MOREHEAD, Ky.---Fraternity members at Morehead State University have attained the highest overall grade point average of the schools in the Ohio Valley Conference for the 2001 spring semester.

The MSU men earned a 2.73 overall gpa, giving them the first place honor. The other seven schools in the ranking were Southeast Missouri State University, 2.72; Eastern Illinois University, 2.65; Tennessee Technologic University, 2.64; University of Tennessee at Martin, 2.62; Eastern Kentucky University, 2.57; Austin Peay State University, 2.57; and Murray State University, 2.55.

"We are very proud of their accomplishments," said Dave Cox, Greek affairs and student organizations coordinator. "For last semester, the fraternity men had a higher average than the men's average on campus."

More than 350 students are involved in Greek life on the MSU campus where they are members of 11 fraternities that include chapters of Delta Tau Delta, Kappa Sigma, Lambda Chi Alpha, Pi Kappa Alpha, Pi Kappa Phi, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Sigma Nu, Sigma Pi, Sigma Tau Epsilon, Tau Kappa Epsilon and Theta Chi.

This is the third year that data has been compiled on fraternity gpa's, according to Cox. In the overall sorority ranking, MSU's 2.96 gpa earned the females sixth place.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Three students and a faculty member from Morehead State University were presenters at the annual Kentucky Geographical Information Systems (GIS) conference held in Lexington.

The students were Eddie Hazelett, **Paintsville** senior; Beth Lawson, **Sandy Hook** senior; and Jessica McCarty, **Farmers** sophomore. They presented "Land Cover Change in Bath, Menifee and Rowan Counties," the only report produced solely by students and one of a few to use remotely sensed data.

Their presentation stemmed from a project in a course taught by Dr. John K. Maingi, assistant professor of geography in MSU's Institute for Regional Analysis and Public Policy. The class, "Introduction to Remote Sensing," focused on learning the basics of remote sensing and its software, ERDAS Imagine.

The student group was interested in permanent vegetation changes in the three-county region. The data revealed that 57,095 acres of land experienced a decrease in vegetation, while 85,215 acres experienced an increase. Such changes, they noted, are due to precipitation, temperature, population growth, development, increases in agricultural uses of land and conservation efforts.

Dr. Maingi's presentation, titled "Detecting Forest Damage by the Southern Pine Beetle in the Daniel Boone National Forest, Kentucky," was a joint effort with William M. Luhn, GIS program manager for the USDA Forest Service.

The Kentucky GIS conference was hosted by the Office of Geographic Information, part of the governor's Office of Technology. It was attended by a variety of professionals, state officials and researchers interested in information about the region.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Dr. Antonino Carnevali, a published researcher in plasma physics and fusion energy, has been named chair of Morehead State University's Department of Physical Sciences.

Dr. Carnevali came to MSU from the University of North Alabama in Florence where he was a professor of physics and a former chair of the Department of Physics and Earth Science. During his six-year term as department chair, he was instrumental in establishing a new geology major program and an option in physics, created on-campus research opportunities and internships with local companies and introduced the requirement for students to complete a research project and seminar presentation before graduation.

In 13 years of full-time teaching, Dr. Carnevali has taught approximately 25 different courses and laboratory classes. He has developed a variety of new offerings for master's degree candidates in physics education, along with upper level physics majors, including analog electronics and digital electronics courses, and "Interactive Physics," a course for non-science majors.

He is a former secretary and vice chair of the Alabama State-wide General Studies Discipline Committee for Physics, Astronomy and Physical Science. On the UNA campus, he was president-elect of the Faculty Senate and served on a variety of committees including the new-faculty mentor, research, planning and institutional effectiveness, and accreditation on faculty compensation in addition to the International Students Advisory Board.

An honor graduate of Hunter College in New York, Dr. Carnevali earned his Ph.D. degree in physics from the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. He completed doctoral and post-doctoral research in experimental and computational plasma physics at Oak Ridge National Laboratory. The results of his work were published in "Nuclear Fusion."

As a consultant and research associate for Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, N.Y., he was responsible for the design of the heavy-ion beam probe which became the first such project to work successfully in a 3-D magnetic field.

Recipient of several grants, Dr. Carnevali was involved in the Department of Energy EPSCoR's Summer Research Program in fusion energy at Auburn from 1996 through 1998 where he was a visiting scientist. He completed research grants from UNA to develop the Hollow-Cathode research facility to study plasma physics and developed a microcomputer-based laboratory to teach physics in a workshop format.

Dr. Carnevali has authored or co-authored 20 articles for scholarly journals, such as the "Review of Scientific Instruments," "Nuclear Fusion" and "The Physics Teacher," and made numerous presentations in physics education. Active in various professional organizations, he is a member of the American Physical Society, American Association of Physics Teachers, and Sigma Pi Sigma and Phi Kappa Phi honor societies.

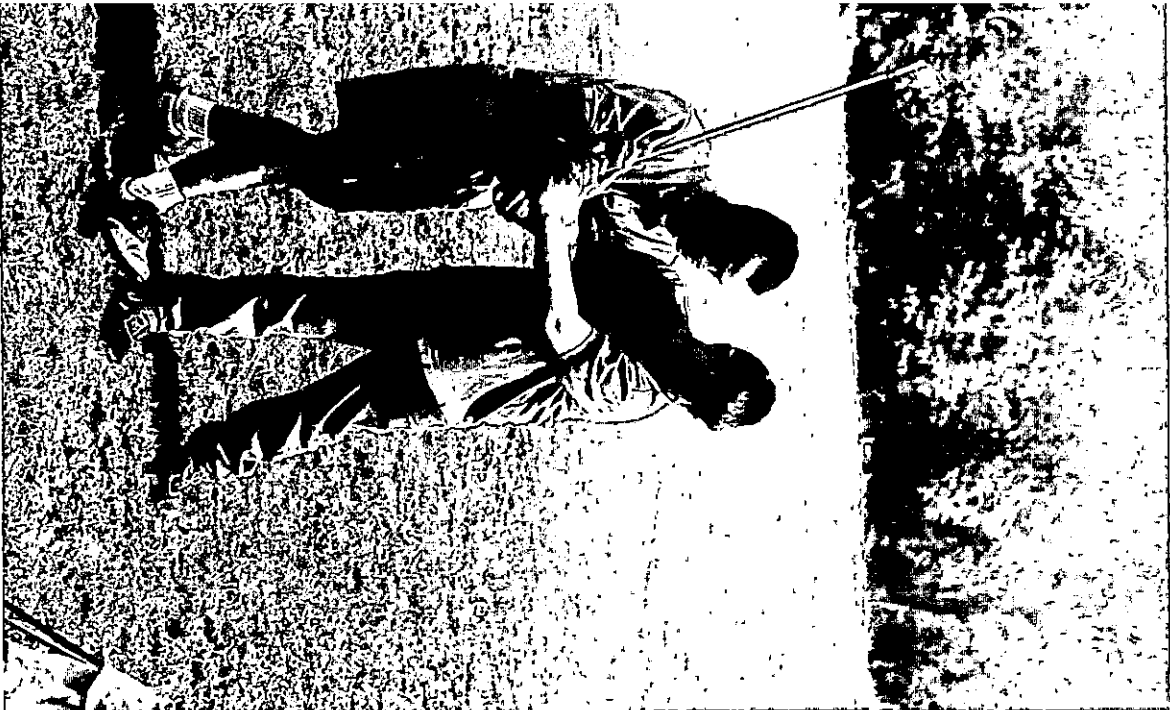

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University is cooperating with area fire departments in an effort to make the community a safer place to live.

The University has given its surplus fire extinguishers to volunteer fire units. Receiving a minimum of 10 water and five chemical extinguishers are: Elliottville, Farmers, Haldeman/Hayes Crossing, Hillsboro, Morehead, Muses Mills, Olive Hill, Route 377 and Salt Lick.

New fire codes allowed MSU to remove fire extinguishers from the hallways of the residence halls, according to Gene Caudill, assistant director of Physical Plant, who coordinated the project. Fire extinguishers will remain in those areas where there is a higher risk of a fire, such as the laundry and mechanical rooms or cooking areas.

"The fire extinguishers, which were removed from the residence halls in late spring, are top of the line," Caudill said. "The fire department staffs were very appreciative."

The departments plan to use the water extinguishers with the new chemical, fuelbuster, which was designed to put out gasoline fires, Caudill noted.

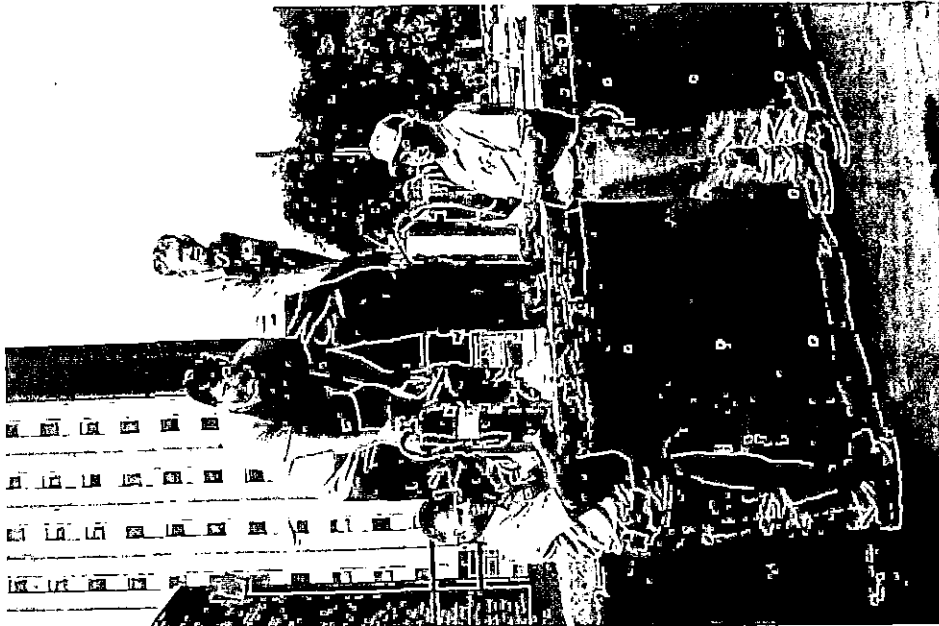

In the notification, Michael W. Bischoff, accreditation manager with the Kentucky Law Enforcement Professional Standards Committee, commended the staff for their enthusiasm and cooperation.

"We are very pleased," said Doug Brown, MSU police chief. "This accomplishment, which is the result of the efforts of the whole department, is a demonstration of the professionalism of this law enforcement unit."

In the past, a bookstore staff member has been assigned to deliver textbooks to each of the extended campus centers. "Now, the money previously needed for these labor costs will be used to hire temporary staff specifically assigned to handle the increased number of orders for these students," Redwine said.

The concert, which is free and open to the public, will feature Billyblues, Homer Ledford and the Cabin Creek Band, and Pat Haney. The show is part of a series presented by WMKY 90.3 FM, MSU's public radio to the mountains, and the Kentucky Center for Traditional Music.

Billyblues is a trio composed of Colin Raitiere on guitar, bass and vocals; Mark Lucas on guitar and vocals; and Mike Norris on harmonica, guitar and vocals. The acoustic band receives inspiration from all styles of blues and traditional Southern music.

For more than 30 years, Booth has been involved in coal mining operations in the Martin County area. As a college student, he worked weekends as an underground coal miner with Wolf Creek Collieries. After graduating from MSU with a Bachelor of Business Administration degree in 1971, he accepted a management position with the company.

Looking to explore new business ventures, Booth and a partner began a contract mining operation in 1975. Building on this business, he added another partner and expanded operations in 1985. He added direct marketing of his produced coal with the introduction of Beech Fork Processing Inc. in 1986. This endeavor allowed him to ship coal directly from the mine to the preparation plant to the electric utility on the Big Sandy River.

In 1995, Booth bought the Island Creek Coal Company and renamed it Czar Coal Corporation. Five years later, he purchased Marshall Resources Inc. and its affiliate companies, which added more than 1.5 million tons of annual production through their surface, high-wall mining and underground operations. What began as a single unit Island Creek contract mine now supplies more than six million tons of coal annually to electric utilities in the Eastern United States.

Booth and his associates branched out into the retail industry in the mid-1980s, adding 13 convenience and 10 fast food stores, a building and mining supply store, 13 oil change outlets, an insurance agency with eight locations and six franchised hotels. His mining operations alone employ more than 1,100 in East Kentucky.

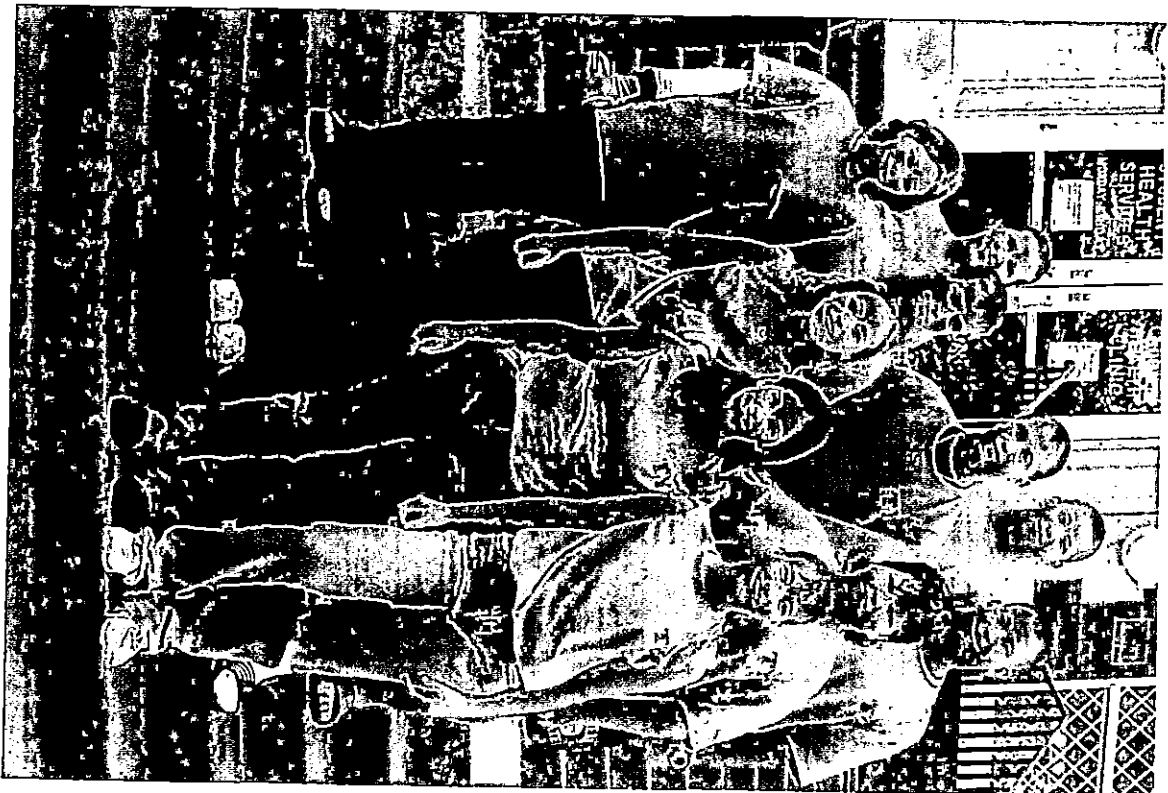

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Students in the Morgan County area who take classes at Morehead State University at West Liberty are getting closer to having a new place to attend classes.

"The contractors are on schedule and the new facility should be ready for occupancy in January," said Joe Planck, MSU director of physical plant. Pearson/Bender Associates PLC Architect and Biagi, Chance, Cummins, London, Titzer Inc. provided the design and engineering services for the \$6,000,000 state-funded project. C B & S Construction Company Inc. of Somerset received the building contract.

"The educational opportunities will increase tremendously with the new facility," said Dr. Jonell Tobin, the center's director. "We are so excited that we will finally have all our classes taught under one roof and have access to the latest in technology."

Currently, classes are held at five sites in West Liberty, according to Dr. Tobin who has been the center's only director. There are more than 50 offerings on the fall schedule.

The new facility will have three distance learning technology classrooms and a well-equipped computer laboratory and two computer classrooms. The two-story building also will house administrative offices, an auditorium and multi-purpose room, equipped with a kitchen on the first floor. On the second floor will be classrooms and the distance learning laboratories.

The University established its presence in West Liberty in 1987 with the MSU-Morgan Center to make educational opportunities accessible to area students in Elliott, Menifee, Morgan, Magoffin, Breathitt and Wolfe counties. From the beginning, it was home for the Adult Learning Center that has grown to become a model program for the state. After serving 5,989 adults, with 638 receiving GED certificates, the name was changed to the Education and Career Center to better reflect its mission of assisting adults in job preparation.

The center was renamed Licking Valley Extended Campus Center in 1990 and other educational classes, both adult and college classes, and governmental services were initiated. MSU also began offering classes leading to a two-year degree in University Studies, focusing on basic skills and liberal arts studies needed for retraining workers, as well as some graduate courses.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University has joined the pioneers of the “smart card” industry with the introduction of its new EagleCard.

The new identification card also is a debit card so you can make purchases without carrying cash in your pocket, according to Bill Redwine, director of auxiliary services. “The goal is to make life less stressful for everyone, especially students. For example, they may utilize various services in Camden-Carroll Library—such as checking out materials or using the convenience copiers—then selecting a snack from the vending machine, with just one card,” he said.

The EagleCard also may be used in the various dining areas, computer labs and student laundry facilities, Redwine noted.

Beginning this fall, all members of the campus community should have an EagleCard for identification purposes. The card is available for new or returning students, and faculty and staff at the Access Card office on the second floor of the Adron Doran University Center.

The card contains an embedded microchip for added security and usability. Transactions may be completed in the Access Card office or at any one of five other convenient locations on campus.

“Your EagleCard should be treated with the same care and security that you would give a credit card,” Redwine said. “In the event that your card is lost or stolen, notify the Access Card office immediately to have your card deactivated. This will interrupt your library privileges but will preserve the cash in your declining balance account.”

A lost or stolen card may be used by anyone with your card and the funds are not refundable, Redwine cautioned. “We recommend that you never carry more than \$50 on the chip,” he said.

By partnering with Firststar Bank, MSU has enabled the EagleCard to function as an ATM card. “If you choose to link your card to a Firststar account, you will have the added convenience of using only one card for all your financial needs,” Redwine added.

The first EagleCard is free to all students, faculty and staff. A \$25 fee will be charged to replace a lost or stolen card.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University's Institute for Regional Analysis and Public Policy (IRAPP) has awarded \$17,000 in grants to schools in East Kentucky to assist with student retention and educational attainment. These grants were funded by the Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) through IRAPP's Kentucky Higher Education Network Center (KY AHED).

The announcement was made today by Gov. Paul Patton and MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin at a special ceremony at the Capital Rotunda that was attended by students, parents, faculty and administrators. Gov. Patton praised the program's objectives, noting the importance of the KY AHED program for reducing dropout rates and increasing educational attainment in the region.

High schools receiving awards were Bath County, \$5,000; with Menifee County, Perry County Central and Whitley County each receiving \$4,000. ARC counties in East Kentucky are eligible to participate in the KY AHED program. These grants were awarded from competitive applications solicited from schools across the region this spring. Another competition is planned for next spring.

Southeast Community College and Hazard Community and Technical Colleges were partners with MSU in this project. Each institution has coordinators that serve public schools in their areas of the region.

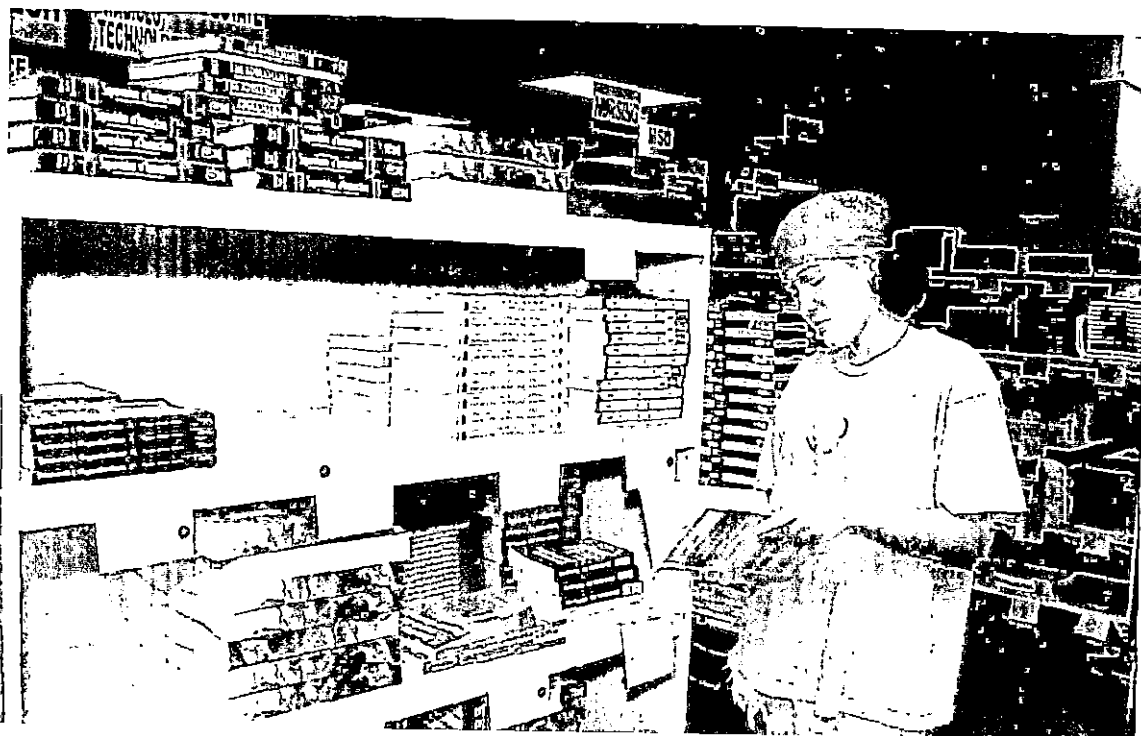
