

THE SIXTH VICTIM.

Young William Logan Expires From the Effects of the Wounds Received in the Morehead Fight.

MOREHEAD, KY., July 24.—William Logan died at 5 o'clock this morning. He had been sinking rapidly for the last two days, and his death was expected at any time. He was 19 years of age, very intelligent, and said to be one of the best and most promising young men in Morehead. He was never in a quarrel until the day when he was shot. Arrangements for his funeral have not been made. His mother is very ill. Logan's death makes the sixth victim of the Rowan-county trouble.

Tom Gorton and Charles Coburn arrived here from the Lexington jail at 3 o'clock this morning. Gorton is indicted for murder. He is rather a good-looking young fellow. He had been married only three weeks when taken to the Lexington jail. His wife visited him in prison here this morning. Coburn, who was indicted for robbing a car at the depot, is a bad-looking character. Both men were brought into court this morning. Amie Young, son of Taylor Young, appeared as the lawyer for Gorton. Coburn had no lawyer, and the Court appointed Wickliffe Kendall. Both cases were set for Tuesday, and the court adjourned. The grand jury is still in session.
