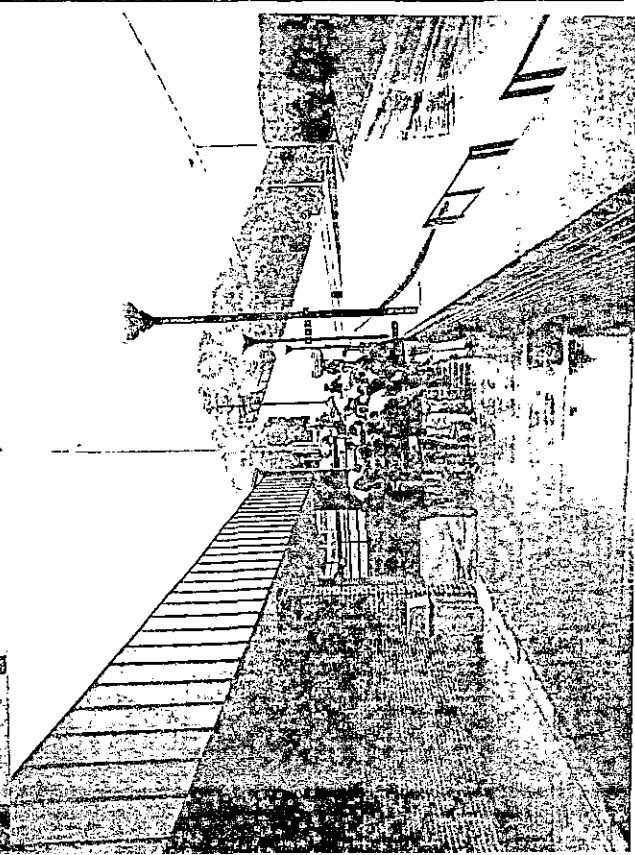
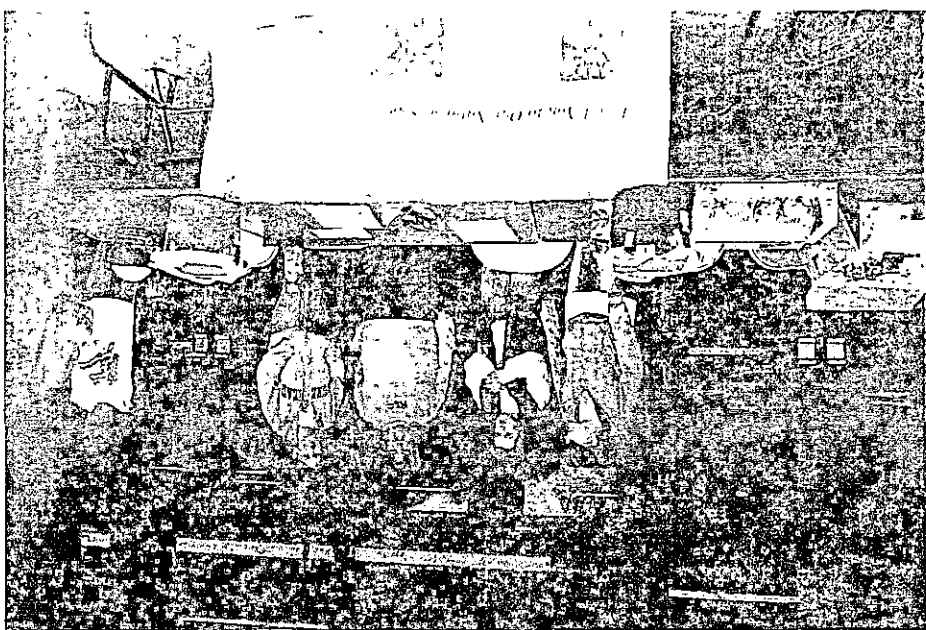

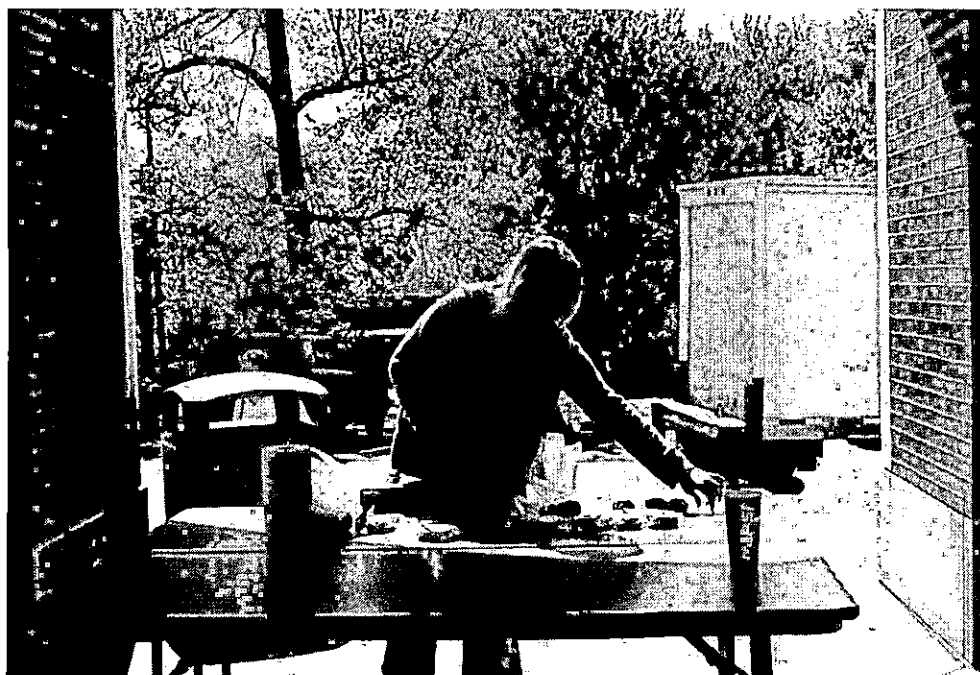

MOREHEAD, Ky.---No one was injured but water damage was “extensive” in a morning fire today at a vacant residence hall on the Morehead State University campus.

Officials said the fire apparently started on the ground floor of Mignon Tower where an outside contractor was soldering copper tubing in a project to replace part of the air conditioning system. The heat ignited insulation and sent smoke up a utilities shaft, activating the heat sensors which triggered the building’s sprinkler system.

Morehead Fire Chief Dale Adkins said the sprinkler system, installed in 2000, worked perfectly and prevented the fire from spreading.

Three trucks and 20 volunteer firemen responded to the alarm at the 15-story structure.

The sprinkler heads, with output of 35-40 gallons per minute, were in operation for approximately 45 minutes.

“We could not turn off the water until we were sure the fire was out,” Adkins said.

“Several crews were checking every floor to insure the building was safe.”

Adkins said the building sustained “extensive” water damage. Cost estimates were not immediately available.

Mignon Tower was erected in 1967. It has been closed for renovation. The building houses 300 students during the regular school year.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University's Board of Regents has approved a \$92.1 million operating budget for 2002-2003, contingent on the adoption of a biennial budget by the state legislature.

The Regents also granted President Ronald G. Eaglin a new, four-year contract and raised his salary from \$170,000 to \$176,000, an increase of 3.4 percent. MSU's chief executive officer since 1992, Dr. Eaglin has the second longest tenure in that office.

The salary pool for MSU's employees for 2002-2003 is 3.8 percent with an additional four percent in fringe benefits, primarily medical insurance.

MSU students will see a rise in tuition and student activities costs beginning with the fall semester. Tuition for full-time resident undergraduate students has been established at \$1,212 with student fees set at \$250, for a total of \$1,463. With residence hall improvements including the next phase of the sprinkler system a priority, the average rate for on-campus housing is \$1,079, up from \$990 last year.

Demand for the University's online Masters of Business Administration (MBA) degree has resulted in a separate tuition rate for that degree program. Resident MBA students will pay \$1,917, compared to \$2,817 for non-residents. Part-time resident and non-resident students coming into the program will pay \$213 and \$313, respectively, per credit hour.

In other business, the Board designated the Kentucky Center for Traditional Music, Inc., as an affiliated corporation, the same as the Kentucky Folk Art Center, Inc.

For service to the University, commendations were presented to Dr. Lynne Fitzgerald, professor of health, physical education and recreation, who served as the faculty regent since 1999, and Brian Martin of Grethel, outgoing president of the Student Government Association who served one year as the student regent.

The Regents were informed that WMKY Radio will become the flagship station of MSU's new public radio network. Effective July 1, the hookup will be identified as Morehead State Public Radio with FM transmitters in Rowan, Owsley and Martin counties.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Learn about the fascinating industry of bee farming during Morehead State University's Appalachian Celebration, which runs June 23-29.

Phil Craft, Kentucky's state apiarist, will conduct a workshop from 2-4 p.m. on Monday, June 24, on the lawn of the Laughlin Health Building on campus. Craft coordinates information services, networking and disease/pest control data for beekeepers across the state.

Topics for the class will include how to set up and maintain a hive, locating suitable places for a bee farm, commercial pollination, honey and beeswax production and how to use honey bees to increase your own vegetable and fruit production.

The class is sponsored by the Kentucky Department of Agriculture.

Historically, beekeeping has steadily declined in the United States since the 1940s, but Kentucky's honey crop for 2001 was one of the best in recent years. Many beekeepers across the state reported 50 to 100 percent increases in their yields. MOREHEAD, Ky.---A new branch of extinct marine life has an official name and a chapter in the history of life on Earth thanks to the lifelong work of a Morehead State University researcher.

An article in the May 2002 issue of the "Journal of Paleontology" describes a new genus and species, or subgroup, of shelled aquatic life called *Masonoceras*, named in honor of Charles E. Mason, MSU associate professor of geoscience. The article was written by Mason's colleagues, David M. Work of the Cincinnati Museum Center and Dr. Walter L. Manger of the University of Arkansas.

"Most times, researchers will have a species named after them, but it's pretty rare to have an entire genus named after you," said Mason.

The *Masonoceras* genus contains several species of ammonoids distinguished by unique features of their shells. Ammonoids are a group of extinct marine creatures with straight or coiled shells, related to the modern-day octopus, squid and chambered nautilus. Their fossilized remains are found in marine rocks around the world dating from more than 400 million years ago to the time that dinosaurs became extinct about 65 million years ago. Mostly predatory, these tentacled animals could swim at varying depths and propel themselves by regulating the amount of air in the chambers of their shells.

While members of this new genus have been identified as far away as Australia, the main species has been named *Masonoceras kentuckiense*, or "Mason's ammonoid from Kentucky."

"I found the first one in Rowan County in the late 1970s while I was working on my master's degree," Mason said. "I've discovered many more in Rowan County along with some in Bath County and parts of southern Ohio. Due to the abundance of fossil ammonoids from the Lower Mississippian time period, this area is the best in the world for researching extinct ammonoids of this age interval."

Masonoceras kentuckiense thrived in this region more than 300 million years ago, when the area was part of a shallow epicontinental sea, covered by several hundred feet of water. Members of this species were small, never reaching more than three inches in diameter, but some ammonoids grew to be nearly six feet across.

A native of Lewis County, Mason earned a bachelor's degree in biology and geology from MSU and a master's degree in geology from George Washington University. He worked for the U.S. Geological Survey in Washington, D.C., for seven years before joining the University's faculty in 1982.

He has published approximately 50 papers related to his geological and paleontological research and is currently writing several more related to the study of the geologic past of this region of Kentucky.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---An Ohio duet known for its distinctive harmonies and reverence for old-fashioned melodies will open the next "Americana Crossroads Live" concert series on Friday, June 28, on the Morehead State University campus.

Ann and Phil Case, traditional and folk music artists, will kick off the concert, slated to begin at 7:30 p.m. at Duncan Recital Hall in Baird Music Building.

The Cases have been singing and playing music together since 1990. Their specialty is old-time Appalachian duets, parlor songs and Depression-era tunes. Additionally, they are renowned for their instrumental duets, featuring Ann on back-up guitar and Phil on any one of a variety of 1920s and 1930s vintage instruments, including clawhammer banjo, mandolin, dulcimer and guitar.

They cite their influences as the Carter Family, ragtime, traditional ballads and early country blues. Recently, the couple was awarded a grant as master artists from the Ohio Arts Council to teach Appalachian duet singing.

Critics have described Ann's voice as "distinctive, exquisitely simple and refreshing," and Phil's harmonizing vocals and accompaniment as "solidly supporting Ann's leads and his instrumental work on guitar, banjo and mandolin is tastefully done."

The Case's first compact disc, "The Springtime of Life," was released in 1996 on their own Dry Run Recordings label. Their latest, "Never Grow Old," is a 1999 release. They have performed at numerous festivals, coffeehouses and other special events and will be among the featured performers at the upcoming Appalachian Celebration at MSU which runs June 23-29.

Following the Case's performance, American singer/songwriter Tanya Savory will take the stage at 8:15 p.m. and Joe Dobbs & The 1937 Flood, a folk/blues/jazz ensemble, will perform at 9 p.m. WMKY Radio will record the program for rebroadcast at 8 p.m. Thursday, July 4.

ACICS, a non-profit education corporation, accredits institutions offering primarily business and business-related programs of study through the master's degree level. It accredits 625 institutions in this country and abroad, which last year enrolled more than 302,000 students.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---A commemorative journey saluting the academic legacy of famed educator Booker T. Washington arrives at Morehead State University's Kentucky Folk Art Center for one night only on Sunday, June 16.

"Freedom Trek III," a month-long event promoting African-American heritage, traces the path that Washington may have taken in the late 19th century from his office as president of Tuskegee Institute in Alabama to his childhood in Malden, W.Va.

During the group's stopover at KFAC, an exhibition of works by African-American artists will be on display in the Center's Ruth Auditorium, starting at 7:30 p.m. At 8 p.m., an historical interpreter from the tour will give a presentation on Washington's, followed by a reception in the Richardson Gallery.

The event, sponsored by KFAC and the Morehead Tourism Commission, is free and open to the public.

Now in its third year, the trek began in Tuskegee, Ala., on May 31 and will cover 18 stopovers in four states. In Kentucky, the travelers are scheduled to stop in Franklin, Horse Cave, Hodgenville, Bardstown, Louisville, Shelbyville, Frankfort, Lexington, Morehead and Ashland. It will end in Malden on June 20.

Trek organizers say the trip allows participating cities and states to showcase their heritage, landmarks and other tourist attractions, while honoring the life and achievements of Washington.

Born into slavery on a Virginia tobacco farm in 1856, Washington began working in a salt mine at age nine. He used his free time to study and later worked as a janitor to earn a teaching degree from the Hampton Institute in Virginia. In 1881, he became principal, and then president, of the newly-founded Tuskegee Institute. After retiring from education in 1895, he wrote a best-selling autobiography and became an adviser to President Theodore Roosevelt.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---A Morehead State University marketing professor will travel to Europe in August to present her latest research and learn more about European retail economies.

Dr. Michelle Kunz, associate professor of marketing, will attend the 9th International Conference on Recent Advances in Retailing and Services Sciences in Heidelberg, Germany, Aug. 15-19. She is scheduled to discuss two recent papers dealing with various aspects of online retailing.

Her first paper, "Providing a Seamless Experience Across Multi-Channel Retailing: Employing Consumer Relationship Management (CRM) Technology Effectively," addresses how businesses can use technology to improve customer sales, retention and relationships. Working with Dr. Ronald Cheek of the University of Louisiana, Lafayette, Dr. Kunz found that many companies succeed or fail based on how well they interact with customers. They argue that new consumer management software can help businesses succeed both online and in person.

The second paper, "The Convergence of Brick and Click Retail Atmospherics: Delivering Similar Worth Utility Online and On-Land," examines the different environments and expectations between shopping online and in-person. Dr. Kunz, along with MSU assistant professor of marketing Dr. Kenneth Henderson, suggest that businesses focus not only on the affordability of a product, but also the ease of purchase, availability, and cost of shipping the product to various locations from both online services and actual retail stores.

During her two-week trip, Dr. Kunz also will visit a fellow marketing professor in Slovenia to discuss that country's struggling economy and how retailing is developing in an area once part of a communist society.

Funding for the trip is being made possible in part by MSU's Department of Management, Marketing and Real Estate and the Office of International Education.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Timeless, natural remedies for ailments will be highlighted at a special class during this year's Appalachian Celebration at Morehead State University.

The class, "Forest Botanical and Domestication of Wild Medicinal," will be offered from 10 a.m. until noon on Thursday, June 27, on the Laughlin Health Building lawn as part of the celebration, which runs June 23-29.

Sponsored by the Kentucky Department of Agriculture, the class will be taught by Linda Heller of the Mountain Tradition Cooperative. Topics will include the history of the mountain tradition of using natural, wild plants and herbs and how the practice developed; plant identification and cultivation; market values of various plants; and the profit potential of herbal medicines.

"There are roughly 100 medicinal plants native to Kentucky," said John Cotten, director of the Division of Value-Added Wood Promotion within the Kentucky Department of Agriculture, who is coordinating the class. "Different barks and roots have been used traditionally for medicines and tinctures."

Risks associated with medicinal herbs will be explored at the class. "You have to be very careful about selecting some plants and barks, because if you're not, the results could be fatal," he said. However, Cotten says, many native plants can be used safely as relaxants and symptom relievers for a variety of illnesses as well as fragrant teas.

A related class will be a botanical nature walk, led by Daymon Morgan. Participants will be invited to tour a section of woodland in Morehead to view the plants in their natural environment. Instruction on identifying various herbs medicinal plants will be provided as the walk proceeds.

The nature walk will run from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. Thursday, June 27. Those taking part in the walk should meet on the Laughlin Health Building lawn.

"Joe Dobbs and the 1937 Flood," an eclectic ensemble of musicians whose individual styles range from Dixieland jazz to Scottish reels, will take the stage at 9 p.m. Friday, June 28, in Duncan Recital Hall on the campus. The group's performance is part of the Americana series, which will be recorded by WMKY, MSU's public radio, for broadcast July 4 at 8 p.m.

The band's frontman, Joe Dobbs, is a Mississippi native who is the grandson of a fiddler. Dobbs moved to West Virginia in 1967 and has been involved with folk music there for 30 years as a fiddler, recording artist, instructor and lecturer. He has toured extensively throughout North America, Africa, Australia, New Zealand and areas of Europe, performing traditional Appalachian folk music.

Dobbs is the owner of Fret 'n' Fiddle of St. Albans, W.Va., a renowned music store for vintage instruments, creator and host of the weekly "Music from the Mountains" radio show on West Virginia public radio.

Band mates include Dave Peyton, one of group's founding members, Charles Bowen, Doug Chaffin, Chuck Romine and Sam St. Claire. Primarily a string band, the members collectively play a variety of instruments including guitar, banjo, fiddle, tuba, ukulele, autoharp, harmonica and bass. Their repertoire features Appalachian folk music, jazz, blues, swing, ballads and jug tunes.

Its unusual name comes from a conversation at a house party in the mid-1970s about the devastating 1937 flood. Dobbs stuck the name on the band because, he said, "they're still talkin' about us!"

The Americana concert will begin at 7:30 p.m. with a performance by Ann and Phil Case, traditional folk artists, followed by singer/songwriter Tanya Savory at 8:15 p.m.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Consumers have seen advertisements and product labels touting goods as being “organically grown.” But what exactly does that mean and does the organic designation make a product superior?

These questions and many others will be answered at a workshop during Morehead State University’s 26th annual Appalachian Celebration, which runs June 23-29. The session will be held on the lawn of the Laughlin Health Building from 9-11 a.m. on Monday, June 24.

Sponsored by the Kentucky Department of Agriculture, the workshop will cover various topics of interest not only to consumers, but for anyone with a green thumb who aspires to raise and market organically grown produce or livestock.

Raising truly organic vegetables is not as easy as simply growing them in a backyard garden without commercial fertilizers, according to John Cotten, director of the Division of Value-Added Wood Promotion within the Department of Agriculture.

“There’s a whole list of issues you have to deal with,” he said. “The primary things we will explore are the new federal regulations on organic foods and what must be done to legally use a label that says ‘organically grown.’ This requires being certified.”

Those who attend the class will learn about soil and pest management, fertilization, crop production, industry growth and marketing. Information will be provided on a certification class the Department of Agriculture has scheduled for October.

“There are opportunities for organic aquaculture and even livestock, including cattle, goats and more,” Cotten said. Certified organic beef is sought after and sold at a significantly higher price than regular commercial meat, he explained.

Two additional Department of Agriculture-sponsored workshops will be presented during the celebration, one on Tuesday, June 25, with a third scheduled for Friday, June 28, on the Laughlin lawn.

The first one, scheduled for 10 a.m. until noon, will focus on growing, harvesting and selling ginseng. The speaker for the workshop will be Chris Kring of the state’s Ginseng Certification Program, who also is teaching the organic farming class.

“Basically, he’s going to talk about the legalities of ginseng, including commercial sales and dealing with the federal regulations,” Cotten said.

Although there are several varieties of the plant, ginseng is native to Kentucky, as well as other areas of North America. Because of its believed medicinal properties, many residents venture into remote woodlands to dig the root which is dried and sold.

“At this time, you don’t have to have a license to dig it,” Cotten said, something he expects to change within the next few years as ginseng becomes increasingly rare.

Jack Gonia, a leading producer of shitake mushrooms in Kentucky, will lead a class on growing and marketing the edible fungus. His program will be held from 1-2 p.m. on Tuesday, June 25.

This workshop will be of interest to those who wish to grow the mushrooms on any level of production from home consumption to producing the mushroom for profit.

Learning the history and practical aspects of the use of aromatherapy will be the subject of another class, to be presented 1-3 p.m. Friday, June 28, also on the Laughlin lawn. Malinda Higgins and Janet Osborne will describe the use of aromatherapy and how to identify and grow your own aromatic plants.

MOREHEAD, Ky.—A Morehead State University historian has been awarded a prestigious grant to further his studies in battlefield restoration.

Dr. Adrian Mandzy, assistant professor of history, will receive a \$15,000 Fulbright-Hayes Faculty Research Abroad Program Grant, to be used toward his studies in Poland and the Ukraine, through Aug. 31.

His grant is titled, “Public History at Zboriv: The Study and Preservation of a 17th Century Cossack Battlefield in Western Ukraine.”

Dr. Mandzy’s project will be gathering data and documenting the location of Zboriv, the site of a 1649 battle between Ukrainian Cossacks and forces of the Polish crown. Other military groups involved in the conflict were Germans, Turks and Tartars. The fighting took place on several battlefields in Western Ukraine.

“The focus of the grant will be to plot the remains of the battle,” Dr. Mandzy said. In proposing the grant project, he drew from the work of Doug Scott, who used historical records such as native accounts, maps and military documents as well as modern technologies like advanced metal detectors to detail the site of the battle of Little Big Horn – made famous as Gen. George Custer’s “last stand.”

Restoration research also has been used successfully at the American Civil War battlefield at Gettysburg, Penn., although the use of metal detectors there has never been allowed, Dr. Mandzy said. This type of work has been done on other sites from the Civil War and the American Revolution.

“This brought about unity, bringing together former enemies, marking this for the purpose of commemorating this historical conflict,” Dr. Mandzy said. “It’s using history to put together a joint past. So, I took this idea and proposed it for Poland and Ukraine.”

Administered by the Council for the International Exchange of Scholars in Washington, D.C., the Fulbright-Hayes Faculty Research Abroad program grants are awarded for research in specific countries where the applicant has a special expertise, in addition to language ability.

Dr. Mandzy holds bachelor's degrees in history and anthropology from St. John Fisher College; a master's degree in anthropology from Michigan State University and a doctorate in history from York University. Additionally, he completed the International Summer School of Ukrainian Studies in Kiev, Ukraine, and the Harvard Ukrainian Summer School. He also speaks the Ukrainian and Polish language.

He was a Post-Doctorate Fellow at the Department of Archaeology, University of Warsaw, Poland, and a founding member and director of the Kamianets-Podilsky Foundation, dedicated to the study, preservation and promotion of Kamianets-Podilsky's culture and heritage. He recently worked as an historic preservation specialist with the National Heritage Trust.

The author of numerous publications about historical archaeology, Dr. Mandzy's research interests include the expansion of the European world system during the late medieval and early modern periods, historical archaeology of Ukraine and Eastern Europe, North America and the Mediterranean and Black Sea basins, as well as frontier studies and spread of religious and secular empires.

Dr. Mandzy also is coordinating the implementation of a master's degree in his specialty - public history - at MSU. He says public history, is the science of not just establishing a location of and documenting an historical event, but "caring for these monuments and how generations are told about them."

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Reaching students earlier to prepare them for college is the goal of a five-year, \$7.6 million program designed to target thousands of middle school students in Kentucky's poorest school districts.

The East Kentucky Appalachian Regional GEAR-UP Project, administered through Morehead State University's Institute for Regional Analysis and Public Policy, focuses primarily on improving mathematics and science skills for students in Floyd, Johnson, Martin and Pike Counties, beginning with the seventh grade.

Under the cooperative effort of Pikeville College, Prestonsburg Community College and MSU, the project began in February 2001 with the goal of guiding and advising students as they prepare for college. Adding a new seventh grade population each year, the project will reach more 5,000 students in 33 schools this fall with a variety of academic, mentoring, tutoring, counseling and summer camp programs.

"We have to reach students early to make them aware of college opportunities," said Kevin Hall, MSU's GEAR-UP Project director. "Many students don't consider the option of going to college so we make sure they know what's out there... everything from career information and college costs to financial aid and scholarships."

Hall said these four counties were targeted for several reasons, including high poverty and unemployment rates, low family income, below average scores on state achievement tests and high percentage of adults without high school diplomas.

"Thirty-seven percent of students in these counties live in poverty," said Hall. "Only one out of every two adults finished high school and less than half of their children go to college. Our goal is to increase college enrollments from these schools by 10 percent every year beginning with our first group of seventh graders which will graduate in 2006."

In 1997, only 27 percent of Kentucky's 18-24 year-olds were enrolled in college compared to the national average of 32 percent. Last year, for the first time ever, Kentucky had more than 200,000 people enrolled in college. The Council for Postsecondary Education has set a goal for the state to raise that number to more than 240,600 by 2020.

GEAR-UP, or Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness For Undergraduate Programs, is a 1998 U.S. Department of Education initiative that established multi-year state and partnership grants to help middle school children and their parents make informed decisions about college. East Kentucky GEAR-UP, a partnership grant, is second only to the state's \$21 million GEAR-UP grant in size and scope.

"For students to stay interested in their educational future, we have to get parents involved early," said Hall. "National studies show that parental involvement tends to drop dramatically when children reach middle school. Many parents in these counties never attended college and some did not even finish high school, so it is imperative that we use special meetings and activities to reach the parents as well."

Hall says each school district has a GEAR-UP coordinator assigned to manage the program, maintain a detailed budget, organize tutoring sessions and camps and schedule field trips to museums, plays, businesses and college campuses.

Some schools have even used GEAR-UP funding for unique projects and learning tools. For example, Pike County purchased special graphing calculators for math students and Johnson County bought wireless laptop computers and designed a mobile system throughout the school for students to use educational software and explore the Internet.

"Tutoring programs and other after-school activities are showing huge improvements in focus and student participation at all the schools," said Hall. "We've also had an extremely positive reception from parents about our efforts to keep them involved. Everyone is starting to realize that there should be no stigma or embarrassment placed on anyone that needs or wants help with their education."

Each seventh-grader is given a career assessment test to identify their interests, list possible career choices and offer advice on how career goals can be achieved. Students then devise individual "graduation plans" that outline possible courses that should be taken in high school.

"State test scores for seventh and 10th graders will be our best guide to how successful the program is," said Hall. "We also will compare the students' progress with that of students in other East Kentucky counties."

While it is still early to assess GEAR-UP's success, Hall says discussions are under way on state and national levels to add a sixth and even a seventh year to the project in order to follow their first group of seventh graders as they continue on to college.

"We hope our program stays around for a long time to help every child possible," Hall said.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Teaching students how to avoid credit card debt and other financial pitfalls of college life is the message of a special program coming to Morehead State University this fall.

"Big Money," an interactive multi-media presentation, shows students how much, or little, they know about their finances. The program, conducted at colleges nationwide by Patrick McGarrity and John Dietrich, will be presented to new students as part of orientation activities on Thursday, Aug. 15.

"This is a fast-moving, interactive program that gives students the opportunity to learn important information on managing money and avoiding debt," said Madonna Weathers, MSU vice president for student life. "It was well-received by students last year so we're pleased to have it back this fall."

With "Big Money," McGarrity and Dietrich use light-hearted scenarios to show students how to avoid the dangers of credit cards and save money over time to stay out of debt and pay off student loans.

"The average student leaves college with over \$15,000 in debt," said McGarrity, who wrote "What I Wish My Parents Had Told Me" which details his own college financial woes.

"Each fall on most college campuses," he said, "students find displays and recruiters wooing them with free T-shirts, CDs and other stuff for simply signing up for a credit card. More than 70 percent will fall victim to the idea of using those cards instead of money and before they know it, they'll be carrying an average balance of at least \$2,500 every month."

According to McGarrity and Dietrich's Web site, many colleges lose more students each year because of credit card debt than academic failure. Most students mistakenly believe they have good money management skills, even though a majority of them admit to out-of-control spending, excessive debt, no written budgets and failing grades caused by worry over their financial situation.

Having first visited the MSU campus last fall, McGarrity says he's glad to be returning during the first week of the semester because that's when new students are being bombarded with offers and free gifts from dozens of credit card companies.

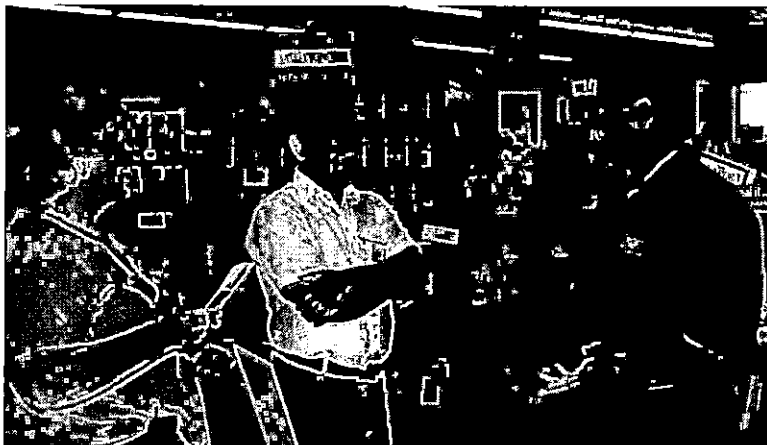

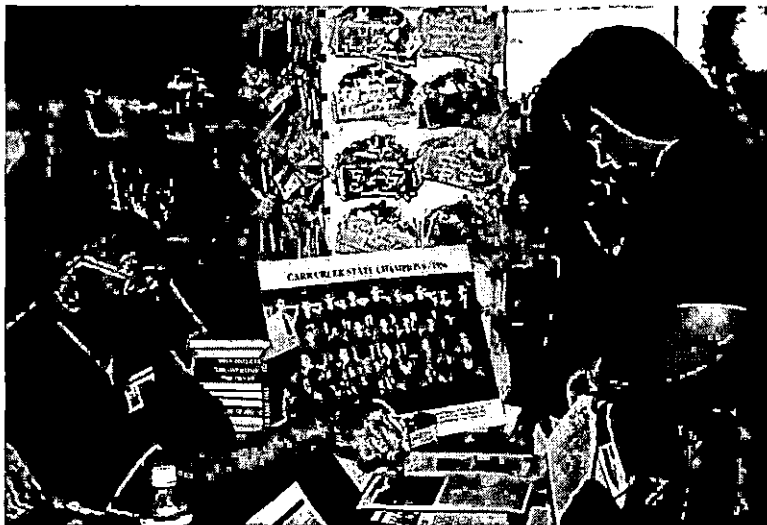

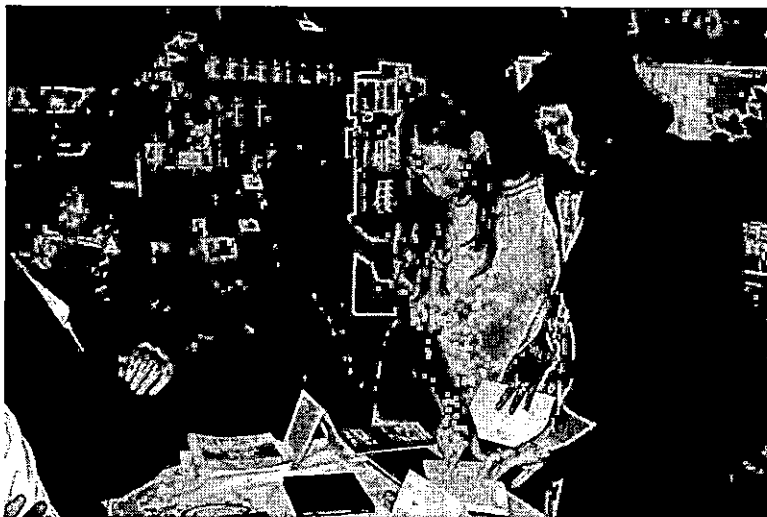
