2008 Eagles Outlook

Morehead State Head Coach Matt Ballard and his staff have reason for optimism about the 2008 campaign with 30 lettermen, including 12 starters set to return. The Eagles were 7-4 in 2007.

Heading the list of offensive returnees are halfbacks Erick Fitzpatrick and Jerrod Pendleton; receiver Nick Feldman; and linemen Jacob Nail, Nick Schoenfeld, and Chris Setters. Defensively, key returnees include backs David Hyland, Josh Harris and Henry Hudson; linebacker Wes McDermott; and linemen Andrew Doan and Derik Steiner. Kicker Mason Webb also returns.

A look at the Eagles, position-by-position, follows:



Sawyer

Quarterback

Red-shirt sophomore Evan Sawyer (6-1, 185, So.), an outstanding athlete who saw limited action last season as the back-up to Brian Yost, will begin fall camp first-team on the depth chart. Jared Phillips (5-11, 188, So.) saw action at halfback as a true freshman in 2007, and he will battle Sawyer for the starting role.



Pendleton

Halfbacks

Fitzpatrick (5-8, 190, Sr.) and Pendleton (6-0, 205, Jr.) combined to rush for more than 600 yards and catch 56 passes last season. Fitzpatrick caught six touchdown passes, while Pendleton rushed for five touchdowns and had four scoring receptions. Cory Jackson (5-7, 160, So.) saw action as a true freshman at halfback and as a kick returner in 2007.



Morgan

Fullback

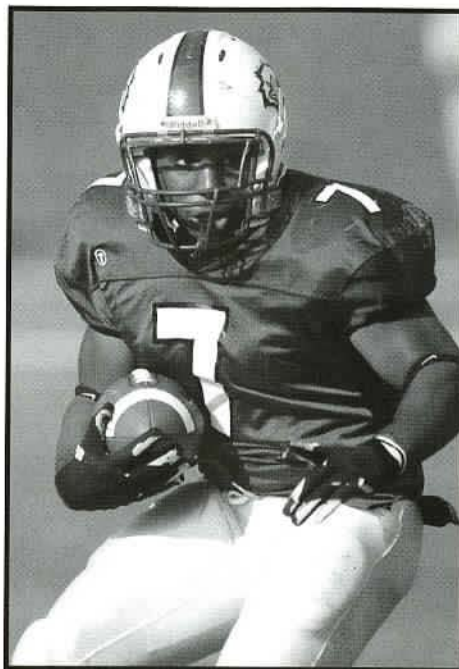
Drew Morgan (5-11, 200, So.), a medical red-shirt last season, will move from halfback to fullback. Michael Kearns (5-10, 211, So.), who saw action on special teams last season, and red-shirt Ryan Smart (6-0, 225, Fr.) will provide depth.



Feldman

Receivers

Feldman (5-10, 189, Sr.) caught a team-high 45 passes for 735 yards and five touchdowns in 2007. Michael Shannon (5-10, 185, Jr.) and Brendan McLaughlin (6-0, 180, So.)



Erick Fitzpatrick led the 2007 Eagles with 960 all-purpose yards and was named Second Team All-Pioneer Football League.

will battle for the starting spot opposite Feldman. Liam Kelly (6-2, 180, Jr.) will see action. Hyland, who caught 10 passes last season, may again split time in the secondary and on offense.



Schoenfeld

Offensive Line

Schoenfeld (6-4, 270, Sr.) anchors the offensive line from his center position. Nail (6-3, 289, Jr.) and Setters (6-5, 320, Sr.) are also returning starters. Brad Seger (6-4, 260, Fr.) will take over for All-American Grant Jennings at left tackle. Steven Bays (6-3, 290, So.) will be the likely starter at right tackle. Chris Collins (6-3, 295, Jr.) can play both center and guard, and Brandon James (6-4, 289, Jr.) has been a reserve tackle the past two seasons.



Hyland

Defensive Backs

Hyland (6-1, 185, Sr.), who led NCAA Division I FCS in interceptions per game last season, may be the top defensive back in all of mid-major football. Harris (6-0, 180, Jr.) and Hudson (5-9, 180, Jr.) were starters in 2007. Other individuals who saw action in

the secondary last season include Derek Harkness (6-0, 170, So.), J.D. Cecil (5-9, 195, So.), Cameron Armstrong (6-1, 195, So.), Ryan Williams (5-11, 202, So.) and Bryan Dowell (5-9, 165, So.).



McDermott

Linebackers

McDermott (5-11, 240, Jr.) was second on the team with 64 total tackles, including 8.5 tackles for loss in 2007. Josh Ballard (6-2, 218, So.) came on strong late in the season and should move into the starting lineup. Tony Bachman (6-0, 202, Fr.) is the leading candidate for the other starting spot. Ryan Meenach (6-0, 220, Sr.) and Anthony Kammer (6-1, 210, Jr.) will provide depth and contend for starting spots.



Doan

Defensive Line

Doan (6-3, 230, Jr.) had 33 total tackles including 11 tackles for loss as a sophomore and will start at one end. Several red-shirt freshmen will battle at the other end spot. Steiner (6-0, 295, Jr.), Caleb Meenach (5-11, 240, Sr.) and Andrew Wilhoite (6-2, 278, So.) are proven tackles.

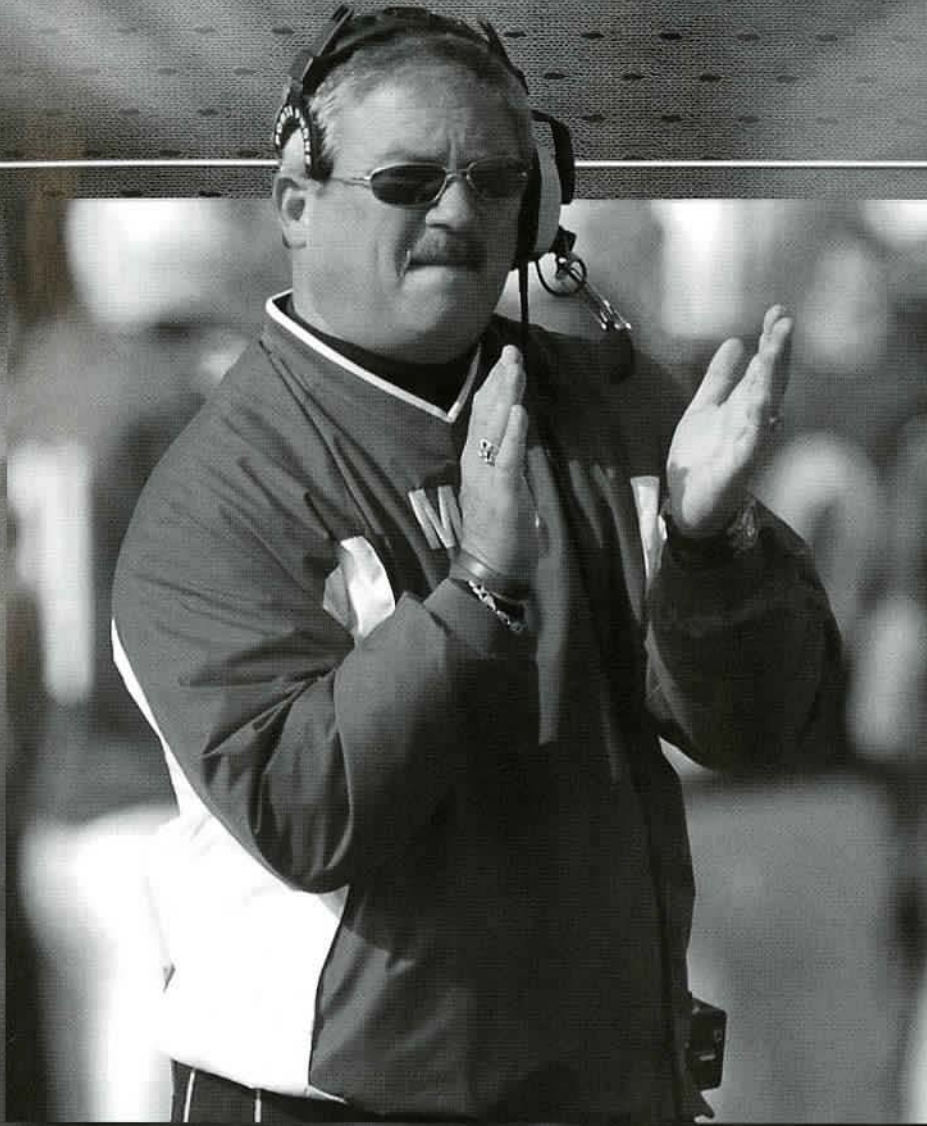


Webb

Special Teams

Webb (6-2, 210, Sr.), an all-conference honoree last season after being named All-America the year before, handled kickoffs, placements and punts in 2007. He averaged 39.5 yards per punt and had 22 downed inside the 20-yard line. He hit 24-of-25 extra points and six-of-13 field goals. Max Hammond (6-0, 185, Sr.) handled placekicking chores in 2006. MSU has outstanding kick returners. Feldman led the nation in punt returns in 2005 and averaged 7.5 yards in 2006 and 9.0 yards last season. Fitzpatrick averaged 20.3 yards. Feldman, Jackson and Hudson are also experienced kickoff returnees.

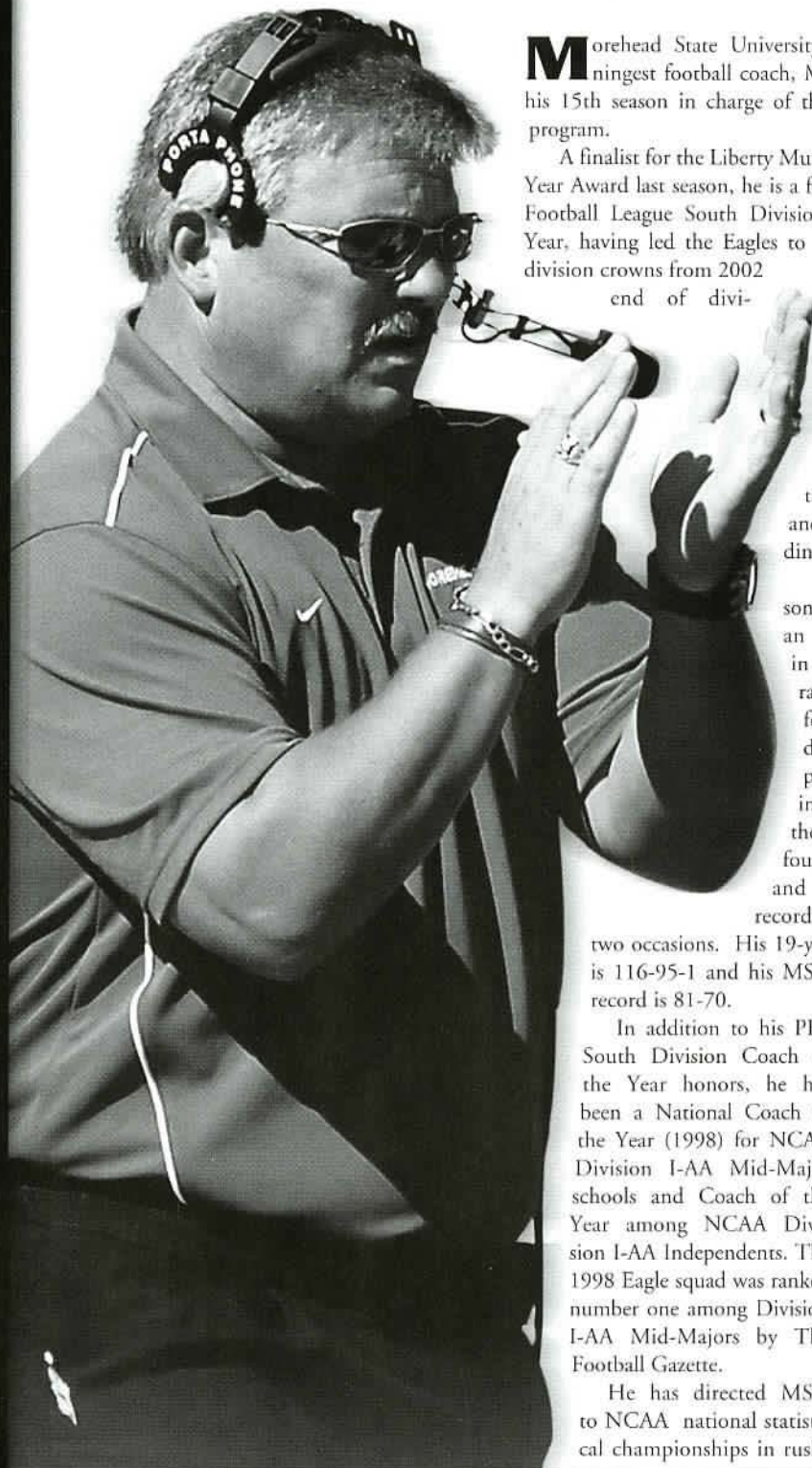
The 12-game 2008 schedule includes six home games, PFL games against Davidson (Oct. 4), Jacksonville (Homecoming, Oct. 18), Valparaiso (Nov. 1) and Campbell (Nov. 22) and non-conference games against Southern Virginia (Aug. 30) and St. Francis (Sept. 27). PFL road trips include San Diego (Oct. 11), Butler (Oct. 25), Drake (Nov. 8) and Dayton (Nov. 15). The Eagles will also travel to Robert Morris (Sept. 6) and Eastern Kentucky (Sept. 13).

Head Coach **Matt Ballard**



Morehead State University's all-time winningest football coach, Matt Ballard is in his 15th season in charge of the Eagle football program.

A finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award last season, he is a four-time Pioneer Football League South Division Coach of the Year, having led the Eagles to four consecutive division crowns from 2002 through the end of divisional play in 2005.

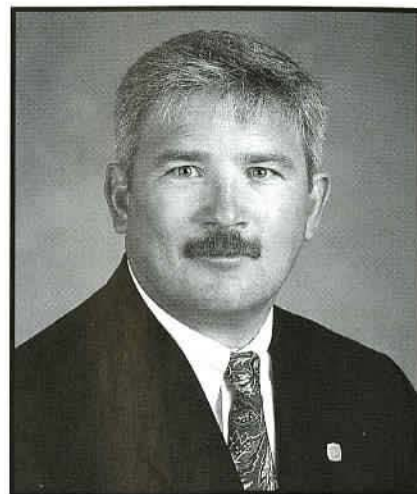
Ballard is a former head football coach at Union College and assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at MSU.

In his 14 seasons, he has taken an MSU program in transition and ravaged by transfers following the departure of the previous coaching staff and led the Eagles to the four championships and to a school-record nine wins on

two occasions. His 19-year career record is 116-95-1 and his MSU record is 81-70.

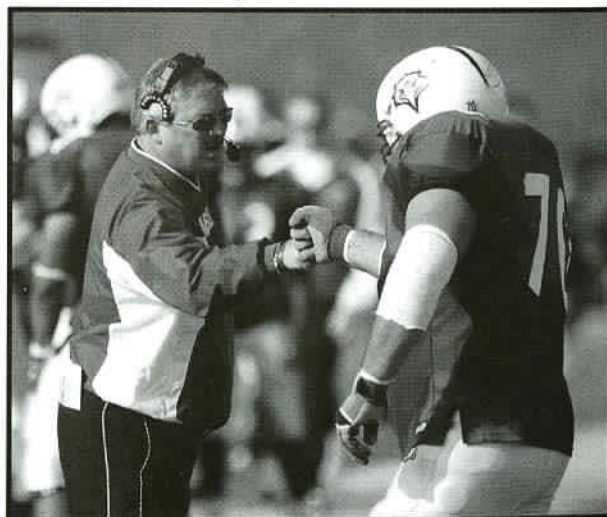
In addition to his PFL South Division Coach of the Year honors, he has been a National Coach of the Year (1998) for NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major schools and Coach of the Year among NCAA Division I-AA Independents. The 1998 Eagle squad was ranked number one among Division I-AA Mid-Majors by The Football Gazette.

He has directed MSU to NCAA national statistical championships in rush



ing defense (2007), scoring offense (1997 and 2000), total offense (2000) and punt returns (1997). In 2003, defensive back Charlie Byrd led the nation in passes defended. In 2005, then freshman Nick Feldman led the nation in punt returns. In 2007, defensive back David Hyland led the nation in interceptions per game. Ballard has coached national players-of-the-year among NCAA Mid-Major schools. They include David Dinkins (Offensive Back and National Player-of-the-Year), Doug Turner (Offensive Back), Bubba Combs (Offensive Lineman) and Toby Moeves (Specialist).

A 50-year old native of Davidson, N.C., Ballard compiled a 35-25-1 record in his six seasons

(1988-93) directing the Union football program. He led Union to its best single season record and to the institution's first Mid-South Football Conference championship. He was named Mid-South and NAIA District 32 Coach of the Year in 1992.

He was on the MSU football staff for four seasons (1984-87) before accepting the head coaching position at Union.

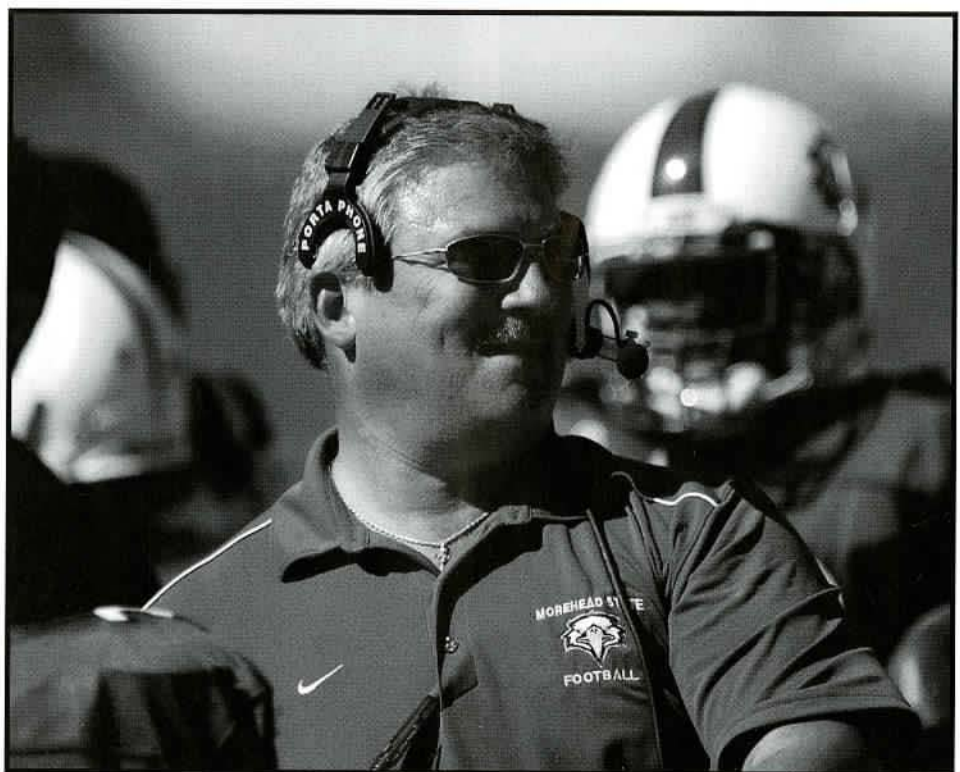
Ballard was a four-year (1980-83) offensive/defensive coordinator at Georgetown College and spent one season (1979) as an assistant at Gardner-Webb.

A graduate of North Mecklenburg High School in Charlotte, he earned a bachelor's degree from Gardner-Webb in 1979 and a master's degree from Georgetown in 1980.

He is active in many community service projects, especially in the area of child abuse prevention.

Ballard and his wife, the former Brenda Harwood, actively support two scholarship funds named in honor of their son, Matthew, one at Rowan County High School and one at Morehead State University.

Matthew was an MSU student and a student coach on the Eagle football staff when he was tragically killed in a motorcycle accident on July 12, 2005.





John Gilliam

Associate Head Coach/Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers



John Gilliam, a former standout Eagle linebacker, is in his 15th season on the staff at Morehead State University.

The native of Prestonsburg, Ky., currently serves as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach and makes all the defensive calls.

His 2007 Eagle defensive unit led NCAA

Division I Football Championship Subdivision in rushing defense, and defensive back David Hyland, a two-time mid-major All-American, led the nation in interceptions per game.

Gilliam was a four-year Eagle letterman (1983-86) during current Eagle Head Coach Matt Ballard's tenure as an assistant coach on the MSU staff. After serving as a student assistant coach for the Eagles in 1987, he joined Ballard at Union College. He spent six seasons under Ballard at Union and returned to MSU with Ballard in 1994.

Gilliam has coached a number of defensive standouts during his tenure at MSU. Earning All-America honors under Gilliam have been linebacker Zac Prewitt, defensive back Charles Byrd, defensive lineman Chris Parker, linebacker Craig Unger and defensive back Kwesi Williams. Twenty-two Eagles have been named to the All-Pioneer Football League South Division teams over the past five seasons.

Unger (2001-04) also earned Academic First-Team All-America honors in 2003 and Second-Team Academic All-America honors in 2004. He was the PFL South Division Co-Defensive Player of the Year in 2003.

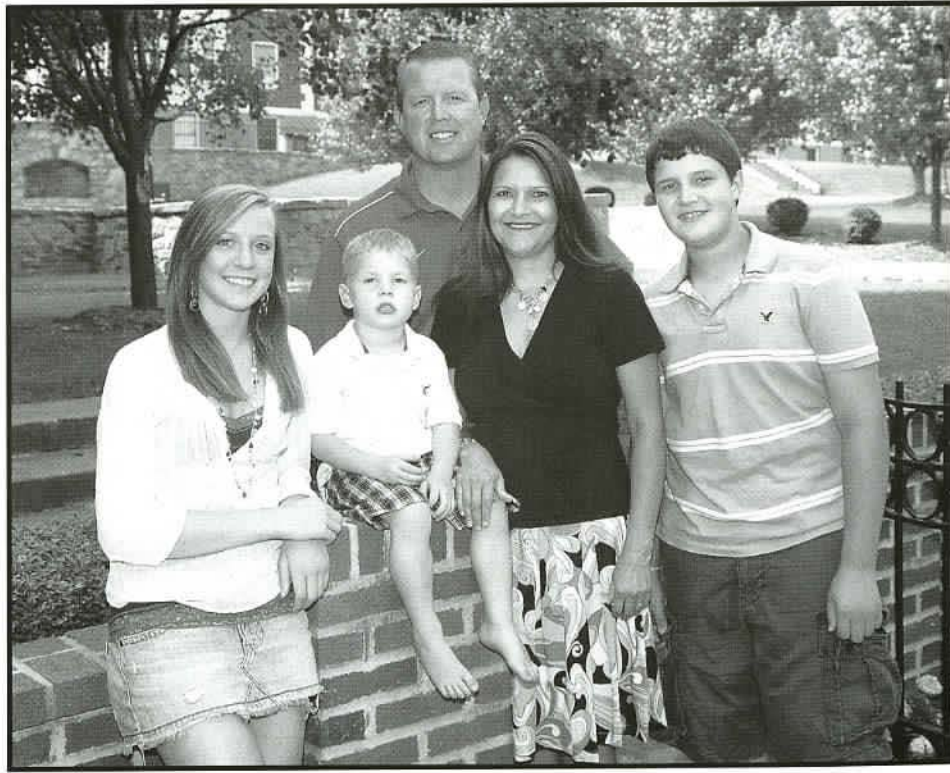
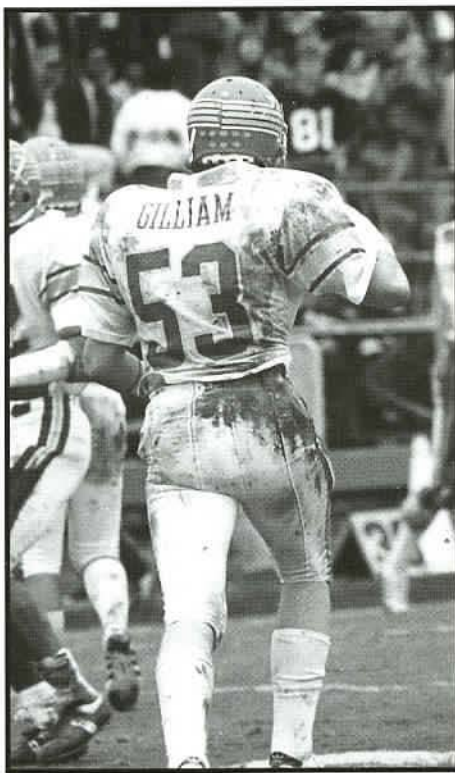
Ballard on Gilliam

"I was so pleased for John, our defensive coaching staff and our defensive unit last season when they won the national statistical championship for rushing defense. As I've always said, John bleeds blue and gold, having been a player for the Eagles and as defensive coordinator since 1994. He has tremendous knowledge of the game and is a great motivator of young men."

Statistically, Byrd led all of NCAA Division I-AA in passes defended in 2003.

Gilliam earned a bachelor's degree from MSU in 1987. He added a master's degree from Union in 1990.

He is married to the former Melissa Childs of Fairfield, Ohio. They have a daughter, Caitlin Nicole, and two sons, Austin William and Mason Clark.





Gary Dunn

Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line

Gary Dunn is in his 12th season as an assistant coach at Morehead State University, his ninth as offensive coordinator.

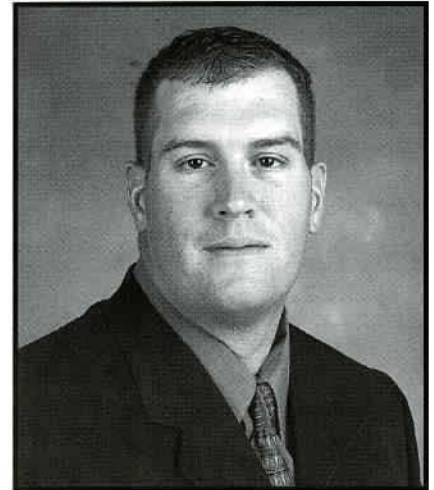
In addition to his coordinator duties, he is in charge of the Eagle offensive linemen and assists with special teams.

The Eagle offense under Dunn won national statistical championships in scoring offense and total offense in 2000, and the Eagles have consistently ranked among the nation's leaders in those categories throughout Dunn's tenure. The 2005 Eagles ranked 12th in total offense among all NCAA Division I-AA schools (116 teams ranked), averaging 432.9 yards per

game. MSU was seventh nationally rushing, averaging 256.5 yards per game. The Eagles averaged 33.9 points per game, 18th best in Division I-AA.

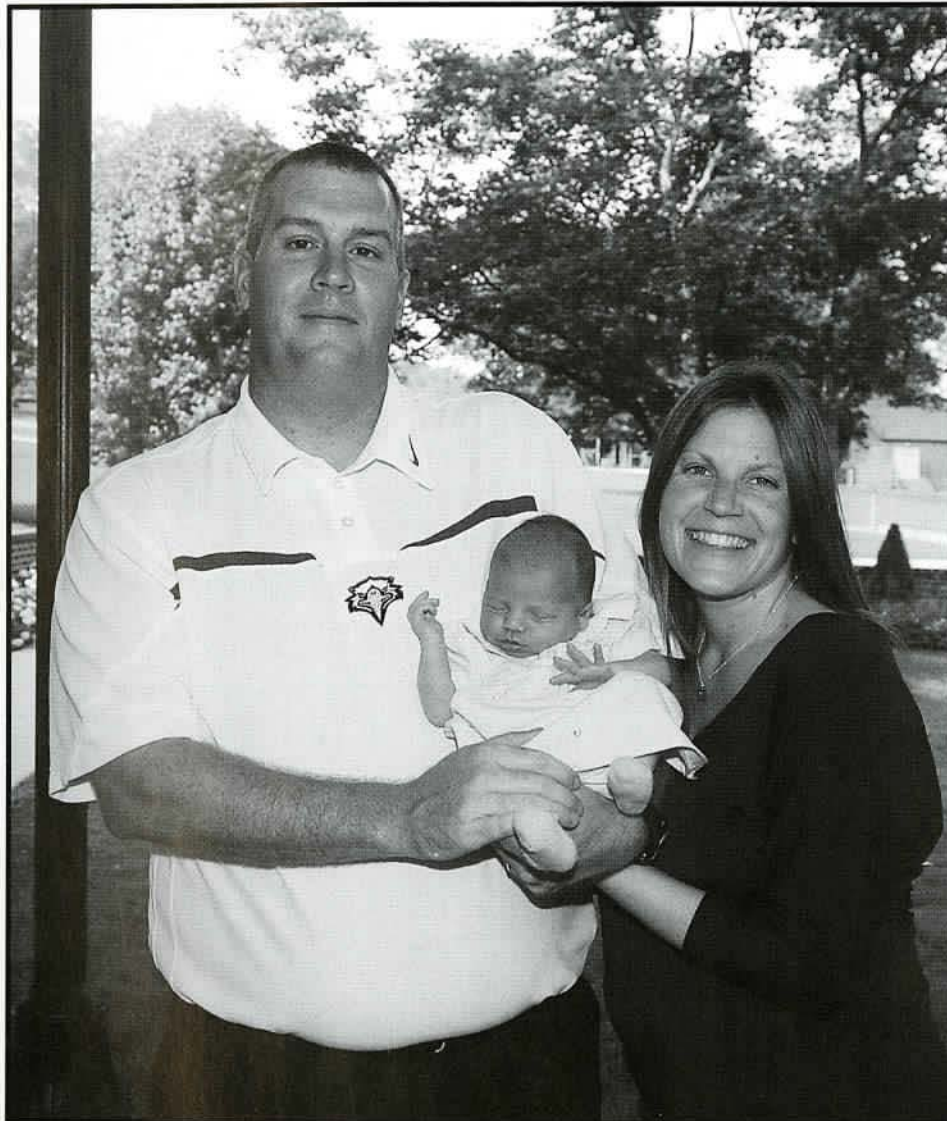
In his years as offensive coordinator, quarterback David Dinkins and offensive linemen Jason Fights and Grant Jennings have earned All-America honors. Twenty Eagle offensive standouts have been named to the All-Pioneer Football League First Team. Quarterbacks David Caudill and Brian Yost have been named South Division Offensive Player of the Year.

Dunn was a four-year starter and an all-conference performer as an offensive lineman at



California University of Pennsylvania and joined the MSU staff after serving as an assistant coach at that school. He earned a bachelor's degree in 1995 and a master's degree in 1997, both from California (Pa.).

Dunn is married to the former Melissa Durka, MSU's senior associate athletic director and senior woman administrator for Eagle athletics. The Dunns welcomed their first child, a daughter Sydney, in July.

Rob Tenyer

Halfbacks/Fullbacks/Recruiting Coordinator



Rob Tenyer is in his eighth season as an assistant coach at Morehead State University. In 2007, he will again work with Eagle halfbacks and fullbacks. He has just completed his second season as recruiting coordinator.

In past seasons working with MSU running-

backs, Tenyer has mentored David White who earned All-Pioneer Football League South Division honors, Jabari McGee who has been named All-PFL South, All-PFL Second Team and NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major All-America and Eli Parkes who earned All-PFL South Division and Second-Team Mid-Major All-America honors.

A native of Marine City, Mich., he joined the Eagle staff after serving as an assistant football coach at Centre College in Danville, Ky.

Prior to going to Centre, he was a graduate assistant coach at California University (Pa.). He also worked as a player/coach with the Landsberg, Germany, Professional Football Team. He led Landsberg to a 15-1 record, passing for 2,576 yards and 33 touchdowns and rushing for 239 yards and eight scores.

Tenyer is a graduate of Marine City High School. As a prepster, he was a three-sport standout, earning all-league honors in football, basketball and baseball.

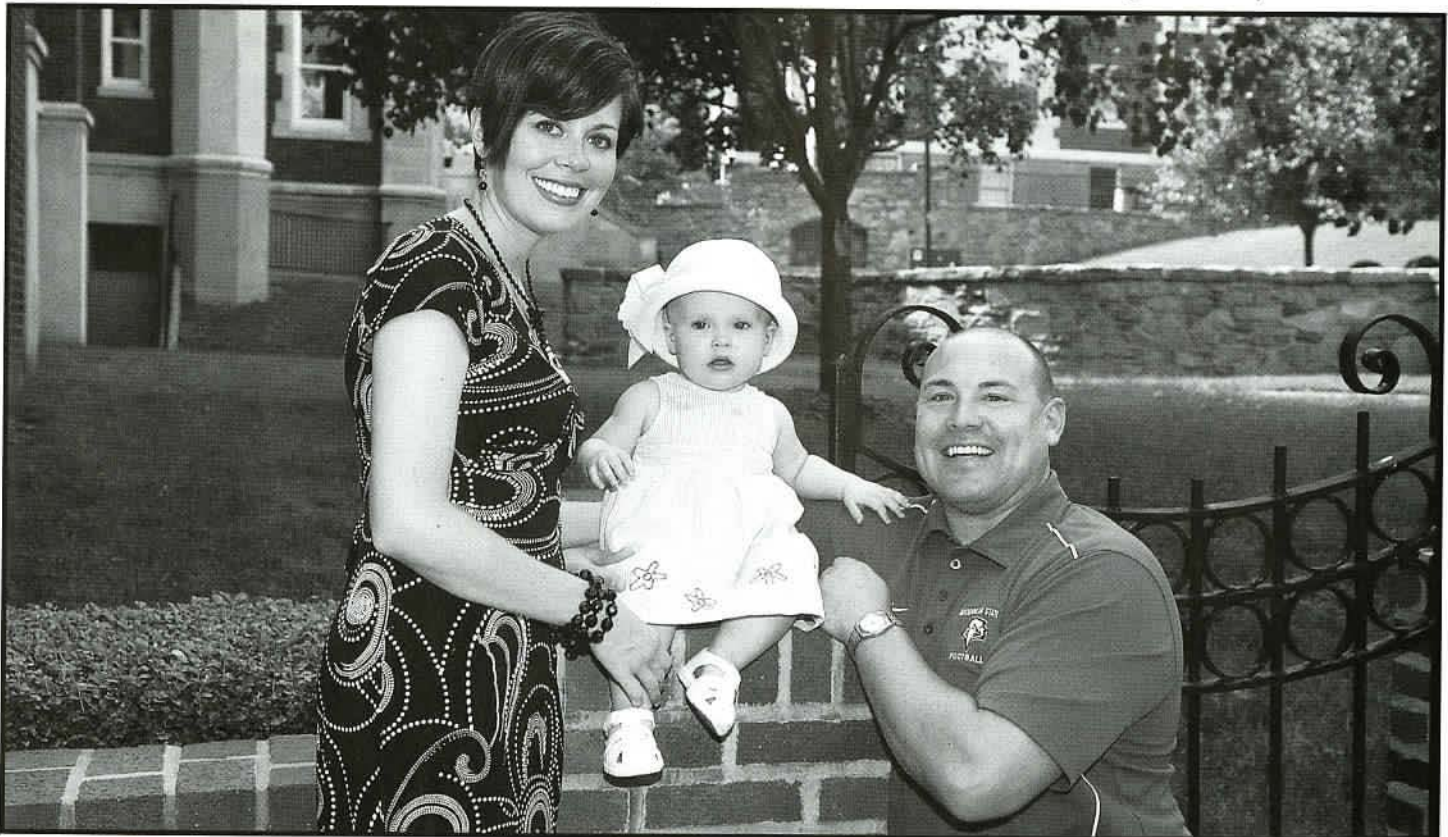
He holds a bachelor of arts degree from Oliver (Mich.) College. At Olivet, he was a four-year letterwinner at quarterback. He served as team

Garner played at Aiken High School in Cincinnati, Ohio, where he earned all-city honors as an offensive and defensive lineman.

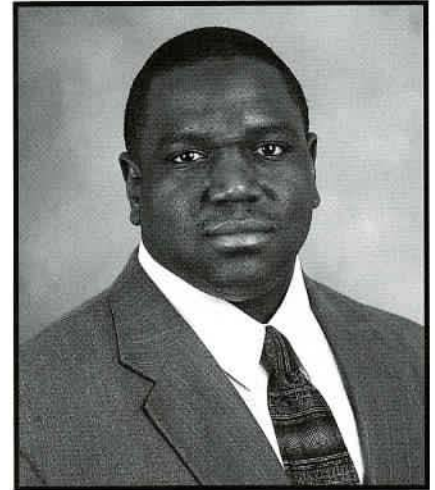
He was a four-year letterwinner and a three-year starter at Findlay, where he earned all-conference honors.

Following his playing career, Garner spent four years on the Findlay coaching staff, assisting one season with the defensive line and three seasons with the tight ends and tackles.

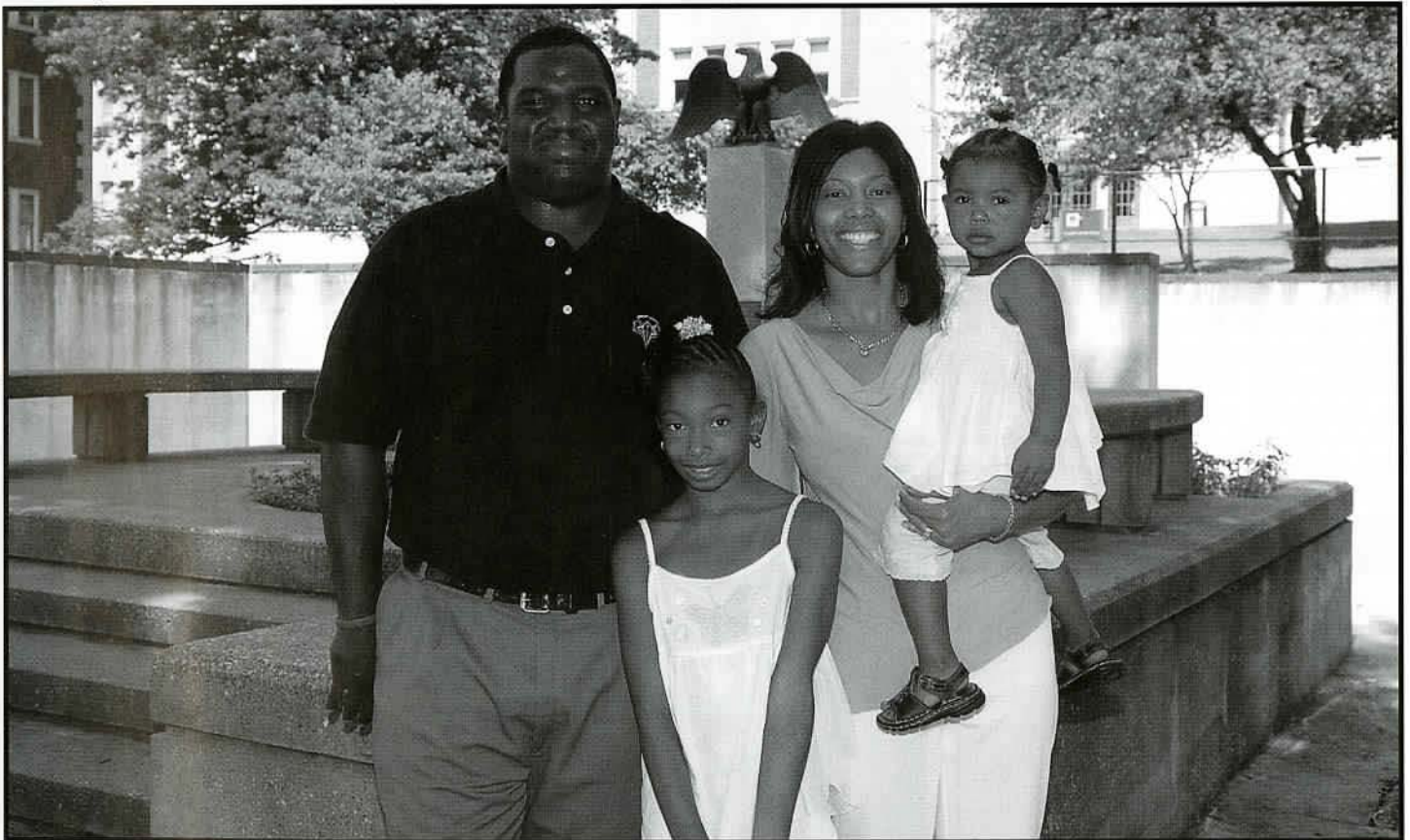
From Findlay, he joined the staff at Cumberland College (now University of the Cumberlands) and spent two years coaching the defensive line.

has completed most requirements for a master's degree.

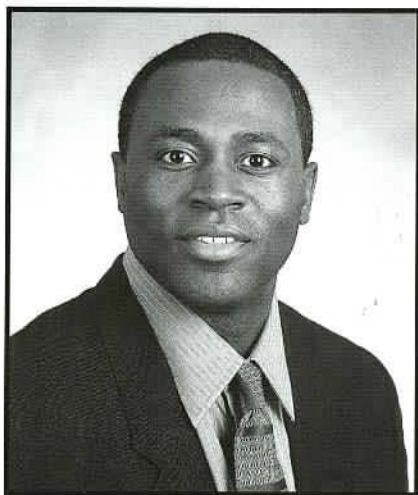
Garner is married to the former Stephanie Menifee. They have two daughters, Ryan and Casey Nicole.

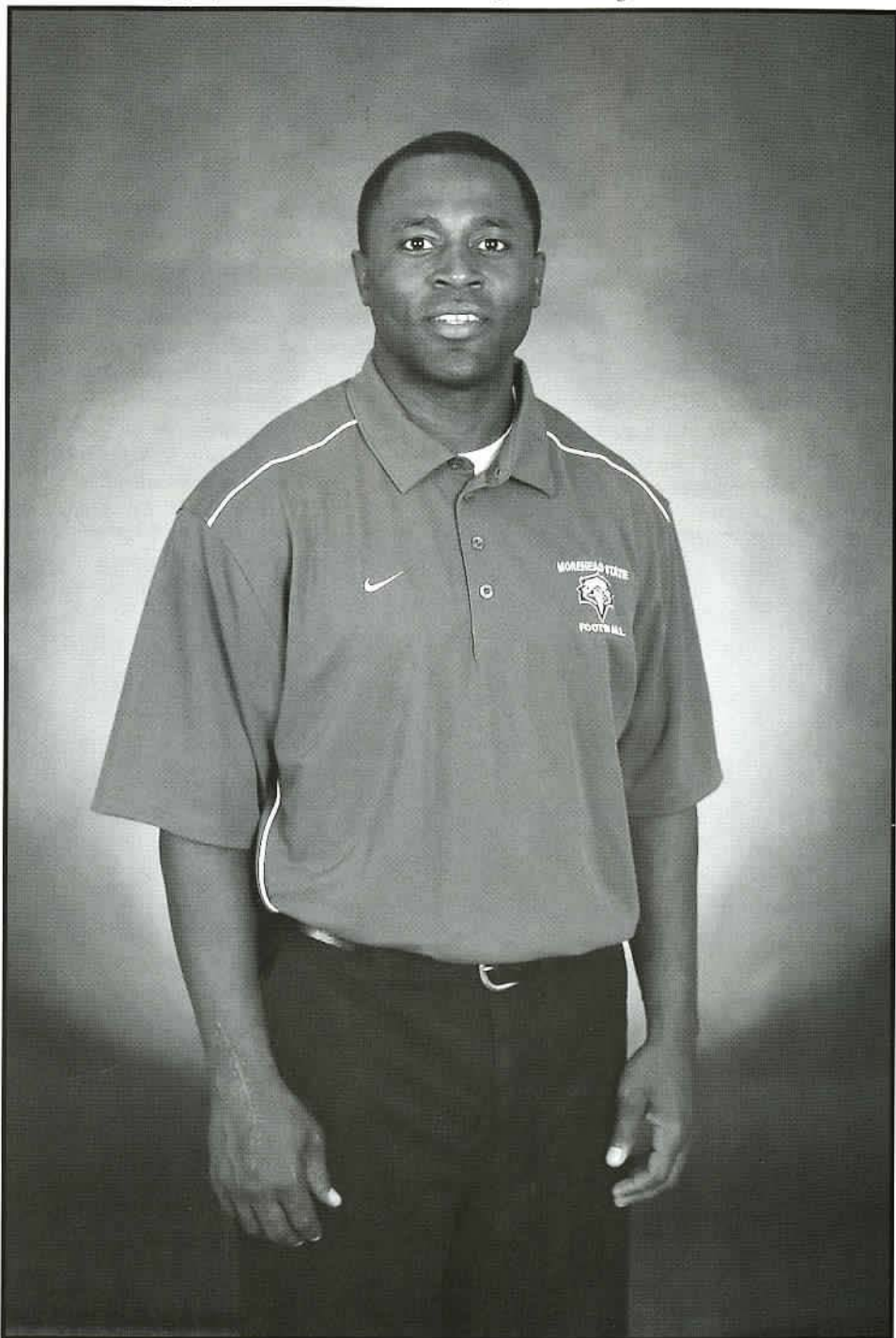

Humphries has a daughter, Whitney Mackenzie Jacks, of Bridgeton, N.C.



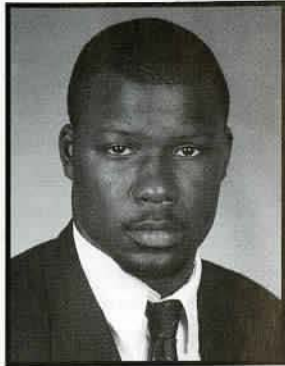

Historically, the University traces its lineage to the Morehead Normal School, which opened its doors in 1887. The private school closed in the spring of 1922 when the Kentucky General Assembly established Morehead State Normal School. The state institution accepted its first students in the fall of 1923 and graduated its first class in 1927. Name changes occurred in 1926 when "and Teachers College" was added, again in 1930 when it was shortened to Morehead State Teachers College, again in 1948 when "Teachers" was dropped and, finally, to university status in 1966. Thirteen men, starting with Frank C. Button, have served as president. Dr. Wayne D. Andrews assumed office as the 13th president on Jan. 1, 2005.

Academically, the University offers 78 undergraduate degree programs, including 8 associate level degrees and 12 pre-professional programs in four colleges, Business, Education, Caudill College of Humanities and Science and Technology, and 20 academic departments.

There are 51 graduate degree programs plus 42 graduate level non-degree programs designed especially for professional educators. The education specialist in five specialty areas also is offered. A master's degree for physician assistants, social workers and a cooperative doctoral program, all with the University of Kentucky, are available on the MSU campus.

Classes are conducted in Ashland, Jackson, Maysville, Mt. Sterling, Pikeville, Prestonsburg, West Liberty and other locations. Regional campuses located in Ashland, Jackson, Mt. Sterling, Prestonsburg and West Liberty are staffed with full-time directors. Additionally, the University offers a number of distance learning courses throughout the region via the Internet and interactive compressed video. Sixty-five percent of MSU's 384 full-time faculty members hold doctoral degrees.

Physically, the University is located in the foothills of the Daniel Boone National Forest in Rowan County. The nearly 500-acre main campus within the city limits of Morehead includes more than 50 major structures with a total replacement value of more than \$144 million. Beyond the city, the University's real estate holdings include the 320-acre Derickson Agricultural Complex and the par 72, 6,902-yard Eagle Trace Golf Course. The instructional plant includes 120 classrooms and 112 laboratories. Housing facilities include space for approximately 2,600 students in a variety of housing styles including traditional residence halls, suites and apartments.

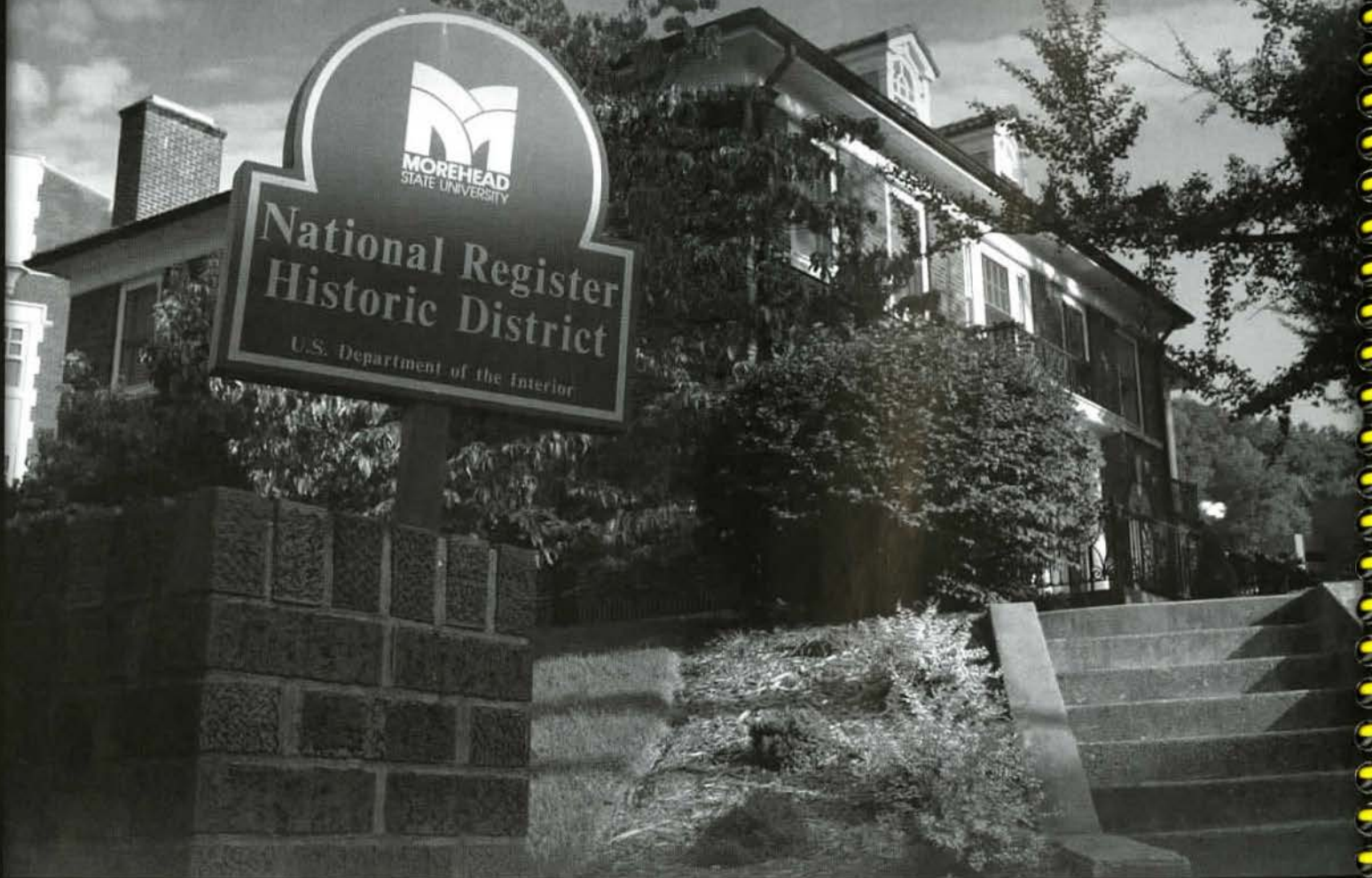
Fiscally, the University currently operates on an annual budget of \$122.5 million with about \$46.6 million provided by the state

and \$52.8 million coming from tuition and fees. Additionally, grants and contracts from external sources for research, service and academic/student support projects generate more than \$15 million each year. Annual private donations to the University, through the MSU Foundation, Inc., average \$3 million annually.

Statistically, the University has awarded more than 50,000 degrees and currently has more than 1,100 full-time employees. Enrollment for fall 2007 was 9,066, with the student body representing 100 Kentucky counties, 45 states and 36 foreign countries. The University attracts more than 50,000 visitors annually and its economic impact, directly and indirectly, on the Morehead area is estimated at more than \$80 million yearly.

Administratively, an 11-member Board of Regents governs the University with eight citizens appointed by the governor and three seats held by elected faculty, staff and student representatives. Management of the institution is vested primarily in six divisions Academic Affairs, Administration and Fiscal Services, Development, Planning, Budgets and Technology, Student Life, and University Relations with each headed by a vice president.

Athletically, the University sponsors 16 intercollegiate sports for men and women in accordance with the regulations of the Ohio Valley Conference, the Pioneer Football League and Division I of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. MSU also supports an intramural program involving more than 25 team and individual sports.



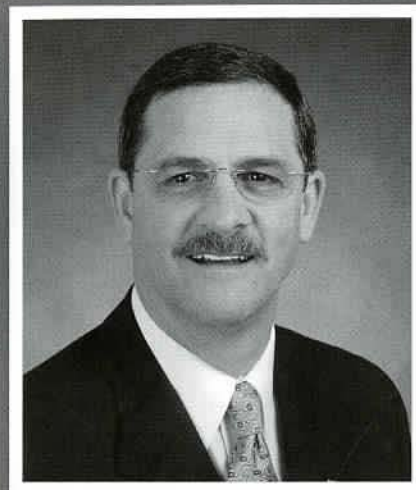


Dr. Wayne D. Andrews

In addition to his background as a teacher and academic administrator, President Andrews has extensive personal experience in strategic planning, student services, human resources, facility construction, intercollegiate athletics, information technology, economic development and community partnerships.

He was selected as MSU's president on the strength of his successful academic and administrative career at institutions very similar to Morehead State, his familiarity with Appalachia, his effective and engaging management style and his unwavering commitment to student success as

the primary focus of the University.

Andrews is an Army veteran whose hobbies include restoration of antique clocks and the singing and playing of traditional music. He and his wife of 35 years, Susan, a retired elementary school reading specialist, have two adult children, Josh and Jill.

President and Mrs. Andrews reside on campus in the President's Home which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.





Brian Hutchinson

Director of Athletics



Brian Hutchinson became Morehead State University's ninth Director of Athletics on March 1, 2005, after spending five years as associate director of athletics and six months as interim director following the departure of former AD Chip Smith. In his previous role, Hutchinson served as sport administrator for football, golf, baseball and volleyball as well as the athletic training operation, managing day-to-day operations of the department, managing the department's annual budget and serving as the department's ticket manager.

Under Hutchinson's leadership, the athletic department has seen major improvements in facilities, student-athlete performance, and staffing level. Some highlights of his administration have included:

- Three consecutive Ohio Valley Conference Athletic Academic Achievement Awards
- Winning the overall OVC Sportsmanship Award for 2006-07
- OVC team academic awards in men's tennis (twice), baseball (twice), softball, women's tennis (three times), and men's track
- Highly successful redesign of the Morehead State athletic brand
- Redesign and launch of the department's website, www.msueagles.com
- OVC Sportsmanship Awards in men's golf, women's basketball and men's track
- A newly-focused annual giving structure through the Eagle Excellence Fund
- Facility improvements in women's basketball and volleyball
- Renovation of all donor hospitality areas

- Leading the formation of an athletics facility master plan that will guide MSU's athletic physical plant for the next 20 years
- Hiring Kevin Deweese as the department's first-ever, full-time strength and conditioning coach
- Increasing staff in men's basketball, soccer, baseball, softball, media relations, sports medicine, and volleyball
- Drafting the department's 2006-10 strategic plan

Hutchinson, 34, is one of the youngest athletic professionals to ever serve as a Division I director of athletics. He has spent his entire professional career at MSU, now spanning more than 12 years, and is a member of the institution's senior leadership group, the President's Cabinet. Previously he served as development director for two years, before assuming the post of director of development and marketing, which he held for nearly one year. Prior to that, he served 18 months as a regional development officer for the University and six months as a staff assistant in the University's Office of Development and Alumni Relations.

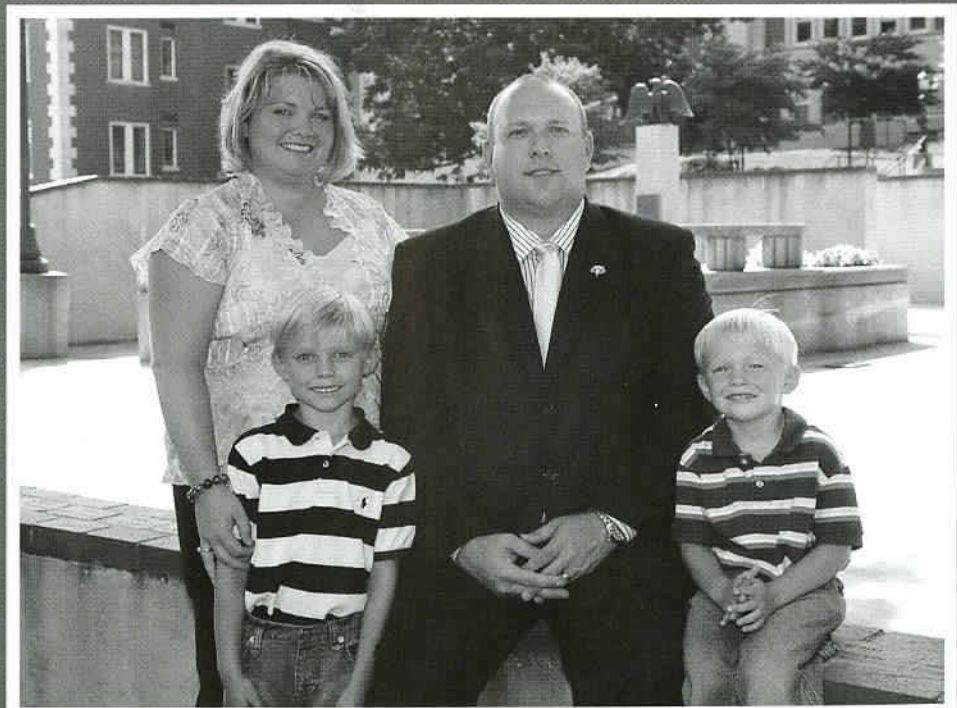
A 1996 cum laude graduate of Morehead State University, Hutchinson earned a Bachelor of Business Administration, while specializing in real estate. During his senior year, the Louisa, Ky., native served as the Student Government

Association President and was a student representative to the MSU Board of Regents. He graduated in 2001 with a Master of Arts in Education (Sports Administration), also from MSU. He has remained active in the local alumni association of Sigma Alpha Epsilon, and he holds memberships in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics, the Division I-AA Athletic Directors Association, the AFCA, and CASE.

Hutchinson currently represents the Pioneer Football League as a member of the NCAA Division I Football Issues Committee, the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Governance Committee, and the FCS Midwest Regional Advisory Committee. He is also a new member of the Recruiting Cabinet of the new NCAA Governance Structure. For the 2006-07 year, Hutchinson served as chair of the OVC Board of Directors of Athletics.

He has attended numerous development and athletics administrations conferences and has been a presenter for the NCAA YES! clinic program. Hutchinson served as the director for the 2002 OVC golf championship and as the director of the 2003 OVC volleyball championship.

Hutchinson and his wife, Elizabeth, also a two-time MSU alum, have two sons, Benjamin, 8, and Riley, 4. They reside in Morehead.





Melissa Dunn

Senior Associate Director of Athletics/Senior Woman Administrator

Melissa Dunn is in her third year in the athletic department and recently was promoted to Senior Associate Director of Athletics after serving as Assistant Director of Athletics and Senior Woman Administrator for the previous two years. She will continue to serve as MSU's SWA. Before joining the athletic department staff, she had most recently served as Director of Student Activities and Greek Life at Morehead State.

Dunn, who holds three master's degrees, including two from Morehead State, has been a member of the MSU staff for 11 years.

Dunn had served as Director of Student Activities/Greek Life since December 2004. In her position, Dunn oversaw intramurals, spirit squads, student organizations and Greek letter organizations.

From September 2002 to December 2004,

Vice President For Student Life

Madonna Weathers assumed the position of Vice President for Student Life in July 2002. A Louisville native, Weathers has been a member of the University's administrative staff since 1972 when she was named Associate Director of Student Housing.

After 13 years in that role, she became Director of Residence Education in 1985 and then Director of Student Development in 1989, before taking on her most recent post. She earned her bachelor's degree in education in 1971 and master's degrees in adult and higher education in 1972 all from MSU.

As a staff member, she has served two terms as chair of MSU's Staff Congress. She also was co-chair of the University's Campus Giving Campaign in 1999 and 2000, and served on the SACS

Assistant Director of Athletics



Brittany Booth has joined the Morehead State athletic department as an assistant director of athletics and will be in charge of MSU's market-

ing, promotions and fundraising efforts. She will also be in charge of the Eagle Excellence Fund and the annual golf tournament and auction.

Booth most recently served as the Director of Sports Marketing at High Point University since May 2007. In that role, she handled all the marketing and promotional efforts for HPU's 16 athletic teams. She also oversaw High Point's radio broadcasting and basketball advertising campaigns and was in charge of production for game programs, posters and schedule cards. Booth was also heavily involved in game management duties. Before her time at High Point, Booth was a promotions assistant for Nelligan Sports Marketing in Louisville where she was involved in day-to-day operations for the promotion of University of Louisville men's and women's basketball and football. From 2005-07, Booth served as a graduate assistant and marketing assistant in University of Louisville's athletic department. She helped coordinate community and alumni activities and was the chairperson for

Booth also designed game programs, media guides, ticket brochures and many other promotional materials for the Fever.

She is a 2002 graduate of Indiana University and earned her Master of Science degree in sport administration from University of Louisville in 2007. Booth was also a Juris Doctorate candidate, completing coursework at Valparaiso University, in 2003.

Richard Fletcher

Associate Director of Athletics/Compliance



Richard Fletcher is a two-time Morehead State graduate and has moved into the role of Associate Director of Athletics/Compliance after serving several years as MSU's Director of Sports Medicine and head athletic trainer. He was promoted to Assistant Director

of Athletics for Sports Medicine in February of 2006.

Fletcher, who directed all aspects of the MSU sports medicine program, is in his seventh year overall with the university. He holds a bachelor's degree and a master's degree from MSU. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1992 and collected his master's degree in 2002.

After nine years, Fletcher returned to his undergraduate alma mater in 2001 as Head Certified Athletic Trainer and served in that title until 2003. In 2003, he was promoted to Athletic Training Director and held that title until his promotion to an assistant director of athletics in 2006.

In addition to his athletic training role at MSU, he has served as an adjunct professor since 2002.

Fletcher began his professional career as the certified athletic trainer for Rowan County High School from 1993 to 1997. He provided coverage for 14 teams and also taught a variety of classes on athletic training. He then moved on to Kentucky State University where he served as a certified trainer from 1997 to 2000.

He led the student athletic training program and also served as an adjunct professor at KSU. From July of 2000 until August 2001, Fletcher was a clinical certified trainer.

He provided services to four high schools in the Frankfort/Lexington area and also served as trainer for the semi-pro women's soccer club, the Fillies, and the Kentucky Thoroughblades, a semi-professional hockey team in Lexington. Fletcher is a member of several professional organizations, including the National Athletic Trainer's Association, the Kentucky Athletic Trainer's Society, and the Southeastern Athletic Trainer's Association. He is a past president of the Kentucky Athletic Trainer's Society, serving from 1998 until 2001, and was the co-chairperson on the Legislative Advisory Committee for that group. He has also presented numerous papers and posters and has been published extensively in the Journal of Athletic Training.

He is married to the former Wendy Tackett, a nurse practitioner in Morehead. The couple has two daughters, Allison and Reagan.



Academics at Morehead

One of the most important aspects of the student-athlete's experience at Morehead State is academics, and the athletic department has excellent facilities and staff to provide MSU student-athletes with the best possible technology and know-how to help them succeed in the classroom.

A new state-of-the-art computer center and resource center, which was also recently updated in 2008, are now available in the Academic-Athletic Center. Academic Athletic Coordinator Valerie Ousley and her staff of students and volunteers also provide academic monitoring, tutoring and counseling in the new Academic Center.

Academically, the University offers 96 degree programs and pre-professional programs through four colleges, Business, Education, Caudill College of Humanities and Science and Technology, and the Institute for Regional Analysis and Public Policy.

On a year-by-year basis, Morehead State student-athletes continually rank among the best in the Ohio Valley Conference, and the athletic department again won the OVC's Institutional Academic Achievement Award, presented by Aeropostale, for 2006-07 – the third year in a row MSU has won the league's highest academic honor. In all, MSU has now claimed eight OVC Academic

Achievement Awards, tying Eastern Kentucky for the most in league history. In addition, the Morehead State women's basketball, women's tennis, baseball, men's tennis, softball and men's track teams have each won the OVC individual sport Academic Achievement Award for having the highest percentage of student-athletes named to the OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll in the last three years. The rifle team was named an All-Academic Team by the National Collegiate Rifle Coaches Association and soccer's Rachel Kendall was named Academic All-Region by the NSCAA.

The MSU athletic department also has had a large number of student-athletes awarded an Ohio Valley Conference Medal of Honor.

Since 1974, Morehead State has had 27 student-athletes earn ESPN the Magazine CoSIDA Academic All-America status, including track and field standout Brian Babcock, who earned first-team track and field/cross country honors in 2006. In 2006-07, track and field's Steve Thieme earned First-Team honors for District IV, while softball's Becky King and baseball's Donald Cheney and Nick Nail were each named Second-Team All-District.

Sports Medicine

The Sports Medicine Program at Morehead State offers student-athletes the most up-to-date professional services available. Led by head men's trainer James Carver and head women's trainer Sara Larson, the Sports Medicine Department allows athletes a wide range of options for treatment and rehabilitation of injuries.

One of the major support services offered is the main athletic training room located adjacent to Jayne Stadium. The facility contains four whirlpools, four electric stimulators, four ultrasound units and nine treatment tables, along with a variety of other services and equipment. Each athletic team has a full-time or graduate assistant athletic trainer assigned to them, and each of MSU's trainers are fully trained and accredited to perform life-saving and injury treatments. The training staff also utilizes two remote facilities in the Academic-Athletic Center and Wetherby Gym. Both facilities have state-of-the-art equipment.

The training staff also works closely with the Caudill Health Clinic on campus in Allie Young Hall and with St. Claire Regional Medical Center.

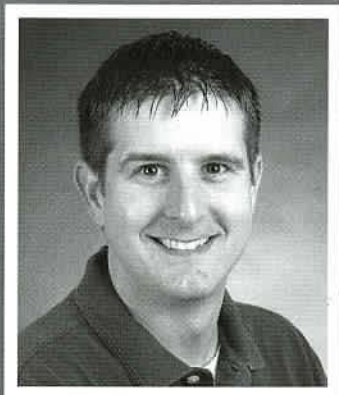

Deweese and his staff develop programs that will help athletes reach their maximum potential and prevent injuries.

Athletes have several options for weight training with the centerpiece of the program being the Phil Simms Weight Training Center. Funded by former Morehead State and NFL star quarterback Phil Simms, the center houses weight machines and free weights and is located adjacent to Jayne Stadium. The center has ample space for several teams to train at the same time.

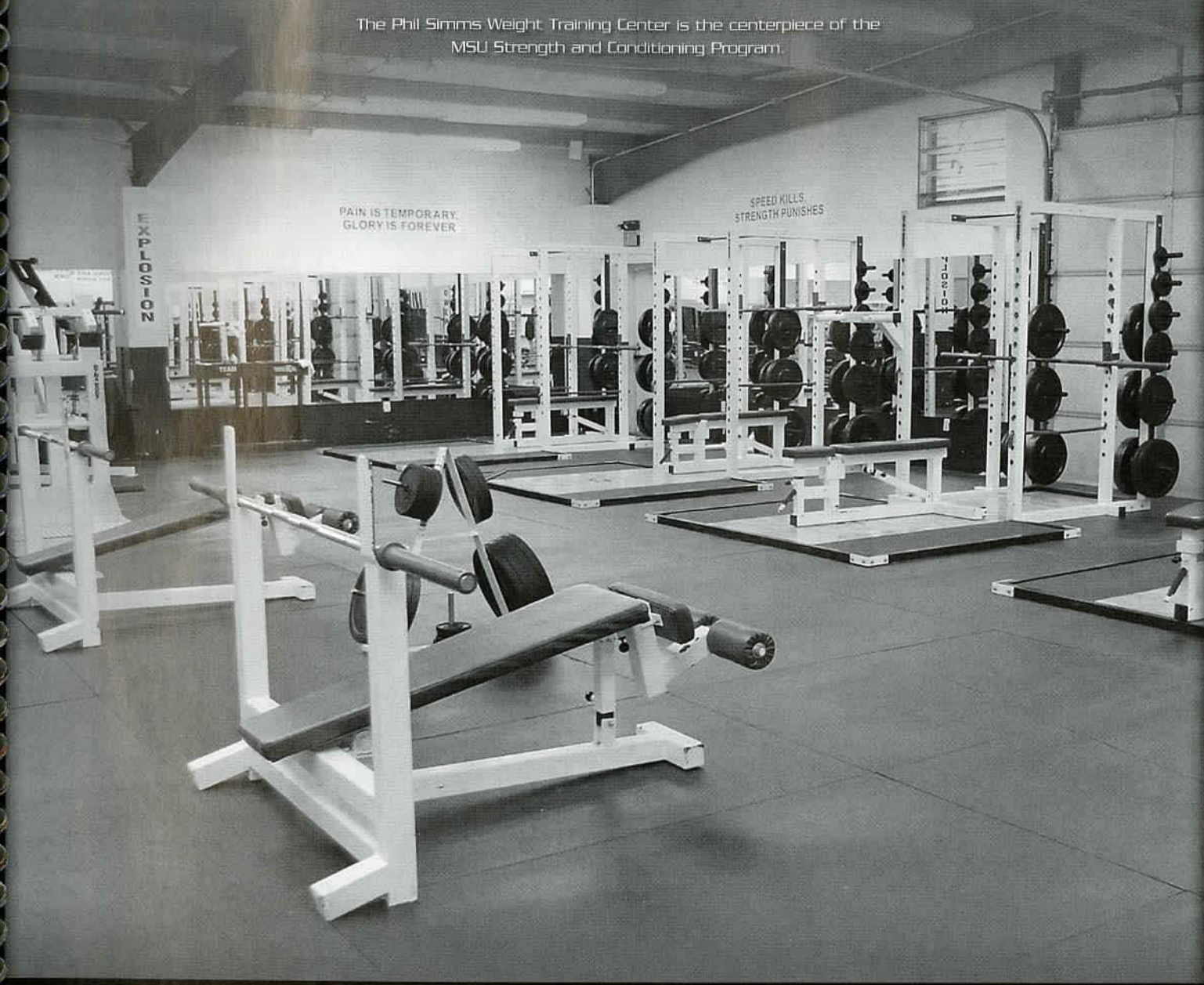
Athletes also utilize the weight center in the Academic-Athletic Center. Free weights, as well as

The staff also oversees off-season workouts and nutrition programs to make sure Eagle student-athletes are in-shape when the season begins.

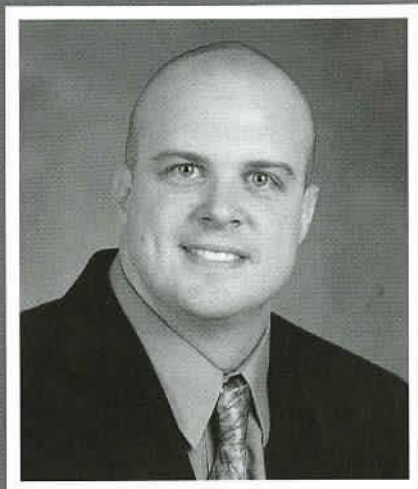
The Phil Simms Weight Training Center is the centerpiece of the MSU Strength and Conditioning Program.





Kevin DeWeese

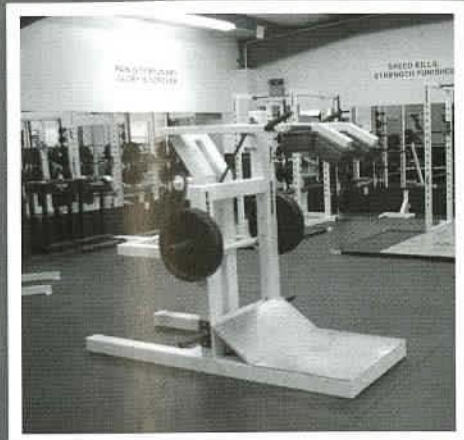
Head Strength and Conditioning Coach

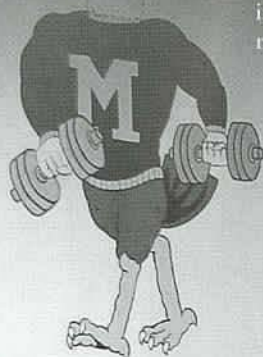

a strength and conditioning intern at UK from 2001-03, where he directed all aspects of the baseball strength program.

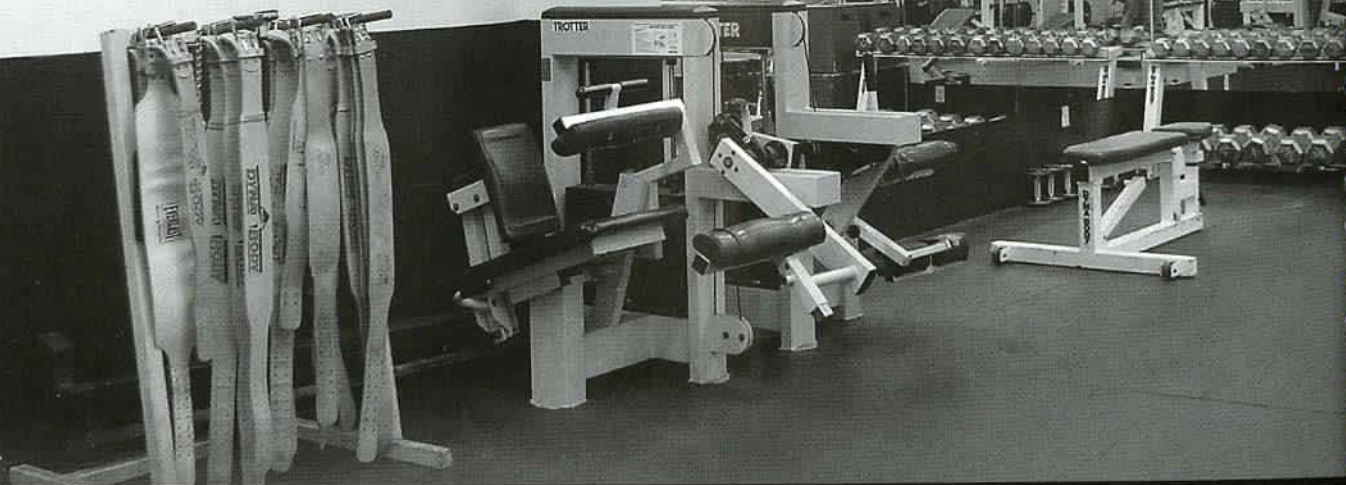

Athletic Facilities



Johnson Arena

Located inside the Academic-Athletic Center is the home to the Eagle basketball programs. Johnson Arena seats 6,500 and recently received a new facelift on the arena floor with the new Eagle logos. Eagle Trace Golf Course

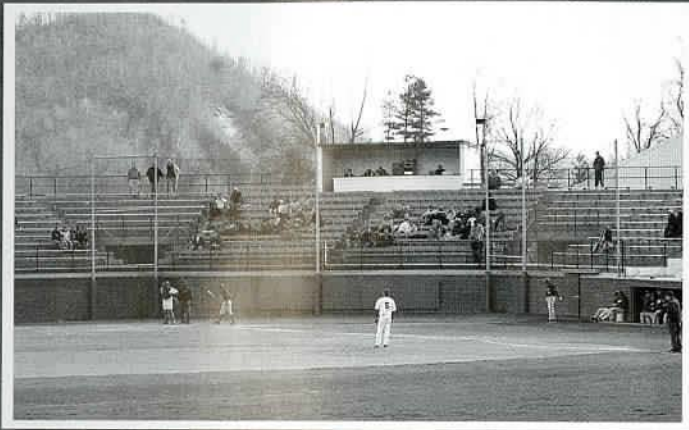

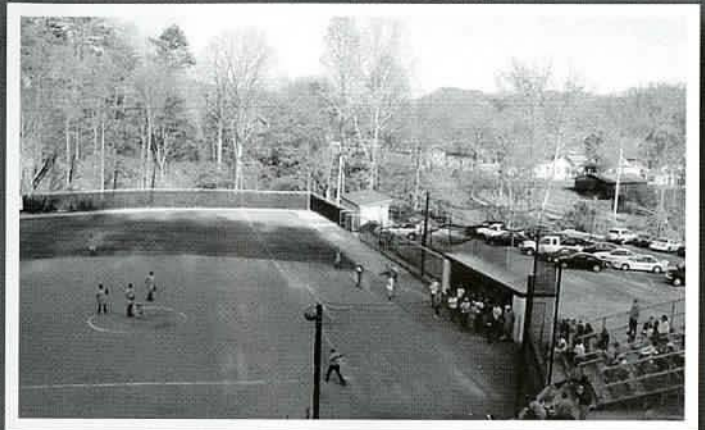
Jayne Stadium

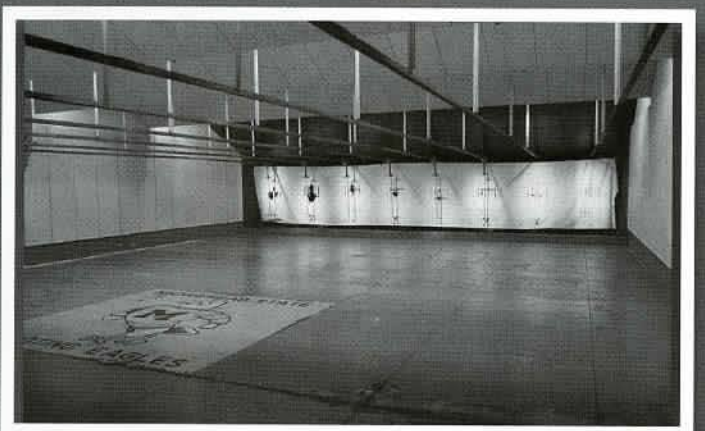
University Field

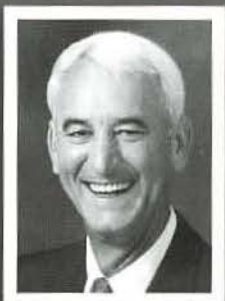

- The athletics program will accommodate student's interests and abilities in a manner that is nondiscriminatory to both sexes and reasonable with the University's resources.
- The athletics program shall adhere to the University's Affirmative Action Plan promoting equal opportunity for all employees and students, as well as applicants for employment and student participation.

Compliance Letter

Dear Friends:

Morehead State University is committed to upholding the highest integrity within all procedures and practices of the athletic department. We are pleased to publish this note as a reference to understanding often confusing NCAA regulations.

The NCAA defines "representatives of athletic interests" as alumni, friends and boosters of the University. All member institutions are held accountable for their representatives' actions. One violation could jeopardize the eligibility of any or all Eagle athletic programs.

As a general rule, anyone who has financially supported Eagle Athletics, been a member of any booster organization, or who has supported Eagle Athletics is considered a "representative" of Eagle Athletics.

Prospective student-athletes can be defined as a student who has started classes in the ninth grade or any younger student-athlete who has received a benefit from the institution. These individuals may only be recruited by MSU coaches who have passed the NCAA Recruiting Rules Examination. While "representatives" of Eagle Athletics may speak to any of these individuals via telephone or in person, a recruiting effort must not be made. Also, no student-athlete or prospective student-athlete may receive any extra benefit outside of the support provided by the institution. These are certainly not all the regulations any "representative" of Eagle Athletics must remember. However, they provide a good outline of the types of things that could endanger the eligibility of any MSU Athletics program. Again, feel free to contact us if you have any questions. All potential constituent groups were consulted throughout the process. While MSU has

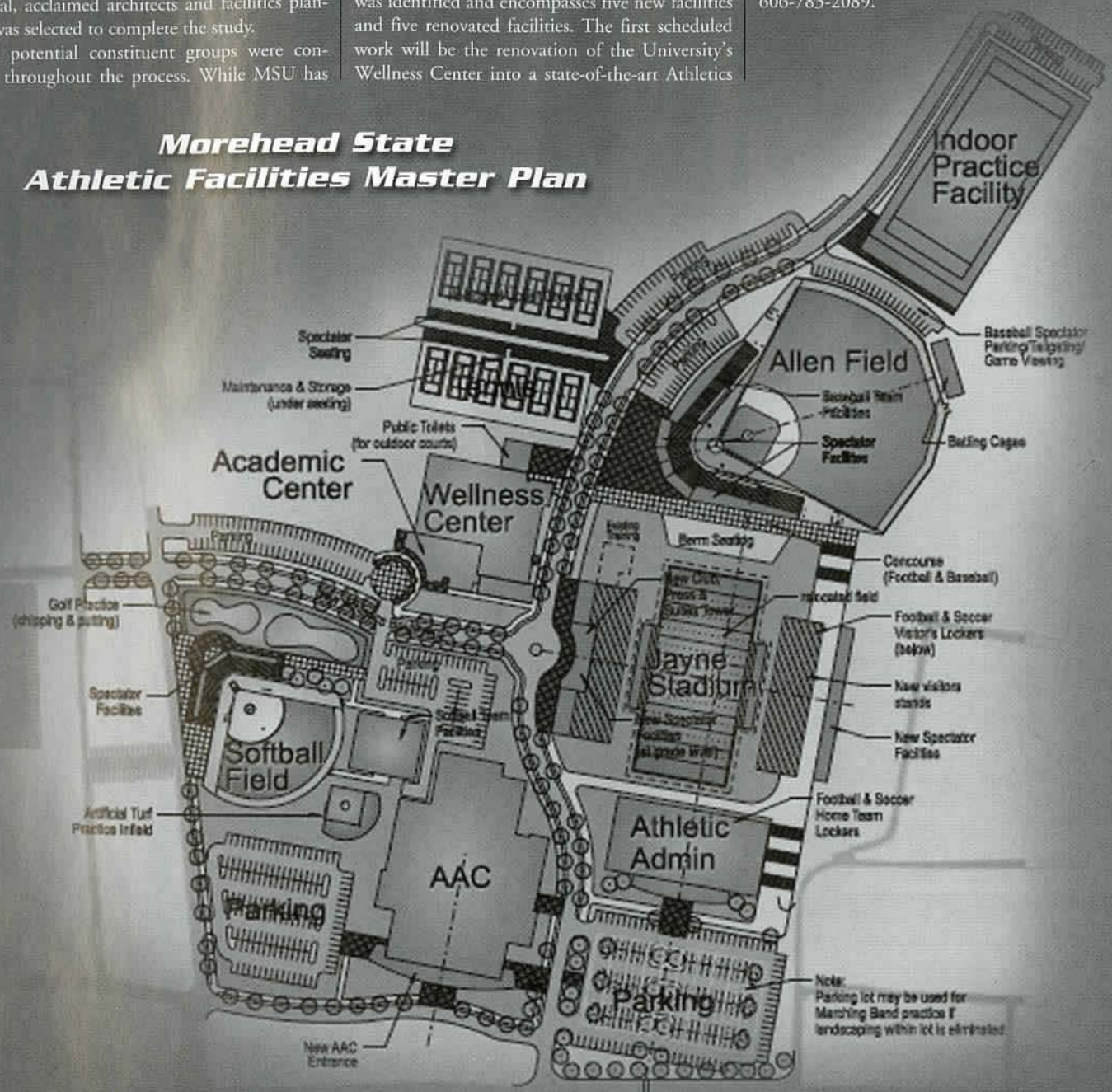
much to be proud of, it became quite apparent that significant work should be done to improve the athletics physical plant.

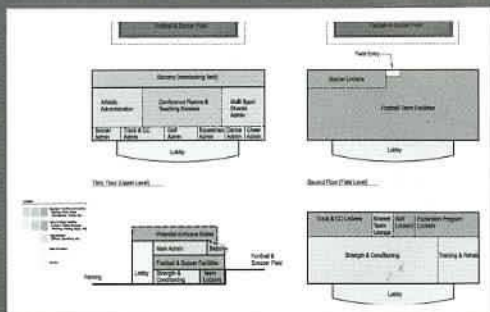

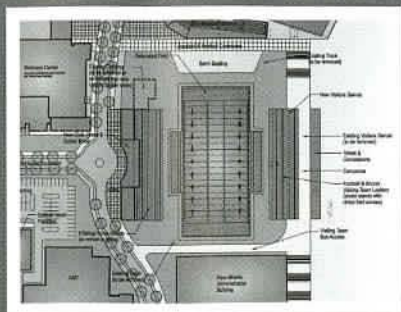
These artist renderings represent many of the major proposed improvements, additions and new facilities outlined in the Morehead State Athletic Facilities Master Plan.

New Administration Building



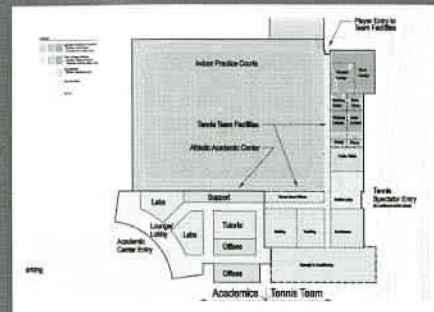
The new administration building will be located on the south end of Jayne Stadium and will house all administrative offices, most coach's offices and football team facilities. The building will also house soccer and cross country locker rooms and serve as the site to strength and conditioning activities and the sports medicine operation.

Jayne Stadium



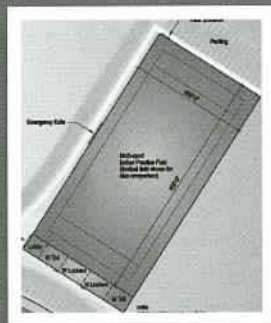
Jayne Stadium will be completely renovated with new grandstand seating on the home sideline as well as a new press/luxury box tower atop the home sideline grandstand. The new press tower will house a spacious press work area, the President's Box as well as space for luxury boxes and a club seating area. Visitor locker rooms will be renovated, and the visitor sideline grandstands will be completely renovated. The road leading into Jayne Stadium will be re-routed and will serve as an entrance to the new athletic complex. The current track will be removed, and the home sideline grandstands will also be moved closer to the field, giving fans excellent sightlines and a feel of being closer to the action.

Academic Center



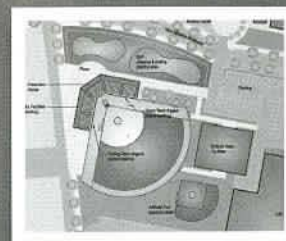
The first phase of the plan, already underway, is the expansion of the current Wellness Center to become the new Academic Center. Once completed, it will house computer labs, offices and study halls and will be a valuable asset to the academic success of Morehead State's student-athletes.

Indoor Practice Facility



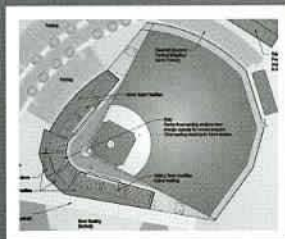
The indoor practice facility will be located on the present site of University Softball Field and will serve as a valuable practice facility for all of MSU's teams.

Softball Facilities



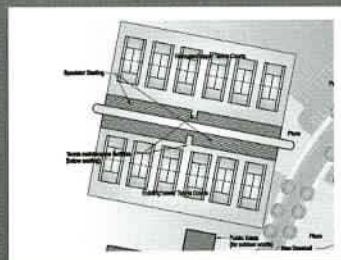
A new softball stadium will be built on the Northwest side of the current Academic-Athletic Center. The facility will have home and visiting locker rooms and a spacious press box. Also planned is a softball team locker room facility as well as an artificial turf infield practice area for use by all outdoor teams. Behind the new stadium, a golf chipping and putting green is also in the plan to be constructed.

Baseball Facilities



The Allen Field grandstand will be reconstructed and modernized, and plans are to extend the current right field "short porch" area to a more-spacious field area. A new press box will be built atop the grandstand.

Tennis Facilities



The current Sadler Courts will be renovated. The new facility will have 12 lighted courts and ample stadium seating for spectators. Team facilities as well as ample storage and restroom facilities will be located in the expanded Academic Center adjacent to the courts.

Morehead and the Gateway Region

Morehead, Ky., is a community of nearly 10,000, nestled in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains in the Daniel Boone National Forest. It serves as the educational, medical, recreational and cultural center of rural northeast Kentucky and is located in the state's Gateway Area. Morehead also is known as the "Hardwood Capital of the World." Situated on the state's major east-west highway, Interstate 64, Morehead is 58 miles west of Ashland, Ky., and the border of West Virginia, and 66 miles east of Kentucky's second-most populated city, Lexington.

Its centralized location allows many parts of the Eastern and Midwestern United States to be readily accessible. Among the major cities within a day's drive are Washington, D.C.; Baltimore; Charlotte; Raleigh, N.C.; Atlanta; Knoxville, Tenn.; Nashville; Cincinnati; Dayton, Ohio; Columbus, Ohio; Cleveland; Pittsburgh; Indianapolis; Detroit; Chicago; St. Louis; Memphis; Birmingham, Ala.; and Louisville, Ky.



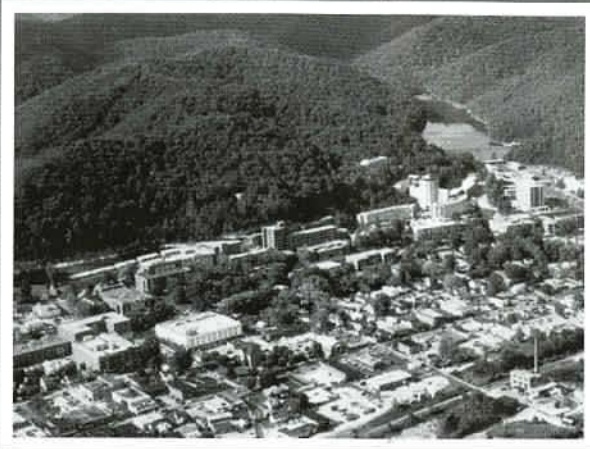
Located in the heart of Rowan County, Morehead affords a wealth of activities for the outdoorsman. Just six miles from downtown is beautiful 8,270-acre, man-made Cave Run Lake, an area nationally-known for its recreation opportunities and the fifth-largest body of water in Kentucky. Hiking, biking, swimming, boating, fishing, water skiing, canoeing, bird watching,

camping or enjoying the solitude of nature are some of the highlights of the activities at Cave Run Lake. The lake is known as the "Muskie Fishing Capital of the South" and hosts numerous tournaments each year. Daniel Boone National Forest, within which Cave Run Lake is entirely located, is visited by over five million people annually, and Morehead also is home to the Minor E. Clark Fish Hatchery, the largest fresh water fish hatchery in the U.S.

Carter Caves, just 25 miles from Morehead in nearby Carter County, is another popular outdoor spot just a short drive down I-64. The historic town of Maysville, Ky., a major stopover point on the Civil War-era Underground Railroad, is located 45 minutes north on the Ohio River, and offers more entertainment options.

Golf is another popular outdoor activity in Morehead. Two courses are within county limits. Eagle Trace Golf Course is an 18-hole, par-72 course, which has hosted both the state's men's

of untrained artisans. Also unique to Morehead is the Kentucky Center for Traditional Music, a facility dedicated to preserving the rich history of traditional Bluegrass, folk and Americana music. Many of the area's best trade and music shows are housed in the new Morehead Conference Center. For fine art, stop by the Pine Grove Gallery on Bridge Avenue or the Claypool-Young Art Gallery, located on MSU's campus. Several local craft and antique shops are dotted throughout the community as well.

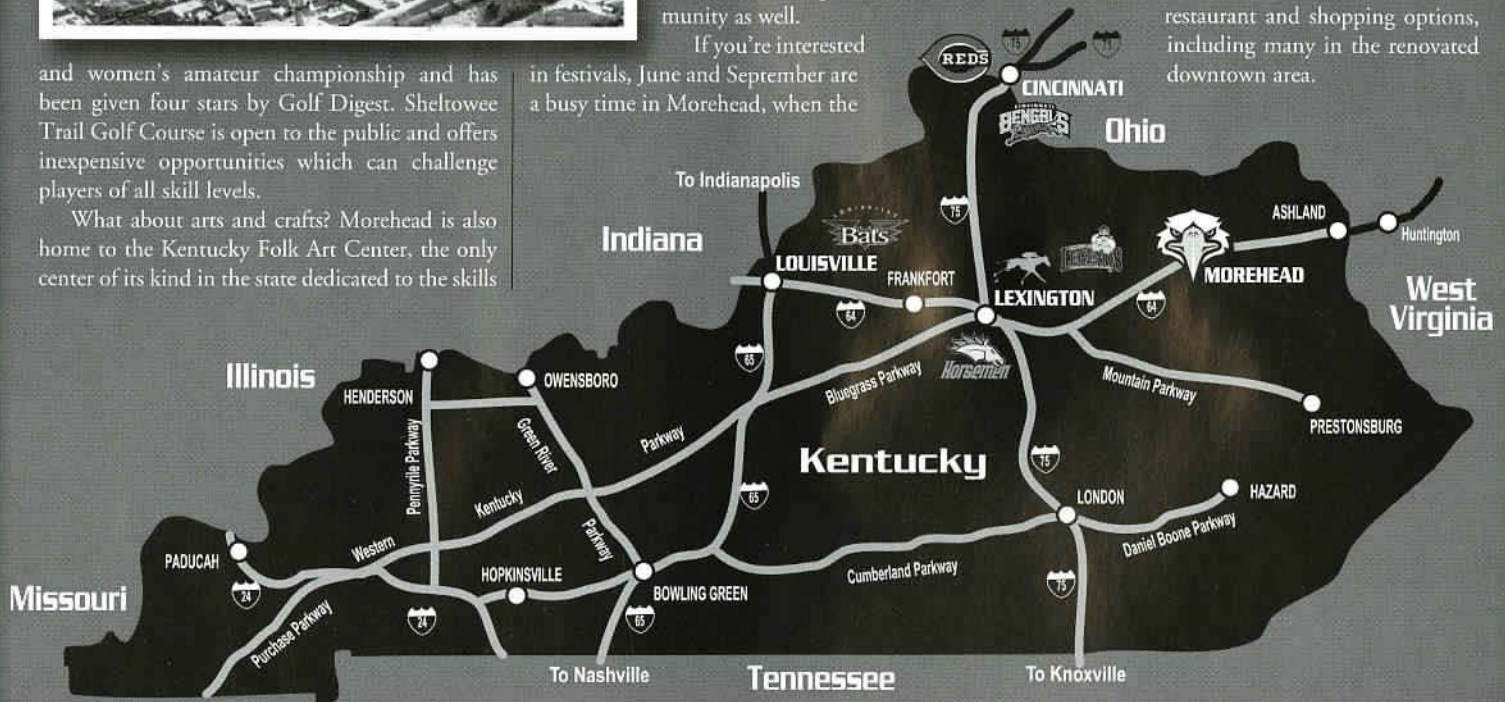

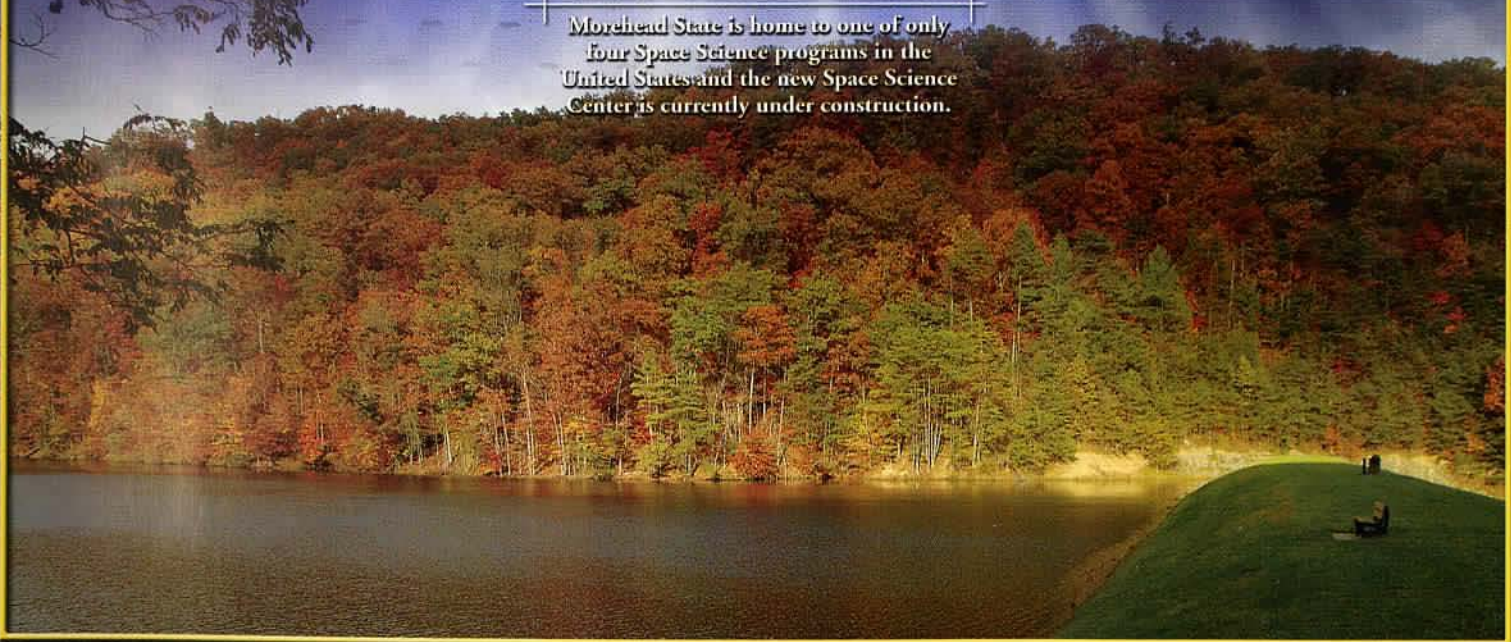
