MOREHEAD, Ky.---Two dying trees have been removed from the Morehead State University campus for safety reasons, according to Gene Caudill, director of physical plant.

An oak near Howell-McDowell Administration Building and a maple in front of Breckinridge Hall were taken down by Physical Plant workers. Caudill said the oak was struck by lightning and the maple apparently was damaged during the Breckinridge construction project completed two years ago.

"Both trees had become serious hazards and we had no choice but to remove them for the safety of everyone who walks or drives on campus," Caudill said.

He said replacement trees would be planted later this year.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Two faculty members in Morehead State University's Department of Health, Physical Education and Sport Sciences have co-written a textbook that will be available this summer.

Dr. Michael Hypes and his wife Julia Ann Hypes, assistant professors of HPER, teamed with Dr. Thomas H. Sawyer, professor of recreation and sports management at Indiana State University, and combined their efforts on "Financing the Sport Enterprise" that will be released by Sagamore Publishing, of Champaign, Ill., in July.

"We are very excited about this project. The text should be a valuable resource for both the student and practitioner," said Dr. Hypes.

Designed to meet the standards established by the National Association for Sport and Physical Education (NASPE) and the North American Society for Sport Management (NASSM), this book is intended to provide students in sport management curricula and professional practitioners with their first comprehensive survey coverage of the many traditional and innovative aspects of financial management.

The text focuses on the basics of financial management including, but not limited to, diversification of revenue, acquisition of revenue resources, financial management, auditing, sponsorships, licensing, franchises and fundraising.

With this knowledge, readers will be able to take a proactive role in confronting the fiscal challenges faced by their organizations.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---The Kentucky Folk Art Center (KFAC) and Morehead State University's Appalachian Heritage Program have announced the next installment of the speakers series "Appalachia: Yesterday and Today." Dr. Mark F. Sohn will present "Appalachian Foods: Defining a Culture" at KFAC on Tuesday, June 8, at 2 p.m.

Southern Appalachia is a culturally distinct mountain region that extends from the Maryland panhandle through West Virginia and Kentucky to the mountains of north Georgia. Thanks to the region's severe topography and strong people, a unique and under appreciated regional cuisine emerged. In this talk, Dr. Sohn will discuss Appalachian food and culture: stack cakes, soup beans, biscuits and gravy, chicken 'n dumplings, apple butter, and other dishes as well as food-related topics like cast iron, corn and can houses.

Dr. Sohn is the author of the award-winning Appalachian cookbook "Mountain Country Cooking," also available as "Hearty Country Cooking." He is a psychology professor at Pikeville College and a featured speaker with the Speakers Bureau of the Kentucky Humanities Council which is sponsoring his presentation at KFAC.

An MSU alumnus, he earned his doctorate from the University of Maryland and has lived in the Central Highlands of Eastern Kentucky's Appalachian Mountains for almost 20 years.

Dr. Sohn started cooking as an 11-year-old Boy Scout in the hills of western Oregon. In 1987, he studied cooking in Paris, completing the Ecole de Cuisine sponsored by Maxim's Restaurant and Pierre Cardin.

Since July 1990, Dr. Sohn has been the host and chef for Classic Home Cooking, a successful television cooking show that features the food of central and southern Appalachia. In 1992, the Penfield Press of Iowa City, Iowa, published his first cookbook, Southern Country Cooking, which featured traditional foods from 13 Southern states.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Kentucky teachers involved in Advanced Placement Program have little time left to apply for a scholarship to attend Morehead State University's Advanced Placement Summer Institute training program which will be held July 12-16 on the campus.

A limited number of scholarships, funded by the Kentucky Advanced Placement Incentive Program (KAPIP), are still available on a first come, first serve basis to Kentucky teachers who will be teaching an AP course during the coming academic year. The award covers tuition costs and fees. Applications are available online at www.moreheadstate.edu/units/ccu/ap_summer_institute.html.

Teachers accepted into the program are provided information to assist them in teaching academically strong high school students on a more complex level. More than half of the nation's high schools take part in the AP program's courses, which give high school students an opportunity to enhance their studies of interest by taking college courses and exams while still in high school.

During MSU's summer institute, participants may choose instruction in biology, chemistry, English language, English literature, environmental science, European history, French language, German language, music theory, Spanish language, statistics, U.S. government and politics, U.S. history and world history. Additionally, the program includes in-depth instruction and interaction with session leaders, focusing on positive and effective teaching strategies.

Teachers may register for the institute until early June. Each participant may enroll in one course. The fee is \$350, plus an additional \$25 lab fee for biology, chemistry and environmental science.

Now in its fourth year, MSU's program is provided through a partnership with The College Board, a national non-profit membership association dedicated to preparing, inspiring and connecting students to college. The Board provides educators with information, tools and strategies needed to build and strengthen their professional skills and techniques.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State Public Radio has announced that changes to its program schedule will be made next month.

Beginning July 3, "American Routes," hosted by Nick Spitzer will be heard Saturday evenings at 6 p.m.

"American Routes" covers a vast region of musical and cultural diversity. Each week the show offers a variety of acoustic, blues, jazz, Cajun, Bluegrass, Celtic, zydeco, Tejano and other forms of regional music found across the United States. In addition, Spitzer mixes stories and conversations with musicians, songwriters and everyday people who are touched by this music in some way.

"Mountain Stage" will remain on Fridays at 9 p.m. with a rebroadcast of show on Sundays at 2 p.m.

"Mountain Stage," now in its 20th year, is a live music program based in Charleston, W.Va. Hosted by Larry Groce, the program has established a long tradition of featuring national and international performers in almost every style of music.

Past performers have included Alison Krauss, Buddy Guy, John Hartford, Ralph Stanley, Indigo Girls, Los Lobos, Bill Monroe, The Fairfield Four, Dr. John and Norah Jones.

These programs will replace "A Prairie Home Companion," "The Writer's Almanac" and "Footlight Parade." An additional hour of "Classical Music with Jonese Franklin" will air on Fridays to replace "Footlight Parade."

Earlier this year, Minnesota Public Radio, the producers of "A Prairie Home Companion," "The Writer's Almanac" and other syndicated programs, announced it would no longer be associated with Public Radio International as a distributor of its programs.

"When MPR decided to separate from PRI, the fees to carry just 'A Prairie Home Companion' increased by nearly 400 percent," said Paul Hitchcock, MSPR general manager. "As our budget was already tight, we were faced with the decision of keeping the program and cutting back on personnel and local programming or we could eliminate the extra fees and maintain most of our current program schedule.

“We decided to continue our deep commitment to the region and we will do all we can to maintain programming, which has an important value and impact to the region.”

Hitchcock noted that during the 2004 Spring Fundraiser, the station had only eight phone calls in support of APHC. “There was just not enough financial support to justify the \$15,000 price tag,” he said.

“It's important for our listeners to realize, their phone calls and comments during our fundraisers are extremely important in the process of determining future programming decisions on MSPR,” said Hitchcock.

Morehead State Public Radio serves more than 20 counties in East Kentucky, as well as parts of Ohio and West Virginia. Located on the campus of Morehead State University, WMKY (90.3 FM) serves as the flagship station with affiliates in Booneville (WOCS at 88.3 FM) and Inez (88.3 FM). MSPR broadcasts 24 hours a day, including live webstreaming, and offers a variety of regional news and entertainment programs.

Nineteen adult educators were recently recognized for accomplishments in the Kentucky Adult Education Leadership Institute. The Leadership Institute, led by the Adult Education Academy for Professional Development at Morehead State University, introduces participants to principles of continuous program improvement based on the Baldrige National Quality Program, which has long been recognized and respected in the private sector.

Cheryl King, vice-president for Kentucky Adult Education, Council on Postsecondary Education, said, "We are extremely pleased to fund this leadership institute. Through our participation, we hope to engage in continuous improvement in both the effectiveness and efficiency of the services we offer our learners."

Using the Baldrige model, participants examine their organizational performance in seven areas – leadership, strategic planning, student, stakeholder and market focus, measurement, analysis and knowledge management, faculty and staff focus, process management, and results.

Participants learn to collect and analyze local program information for data-based decision making that will improve services to our learners.

"Leadership Institute participants have worked extremely hard during the one or two years they have been enrolled, but they say it has been worth the extra effort," added Connie Spencer-Ackerman, professional development specialist at the Adult Education Academy.

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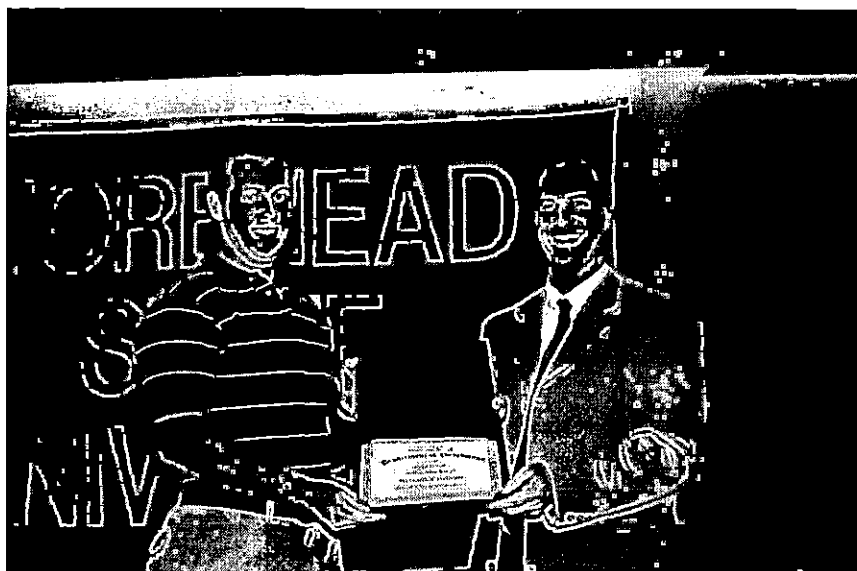

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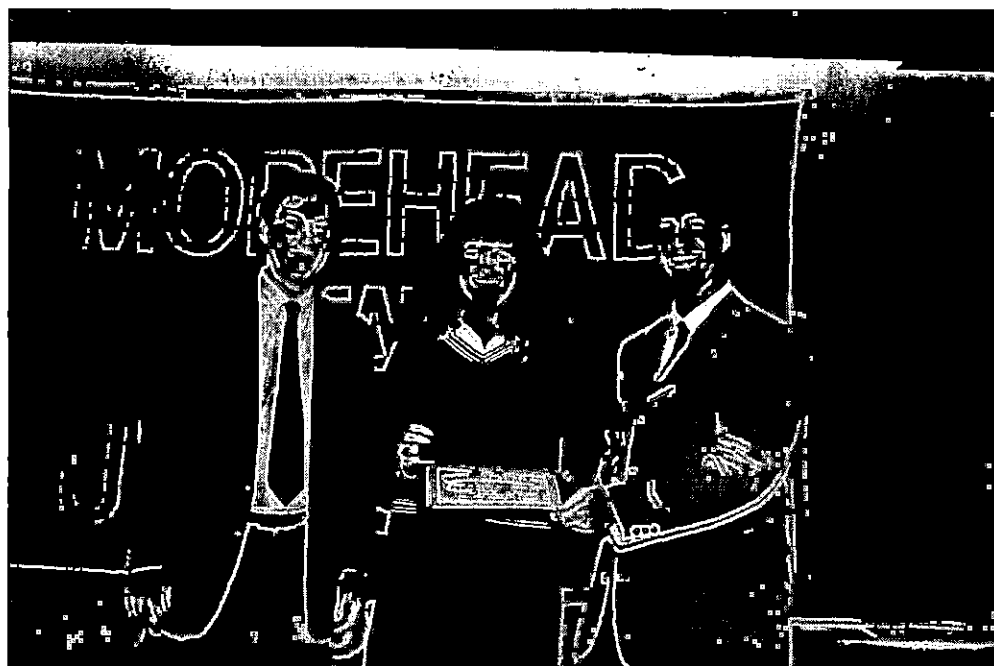

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University is now offering a Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) degree for Middle Grades. The two-year program is designed for anyone holding a bachelor's degree who desires to teach in one of four middle grade certification areas: language arts, mathematics, science or social studies. People who have majors or minors in these areas may have met content specific requirements; those who have other majors or minors will be required to take additional course work.

Once admitted into this program, an enrollee may begin teaching in any middle school in Kentucky under a temporary provisional teaching certificate while taking courses to earn full certification. MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University's Board of Regents has approved a \$99.2 million operating budget for 2004-05, an increase of 3.1 percent over last year, contingent on the adoption of a biennial budget by the state legislature.

During its quarterly meeting (June 11), the Board also approved a 3 percent salary pool for faculty and staff. From a total of 1,048 positions, 984 contracts are expected to be filled by July 1. President Ronald G. Eaglin's salary will be \$200,000 for the remainder of his term. The senior CEO of the state's public universities, Dr. Eaglin plans to retire before the end of the year.

MSU students will see a 14 percent rise in tuition rates and mandatory student fees for the coming year as approved by the Regents. This figure equates to an additional \$238 per semester for an undergraduate resident. Housing rates will increase an average of 4 percent, or \$68 per semester, to allow for continuous upgrade and improvement of residence hall facilities and furnishings.

The Board also approved the naming of the Admissions Center which houses the Office of Admissions, the Office of Institutional Research and Computer Applications and Gov. Fletcher's East Kentucky Regional Office. The two-story office building, acquired by the MSU Foundation in 2003, is under the University's control through a lease-purchase agreement.

In other matters, the Board approved the granting of promotions for the coming year: Dr. Robert Prichard, music; Dr. Elizabeth Regan, information systems; Dr. Allen Risk, biology; and Thomas Kmetz and Jennifer Little, librarians III.

Emeritus status was granted to Dr. Wade Cain, associate professor of chemistry; Mary Jo Netherton, associate professor of French; and Betty Jo Peters, assistant professor of English. Yan Duan, associate professor of nursing, was granted an educational leave for 2004-05, contingent upon funding.

The Board also adopted resolutions in memory of two former governors--Edward T. Breathitt and Louie B. Nunn--and a commendation for Joshua Gruenke of Maysville, outgoing president of the Student Government Association who has served as the student regent during the last year.

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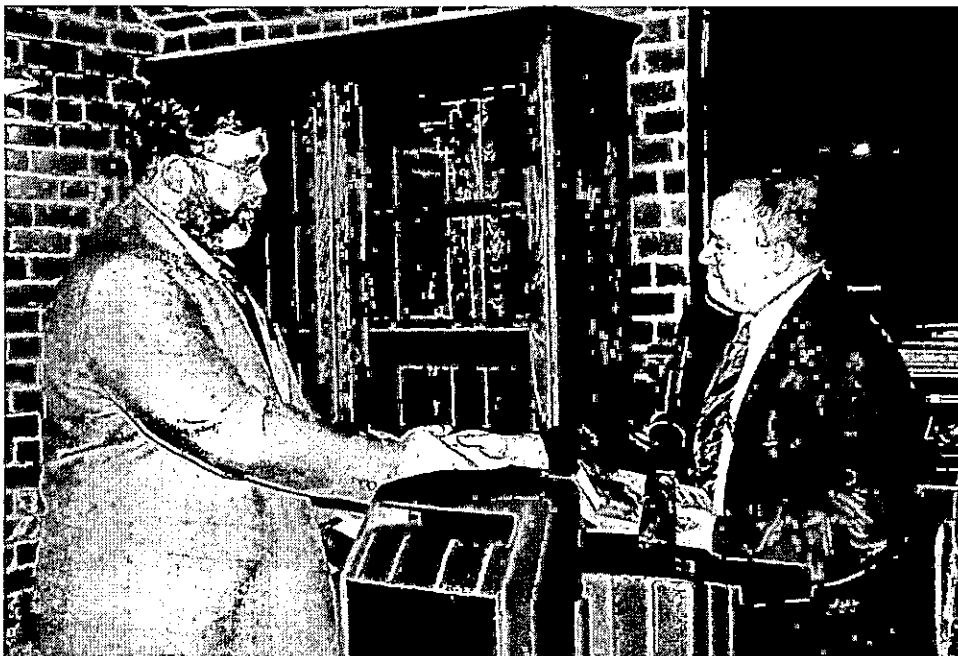
AUTHOR RECEIVES AWARD AT MSU

MOREHEAD, Ky.---The deadline is fast approaching for teachers and other professionals in Kentucky's elementary and secondary schools and adult education centers to enroll at Morehead State University's Kentucky Educators Excellence Program (KEEP).

The initiative grants a 10 percent reduction in published tuition rates to those employed by K-12 schools and adult education programs that seek to acquire additional administrative or teaching credentials recognized by the Kentucky Education Professional Standards Board.

Any graduate course at MSU will qualify for KEEP that is administered by the Office of Graduate Programs. A discount for as many as two courses per semester of graduate study, including Internet courses, is available for full-time faculty and staff members of accredited public and private K-12 schools and adult education centers in Kentucky who are enrolled in degree, non-degree or certificate programs recognized for credentialing purposes by the Standards Board. Non-degree programs include Fifth Year and Rank I.

To receive the KEEP discount, a student must be fully admitted by the start of classes. Applicants must have their full-time employment verified by a school official by the same deadlines.

A waiting list for "filled" classes will be established and maintained during advance registration each semester for the benefit of KEEP participants and other students.

Fights' position with Mazak involves working directly with a project manager to set up machine drawings and to make needed changes to the drawings to facilitate the company's projects.

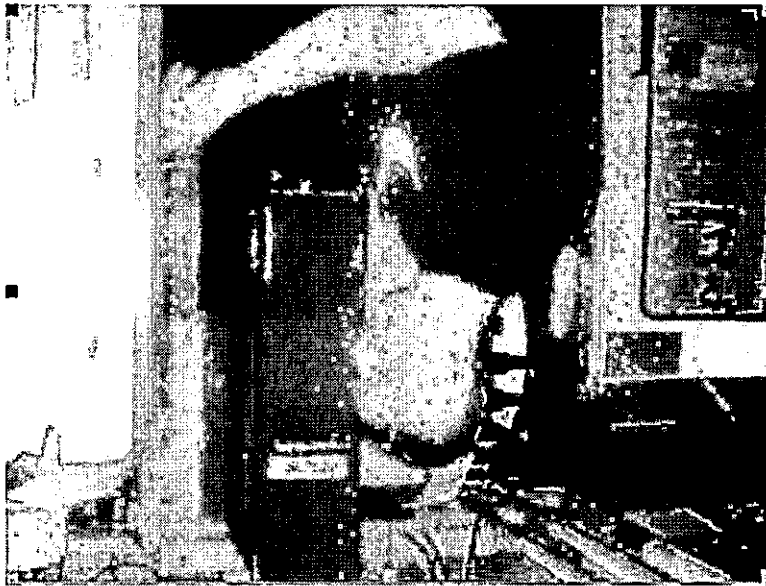

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University Police Chief Joseph S. Cline was among 257 law enforcement officers graduating from the 217th Session of the FBI National Academy Program at Quantico, Va.

He is the first MSU law enforcement employee to graduate from this prestigious program.

Cline, a 19-year-veteran of law enforcement, was one of three Kentuckians attending the spring session of the Academy, which offers 10 weeks of advanced investigative, management and fitness training for selected officers.

The 217th Session, which ended June 11, drew men and women from 48 states, the District of Columbia, 21 international countries, three military organizations and four federal civilian organizations. It is the wide range of personnel attending from across the world that makes the FBI National Academy so unique and so beneficial to law enforcement officers.

"Being a graduate of the FBI National Academy, it allows me to be involved in networking with other graduates across the country and the world," said Cline. "These interactions provide invaluable contacts for information, assistance and other aspects of law enforcement training that can be beneficial for us."

Academy training is considered by many to be the premier law enforcement training opportunity in the country, drawing attendees worldwide.

"I'm very proud and the MSU community should also be proud that Chief Cline graduated from this course," said Madonna Weathers, vice-president of student life.

The FBI National Academy was the brainchild of J. Edgar Hoover. The Academy began in July of 1935 as a way for law enforcement officers to share information and network with each other.

Cline said he is thankful he had the chance to attend.

"I'm so glad for the opportunity to go and get this kind of training and leadership experience," he said.

Cline said he took classes in forensic science, behavioral science, law and more. Training for the program is provided by the FBI Academy instructional staff, Special Agents and others holding advanced degrees.

In addition, the officers have to undergo extensive physical training.

"In the ninth week, attendees must travel what's called the 'yellow brick road'," Cline explained. "It's a 6.5-mile run/walk and obstacle course. Three and a half miles consist of a rigorous marine obstacle course."

A total of 37,488 graduates now represent the FBI National Academy since its inception. Of this numbers, approximately 22,533 are still active in law enforcement work.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---For Morehead State University, the term “student-athlete” is not just an empty phrase. Whatever success the Eagles have had on the courts or fields, they have accomplished even more in the classroom.

During the June Board of Regents meeting, MSU Director of Athletics Chip Smith provided those in attendance with details from a three-year academic survey conducted by his department.

For the 2003-04 school year, Eagle student-athletes had a combined 2.878 grade point average, which should rank them among the best in the Ohio Valley Conference.

In 2002-03, MSU ranked third among OVC universities with a 2.872 GPA. “We are very proud,” said Smith. “Our students work hard in both their sports and their classes and the numbers show this.”

In the spring 2004 term, a total of 82 athletes were on the dean’s list at MSU. Out of that number, 28 had perfect 4.0 grade point averages. Both are records for the athletic department.

“There still is work to do be done,” said Smith. “This staff is committed to providing our student-athletes the best possible opportunity to obtain their college degrees.

“Unless you work with these young women and men, who maintain a full-load of classes and a challenging practice or game schedule, it is hard to understand the mental and physical demands on a Division I student-athlete. However, we do feel that we have the right type of students to overcome what may be obstacles to others.”

In the past year, Smith’s unit has not only hired a full-time athletic academic coordinator but has opened an academic center, which includes a computer lab as well as study space for the student-athletes.

According to the survey, six out of seven women’s sports have at least a combined 3.0 grade point average, which includes three sports –tennis, volleyball and rifle – that had 3.5 or higher.

On the men’s side, five out of the seven sports had a 2.7 GPA or better.

The award recognizes an OVC male or female junior or senior student-athlete who best exemplifies the characteristics of significant athletics performance, good sportsmanship and citizenship.

- Five members of the Morehead State University football team were honored on the 11th Annual Academic All-Pioneer Football League Team while a total of 31 players were named to PFL Academic Honor Roll.
- Eagle senior track and field standout Brandon Gulley, for the third consecutive year, was named to the Verizon Academic All-District IV Men's University Division Track and Field/Cross Country First Team.
- In addition, three Morehead State men's and women's rifle team members earned honors as College Rifle Coaches Association (CRCA) All-Academic Scholars. Garry Garrett, Matt Ritenour and Erica Werkman were selected for the CRCA award. Garrett was named to the First-Team Verizon/CoSIDA Academic All-District team.

MSU's student-athletes' graduation rates for the 2002-03 academic year were 54 percent, up from 50 percent in 2001-02.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Three Morehead State University professors have been selected to participate in a prestigious year-long professional development program within the mathematics discipline.

Michael Dobranski, assistant professor of mathematics; Dr. Maureen Doyle, assistant professor of computer science, and Dr. Tim O'Brien, assistant professor of mathematics, were among approximately 60 educators chosen nationwide to take part in Project NExT (New Experiences in Teaching), according to Dr. Rodger Hammons, chair of the Department of Mathematics and Computer Science.

Funded primarily by Exxon Mobil with support from several national mathematical organizations, Project NExT is implemented by the Mathematical Association of America (MAA). The program, in its 10th year, addresses the full range of faculty responsibilities in teaching, research and service, while providing a supportive community for the educators.

Project NExT Fellows attend three national meetings and associated specially-designed professional developmental workshops that give them a heads-up on starting a professional career at their home institutions.

A total of 695 Project NExT Fellows have been selected in the past, including MSU faculty members Dr. Dora Ahmadi, associate professor of mathematics, and Dr. Kathy Lewis, assistant professor of mathematics. Dr. Chris Schroeder, assistant professor of mathematics, also had been selected in the past, though he declined at the time due to scheduling conflicts.

"This will bring to five the number of participants in the Project NExT program within this department," Dr. Hammons said. "I think this speaks highly of not only these three individuals but also reflects favorably on this institution. It would seem that with MSU getting three out of 60 places when applications are received from across the nation speaks highly of the potential of these individuals to help this department grow and meet its goals and objectives."

Dr. Hammons said he was "delighted that our faculty have competed so favorably."

Dobranski is expected to complete his Ph.D. degree in mathematics this summer at the University of Kentucky. MOREHEAD, Ky.---The Great Plains is experiencing a shift in the membership of its traditional religious denominations, according to Morehead State University assistant professor of demography Dr. Holly R. Barcus.

Dr. Barcus and Stanley D. Brunn, professor of geography at the University of Kentucky, were two Kentucky geographers whose research was published in studies presented in the spring 2004 issue of Great Plains Research.

The pair gathered denominational membership from 1952 to 2000 and compared it to population changes during the same period.

"Mapping county-level data of the four major denominations reveals that Catholics and Lutherans are strongest in the northern plains, Methodists in the central plains, and Baptists in the southern plains," Dr. Barcus said. "Counties that are increasing in populations and closest to metropolitan and interstate areas experience the most diversity."

Great Plains Research, a journal of social and natural history, is edited by Robert F. Diffendal Jr., emeritus professor of conservation and survey at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and published by the Center for Great Plains Studies at UNL.

Using tables and maps, Barcus and Brunn illustrated the shift in denominational membership from more rural areas to metropolitan. The number of Catholics more than doubled in the past half century, which the authors attributed to the growth of Hispanic populations in the plains.

The geographers said the central and southern plains witnessed the greatest shifts in denominational membership. The once almost entirely Baptist-dominated Texas counties diversified by 2000 to include more Methodists, Lutherans, Disciples of Christ and Catholics. Kansas, Nebraska and Colorado were mixes of Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists in 1952, but by 2000 there were several counties with Baptist, Congregational Christian and Disciples of Christ majorities.

The geographers expanded their study of the major denominations with an examination of the changing religious diversity and how population changes relate to that diversity. They concluded that the Great Plains' religious makeup reflects both the expansion of new religious groups and the contraction of traditional groups.

The metropolitan centers with increasing population diversity exhibit the greatest religious diversity, while rural areas with no change or decreases in population exhibit little religious diversity currently or historically.

The authors caution that population is not the only factor in religious diversity and that the economic changes in land use may play a major role.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Veteran language professor Mary Jo Netherton has decided to bid au revoir to her full-time faculty status at Morehead State University.

After 40 years as an educator, Netherton says it's time she slowed down a bit.

"Teaching doesn't give you any time for leisure, because your calendar is always so full," she said. "I think that when I saw my 60th birthday coming, I just decided that it was time."

She said her sister and her husband Larry, both retired educators, were role models who helped her make her decision. "They thought they should retire while they still enjoyed it, so they did."

But she says her retirement, effective July 1, from her position as associate professor of French doesn't mean her teaching career is over. She plans to continue with certain programs, including a teaching abroad assignment in France this summer, and she has been active in public school foreign languages enrichment programs. Additionally, she has maintained an active role at the local, state and national level as a presenter of educational programs on eating disorders.

"I've just always been a teacher, and I assumed that it would be my lifelong career, but I have interests that will never stop."

The Bowling Green native earned her bachelor's degree from Western Kentucky University, and holds master's degrees from MSU and the University of Kentucky.

She began her life as an educator in Morehead in 1964, as a French and Latin teacher at Breckinridge Training School. In 1967 she began teaching at the college level in the former Division of Languages, teaching English, then French and Latin, and since 1980, exclusively French. She was the University's only French instructor until Dr. John Secor, associate professor of romance languages, joined the faculty in 1988. He and Netherton individually and team-taught the seminar courses in French, covering teaching methods, phonetics, early and modern French, literature and film.

"We have always had a close working relationship, based on respect for each other as colleagues, interest in sharing ideas about teaching and research, and genuine love of France and the French language," Dr. Secor said. On a day-to-day basis, he says they have been able to practice what they teach.

"We have been successful in speaking French with each other as much as possible. This has been personally and professionally rewarding because of the pure pleasure of speaking French," he continued. "And it has rubbed off on many of our students, who are motivated to speak French with us and with each other, both in class and outside of class."

Dr. Secor described Netherton's career as a "selfless devotion to her students through the unerring promotion of French language and culture."

That devotion to her students has prompted Netherton to employ innovative techniques in the classroom, including her legendary use of costumed characters.

"I have always had a passion for teaching and I see that it has so many possibilities to keep it exciting for the students," Netherton said. "One of those ways that is a natural in teaching is role-playing."

She says she once attended a workshop presented by a teacher at Dartmouth College who used characters. "I saw how engaging it was to see a teacher do this, so in the summer of 1982, I decided to start dressing in costume to make it fun and exciting for my students."

One of her best-known French-speaking characters was "The Mad Jogger."

"She had super-human qualities," Netherton explained. "I'd come running into class with a T-shirt and tights on, and make all the students get up and exercise while counting in French." She also would do French number drills on the board during these sessions. "That's the only way to get it to be natural, is to repeat it over and over."

Other characters would bring a theme lesson with them to class. For example, the "French Maid" would bring in a toy vacuum cleaner and a duster, and reinforce household words to the students. "Preppie Le Pew" dressed in 1980s-era "preppie" attire, would use French to talk about articles of clothing.

"I really do think teaching is an exciting and enjoyable endeavor, and learning is as well. I like to have fun with it."

Personnel adviser to MSU's chapter of Chi Omega sorority since 1969, Netherton says she is also stepping down from that position. Her dedication to that organization has inspired the chapter to establish an endowed scholarship in her name.

Her numerous awards include MSU's Distinguished Teacher and Distinguished Faculty Service awards, Chi Omega's National Award for Excellence and MSU's Greek Adviser of the Year. She also has been a past director of the University's Eastern Kentucky Regional Foreign Language Festival.

Netherton says that despite the happiness she feels about the opportunity to retire, she also is a bit sad. "After 40 years, it will never be the same. When you change directions, you're always uncertain of how things will be. I wonder if I'll be as happy teaching part-time as I have been full-time."
