invoked the Neutrality Law as it stands. However they seem to feel that the law should be amended along the line the administration has laid down, of selling to all on a cash and carry basis. That means of course that the United States manufacturers might sell to anyone who had the money, whatever nation they might represent, but that the purchaser must pay cash, and carry it away in his own boats.

War developments in the past few days have been scarce, with a complete censorship clamped down in France and England and with all nations making extravagant claims of successes. It seems to be clear that the Germans are making definite headway in Poland, but advice from Germany state that it is slower than was expected and that they are being fought every step of the way.

The Spanish War just ended may be an illustration that the fighting will continue along that line, at the Spanish Government maintained a war for three years, much longer than it was believed possible for them to hold out. The Poles need only hold long enough for the allies to get started on the Western front, as Belgium held in the World War in 1914. It seems certain that this war will surpass that war and is even now being called the Second World War.
