WEEKLY BIBLE STUDY	ELLIOTTVILLE SCHOOL
BY B. H. KAZEE	Second and Third Grades

Question—What is meant in the Bible by the word "sanctification"?

Answer—The word "sanctify" or its derivatives are used in both the Old and New Testaments, with substantially the same meaning. I could do no better than to give you a note by Dr. C. I. Schofield on this question:

"(1) In most Testaments, the Hebrew and Greek words are rendered by the English words "sanctify" and "holy," in their various grammatical forms. The one uniform meaning is, "to set apart for God." (2) In both testaments the words are used of things and persons. (3) When used of things no moral quality is implied; they are sanctified or made holy because they are best set apart for God.

"(4) Sanctification, when used of persons, has a threefold meaning. (a) No Position believers are eternally set apart for God by redemption, "through the offering of the body once for all" (Heb. 10:10). Positionally, therefore, believers are "saints" and "holy" from the moment of believing. (b) In the New Testament, the believer is being sanctified by the work of the Holy Spirit through the Scriptures. (John 17:2; Cor. 3:18; Eph. 5:26; 1 Thess. 5:22-24.) (c) In Consumption, the believer's complete sanctification awaits the appearing of the Lord (1 John 3:2, 3).

These notes of Dr. Schofield well set forth the truth of the doctrine of sanctification. That the word does not mean "sinlessness" is clear from all the uses of the word in both Testaments. In the eyes of God the believer is justified; that is, put in the position of one who is sinless. But this legal state of sinlessness does not mean that God does not charge the believer with sin. Since the believer is declared sinless as far as judgement is concerned, God, through the holy spirit dwelling in the believer, undertakes, through experience, to effect the character of God in the believer. This process goes on through the believer's whole life. Through death and resurrection, makes the believer completely sinless and perfect, and an ideal associate of Jesus Christ the perfect one.

The whole body of scripture teaches us that we all have sin as long as we live. Paul in the book of Romans, tells us how we are first sinful, as is the whole world; then he tells of the justice of God for those who believe, then he tells us of the struggle of the old nature and the new nature; then he tells us of the victory over the old man (not the doing away of the old man, but victory over him) through the Spirit's indwelling power, then he shows us the beautiful life and service of one who has found this victory. Victory over sin is not sinlessness. Where there is no sin there is no victory. But where sin abounds, grace multiplies more abundantly to give victory.

**City Council Passes Ordinance**

of Morehead and pay a license fee of \$25.00 per annum. Before the City Clerk is authorized to issue such license, he shall obtain the consent of the City Council.

Section II. Any person, sons, firms, or corporation operating skating rink combined under one operation, before engaging in such business, shall first procure a license from the City Clerk for which a license fee of \$25.00 may be charged per annum. The Clerk, before issuing such a license, shall obtain from the City Council authority to issue same.

Section III. Any person, persons, firms or corporation who is engaged in the business of conducting a skating rink or a swimming pool without first obtaining a license shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and fined any sum, not less than Fifteen Dollars or more than Twenty-five Dollars, and each day said business is engaged in without procuring such license shall be deemed a separate offense.

**CLEAN-UP**  
Section I. That it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firms, or corporations allowing or permitting such filth, refuse, waste or garbage to accumulate in or upon their premises or upon such premises over which such persons, firms or corporations exercise ownership or control, and any person, firms or corporations exercising ownership or control, and any persons, firms or corporations allowing or permitting such filth, refuse, waste or garbage to accumulate shall be fined not less than one (1.00) Dollar or more than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, and each day shall constitute a separate offense in allowing said filth, waste, refuse or garbage to remain on said premises after having been notified by the City Marshall or City Policeman of the presence of same.
