year. So today we have more money to bid for fewer goods. A price increase has followed. And this general price increase will continue to follow unless a satisfactory measure is found to solve the problem of increasing wealth and decreasing civilian production.

We on the Morehead campus, of course; cannot do much to correct the situation. We must however control and even suggest our purchases of war bonds and stamps. And all the surplus of cash resulting from the war bond is put into this form of investment; the serious problem of inflation will be avoided. Were there not more money in circulation today than formerly; prices would not advance needlessly as they have been and are every day. Because prices are rising; there is actually little good being realized from the larger national income.

If the prices and income continue to skyrocket higher and higher the same inflation may occur in this country that is found in Germany during the last war. Inflation hurt their war effort just as it could harm ours were it to happen here. We must avoid inflation at all costs. And we will if we buy bonds and stamps in increasing numbers.
