For those who wish to schedule classes or adjust a schedule, academic advisers will be available in the major departments from 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m. on June 6.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University has partnered with Virtual Education Software to offer educators interactive, multi-media CD-ROM courses that may be completed at one's own pace from the comfort of their home.

"Violence in Schools: Identification, Prevention and Intervention Strategies," an interactive computer-based instruction (CBI) course, is designed to give teachers a better understanding of school violence and increase intervention strategies.

Violence in Schools provides a foundational understanding of violence and the motivational purposes behind aggression. The correlation with and impact of the media, community and family upon violence will be investigated.

The course teaches identification and intervention approaches for working with out-of-control behaviors. In addition, information on available national resources for both parents and teachers is included. This course will help each person to increase his or her understanding of violence, the motivations behind the use of violence and specific strategies to minimize the occurrence of violence in a school and community.

The fee is \$185 and participants may earn 30 CEUs for completing the course.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University will hold its first of four Student Orientation, Advising and Registration (SOAR) days on Saturday, June 11, to assist new students in getting acquainted with the University and its programs.

Other SOAR sessions, which will follow the same format, will be held on Tuesday, June 14, Friday, June 24, and Friday, July 15.

“SOAR is an important part of the college experience,” said Lora Pace, director of first-year program and retention. “It provides students with the foundation necessary to begin their university career at Morehead State.”

The activities will start with check-in at 8 a.m. on the first floor of the Adron Doran University Center (ADUC).

From 8-11 a.m., Technology Services sessions, which run 25 minutes per session, will be held in 301 ADUC.

Following SOAR registration, students will have the opportunity to have their photographs taken for the University’s identification card, the EagleCard.

From 9:30 – 11:30 a.m., informational programs designed for students and parents will be presented on the building’s third floor. Representatives from the Office of Financial Aid, student housing, academics, student organizations, food services, EagleCard and University Bookstore will be available to answer questions.

Transfer students will attend a special orientation session at 9:30 a.m. in the Heritage Room.

After lunch, Morehead State President Wayne D. Andrews will welcome students and parents to the event. At 12:30 p.m., the campus visitors will be divided into groups of their chosen educational discipline and proceed to that academic department for advising and course registration. While the students are in the academic departments, parents will be hosted by Dr. Andrews and staff in the Crager Room.

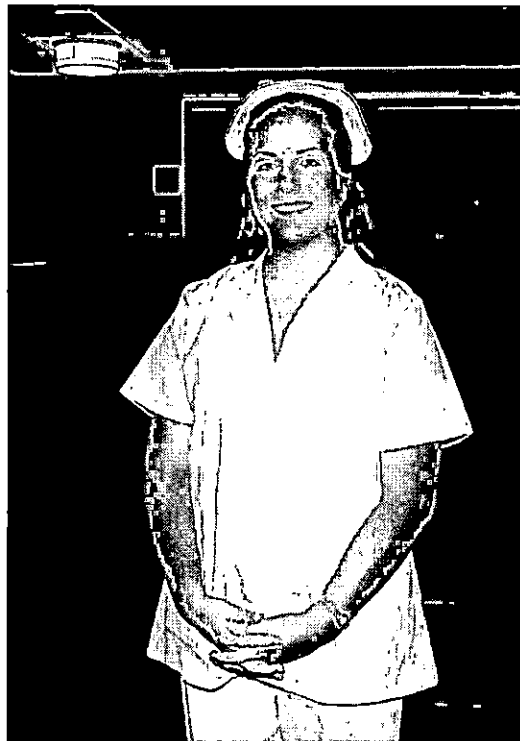

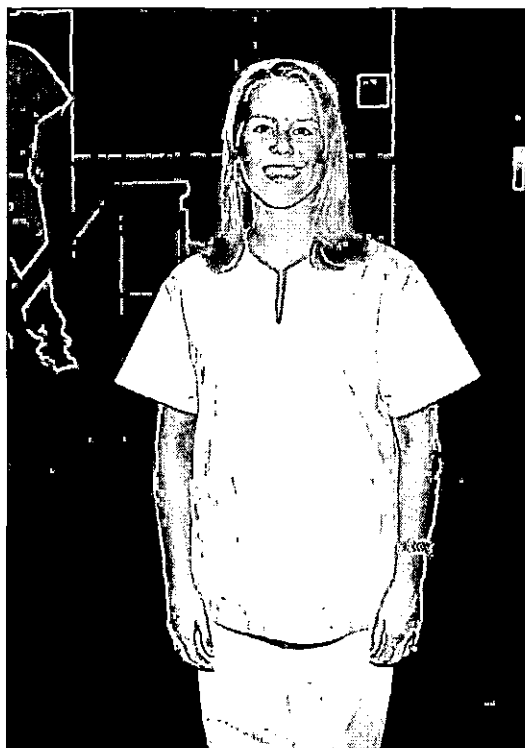

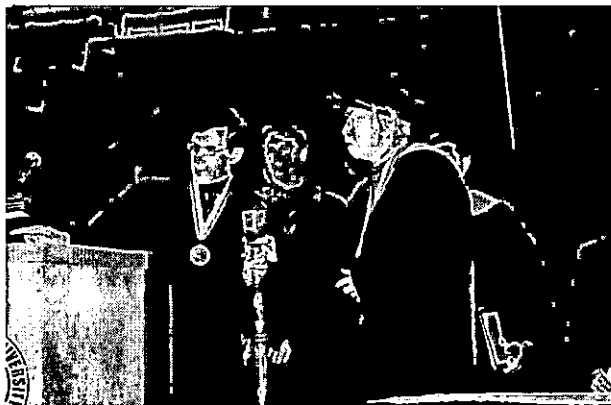

MOREHEAD, Ky.---East Kentucky's first public radio station, WMKY, hit the airwaves on June 15, 1965, from the campus of Morehead State University. The signal of only 10 watts covered the Rowan County area with programming from the studio, located in the Combs Building.

Now 40 years later, WMKY, currently 50,000 watts, is the flagship station of Morehead State Public Radio. MSPR, which includes WOCS in Booneville and a translator in Inez, reaches more than 40 counties in Kentucky, Ohio and West Virginia.

Since 2002, the MSPR signal has originated from the state of art studios located in Breckinridge Hall.

Earlier in 2005, WMKY along with WOCS became two of the first public radio stations in the Commonwealth to convert to a high definition, digital broadcast signal.

As part of the yearlong celebration of WMKY's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary, MSPR will host an Open House on Wednesday, June 15, from 5-7 p.m. at the main studios in 132 Breckinridge.

During the event, there will be food, live music, free door prizes and studio tours.

"We invite everyone to come visit," said MSPR General Manager Paul Hitchcock. "We have dusted off some of the old photos and we are ready to share our celebration with our friends.

"We are very excited about how far we have come in the last 40 years. This year (2005) is a very special year in the history of MSPR and we want everyone to be part of the celebration."

MSPR is the regional voice for National Public Radio (NPR) News, "Morning Edition," "Car Talk," and "All Things Considered." The station carries local programming, such as "Front Page" with Chuck Mraz, "Classical Music" with Greg Jenkins and Jonese Franklin, "A Time For Tales" with Carolyn Franzini, "Bluegrass Diversion" with Sandy Knipp, "Nothin' But The Blues" with Paul Hitchcock, "Health Matters," "Mountain Edition," "Sunday Night Jazz" and "Americana Crossroads Live."

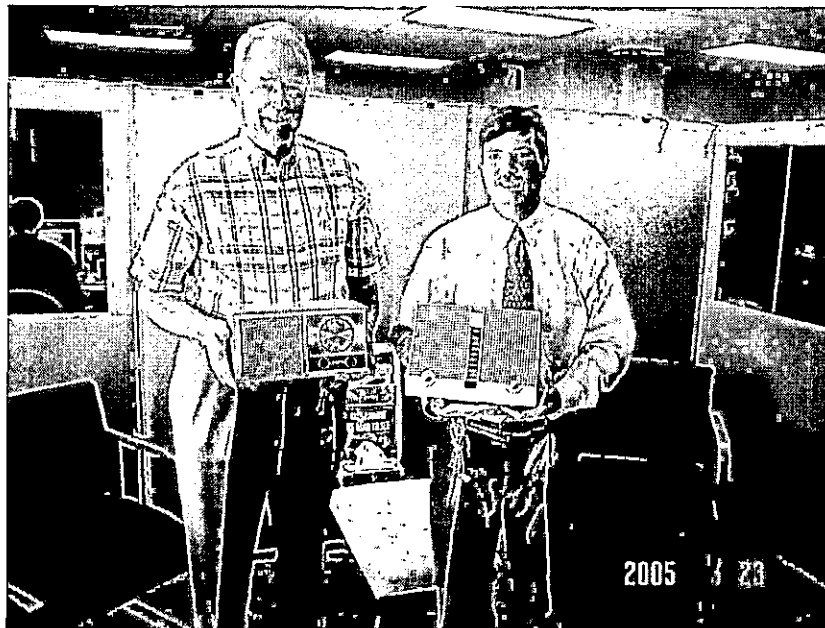

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University's Theatre program has been accredited by the National Association of Schools of Theatre.

"This is very significant. We are one of only 146 accredited schools in the country and one of two accredited programs in the Commonwealth. This recognizes the outstanding work of our students, staff and faculty," said Dr. Bob Willenbrink, chair of the Department of Communication and Theatre.

The National Association of Schools of Theatre (NAST) was founded in 1965 to improve educational practices and maintain high professional standards in theatre education and has been designated by the U.S. Department of Education as the agency responsible for the accreditation of all theatre curricula. In addition to accrediting standards, the association disseminates information to the public, produces statistical research, provides professional development for leaders of theatre schools and engages in policy analysis. Also, NAST has been recognized by the Council on Higher Education Accreditation and is a member of the Association of Specialized and Professional Accreditors.

Dr. Willenbrink said, "Attaining accreditation from NAST is a tribute to all students, staff and faculty who have contributed to MSU Theatre's excellent academic and production program. For many years, the program has produced high quality productions and provided students with outstanding education in the theatre. Thanks to the selfless dedication of our faculty and staff, theatre students flourish during their time at MSU and most move on to successful careers as actors, directors, designers and theatre educators. Meeting the standards established by NAST and receiving accreditation is a major achievement."

The granting of accredited membership by the Commission on Accreditation signifies that an institution has successfully demonstrated compliance with the procedures, standards, and guidelines of the Association. Integral to this voluntary process is ongoing, regularized self-evaluation and peer review.

Accreditation, in practical terms, is a stamp of approval, a sign that an institution ascribes to, believes in, and has met an external set of basic criteria for the programs it offers. In some cases, accreditation assists in the transfer of credits from one institution to another. In all cases, it indicates that threshold standards are adhered to in a fashion that provides a base of academic strength and operational integrity.

The association accepts for membership only institutions established for the purpose of educating individuals in theatre. Member institutions must consistently adhere to sound educational policies and practices.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University's Dr. Benjamin K. Malphrus, director of the Ronald G. Eaglin Space Science Center, has been chosen to serve a second term on the Kentucky Statewide EPSCoR (Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research) Committee.

The group operates as a quasi-independent committee of the Kentucky Science and Technology Corporation (KSTC). Its purpose is to stimulate and enhance competitive research, to stimulate and effect systemic and sustainable improvement in the capacities of the Commonwealth's universities and colleges to compete successfully for research and development funds on a national basis, and to stimulate complementary cooperative efforts in education and human research development to ensure growth and support of science, engineering, and mathematics (SEM) research and training.

The committee is composed of 19 members with statewide representation. The membership includes six university administrators, seven faculty researchers, and six private/public representatives. The committee meets three times a year.

The Statewide EPSCoR Committee, subject to the concurrence of KSTC, has the authority to hire and coordinate central EPSCoR office project staff including the statewide director and assistants as employees of KSTC, establish and administer policies, criteria and procedures to implement EPSCoR programs as necessary to ensure that program goals and objectives are met, appoint members and elect leadership of the Statewide EPSCoR Committee and the subcommittees for each agency EPSCoR program, monitor the progress of programs and approve changes in scope and direction, and determine the allocation of state matching funds for EPSCoR programs.

Dr. Malphrus, who has been at MSU since 1990, earned his B.A. degree in art and an M.A.T. degree in physics from the University of South Carolina. He holds a Doctor of Education degree from West Virginia University. He has done graduate work at the University of California at Berkeley and at the Harvard Center for Astrophysics.

His scholarly grants and projects funded during his MSU career have totaled more than \$5.3 million and he has secured in-kind equipment gifts of an additional \$6 million.

A new financial aid program available this fall will allow first-time freshmen who meet certain qualifications to receive up to \$2,000 per academic year if they attend classes at MSU at West Liberty. The two-year grant program gives Morgan County students an opportunity to complete their first two years of college locally before continuing upper division course work on MSU's main campus.

The grant will cover tuition, fees and books for MCHS graduates or students who have completed the GED certification through the MSU at West Liberty testing center. Applicants must have an unmet financial need as determined by MSU's Office of Financial Aid.

To continue receiving the grant, students must maintain full-time enrollment at MSU at West Liberty and continue to show satisfactory academic progress through four semesters.

The trip is part of an agreement with the Guangxi Education Department. While overseas, some of the students will visit Guangxi University in China, which is MSU's partner university through the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and the Chinese Education Association for International Exchange program.

"This trip is the second year of our Morehead State-Guangxi English Language Academy. We have a strong relationship with Guangxi University and the Guangxi Education Department," said Dr. Robert E. Frank, associate dean of international education. "Each year a delegation of university presidents and vice presidents come to MSU for a two-week seminar on U.S. higher education."

This summer, the MSU contingency will work with Chinese secondary school teachers of English. The group will be based in the city of Beihai. The three-week program will mainly focus on oral English.

According to Dr. Frank, the MSU group will meet the teachers for three hours in the mornings and also some afternoon activities. The Education Department will provide the delegation with a tour of the province during the last week.

The program is ideal for future teachers or for those with an interest in Chinese culture. Participants must provide the cost of their international travel, but once in China, housing, food, and in-country travel is provided.

Dr. Frank will be joined by Dr. Rebecca Katz, associate professor of sociology; Douglass Cooper, Paris graduate student; Darryl Houston, Woodbridge, Va., senior; Allen Fitzpatrick, Lexington sophomore; Jared Neal, Morehead senior; Betty Ison, Morehead graduate student; Katherine Whitmore, Morehead senior, Amy Keller, Winchester senior; and Andrew Shelley, Hillsboro senior.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University's Board of Regents approved a record \$103.7 million operating budget for the 2005-2006 fiscal year during its quarterly meeting (June 16). This represents a 4.46 percent increase from last year's opening budget.

The new budget is based on a projected enrollment of 9,100.

The Regents approved a 12.5 percent tuition increase, effective with the fall semester. Tuition and fees for full-time in-state, undergraduate students will be \$2,160, an increase of \$240 per semester, and \$2,340 for graduate students, up \$260. The cost for non-resident undergraduates is \$5,740 and \$6,265 for graduate students. The rates include the student activity and services fee.

Students living in residence halls will see an increase of \$42 per semester.

The Board also approved a 4 percent general salary pool increase for faculty and staff members, including President Wayne D. Andrews, bringing his annual salary to \$218,400.

In other matters, the Board approved three new degree options: Master of Public Administration (MPA) degree, administered through the Institute for Regional Analysis and Public Policy; Master of Science in Information Systems (MSIS) in the Department of Information Systems; and Bachelor of Science: Area of Concentration in Engineering Technology, in the Department of Industrial and Engineering Technology.

The Regents also authorized the University to proceed with hiring a consultant to assist a programming committee with the preliminary programming needs and cost estimates for a student recreational center estimated to cost \$17 million. Student Regent Jason Marion of Batavia, Ohio, spoke on behalf of the center, stating that the Student Government Association had adopted a resolution in support because that would be a good recruitment and retention tool.

For service to the Board, Dr. Charles H. Morgan Jr., professor of psychology, was recognized for the three years he served as a faculty regent.

The final report for the spring semester was presented, showing a headcount of 8,680, a 3.1 percent decrease over spring 2004 figures.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University has received a \$496,000 federal grant to help fund a research partnership with the University of Kentucky.

U.S. Rep. Hal Rogers (KY-5) recently announced that MSU would receive the funding from the U.S. Department of Education for the Institute for Federalism and Intergovernmental Relations (IFIR). In the last two years, Rep. Rogers has directed \$993,000 for IFIR, securing funding in his role as a senior member of the House Appropriations Committee.

IFIR, jointly administered by UK's Martin School of Public Policy, will study the effects of public policy at the state and local levels of government and their relationship to national policies. The research conducted by IFIR will focus on intergovernmental management issues with a special focus on how those issues impact homeland security.

"The federal government clearly recognizes the first class research skills at Morehead State University and the University of Kentucky," Congressman Rogers said in announcing the funding. "The research conducted by these two programs of excellence will allow Kentucky to make a significant contribution to national public policy. Most importantly, their research will be a valuable asset for state and local policy makers throughout the United States who are working to keep our communities safe from terrorism."

Dr. David E. Wildasin, UK professor of economics and endowed chair in public finance at the Martin School, will serve as IFIR director. Dr. Michael W. Hail, assistant professor of government in MSU's Institute for Regional Analysis and Public Policy (IRAPP), is the project's associate director. Dr. Hail also is director of Morehead State's new Master of Public Administration (MPA) program.

"We are deeply appreciative of Congressman Rogers' ongoing efforts to assist the University's efforts to serve our region and the Commonwealth," said MSU President Wayne D. Andrews.

“UK and MSU will collaborate through IFIR to explore their common interest in federalism studies and build from their individual strengths,” Dr. Hail said. “IFIR at UK and MSU provides a very powerful combination of faculty that comprehensively covers federalism with innovative research and distinction.

“Ultimately, the work of the Institute will contribute to graduate education, research, publication, and contributions to public policy and administration related to intergovernmental relations and federalism,” he continued.

Dr. David Rudy, IRAPP dean, said, "IFIR will facilitate and strengthen the collaborations of UK and MSU in research arenas that have promising intellectual as well as practical significance. This is another example of the role of Congressman Rogers in building broad based partnerships that matter."

IRAPP and the Martin School have developed partnerships during the past several years that have included the co-sponsorship of a federalism-intergovernmental relations distinguished policy lecture as a part of each institutions annual lecture series, development of joint grant applications such as that to the NSF Partnerships for Innovation initiative, sponsorship of graduate research students, and collaboration on a dual degree program.

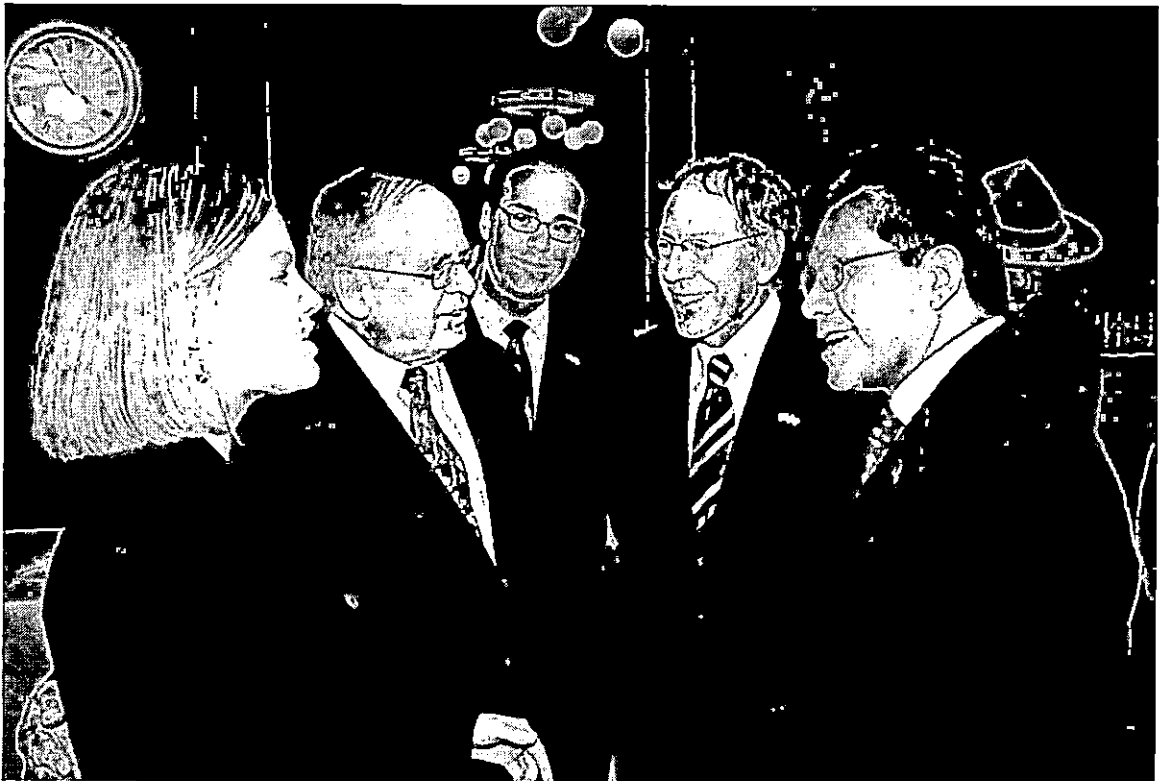

MOREHEAD, Ky.---The continued increase in the demand for highly skilled healthcare professionals across the Commonwealth and at the national level, has resulted in significant growth for Morehead State University's nursing and radiologic sciences programs.

To better address the rapid changes in healthcare education and to provide a more effective focus on the academic needs of students pursuing healthcare careers, an organizational restructuring of MSU's allied health programs has been approved.

Effective July 1, the Department of Nursing and Allied Health Sciences will be separated into two new academic units, the Department of Nursing and the Department of Imaging Sciences. Nursing education will focus on both the associate (ADNP) and baccalaureate (BNP) nursing degree programs on campus, and through the LPN Transition Program with the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS) and the RN Track Program across MSU's service region.

The imaging sciences department will continue to focus on the Associate of Applied Science degree (AAS in radiography) and the baccalaureate program with options in sonography and computed tomography/magnetic resonance.

"The primary reasons for this reorganization are to enhance teaching and learning experiences across both academic disciplines, to better facilitate collaborative working relationships with regional healthcare providers to provide enhanced clinical experiences for students and to more effectively provide a highly skilled workforce of healthcare professionals to better serve Kentucky," said Dr. Gerald DeMoss, dean of the College of Science and Technology.

Dr. DeMoss said that as accreditation standards continue to change for all healthcare programs, there is an increasing demand for highly trained faculty, more specialized instructional equipment, and classroom and laboratory facilities designed to promote student success.

"As such, this reorganization will have a positive impact on our academic programming and functionality for both units," he said.

Both nursing and imaging sciences programs have enjoyed significant growth in the past two years, according to Dr. DeMoss, and it is expected that this growth will continue as additional educational experiences become available to students through the two new departments.

“Having the opportunity to expand our academic program offerings was a big component of the reorganization,” he continued. “One area that we intend to explore is a program in nuclear medicine to enhance the baccalaureate program in imaging sciences.”

One faculty member will be added to each of the two nursing departments, effective this fall, to allow more students to be served, particularly in the initial program courses.

In nursing, Dr. DeMoss said, both the associate and baccalaureate degree programs have had strong enrollment in the past couple of years. The Department of Nursing will continue to collaborate with the University of Kentucky on the Nurse Practitioner programs and the Respiratory Care program partnership with KCTCS’ Maysville Community College, Morehead campus. MSU also is a partner in the delivery of UK’s Physician Assistant Program at Morehead.

As far as future program development plans, Dr. DeMoss said there “appears to be a growing interest in an ADN (associate degree nursing) program at our Mt. Sterling campus,” but specifics have not yet been worked out. Additionally, the college would like to offer a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree at some point.

To coordinate these changes, department chairs have been selected for each unit. Dr. Erla Mowbray will serve as chair of the Department of Nursing, and Barbara Dehner will chair the Department of Imaging Sciences.

Dr. Mowbray most recently has been a professor and coordinator of nursing at Lexington Community College (now Bluegrass Community and Technical College). A nurse for 30 years, she has worked in labor and delivery, medical-surgical, orthopedics and in other areas of nursing, and has been involved in collegiate nursing instruction during most of that time.

Dr. Mowbray’s other duties at LCC included serving as an assistant to the dean of academic affairs, and as the division chairperson of biological sciences and nursing. She also has served on the nursing faculty at Ashland Community College and at Shawnee State College in Portsmouth, Ohio.

Her committee memberships have been at the college and university level, and she has been a national site visitor for the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission, as well as an evaluator for the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools' Commission on Colleges. She has served as president of the UK chapter of Sigma Theta Tau International, and was a graduate mentor with Eastern Kentucky University's master's degree program.

Dr. Mowbray holds a Ph.D. degree in educational policy studies and evaluation in higher education, and a Master of Science in Nursing degree, both from UK. She earned her Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from the Ohio State University at Columbus, and also attended Miami University of Ohio in Oxford.

Dehner, a 23-year veteran of MSU, currently holds the position of program coordinator and interim co-chair of NAHS. She has served as a radiologic technology professor and as the clinical coordinator for the radiologic technology program for more than 20 years.

A leader in her field at the local, state and national level, she has been actively involved with JRCERT since 1990, holding the positions of apprentice, site visitor, chair, and most recently, was elected to the JRCERT Board of Directors. She additionally has held leadership roles in the Association of Educators in Radiological Sciences (AERS), including two terms as director. With the American Healthcare Radiology Administrators (AHRA), Dehner served on the organization's annual meeting planning committee.

Dehner has been active in committee assignments and organizational planning with the Kentucky Society of Radiologic Technologists and the Appalachian Regional Society of Radiologic Technologists.

She holds a Master of Science in Radiologic Science (education) degree from Midwestern State University in Wichita Falls, Texas, and a master's degree in adult and higher education from MSU. Additionally, she earned a bachelor's degree in university studies and an Associate of Applied Sciences (AAS) degree from MSU. She is certified in computed tomography, mammography and radiography.

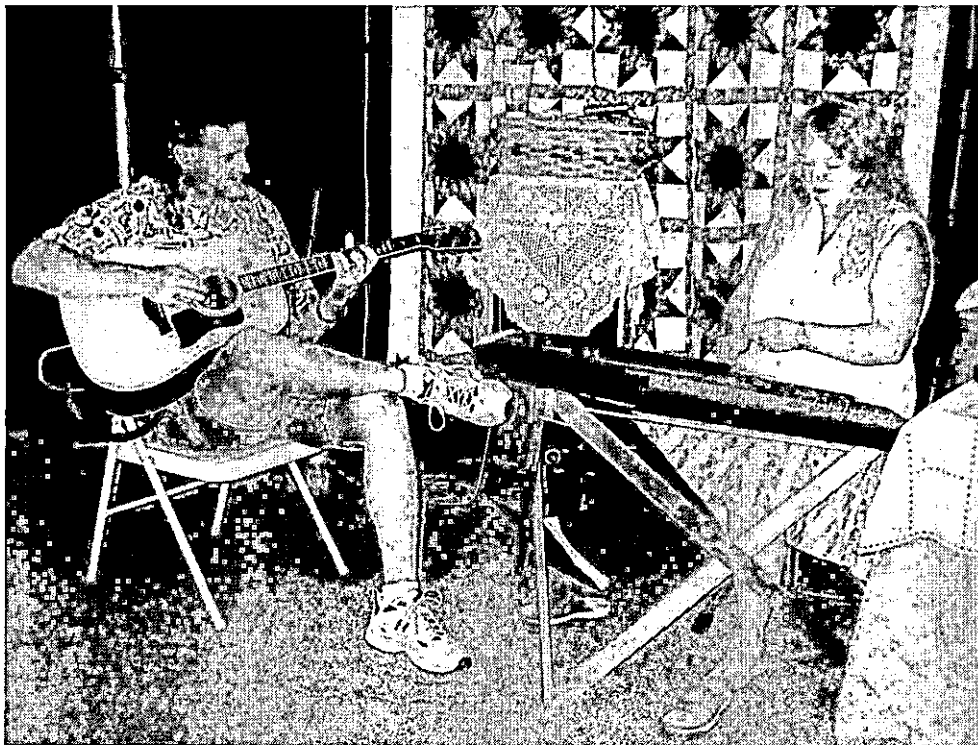
