MOREHEAD, Ky.---Whether its Bluegrass, Celtic or folk, music lovers may enjoy it all at Morehead State University's "Americana Crossroads Live" on Friday, Feb. 22, in Duncan Recital Hall on the campus.

The concert, which begins at 7:30 p.m., will feature Atwater-Donnelly, Greg Trooper, and Melvin Goins & Windy Mountain. Doors open to the public at 7 p.m. to allow campus guests to visit the performers and sponsors display tables.

Aubrey Atwater and Elwood Donnelly, are self-taught musicians from Rhode Island who formed a duo in 1987. Atwater has performed original songs of social commentary, as well as contemporary folk songs and traditional ballads. Donnelly, who has performed professionally since he was 15, began with a rock band, then as a solo artist, and later in a Cambodian band. He writes songs for voice, guitar and harmonica.

The pair has performed throughout the United States and British Isles and their seven recordings receive international airplay. They have completed extensive research on folk music in New England, Ireland, England, Prince Edward Island, the Ozarks and Appalachia. The duet has shared festival billing with a number of folk legends, such as Jean Ritchie, Pete Seeger and Doc Watson.

Among Atwater and Donnelly's latest projects was a live recording titled "And Then I'm Going Home." They also completed two books of poetry, written by Atwater, and a 130-page songbook titled "Song by Song."

The free concert is presented by WMKY 90.3 FM, MSU's public radio to the mountains, and the University's Kentucky Center for Traditional Music (KCTM). Sponsors include Farmer's Mercantile, Morehead Tourism Commission, Poppy Mountain Bluegrass Festival and KCTM.

A recording of the live performance will air on WMKY on Thursday, Feb. 28, at 8 p.m.

WMKY has produced a CD, "Best of Americana Crossroads Live," which features 18 performances from the first six concerts in the series. The CD may be purchased at Farmer's Mercantile, the Kentucky Folk Art Center and Main Street Music in Morehead, as well as CD Central in Lexington.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Don Rigsby, award-winning singer and director of Morehead State University's Kentucky Center for Traditional Music, now has a "Song of the Year" to add to his list of honors.

Rigsby's "Empty Old Mailbox" was voted "Song of the Year" at the 28th Annual Society for the Preservation of Bluegrass Music in America (SPBGMA) awards on Sunday, Feb. 3, in Nashville. The song, written by Kentucky native Tom T. Hall and his wife, Dixie, is the title track on Rigsby's latest solo CD.

"I am quite happy and surprised to have won," said Rigsby, "especially since I was up against some tough competition. This has been a groundbreaking year for traditional music so I'm very proud to have been recognized."

Rigsby, who also plays mandolin, guitar and fiddle, was nominated in three other categories including Bluegrass Album of the Year, Traditional Male Vocalist of the Year and Mandolin Player of the Year.

In more than 17 years in the music industry, Rigsby has accumulated several other awards, including the 2001 SPBGMA Traditional Male Vocalist of the Year, 2001 Governor's Kentucky Star Award and two awards from the International Bluegrass Music Association.

Rigsby returns to the stage on March 22 for the 4th Annual Don Rigsby Homecoming Concert at the Paramount Arts Center in Ashland. The concert will kick off the release of his first CD recorded with his new band, Rock County.

He plans to begin recording his 5th solo CD in March as well.

Rigsby was named as the first full-time KCTM director at MSU in December. KCTM was established in June 2000 with the goal of preserving and promoting traditional music in all forms, especially Bluegrass, historical folk and gospel. The Center's offices opened last year at 133 E. First St. in Morehead.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Jacquelyn H. Scott, non-traditional and commuter coordinator at Morehead State University, has been appointed to the Committee on State Government Employees of the Governor's Task Force on the Economic Status of Kentucky's Women.

During the one-year term, Scott will be involved in examining issues that affect women and provide feedback to the task force. The next step, Scott noted, will be to compile information. To accomplish this goal, she will be asking for suggestions when she sends out a short survey in the next week.

"There are so many issues that we need to determine which are the most important," Scott said, "whether it is retirement, flex time, maternity leave or child care."

In November, Gov. Patton and the Kentucky Commission on Women created the task force to examine the barriers that affect the economic progress of women, to identify solutions and to develop a plan of action.

Since coming to MSU in 1982, Scott has served as counselor for the Displaced Homemaker Program; coordinator for Job Training Program and counselor for non-traditional students before being named to her current post in 1991. She served on the Education Task Force on Welfare Reform which made recommendations that resulted in House Bill 434. Scott is currently director of the STEPS project that provides workstudy wages to K-Tap recipients as part of the community service requirement of the welfare reform act.

Scott received her B.S. degree in psychology with a history minor from Abilene Christian University and a master's degree in adult and continuing education from Morehead State.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---With higher test scores, rising teacher enthusiasm and growing student motivation, an award-winning set of programs coordinated through Morehead State University is moving mountains to improve literacy in the Pike County school system.

"We're already seeing differences," said Dr. Melinda Willis, MSU associate professor of education and director of Pike County's Elementary Reading Academy. "Students are showing more excitement about reading and learning, even when they are not under direct supervision."

In the past two years, the district's CATS (Commonwealth Accountability Testing System) scores in reading have catapulted. As of Spring 2001, 10th grade reading scores in each of the county's six high schools have risen by at least 5 percent since 1999. Three high schools (Elkhorn City, Feds Creek and Phelps) had double-digit increases with Phelps leading the pack in an eye-popping 28.3 percent jump.

Fourth grade students in the district's 19 elementary schools improved their reading by an average of more than 4 percent. Scores in five elementary schools rose by more than 13 percent.

According to results from the Comprehensive Test of Basic Skills (CTBS), reading levels for third grade students climbed from the 47th percentile in 1999 to the 57th percentile in 2001. The biggest improvement came at Kimper Elementary where third grade reading skills improved by an astounding 47 percent in two years!

"This program is still young," said Judy Lester, Pike County Schools' director of federal programs, "so we can only hope scores will continue to improve as more teachers go through the academy."

After a 1999 internal study pointed to student reading ability as an overwhelming concern among its teachers, Pike County Schools Superintendent Frank Welch began looking for solutions. Using the state-sponsored Kentucky Reading Project as a model, the district formed a partnership with MSU and established a reading academy for its teachers in Spring 2000.

The goal was to provide teachers with new skills to help all students learn to read and better apply reading to all subjects. Thirty teachers met for 10 days during the school year to learn new strategies, create plans of action, discuss what methods are or are not working, exchange ideas and provide feedback.

"The benefit to having sessions during the school year," said Dr. Willis, "is that it promotes immediate application in the classroom and then immediate feedback during the next session. We also conduct follow-up visits with district personnel to observe how teachers implement their plans and offer feedback and support where needed."

"It is rewarding to see the rejuvenation of veteran teachers when they realize the impact these strategies are having on student learning," said Brenda Maynard, director of curriculum and instruction in Pike County.

"I only wish I had known all of these methods and strategies 15 years ago when I started teaching," said Roberta Justus, a primary teacher at Blackberry Elementary.

The success of the elementary program after the first semester led to the creation of the Middle and Secondary Reading Academy, led by Dr. Mary Anne Pollock, chair of MSU's Department of Elementary, Reading and Special Education.

"Once students learn the basics," said Dr. Pollock, "they can then apply reading to other subjects through vocabulary, writing and comprehension strategies. Some teachers fail to realize that many learning deficiencies are rooted in literacy. Everything revolves around how well students can read."

Teacher observations and academy evaluations suggest younger students are more confident and even use recess time to read to each other. Surveys of older students indicate they are retaining more and placing more value on learning the academic content of their classes. Also, while both boys and girls improved, early figures show girls have a slightly higher motivation for reading than boys.

Impressed by the program's first year accomplishments, the Kentucky Association of School Administrators (KASA) presented Pike County Schools with its Tom Vest Award for Outstanding Achievement in Professional Development in July 2001.

The Kentucky School Board Association (KSBA) followed up in November by honoring the district with a PEAK (Public Education Achieves in Kentucky) Award. One KSBA judge said the program "appears to have great potential to improve student achievement through improved leadership and instruction."

"These programs offer not only reading strategies, but they also offer thinking and learning strategies," Dr. Pollock added. "Getting teachers involved greatly increases our chances of getting children involved. If teachers see it work and see value in it, then the children will benefit from the teacher's efforts and enthusiasm."

"We have been so pleased with the program," added Maynard, "that we are continuing both academies this semester with a new group of teachers. They are convinced the academy concept is the most effective way to provide professional development for their teachers."

"Pike County's willingness to do this for their teachers and their students makes them stand out," said Dr. Willis. "We can only hope other districts in the state will follow suit."

MOREHEAD, Ky.---A popular folk singer who has toured the U.S. and Europe for the past 15 years will perform at Morehead State University's "Americana Crossroads Live" on Friday, Feb. 22, in Duncan Recital Hall on the campus.

Singer-songwriter Greg Trooper will perform along with Melvin Goins & Windy Mountain and Atwater-Donnelly at the concert, which begins at 7:30 p.m. Doors open to the public at 7 p.m. to allow campus guests to visit the performers' and sponsors' display tables.

Numerous artists, including Steve Earle, Billy Bragg and Vince Gill, have recorded Trooper's songs.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---World-renowned trombonist Abbie Conant will perform in concert at Morehead State University on Monday, Feb. 25.

The concert, which is free and open to the public, will begin at 8 p.m. in Button Auditorium.

MSU will be the second stop on her 16-city tour of the southeastern United States. While the tour will take her to nine states from Maryland to Arkansas, this will be her only appearance in Kentucky.

Conant will arrive in town on Sunday, Feb. 24, where a reception in her honor will be held at 6 p.m. at the Kentucky Folk Art Center, 102 W. First Street. The activity, sponsored by MSU's Women's Studies Program, is free and open to the public.

In her concert, Conant will perform material from two highly acclaimed works written in collaboration with her husband, composer William Osborne. "Street Scene for the Last Mad Soprano" is a music theater work depicting the down-and-out soprano living in a dumpster while waiting on an audition at the New York Opera House, and "Music for the End of Time" is a six-movement composition based on St. John's Book of Revelation.

Conant is touring with her own 600-pound, surround-sound system to provide the highest quality sonic effects.

An honors graduate of Temple University, Conant received her master's degree from the Juilliard School in New York City where she studied with Per Brevig of the Metropolitan Opera. She then earned a Meister diploma from the Staatliche Hochschule fur Musik in Cologne, Germany.

She was a solo trombonist with the Royal Opera of Turin, Italy, from 1979 to 1980 and with the Munich Philharmonic until 1993. Grant-writing workshop offered

The Caudill College of Humanities and the Office of Research, Grants and Contracts are co-sponsoring a two-day grant-writing workshop for faculty representing disciplines both in the visual and performing arts, and the social sciences.

On Feb. 20 and 21, there will be both mock proposal reviews conducted for faculty of similar academic disciplines, and the opportunity for interested faculty to have a 45-minute individualized consultation with AASCU/GRC staff regarding available funds for the faculty member's specific areas of interest.

The Caudill College is very fortunate to be able to bring consultants from such a well recognized and respected national organization to campus to work with our faculty, and this activity will certainly move us forward in goal attainment in this area." Dr. Seelig added.

With more than 25 albums to their credit, the band is preparing to record its latest CD with Kentucky native, Tom T. Hall, at his studio in Nashville.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---A Morehead State University researcher has received a nationally recognized grant to support her study of planetary nebulae.

Dr. Jennifer Birriel, assistant professor of physics, received the Theodore Dunham, Jr. Grant for Research in Astronomy in December. The award, in the amount of \$1,983, will be used to purchase a LINUX-dedicated personal computer to further her research into the relationships between planetary nebulae and binary stars.

"I'm very excited about receiving this grant," said Dr. Birriel, "and I'm anxious to begin analyzing data that I gathered at Kitt Peak Observatory in Arizona in October. Over the next couple of years, I'll be looking for evidence of specific energy emissions that could help us to better understand the evolution of stars."

Originally from Kansas, Dr. Birriel came to MSU in August 2001 after a brief term as a visiting assistant professor at Carleton College in Northfield, Minn. She has a master's degree in physics and a Ph.D. degree in astrophysics from the University of Pittsburgh.

Since 1986, the Fund for Astrophysical Research has awarded thousands of dollars in grants to promote the use of computer hardware/software and astronomical equipment in the study of the universe. Only seven to nine grants are given each year.

Dr. Theodore Dunham Jr., physicist and astronomer, was the scientific director of the F.A.R. from its founding in 1936 until his death in 1984. He was instrumental in the study of planetary atmospheres during his career and is best known for discovering the chemical makeup of the atmosphere of Venus.

Awards that bear his name are not intended for salaries or administrative costs and generally go to colleges, universities and non-profit observatories in North America.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---An innovative, new program at Morehead State University is putting its college faculty in a unique position to teach where many of them have never taught before – in a high school classroom.

“Our teachers need to know what’s really going on in today’s classrooms,” said Dr. Wayne Willis, MSU professor of education. “They go into these schools as learners.”

Created in Fall 2001, MSU’s Professors in Schools Fellowship program was designed to encourage all faculty who help train future teachers to go into public schools and participate in the day-to-day instruction of elementary and high school students. Each participant must work in the classroom with a local teacher for a minimum of 45 hours per year in the classroom. At least 25 percent of that time must be spent instructing students.

“Many of these types of programs around the country center more on research and methods and tend not to involve direct contact with the children,” said Dr. Willis. “We stress above all in our program that they have to teach actual students.”

“Every faculty member ought to experience this,” said Jackie Darling, MSU associate professor of radiologic sciences. “I have a huge respect for these high school teachers. They have to deal with a million interruptions in a class hour and still get their lessons taught.”

“Some have commented that it’s not what they expected,” Dr. Willis said, “and that they weren’t prepared to deal with all the discipline and learning problems, but that’s the point. We want this to be an eye-opening experience for them.”

More than 40 teachers signed up for the inaugural year of the program. The instructors represent every discipline at MSU from chemistry and biology to music and mathematics. Some have teaching experience outside the college level, but others, such as content specialists or educational theorists, may have little or no public school experience.

Due to the flexibility of the program, MSU faculty are now involved with schools in nearly 20 counties across East Kentucky. Instructors were able to choose their own school and arrange a work schedule with a local teacher. They also span a wide array of classrooms from 4th through 12th grade.

Rowan, Floyd and Bath Counties have the largest complement of MSU's "professors in schools," but faculty are also working with students in Boyd, Breathitt, Carter, Elliott, Fleming, Greenup, Johnson, Knott, Lawrence, Lewis, Magoffin, Mason, Menifee, Montgomery, Morgan, Pike and Powell Counties.

"Professors know their content," said Dr. Willis, "but all of us struggle at times to find successful ways to teach it to our students. The gap between the academic world of the university and the everyday life of the public school can be a very big one. Actually teaching in the public school classroom will help professors better understand both the students who come here and the struggles of the public teachers who taught them before."

Darling chose Allen Central High School in Floyd County for her work experience and said she has learned something valuable after every visit.

"I am impressed by their science department," she said, "but I was shocked to find out that so few students are taking physics and anatomy because those classes are not required. I understand now why some of my college students have difficulty with these subjects. I assumed they'd all been exposed to them before."

Participating faculty must keep a journal of their experiences not only as a record of their involvement, but more so to benefit them when they return to their college classrooms.

"We've found that people retain and learn more when they can reflect on the material or the experience," said Dr. Willis. "Reflection is the key to improving teaching."

At the end of the year, all of the participants will meet in a four-day workshop to compare notes about and discuss their individual experiences.

"By involving teachers from across the campus," added Dr. Willis. "this program also promotes cooperation and partnership between instructors of various disciplines because they all play some role in the education of future teachers."

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Dr. C. Nelson Grote, the 11th president of Morehead State University, 1987-92, will receive the 2002 Founders Day Award for University Service. The award will be presented at the 11:30 a.m. luncheon during the annual Founders Day on Thursday, April 4.

“This award is given to an individual who has supported Morehead State and Nelson Grote is most deserving because of his past record and continual involvement,” said MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin. “While president, he worked effectively to rebuild campus infrastructure and to improve student housing. He took leadership roles in promoting cooperative efforts in education at all levels, and encouraged partnerships between business and education.”

In a career that spanned 42 years in education, including 16 years at MSU, Dr. Grote was a high school teacher, served 21 years as a chief executive officer, participated in extensive overseas travels to study the European Common Market, and served as a member of numerous foundations and committees at the state and national level.

His association with MSU and higher education began in 1960 as an associate professor and chair of the Division of Applied Arts. He was later named dean of the College of Applied Sciences and Technology, a post he held from 1966 until 1971. He was president of Schoolcraft College in Livonia, Mich., 1971-81, and CEO of The Community Colleges of Spokane, Wash., 1981-87.

As MSU’s president, Dr. Grote maintained strong ties in legislative matters, promoted relationships with public schools in the service region, was instrumental in establishing successful marketing, and was an innovator in shared governance, staff development, collaborative problem-solving, wellness and staff recognition.

During his term as president, MSU’s student population increased by 55 percent in a five-year period. A record number of 9,169 were enrolled in 1992.

He received an honorary doctorate of Humane Letters from MSU and was granted emeritus status upon his retirement. An endowed scholarship has been established in the name of Dr. Grote and his wife, Wilma, and the MSU Alumni Association granted them honorary alumnus status.

Since his retirement, he has continued to stay involved in the community, serving on the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Council on Economic Education and the Jesse Stuart Foundation. He is vice president of the Kentucky Community and Technical College System Foundation, Inc.

Among the activities planned for Founders Day are a memorial brick dedication and an open house at Breckinridge Hall, which is being reopened after a \$14 million renovation.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---For the second time in three years, graduates of Morehead State University's Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) program have achieved a 100 percent passing rate on the national licensing exam.

All 21 of Morehead State's ADN graduates in 2001 passed the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). The exam, administered by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, is used to determine entry-level nursing competency.

MSU's 100 percent passing rate far surpassed the national average passing rate, which has remained at 83 percent for the past three years. Kentucky's average, which was 86 percent in 2000, is expected to remain the same when all of the 2001 test scores are tabulated.

"We are very pleased with the scores and we think this shows just how motivated the students in the program are," said Donna Corley, ADN program coordinator. "We also have a dedicated faculty and a wealth of support from the clinical facilities in the area."

The facilities involved with the program include St. Claire Medical Center, Outreach, Home Health and Hospice; The Gateway District Health Department, health units and school; Mary Chiles Hospital in Mt. Sterling; and King's Daughters' Medical Center in Ashland.

Associate degree candidates make up the largest group of those taking the test each year. In 2000, nearly 73 percent of Kentucky's candidates had graduated with two-year degrees.

MSU's ADN program, one of 23 such programs in the state, has a selective admissions policy and accepts only 30 students into the program each year. The program is designed to prepare graduates to become technical nurses.

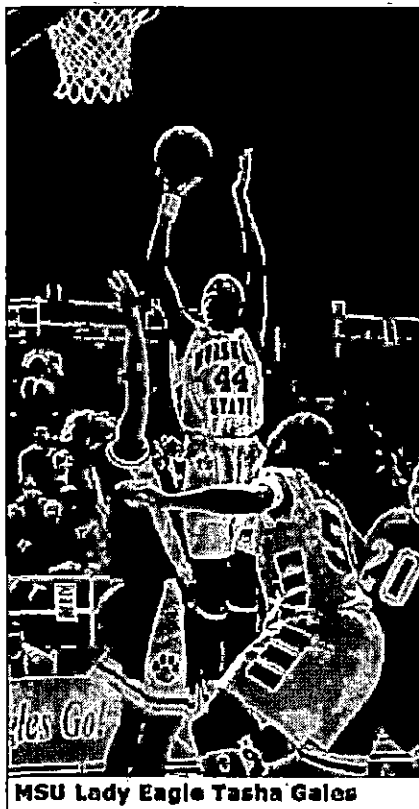

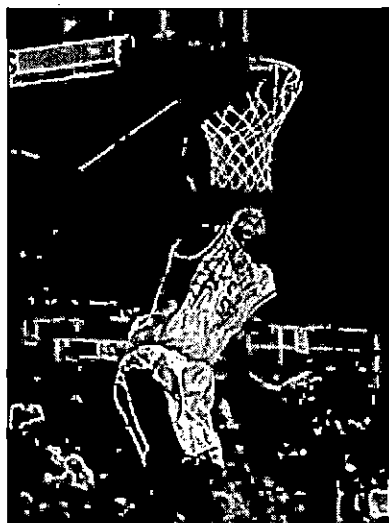
MSU to host OVC tournament Feb. 26

MOREHEAD, Ky.---With the largest spring semester increase in more than 12 years, Morehead State University is closing in on a record-breaking enrollment mark for Spring 2002.

On the heels of MSU's second-highest fall enrollment ever, preliminary figures show 8,575 students enrolled this spring, jumping more than 9 percent from last spring. That makes this semester's student population the second-highest in University history, less than 40 students below the benchmark of 8,613 set in 1993.

"This is a testament to our dedicated university-wide effort to enroll more students and keep them here to successfully achieve their degree goals," said MSU President Ronald G. Eaglin. "Our rising enrollment numbers continue to underscore the hard work and commitment of our faculty and staff members."

The number of full-time students this spring climbed to 6,003, the highest mark in recent years. The graduate population also continues to peak with 1,834 students, marking its highest spring enrollment in more than 22 years.

More than 88 percent of the University's graduate students and nearly 86 percent of MSU's total student population are from Kentucky.

This semester's figures continue a surge which began in Spring 2001. Last year's tally of 7,845 was an increase of more than 3 percent from Spring 2000.

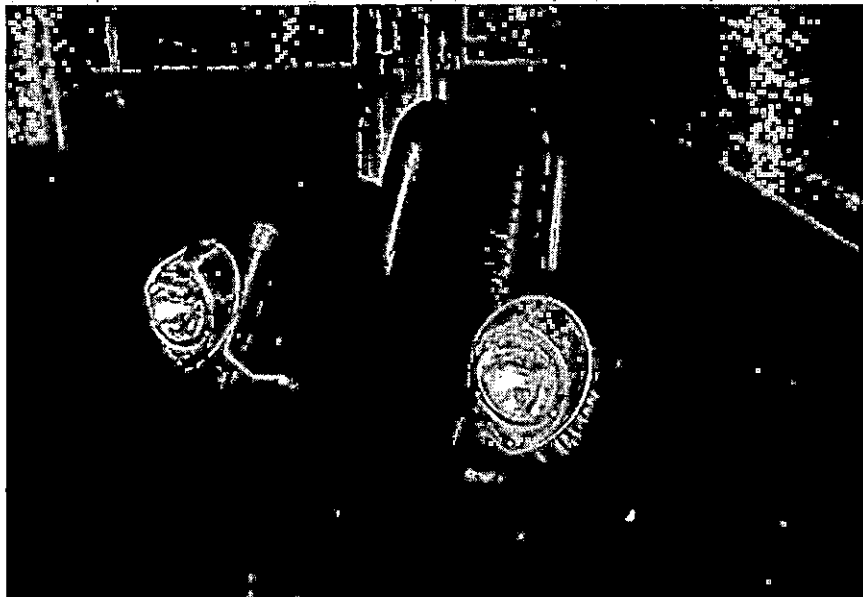
MSU INSTRUCTOR TO EXHIBIT WORK IN LOUISVILLE
