CINCINNATI, Oct. 12.—The case of Craig Tolliver for the alleged robbery of Mrs. Hannah Buxton, at Lockland, four years ago, was called this morning before Judge Huston. Tolliver was arrested and brought here immediately after being discharged from custody in Kentucky for his connection with the Rowan county troubles. When brought here he was suffering from wounds, and when his case was called, some two months ago, it was postponed to give him a chance to recover his health slightly. He is in fair shape now, and appeared in Judge Huston's Court this morning with his attorneys, Maj. C. H. Blackburn, Miller Outcalt, and Squire Ruddell. The State was represented by Prosecutor Pugh, who has done excellent work in this celebrated robbery case. The State exercised all its peremptory challenges, and got rid of several persons not wanted, among them W. C. Elstner, who was one of the jurors in the Mullen case.

Mr. Pugh asked that the jury be not sworn until they were right on the point of beginning the trial. He said a very important witness had not yet arrived, but would be here in a day or two. Maj. Blackburn wanted to know the name of the witness, but Mr. Pugh would not give it. The court, for this and other reasons, put the case over to Thursday morning.
