Earl Duncan had one of the hottest nights of his spectacular career Monday night when he scored 35 points and led the Eagles to a surprising 63-40 victory over Marshall College. Duncan's uncanny shooting enabled the team to win in a surprise which was never threatened. Marshall's fast-break proved to be ineffective with Howerton, Hogge and Holbrook continually controlling the tempo.

Duncan hit the hoops for 15 field goals and 10 free throws, the most of every conceivable kind. The play of Fred Johnson, Max Brand, and "Cotton" Howerton also was outstanding.

"Babe" Maize, Marshall's trail forward and scoring ace for the season, led his club with 16 points.

This 23-point margin was the worst defeat suffered by the Thundering Herd this season, and the most demoralizing ever suffered by the Blue and Gold when the Henderson-coached Eagles.

Last week, two American columns, driving on Maknassy from the northwest and the south, showed considerable progress. The northern column, driving from the area of Sidi Bou Zid, 120 miles from Maknassy, pressed forward "exceptionally heavy" position. The second column, striking eastward and north from Gafes, met heavy air and artillery resistance. 23 miles southwest of Maknassy, but cut off and surrounded in positions about a mile east of Maknassy.

or in part of leather or rubber soles, except waterproof rubber footwear, soft and hard-soled shoes, and rubber slippers, soft-soled infant shoes, and ballet slippers, are rationed beginning 3 1/2. E.W.T. Sunday, February 7, 1943.

Consumers may not buy rationed shoes thereafter until Tuesday, Feb. 8. Beginning then consumers should purchase shoes only after they have received their official Stamp No. 17 from War Relocation Authority. Stamp is good for one pair of any kind of rationed shoes through June 15, and is transferable between members of a family living in the same household. Until further notice, dealers may buy shoes without giving stamps but will use ration currency for all such purchases and must keep all stamps and certificates collected. If a consumer has no stamp he can, and can prove hardship if unable to buy a pair of shoes, local boards may issue a single purchase certificate made valid for one pair of shoes.

A provision of the order exempts members of the armed services. They may purchase shoes without using a ration book certificate. They may purchase a certificate signed by their commanding officer. Service men do not go to their local War Price and Ration Boards. CPA emphasized, but must get it from the commanding officer.
