

**Fourth War Loan  
Drive In County  
To End Feb. 15th**

**One-Half Of Quota  
Reached According To  
Local Chairman**

As of Saturday, January 29, Morehead County had raised only one-third of its quota in the Fourth War Loan Drive, according to figures released by W. H. Vaughan, chairman of the drive in Rowan County. At the close of business on that date, reports indicated that slightly less than \$50,000 worth of bonds had been sold. The quota is \$125,000.

That means that Rowan County is showing in this drive is not nearly as good as some of the neighboring counties. Jefferson County has already exceeded its quota and is continuing to sell bonds. A good many communities throughout this section of the state are showing excellent progress in their record for outstanding contributions to the war effort and associated relief work.
