MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University hosted the Kentucky Science Olympiad finals in which 592 high school and middle school students from across the state participated.

The winners, Louisville's duPont Manual High School and Meyzeek Middle School, will compete in the National Science Olympiad in Colorado Springs, Colo., later this year.

After preparing for a year, 55 teams from five regional contests competed in 44 different categories. Each school was allowed a team of 15 students.

"With this tournament, there are so many different things the students can participate in that all types of students can be successful," said Dr. Ronald L. Fiel, MSU professor of science and tournament director. He has coordinated the program for six years.

The events were created and run by 100 Morehead State faculty, staff and students. Activities ranged from keeping an egg safe during a bungee drop, to solving a crime, to manipulating maps.

"Every year we get lots of people telling us how much fun they had," Dr. Fiel said.

"Watching kids think is always a charge."

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Judi Conway Patton, the First Lady of Kentucky, will receive an Honorary Doctor of Public Service degree during Morehead State University's Spring Commencement on Saturday, May 12.

During the ceremony that begins at 10:30 a.m. in the Academic-Athletic Center, MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin will confer degrees on more than 800 graduate and undergraduate students who are candidates. Thomas Hall Frazier of **Louisa** will be the student speaker.

Since moving to Frankfort from her native Pike County, Mrs. Patton has devoted much of her time to assisting women and children harmed by abuse and violence. She has pushed for legislative reform and serves as co-chair of the Governor's Council on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault.

Mrs. Patton was instrumental in getting \$1 million set aside from the state's 1998 budget to upgrade 15 facilities in Kentucky which house battered women. The 2000 biennium budget earmarked \$1.1 million, the largest one-time contribution in history, to increase operating funds for spouse abuse centers.

Her work with MSU's First Lady Bonnie Eaglin led to the establishment of a new child advocacy center for the Gateway area, located in Morehead.

Recognized for her efforts, Mrs. Patton has received nearly two dozen awards, including the Outstanding Legislative Advocacy Award from the Kentucky Coalition Against Rape and Sexual Assault and the Committed to Peace in Kentucky Homes Award from the Kentucky Domestic Violence Association, in 1996; the first Outstanding Advocate Award from the Kentucky Council on Child Abuse in 1997; and the Friend of Kentucky's Children Award from the Exploited Children's Help Organization in 1999.

Mrs. Patton also has devoted her humanitarian efforts to breast cancer issues and serves as the honorary chair of the Kentucky Breast Cancer Coalition and chair of the Governor's Task Force on Breast Cancer.

A graduating senior in the College of Science and Technology, Frazier is a biology major with a chemistry minor. He is a candidate for the Bachelor of Science degree with honors.

During the University's 2001 Academic Awards Week, Frazier was recognized as the Outstanding Pre-Medicine Student and Outstanding Undergraduate Student by the Department of Biological and Environmental Sciences. Last year, he received the department's Margaret Heaslip Scholarship and the Department of Physical Sciences Outstanding Organic Chemistry Student Award.

A resident assistant for three years, Frazier served a term as president of the Pre-Medicine Club and has been active in the Academic Honors Program, presenting his work at regional, state and national conferences at the Honors Program roundtables.

Last year, he participated in Emory University's Summer Undergraduate Research Education program where he spent time investigating DNA vaccines for HIV. A synopsis of his work is available on Emory's Web site.

A 1997 graduate of Lawrence County High School, he is the son of Annette Frazier and the late James A. Frazier, and the grandson of Mary Jane Hall. In July, he plans to marry Crystal D. Sammons, a Louisa senior dietetics major.

In the fall, Frazier will attend the University of Louisville's School of Medicine where he has been awarded the Dean's Merit Scholarship, which pays all expenses, including tuition, books and supplies for the next four years.

Once degrees are conferred, the new graduates will be inducted into the MSU Alumni Association by Joyce LeMaster, president-elect.

Dr. Charles Patrick, professor of industrial education and technology and recipient of the 2001 Distinguished Teacher Award, will be the grand marshal and mace bearer, assisted by Dr. Frances Helphinstine, professor of English, and Mary Jo Netherton, associate professor of French.

Student marshals will be Stephanie M. Black of **Xenia, Ohio**, and Su-Lin Hammond of **Jackson**, representing Graduate Programs; Christopher Robbins, **West Liberty** junior, and Caleb Lee Evans, **Hillsboro** senior, College of Science and Technology; Rachel D. Crisp, **Morehead** sophomore, and Jeffery L. Erwin, **Olive Hill** sophomore, College of Business; Jennifer S. Couch, **Eaton, Ohio**, senior, and Jessica L. Beth G. Patrick is being promoted to associate vice president for planning and technology and Jeffrey R. Liles has been named assistant vice president for marketing.

"We are pleased to welcome these two professionals to important staff positions at the University," Dr. Eaglin said. "Ms. Patrick is being appointed to a position with more responsibility on the basis of her excellent performance as our chief technology officer and we are delighted to have an experienced marketing executive like Mr. Liles join our institutional marketing effort."

Since joining the MSU staff in 1983, Patrick has served in various roles in Information Technology, such as a database systems analyst, programmer/consultant and director of the unit for nine years. Most recently, she was assistant vice president for information technology where she supervised a professional technical support staff of 38, administered an annual operating budget of more than \$3 million, and managed the University's technology resources and services.

When she assumes her new position on July 1, she will add oversight of the University's strategic planning and budget development process to her list of responsibilities.

Patrick has served as consultant to various higher education institutions on programming and project management relating to administrative computing issues. She was appointed by Gov. Paul Patton to Kentucky's Information Resources Management Commission and Information Technology Advisory Council.

Previous experiences also include serving as a consultant with Higher Education Associates in Denver, where she did contract consulting services for programming, systems analysis/design and project management issues relating to technology in postsecondary education.

A two-time graduate of MSU, Patrick received a Bachelor of Business Administration degree in data processing in 1982 and a Master of Arts degree in adult and higher education in 1997. She and her husband Bobby live in Morehead with their three children: Erin, 17; Joey, 12; and Andy, 11.

Liles is responsible for coordinating marketing initiatives and resources, developing and implementing cost-effective advertising, and monitoring trends and strategies in higher education as they relate to the University's strategic plan.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University's Camden-Carroll Library and Institute for Regional Analysis and Public Policy have partnered with the University Press of Kentucky to make authoritative, historical information about the state available through a Web-based service by creating an online version of "The Kentucky Encyclopedia."

Dr. John E. Kleber, MSU professor emeritus of history, edited the original, hardback book, published by the University Press in 1992. It covers a multitude of historical topics such as art, business, education, politics, religion and sports.

The task of transforming the encyclopedia into a Web site has taken about three years — from initial discussions through full implementation. All entries in the print and CD-ROM versions of the encyclopedia are included in the online version, which consists of 2,138 separate entries interconnected by 51,273 textual hyperlinks. The entries have been enhanced using a descriptive tagging system, which allows for special search and display capabilities on the Web.

The interface and search features were designed by Dr. Scott Wymer, director of Morehead State's Center for Virtual Appalachia, and Tom Kmetz, a librarian in Camden-Carroll Library. Helping with the project were MSU seniors Brad Hamlin and Bethany Slone, and freshman Cephas Slone, all of Morehead.

"The online version of 'The Kentucky Encyclopedia' is a wonderful resource for everyone, but it will be of particular interest to students and those doing genealogy work," said Craig Wilkie, assistant director and business manager of University Press. "The online format allows for a full search of the text of the encyclopedia, which should make it an invaluable research tool for Kentuckians," he added.

"Kentuckians everywhere will benefit from the important step of putting this basic reference work online," said Larry Besant, library director. "I don't doubt that the added tagging and search features will allow some clever students and teachers to discover new ideas about the state's history and life."

"We are excited about the online version of 'The Kentucky Encyclopedia'," said Dr. David Rudy, IRAPP dean. "This will significantly increase the accessibility and use of an already vital resource for Kentuckians," he added.

Subscriptions for access to the digital encyclopedia will be made available to public schools, colleges, universities, government agencies, public libraries, non-profit organizations and businesses sometime this summer.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Time is running out for educators to register for classes in the Advanced Placement Program being offered at Morehead State University this summer.

Through a partnership with The College Board, MSU will offer a weeklong Advanced Placement Summer Institute, July 9-13, which will include classes, workshops and conferences for middle and high school teachers and supervisors.

Having a program close to home will be advantageous for local school systems as noted by William Helton, principal of Magoffin County High School, who has already registered six teachers. "This is a good opportunity for us to upgrade our curriculum and will save us money," Helton said. She compared the occasion to getting a green light when you are driving. "You proceeded with caution, stopped, and now you are set to go toward those things for which you have worked." She also asked the graduates to use their minds, education, talent and abilities to make their communities a better place, offering suggestions for ways this could be done, such as donating blood, serving as a mentor, volunteering to build a Habitat house or supporting an arts program.

The student speaker, Thomas Hall Frazier of Louisa, described his four years at MSU as a time to learn about people different than ourselves. "It is through this awareness that we will become better parents, better citizens and better humans," he said.

While the day's activities provides a commonality for us, Frazier said, it also represents our greatest accomplishment — the loss of prejudice and indifference. "Whether it is being discriminated against because of your southern accent, passed over because of gender, hanged for the color of your skin, ridiculed over sexual orientation, or placed into a gas chamber because of your religious beliefs, stereotypes and the prejudices surrounding them, affect each of us," he said.

Frazier credited his mother for opening his eyes to stereotyping by allowing him to get a Mohawk haircut when he was 10-years-old. "I became immediately known as the hoodlum with the Mohawk," he said. "She taught me that no matter who you are, there are some people who will judge you for being different."

A senior graduating with honors from the College of Science and Technology, Frazier is a biology major with a chemistry minor. In the fall, he will attend the University of Louisville's School of Medicine where he has been awarded the Dean's Merit Scholarship.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---A fund raising executive at a Pennsylvania institution will become the first ever vice president for development at Morehead State University and a current MSU college dean will assume a new post effective July 1, according to President Ronald G. Eaglin.

Barbara A. Ender, executive director of the IUP Foundation and senior development officer at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, will assume the new vice presidency and become chief executive officer of the MSU Foundation. Dr. J. Michael Seelig, interim dean of the College of Education and Behavioral Sciences, will become the dean of the Caudill College of Humanities.

"We are delighted to welcome an experienced and successful foundation executive to the leadership of our fund raising efforts and to have a fresh, energetic administrator devote his considerable talent and energy to another of our colleges," Dr. Eaglin said of the appointments.

In her current post since 1997, Ender manages private resource development, investments, allocations and reporting, assuring that legal and fiduciary responsibilities are met. She develops policies and practices affecting the foundation and oversees the management of a \$25 million endowment. She also supervises the development professionals in annual giving, corporate foundation relations, major and planned giving, research and advancement services.

A former director of corporate and foundation relations at IUP where she also served as an associate campaign director for a \$20 million capital campaign, Ender has experience in writing grant proposals and in coordinating volunteer networks for corporate and foundation fund raising.

Previously, she was director of academic outreach in continuing studies at Kansas State University, director of the Educational Opportunity Center at the University of Georgia, and director of admissions at Mercer University's Atlanta campus.

A former high school teacher in Ohio, Ender has given numerous presentations at various conferences, including the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education and the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. She holds memberships in several

professional organizations including the American Association of University Women, Grantmakers of Western Pennsylvania and the National Task Force on the Status of Women in Higher Education.

Ender earned a bachelor's degree in education from West Virginia University and a master's in education, counseling and student personnel from the University of Akron. She has additional coursework at the University of Georgia at Athens and is a graduate of Harvard Graduate School of Education's Institute for the Management of Lifelong Education. She is the mother of two college students, Joanna and Mason.

Dr. Seelig currently oversees six academic departments, including an NCATE-accredited teacher education program, with a budget totaling more than \$6 million. He was co-leader of the first of a three-year major campus-wide teacher education reform initiative and co-director for implementation of a \$1.4 million grant from the U.S. Department of Education to infuse technology throughout the teacher education program. He was instrumental in increasing discretionary monies available to individual academic departments through private fund raising.

In addition to acting as dean during the last year, Dr. Seelig also has served as executive director of the Office of Development and Alumni Relations. He managed a budget of more than \$700,000, directed the academic community in a fund-raising campaign and led the professional and support staff through a major reorganization of personnel and data support technologies.

He has served since 1993 as the University's staff legal counsel and executive assistant to the president. A 1990 Fulbright Program Scholar, he conducted a yearlong study of the child welfare system in Ethiopia. The next year he was named an International Scholar for the Slovak Academy of Sciences and was invited to give a series of lectures at institutes, academies and universities in what was then Czechoslovakia. He is a professor of social work.

An American Council on Education Fellow in 1997-98, he completed a one-year internship with the Office of the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland. He has published more than 50 papers in scholarly journals and presented several works at professional conferences.

An advocate of shared governance, Dr. Seelig served on the University's Faculty Senate, including one term as chair. He received the Paul Oberst Award from the Kentucky Chapter of the American Association of University Professors for service to the profession in the protection and furtherance of academic freedom.

Dr. Seelig has served in numerous posts since coming to the University in 1983 in the Department of Sociology, Social Work and Criminology. As program coordinator of MSU's social work program, he developed a flexible evening B.S.W. degree program and was influential in establishing the cooperative M.S.W. degree program with the University of Kentucky. Under his leadership from 1985 to 1994, enrollment in the undergraduate program grew from 35 to 300 students.

A 1992-93 recipient of MSU's Distinguished Faculty Service Award, Dr. Seelig served as the University's affirmative action officer from 1992 until 1997. He is a graduate of Ohio State University where he received a bachelor's degree in biology in 1972 and master's degrees in public administration and in social work in 1976. He also earned a law degree from Capital University in 1983.

Her essay addressed the question: "Does the Display of the Ten Commandments in a Courthouse as Part of a Collection of Historical Documents Violate the U.S. Constitution?"

As the constitutional scholarship winner, Johnson will receive a \$1,500 award for study at MSU as a full-time student for the 2001-2002 academic year. The scholarship, renewable for three academic years, has a total value of \$6,000.

The award will be presented to Johnson, the daughter of Lynn and Carolyn Johnson of **Pikeville**, during BLHS's awards night, June 11.

The Constitutional Essay and Scholarship competition is sponsored by Societas Pro Legibus pre-law society and the Department of Geography, Government and History, in cooperation with the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships.

Dr. William Green, MSU professor of government, coordinated the scholarship competition. "This is another example of how MSU uses its resources to encourage high school teachers and students in the service region to accomplish the goals of the Kentucky Education Reform Act," he said.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Renovation has begun in the center of the Morehead State University campus, near the Little Bell Tower, to complete the next step of the University's Master Plan and making the area more accessible to students.

"The major impact in the construction is the addition of ramps that will make the area in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act," said Joe Planck, physical plant director. "Removal of the existing concrete wall will make Camden-Carroll Library more visible."

In this phase of construction, the west portion of the concrete wall at the Little Bell Tower Plaza will be removed and a steel handrail will be installed. New to the redesign are several short walls to be used as benches for studying or visiting. Existing sidewalks will be replaced with bricks inlaid on both sides. Plans also will include a new retainer wall and sidewalk running adjacent to University Boulevard from the bell tower to the Button Auditorium driveway.

Once the construction is completed, the plot will be landscaped with flowering shrubs and trees that are native to Kentucky, Planck said. "We will restore the area to resemble its original state before a storm destroyed several trees in 1995."

The projected cost to complete the project is \$169,000, which includes an irrigation plan for the landscaping and the addition of traditional lighting. It is estimated that the work will be completed in late August.

During the week, Goins and at least one member of his band appear at elementary schools across Eastern Kentucky, Southwest Virginia and West Virginia, bringing bluegrass and mountain music to youngsters at no charge. His group made an appearance at the Grand Ole Opry in 1999, the same year Goins was a featured performer in the Grass Roots to Bluegrass documentary.

Non-riders, new riders or those in need of a refresher class may benefit from the Kentucky Motorcycle Program Basic Course. Topics to be covered include the basics of riding, and maneuvering and operating a motorcycle.

The workshop will be offered in Morehead on June 8-10, July 20-22, Aug. 3-5 and Sept. 14-16. In Ashland, the class will be taught on June 22-24, July 13-15, Aug. 10-12 and Sept. 7-9.

Motorcycles and helmets will be provided for the 20-hour course which has an \$80 fee. After completion, participants will receive a waiver for the skills test needed to obtain a motorcycle license and may receive a discount from some insurance agencies.

For the advanced rider, the Kentucky Motorcycle Program Experienced Course will be offered in Morehead on Saturday, Aug. 25, and in Ashland on Wednesday, Sept. 5. There is a \$50 fee for the eight-hour session. Helmets will be provided, but participants must provide their own motorcycles.
