MOREHEAD, Ky.---Members of the Kentucky National Guard from the Morehead post were activated on Dec. 13, to serve in Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF).

Among the guardsmen are three members of Morehead State University's Eta Gamma chapter of Theta Chi fraternity: Brothers Timmy Smith, Morehead sophomore university studies major; Brent "Dewey" Achtermann, Martinsville, Ohio, senior business major; and Talmadge "T" Zipperer, Cincinnati senior military science major.

The group was first mobilized at Fort Dix, N.J. where they stayed for two months before being sent to Kuwait on Feb. 16. After a week, the trio moved to their current destination in CSC (Convoy Support Center) Scania, located approximately 120 miles south of Baghdad.

In his correspondence, Achtermann said "our brothers are currently living in improved tents with hardwood floors, and all have chosen beds to sleep on! They run missions every other day north to Baghdad International Airport (BIAP) or to Camp Anaconda, (located approximately 50 miles to the north)."

Their current mission is convoy security, where a team of soldiers with three humvee's, goes with a 30 semi-truck convoy to provide an escort for them from Scania to BIAP or Anaconda. The trip can take anywhere from 3-10 hours depending on vehicle breakdowns or roadside bombs which force them to stop.

The fraternity brothers are part of the 503rd Military Police Battalion, Bravo Company, along with other soldiers from Morehead, Jackson and Hazard. They are in the 4th platoon, where Smith is part of the first squad, and the other two are in the 3rd squad.

The servicemen wished to say "hello" to everyone stateside. They would enjoy hearing from family and friends back home. MOREHEAD, Ky.---A Morehead State University alumnus and former 25-year employee is one of the delegation representing the United States in Singapore this week as the International Olympic Committee conducts the election for the 2012 host city.

William "Bill" Rosenberg will be among the 100-member group from the New York City's Olympic Committee.

"I was very flattered to be ask," said Rosenberg on a recent visit back to Morehead. "It's going to be a hard call for the IOC."

The other cities vying for the 2012 games are London, Madrid, Paris and Moscow.

Rosenberg retired in May from his position as executive director of United States Judo, Inc., the chief operating officer of the national governing body for the Olympic sport of judo.

"I was suppose to retire last December, but it was actually the first of May before my replacement started," said Rosenberg. Even though retired, he still plans on working and staying involved in the organization that he has been part of since 1988, and since 1997 has served as its executive director.

After graduating with a Bachelor of Arts degree with an emphasis in political science, economics and sociology in 1969, he joined the MSU staff while continuing his education, earning a Master of Arts degree in higher education in 1970 and completing postgraduate work in educational administration.

"I was walking across campus on my visit and realized again just how nice Morehead State is," said Rosenberg. "I felt blessed because I had some very good people, who helped me when I was a student at MSU, then I got to pass that to students when I worked for the University.

"That's what makes MSU so special, it's how the faculty and staff are really concerned for the students. It's something that I will always remember about Morehead State."

During the trip to Morehead, the Rosenbergs stayed with Dr. Gary Cox, a former professor and head of the Department of Geography, Government and History, and his wife, Jo, who were their neighbors when they lived in Morehead.

In his 25 years of service to the University, Rosenberg served in various posts. He was director of communication services, overseeing a comprehensive array of voice, data and video technology. He was director of media services, administering both audiovisual services and telecommunication activities, including a complete broadcast quality television production facility.

He also supervised the Department of Public Safety and served as assistant to the vice president for administration and fiscal services, where he oversaw the operation of the University's golf course.

When he retired in 1995, Rosenberg was director of risk management and Americans with Disability Act coordinator/compliance officer. He served as the institution's representative to local, state and federal agencies, taught classes in educational media, authored and administered grants and produced media productions.

Rosenberg served as coach for the MSU Judo Club, an organization that he founded and served as head instructor and faculty sponsor for 20 years. He was a multi-term president and treasurer of the Kentucky Judo Council and has worked in numerous positions in U.S. Olympic Festivals, Goodwill Games and many other distinguished Judo competitions.

The Atlanta Committee for Olympic Games invited Rosenberg to serve as competition manager for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. He was responsible for all activities in support of both the judo competition and meeting the needs of International Judo Federation's directing committee.

For his work, the IJF awarded him the Medal of Merit, the first American ever to receive the award.

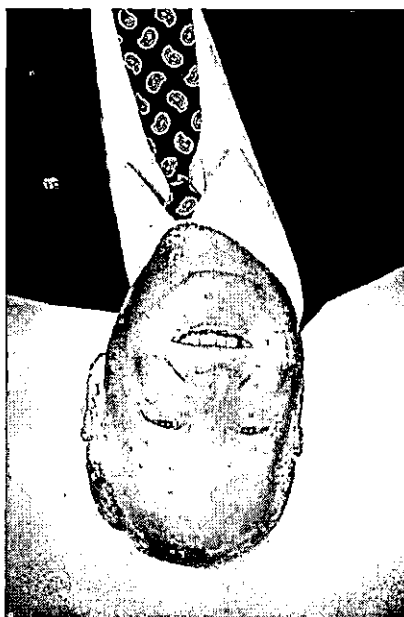
In 2000, Rosenberg was inducted into Morehead State University's Alumni Hall of Fame, and was an official member of the Paralympic Delegation in Athens in 2004.

He and his wife, Alice, also an MSU alumnus, have decided to move from Colorado Springs, Colo., and settle in Jefferson, Ga., near their son William T. Rosenberg, Jr., a graduate of Rowan County Senior High School.

"We have a lot of great memories of the University and the area, this place (Morehead State) and our friends here will also be special to us," said Rosenberg.

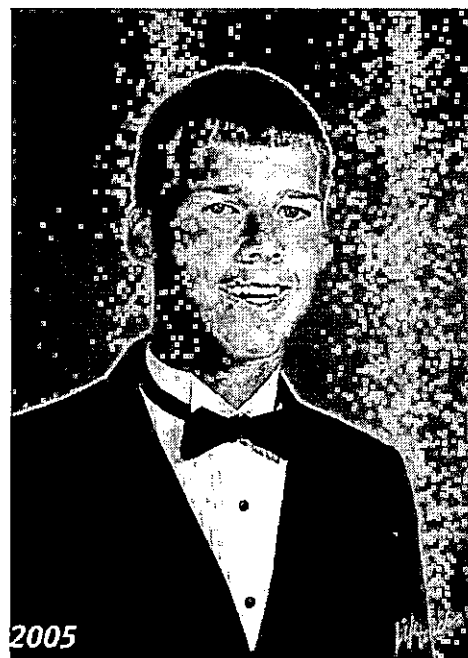

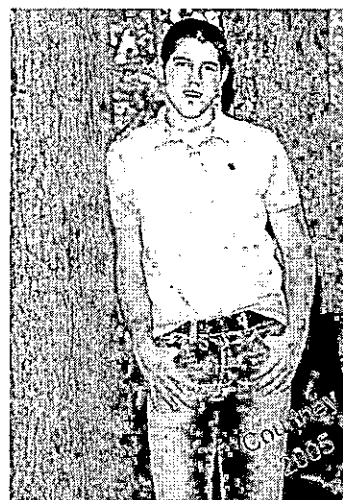

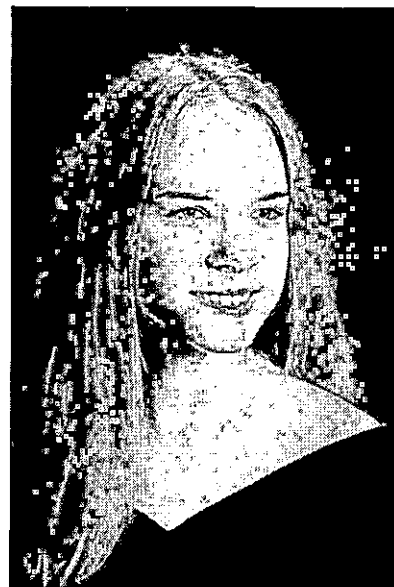

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University's imaging sciences students will once again offer free fetal ultrasounds to expectant mothers.

The fetal scans will be conducted by appointment July 25-27 at the University's sonography lab in Reed Hall. Performed by students, the scans will be supervised by faculty who are registered in obstetrics and gynecology through the American Registry of Diagnostic Medical Sonographers (ARDMS).

Students performing the scans have already successfully completed MSU's radiologic technology initial program and are pursuing sonography as a fourth-year specialty.

The exams are non-diagnostic and are being conducted specifically as a learning experience for MSU students. Neither the University nor its faculty and students are responsible for interpretation of the exams. Standards of patient confidentiality will be observed.

Those who would like to have a scan conducted are asked to call for an appointment. All participant mothers must sign a consent form allowing students to perform the scan. On their exam day, volunteer mothers should bring a towel, as well as a VHS tape if they wish to record the ultrasound images.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University's Office of Continuing Education offers motorcycle riding classes for the beginner and the advanced rider.

The Basic Motorcycle Rider Safety Course (BRC) is for non-riders, new riders, or someone wanting a refresher course. During the course, instruction includes how to maneuver and operate a motorcycle in a controlled, off-street environment. Registration is still available for the August classes in Morehead and Ashland.

Upon successful completion of the course, the rider will receive a waiver for the skills test to obtain a motorcycle license. Some insurance agencies offer discounts to persons completing the course.

Motorcycles and helmets are provided for each student. The course is a minimum of 15 hours. All classes meet on Friday, from 6-10 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. All classroom and skills hours must be attended in order to successfully complete course requirements.

The Experienced Rider Course (ERC) is designed for individuals who have a current motorcycle license, have access to a street legal cycle, and have riding experience. On-cycle maneuvers are practiced in a controlled, off-street environment and are specifically geared to reinforce safe riding strategies. The course meets a minimum of four hours on Saturday, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Proof of insurance and registration are required.

Registration for the BRC class is \$110 per person and \$60 for the ERC class. Class size is limited to 12 students per section.

For the basic class, one free slot per class is allocated to a Kentucky resident, 16 - 17 years of age who meets specific requirements. Prior parental signatures must be submitted before class participation is allowed.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Summer vacations are coming to an end and in less than one month, students at Morehead State University will return to the campus for the fall semester.

While several have already completed the process, the remaining students will have a final opportunity to register for classes on Thursday and Friday, Aug. 18 and 19.

“With computer access, students may register for classes, pay fees, check the status of their financial accounts, review financial aid awards, defer payments and books, make changes in their meal plans, and pay rent, library fines and parking tickets,” said Jim Fluty, MSU’s director of accounting and budgetary control.”

For those who have already registered, your fall billing statement may be viewed online. Payment or deferment is due by the close of business on Aug. 19. A \$75 late fee will be in effect beginning the first day of classes on Monday, Aug. 22.

If you did not advance register, but have a checksheet on file and were enrolled at MSU last semester, scheduling for classes may be completed online after checking with your adviser. Information also is available in your major academic department or at one of the University’s five regional campuses.

For those who have not paid or deferred their fees, the University will cancel your class schedule on Sept. 6. Students will be notified of this action through their MSU electronic mail account. “We encourage students to view their billing statements and financial aid awards at least twice a month so they will be aware of any current transactions,” Fluty said.

Once dropped from the class rolls, students have one month, until Oct. 6, to have their class schedule reinstated. Payment or deferment must be made at the time of the reinstatement. In addition, a \$75 late fee and a \$100 reinstatement fee will be assessed. After this deadline, schedules cannot be reinstated unless there was a University error.

For students already registered, the transmittal of financial aid will be made on Aug. 8 and refund checks will be mailed on Aug. 12.

For the finale on Aug. 17, Rigsby will serve as the staff mandolin player and tenor. He will sing three of the songs he has recorded: "Empty Old Mailbox," from his third album which won him Song of the Year from SPGBMA (Society for the Preservation of Bluegrass Music in America) in 2001; "Midnight Call," the title track from his most recent release on Sugar Hill Records; and will close the show with "Me and Jesus," which has been released on a gospel recording.

Rigsby, who has performed with some of the country's best musicians, is a two-time Grammy nominee and a two-time SPGBMA's Traditional Male Vocalist of the Year. His first solo album won the Association of Independent Music's gospel album of the year award and was nominated for an International Bluegrass Music Association award.

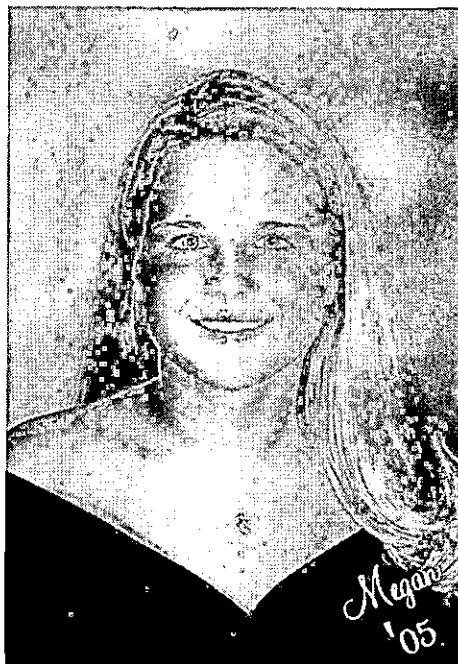
